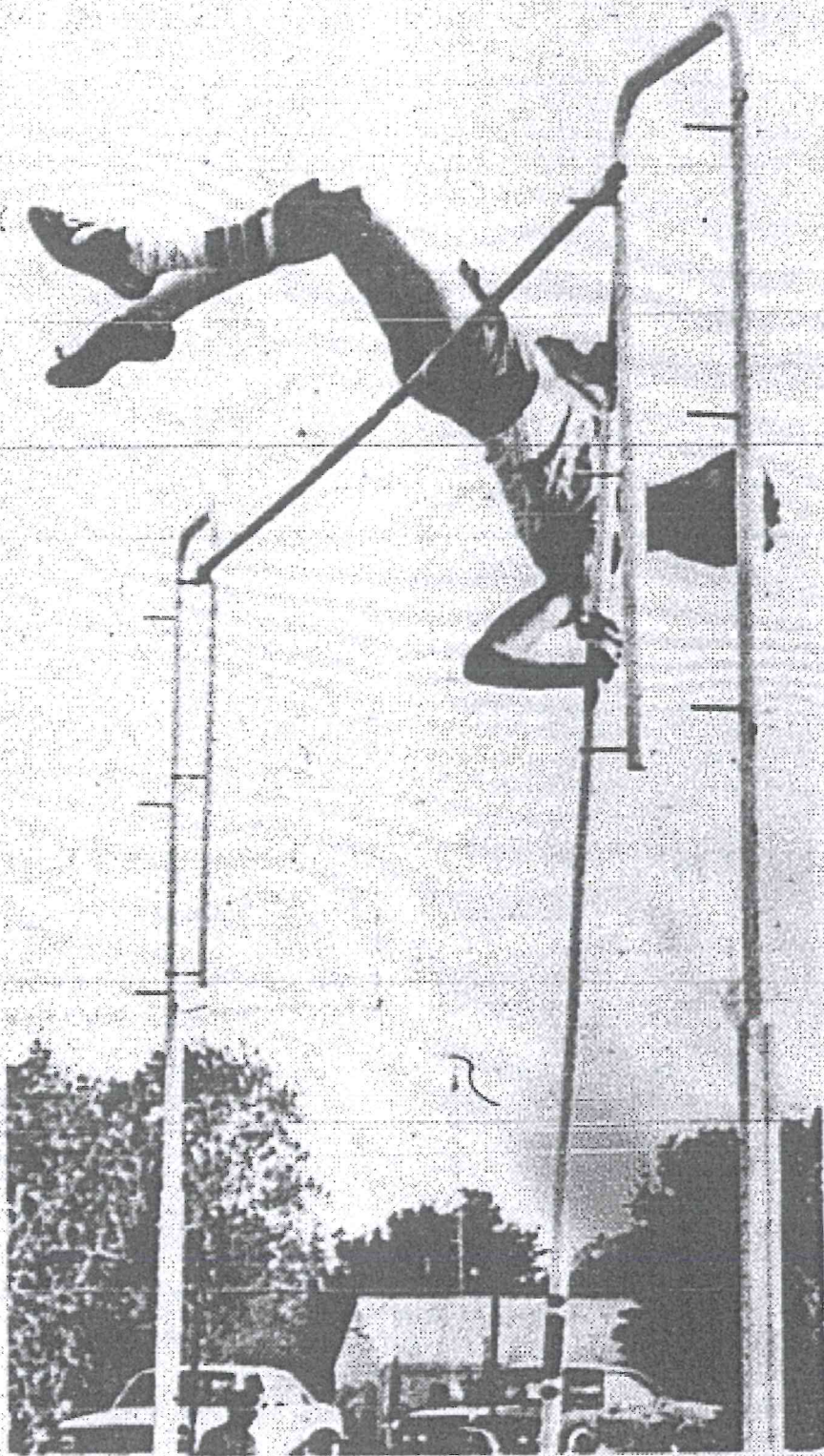




Sailing

Wayne Anderson clears 11'6" in pole vault competition at the Geneseo Invitational. The height wasn't enough, though, to earn him a place finish.

