

► Track and field conference meets

Olympic Conference boys' track and field meet

► **When & where:** Today at Macomb High School. Field events start at 4 p.m., with preliminaries in sprint events on the track starting at 4:30. Running finals begin at 6 p.m.

► **Directions:** US-67 southbound into Macomb. That road is North and eventually South Lafayette Street in the city. Turn right on West Grant, go approximately two blocks, and turn left on South Johnson. School is at 1525 South Johnson Street, on the left.

► **Defending champion:** Macomb.

► **Favorite to win:** You have to like the Bombers to win on their own track, but Aledo — which finished just a few points off the pace last year — could pull this out. Farmington and Sherrard also will chase for the title.

NCIC boys' track and field meet

► **When & where:** Friday at Ottawa High School. Field events for varsity and frosh-soph levels begin at 3 p.m., as do preliminaries in the sprint events (100, 110 hurdles and 200). Running finals begin at 5:30 p.m.

► **Directions:** Take I-80 east to exit #90 in Ottawa (Illinois Route 23). Turn right on to 23, stay on 23 for approximately two miles. Turn left on Main Street, school is on the right hand side.

► **Defending champion:** Dixon, by one point over Geneseo.

► **Favorite to win:** Princeton, which finished third at last year's NCIC event, might be the top team in the league this year, but don't count the Maple Leafs, or Dixon, out of the title hunt.

Western Big 6 boys' track and field meet

► **When & where:** Saturday afternoon at Public Schools Stadium in Rock Island. With the echoes from Friday night's girls' sectional still ringing the field, field events for the boys kick off at noon on Saturday. Prelims in the 100, 110 hurdles and 200, in that order, begin at 1 p.m., with running finals starting at 2:15.

► **Defending champion:** The host Rocks have won 11 consecutive Big 6 championships.

► **Favorite to win:** It should be 12 in a row by late afternoon on Saturday for Rock Island. United Township, the last team other than the Rocks to win conference, is probably the next best team, and Quincy is reputed to have a lot of talent back from last year's tournament runnerup team.



Leafs Capture NCIC Gold and End Dixon's 6-Year Reign

The Last time the Geneseo Boys Track team won the NCIC Title this year's seniors were 5 years old. It has been 13 long years since the Maple Leafs have won the title. That all changed on Friday night as the Leafs traveled to Ottawa to participate in the seventy-fifth running of the NCIC finals. Going off of the seeds the Princeton Tigers and Geneseo Maple Leafs were considered co-favorites with the Dixon Dukes and Sterling Golden Warriors close behind.

The Leafs stormed out to a commanding lead in the field events and never looked back as they grabbed Nine Gold Medals along the way. This year's seniors were not to be denied.

Leading the way were the following NCIC Champions: **High Jump:**

Byron Stanley; **Long Jump:** Shaun Russell; **Shot Put:** Joe Paradiso; **Triple Jump:** Shaun Russell; **3200 Meter Relay:** Nathan Schlindwein, Nate Silver, Brian Chenoweth, Dan Chenoweth; **3200 Meter Run:** Brian Chenoweth; **800 Meter Relay:** Shane Reschke Augie Anderson, Cody Leamen, Shaun Russell; **400 Meter Dash:** Luke Reschke; **1600 Meter Run:** Brian Chenoweth.

On the Fresh-Soph Level, the Leafs were competing short handed with several key teammates doing Varsity duty. Despite that handicap the team still managed a strong 4th place finish. Team scores: 1.) Boys track team clinches NCIC title

The Leafs track and field team continues to dominate the competition, this time in the NCIC conference meet, May 13 where the boys won the NCIC championship with 152 team points. Placing second was Princeton followed by Sterling, Dixon, Ottawa, Mendota, Rock Falls, Hall, Rochelle and La Salle-Peru. This marks the first time in 13 years the Leafs have claimed an NCIC title.

"(The win) was pretty special," Head Coach Don Fredericks said. "The last time we won the NCIC meet, this year's seniors were five-years old. It was truly a battle with Princeton."

Geneseo claimed nine first-place finishes in the championship victory. Senior Luke Reschke won the 400-meter dash, taking the tape in 50.09 seconds, while senior teammate Byron Stanley claimed victory in the high jump event, clearing the bar at 6-3 1/2. Senior Brian Chenoweth won two distance events with a 4:32.18 time in the 1600-m run and a time of 9:55.21 in the 3200-m run.

Junior Shaun Russell also grabbed two victories; one in the long jump with a leap of 21-9 and the triple jump with a mark of 42-7. Junior Joe Paradiso won the shot put event with a 53-7 heave. The Leafs also received firsts from the 4x200 relay of

freshman Shane Reschke, seniors Augie Anderson and Cody Leamen and Russell, taking the tape in 1:32.49 and the 4x800 relay of senior Nathan Schlindwein, sophomore Nate Silver, B. Chenoweth and sophomore Dan Chenoweth, clocking in at 8:16.94.

"The Chenoweth brothers volunteered to run a triple, running in the 3200-m relay, the 3200-m run and the 1600-m run," Fredericks said. "After the field events, we told the 3200-m relay that we were in a good spot so if they wanted to scratch they could, but the guys said no. We then asked them to go for third, but the guys said they were going

to win the thing.

"The field events got us off to a great start," Fredericks said. "Byron Stanley with an all-time best in the high jump and Shaun Russell in the triple jump. He was in second until the last jump where he beat the Dixon participant by one inch.

"Joe Paradiso tied his best throw in the shot put, which is a junior school record, and Shaun Russell and Luke Reschke finished one and two in the long jump."

The Leafs grabbed three second-place finishes from D. Chenoweth, Schlindwein and L. Reschke. D. Chenoweth came in second in the 3200-m run to brother Brian, crossing the line in 10:00.65, while Schlindwein clocked in at 2:02.65 in the 800-m run. L. Reschke finished second to Russell in the long jump with a mark of 21-5 1/2 to claim the top two finishes in the event.

L. Reschke added a third-place finish in the 200-m dash in 22.72, while D. Chenoweth took third in the 1600-m run with a time of 4:35.52. The 4x100 relay of Anderson, junior Mason Kernan, Leamen and Russell raced to a third-place finish, crossing the finish line in 44.59.

Leamen claimed two fourth-place finishes for the Leafs; one in the 100-m dash with a time of 11.15 and the other in the 200-m dash behind Reschke in 22.73. The 4x400 relay team of S. Reschke, Schlindwein, Silver and sophomore Jesse Gessel grabbed the final fourth, crossing the line in 3:38.08.

Geneseo also tallied three fifth-place finishes in the win from L. Reschke in the 100-m dash with a time of 11.26 just behind Leamen; senior Brian Sandoval in the pole vault, clearing the bar at 11-3 and from sophomore Chris Brooks who took fifth in the shot put with a 47-6 1/2 heave.

The freshmen/ sophomore track and field squad finished fourth out of 12 teams in the NCIC meet with five second-place finishes, one third, three fourths and five fifths.

Among those placing second

for the Leafs was sophomore Wolfe Repass in two events; the 110-m hurdles with a time of 17.18 and the 300-m hurdles, crossing the finish line in 43.43. The 4x200 relay of sophomores Elliott Kenney and Sam Woolsey and freshmen Jaran Heaton and Jacob Kuban took second with a time of 1:38.65, while sophomore Jeremy Peters came in second in the high jump, clearing the bar at 5-8. Kuban grabbed the final second for Geneseo in the long jump with a leap of 19-6.

The 4x800 relay of freshman Andy Collis, sophomores Erik Kowitz and Tom Blean and freshman Jon Fleming gave the Leafs their only third-place finish of the meet, crossing the finish line in 9:22.68. S. Reschke raced to a fourth-place finish in the 100-m dash, clocking in at 11.79, while sophomore Blake Wyffels took fourth in the 3200-m run with a time of 10:56.28. Kenney took fourth in the triple jump with a mark of 37-7.

Geneseo also saw five fifth-place finishes from Fleming in the 800-m run with a time of 2:14.87; freshman Ryan Kotecki in the 3200-m run in 10:59.53; Heaton in the 300-m hurdles, clocking in at 45.14; sophomore Andrew Timmerman propelled

himself to a fifth-place finish in the pole vault with leap of 8-3 and sophomore Bren Gillespie came in fifth in the triple jump behind Kenney with a mark of 37-4.

"It was a solid team effort across the board," Fredericks

said. "And the team was not going to be denied."

The Leafs will be in action at 3 p.m. today, May 20 for field events and prelims followed by the finals starting at 6 p.m. in the IHSA Sectional meet in Moline at Browning Field.

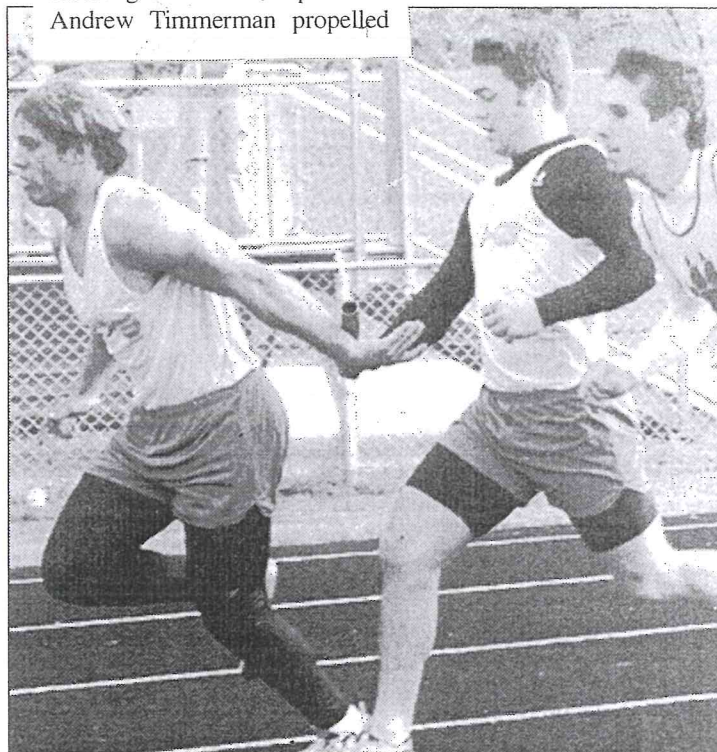

Dixon's NCIC reign comes to an end

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OTTAWA — Eventually, the streak had to come to an end.

For the Dixon boys track team, its run of six consecutive NCIC championships came to end at the hands of the meet favorite, Geneseo, at this year's meet held Friday in Ottawa.

Geneseo racked up 152 points, comfortably ahead of runnerup Princeton, which had 120. Rounding out the top five were Sterling with 99, Dixon with 98 and Ottawa with 39.

"The thing about track and field, when you come into a meet, more

often than not you know probably who's going to win the meet," said Lawton. "Kids, to a degree, perform like they're going to perform a lot of the time. We knew with our situation this year we didn't have the volume of kids it takes to win this meet. Does that mean we couldn't win it? No, because crazy things have happened.

"This meet isn't a disappointment. The only disappointment is when your kids don't perform in areas where you hoped they could perform. You want to see kids that have worked all season long come to the conference meet and perform up to their capabilities. In a lot of places,

we did that tonight. In a few, we didn't."

The coach for Geneseo, Don Fredericks, was also the coach the last time the Maple Leafs won the NCIC, back in 1992. He appreciates what his team accomplished, to unseat the Dukes.

"Hats off to that streak, coach Lawton, his staff and the athletes that put all of those great efforts together," said Fredericks. "To win six in a row, that's phenomenal. If someone had to end that streak this year, we're glad to be in that position. ...You just never know how these things are going to work out. We had solid efforts across the

board. It was a total team effort, and I'm very, very pleased."

The top area performer in the meet was the Dukes' Richie Johnson, who captured both hurdles races and posted a season-best in the 100, where he placed second.

Johnson ran a 14.58 in the 110 high hurdles and a season-best 39.43 in the 300 intermediate hurdles. His main competition in the hurdles this season, Princeton's Jeff Scoma, was competing with a slight hamstring injury and finished a distant second in each race.

"I was just running as fast as I

could," said Johnson, after winning the 110 high hurdles. "When I came out of the blocks, I knew it was going to be a good race. I think that was one of the best races I ran this year."

Johnson also ran the 100 in 11 seconds flat, behind only the meet's outstanding track performer, Evan Holschbach of Princeton, who won in 10.93.

"I just had a great start," said Johnson, "and I took advantage of it."

Joining Johnson as a second-place finisher was Tim Bentz, who was the runnerup in the 1600 with a time of 4:32.87. Also, Will Mardaus was the runnerup in the triple jump at 42-6. He was edged by Geneseo's Shaun Russell, who went 43-7 on his final attempt. Russell, also the long jump champ, was voted the meet's outstanding field performer.

Third-place finishers for the Dukes were Christian Clark in the 3200 (10:03.65), James Wohrley in the high jump (6-1) and Andrew

Burnell in the shot put (49-7 3/4). Burnell's effort was a personal best by a foot.

Dixon was also third in the 1600 and 3200 relays.

Heading into the final event, the 1600 relay, Sterling trailed Dixon by three points (92-89), but made up that deficit by winning the race in 3:29.24. Team members were sophomores Kymin Hussung, Joe Schneiderbauer and Sam Megli and senior Victor Dawson. Dawson had about a 10-meter advantage heading into the final leg of the race and was pulling away for a 20-meter win at the end. Dawson is looking for the group's split times to drop by next week's sectional.

"Being sophomores, 52s are good for them," said Dawson. "Sam Megli, he's a beast for being a sophomore. He won the open 800, so I expect he can get down to a 50. I'm trying to get down to a 49, so that would be good for us."

Catching Geneseo and Princeton in the team standings was likely not a realistic goal for the Golden Warriors and the rest of the field, so the third-place finish brought a smile to the face of head coach Bob Brown.

"We absolutely knew that unless Geneseo just didn't get off the bus, they had it," said Brown. "We knew the battle was for third. I predicted 98 points, and we got 99. We're just tickled. Our kids competed well all night. They did what they were capable of and a little bit more."

The lone champ for the Golden Warriors was Megli, who cruised in the 800 with a time of 1:59.87, nearly three seconds ahead of his nearest competitor but over two seconds off his personal best.

"I probably went out too slow, but I came in pretty good," said Megli. "I wanted to win conference, then sectionals and hopefully make it state."

Second-place finishers for Sterling were Sean Bright in the high jump (6-3), Schneiderbauer in the pole vault (12-3) and Colin Fane in the shot put (50-8 1/2). Also, the 400 relay team of Matt Hughes, Mike Tucker, Dawson and Cory Renner was second in 44.15. Missing from the group was Andrew Bley, slowed by an injury.

Taking third for the Golden Warriors were Dawson in the 400 (51.22), Schneiderbauer in the

triple jump (40-8) and Fane in the discus (144-6).

For Rock Falls, the top placers were fourth-place finishers Geoff Wright in the 1600 (4:41.91) and Jeremy Hardey in the 110 high hurdles (15.68).

Sterling's future looks bright as the school took top honors in the fresh-soph portion of the meet with 121 points. Rochelle was next with 96.5, Dixon seventh with 31 and Rock Falls ninth with 19.

Tim Gaumer led the way for the Warriors with firsts in the 110 high hurdles (16.50) and 300 intermediate hurdles (42.84). He was third in the triple jump (38-1).

Other first-place finishers at the fresh-soph level included Rochelle's Ben Walter in the 200 (23.35), the Hubs' Marcus Peters in the 1600 (4:41.28), Sterling's Frederick Moore in the shot put (46-8 1/2) and Dixon's Mike Ridgeway in the discus (142-6).

Rochelle took the 400 relay (46.82), while Sterling won the 800 (1:38.06) and 1600 (3:42.75) relays.

Receiving sportsmanship batons after the meet were Sterling's Megli and Dixon's Dennis Mohammad.

Prep boys track

► **Geneseo wins NCIC:** An all-around solid team performance allowed the Geneseo Maple Leafs to capture the NCIC track and field championship on Friday night.

On the track, Brian and Dan Chenoweth took care of the distances, as Brian won the 1600 and 3200 runs. Dan took second in the 3200 and third in the 1600.

In sprints, Luke Reschke had three top-six performances, finishing fifth in the 100, third in the 200 and winning the 400. Nathan Schlindwein placed second in the 800.

Shaun Russell won the long and triple jump, leading a strong effort in the field events. Adding to the Maple Leaf medal count were Bryon Stanley and Joe Paradiso who won the high jump and shot put, respectively.