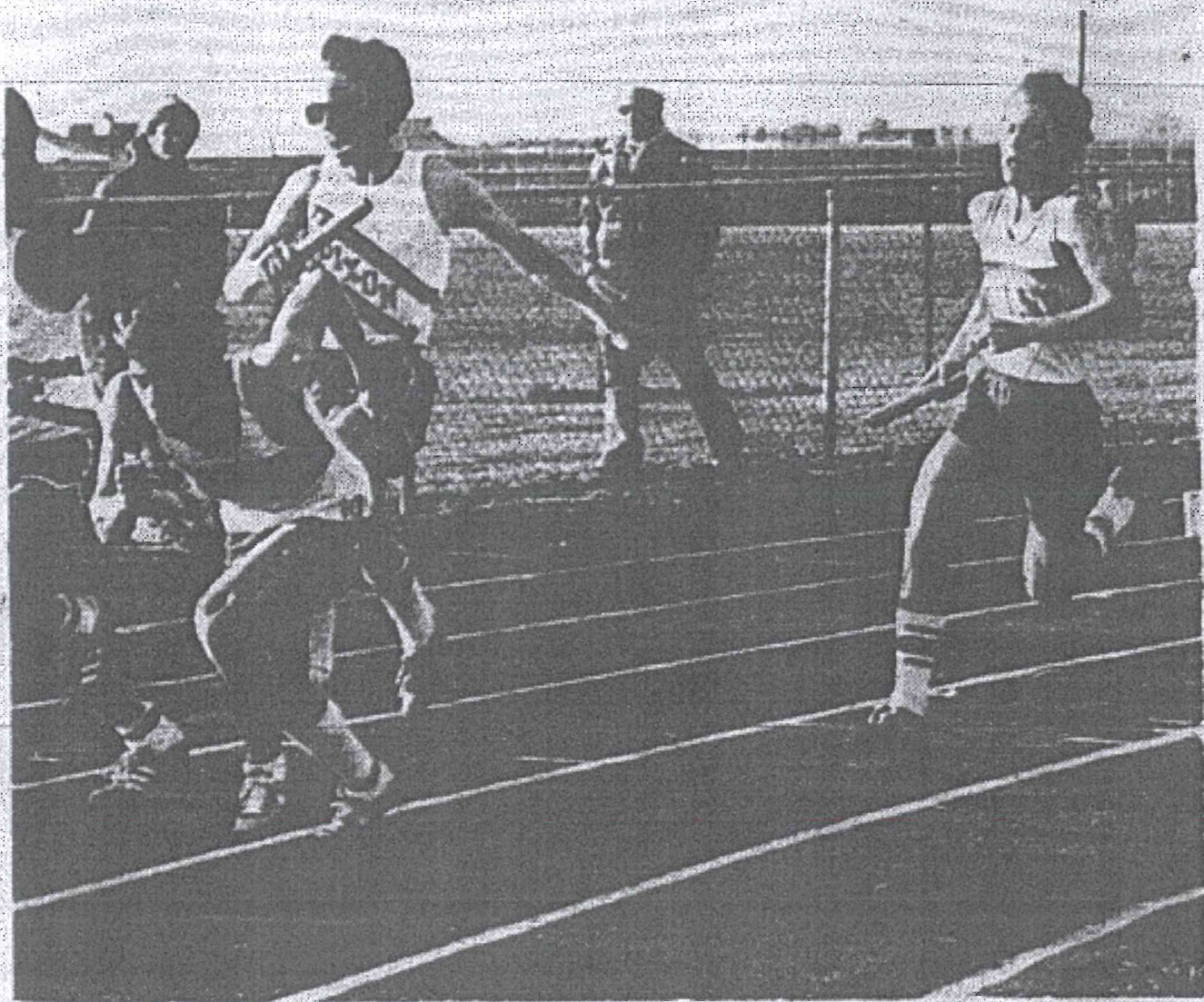


First place

NCIC crown to Princeton

GENESEO — What the Geneseo Invitational provided, besides good competition in its own right, was a clearer picture of which team will place second to Sterling at next Friday's NCIC meet in Geneseo.

The Geneseo Invite brings together Galesburg and eight NCIC schools, and Friday night, Princeton showed it has the kind of quality that will do well in meets much larger than this.

Coach Gary Coates' Tigers, the top-rated Class A team in the state, based on reported times, edged Rock Falls 64-60 for the team title, with LaSalle-Peru third with 54 points. Geneseo, fourth with 43, drew praise from coach Jeff Quick for improved performance.

WHERE PRINCETON is good, it is very good. Four meet records were broken, two by Tiger athletes. Tom Hodge ran 800 meters in 1:57.01, and Rick Lappin pole vaulted 14 feet, one-half inch, both setting new marks.

Princeton, beaten on the track by LaSalle-Peru, Rock Falls and Geneseo, won this meet by scoring 34 of its 64 points in the field events. Rock Falls was second in field events with 17 points.

Princeton went one-two in the shot and discus, Eric Foresman winning both. He heaved the shot 58 feet, 5 1/2 inches, and teammate Pat Pence tossed 56-6 1/2. No one else reached 49 feet.

Princeton's Jamie Dow took the 3,200-meter run in 9:38.72, but it was a splendid race, with the first four runners in under 9:45. Geneseo's Rich Werkheiser, who has taken 16 seconds off his previous best time in this event in just one week, was second at 9:39.68.

Only three high jumpers cleared the 5-10 opening height, including Marc Clasper of Rock Falls, who set a meet record at 6-5 1/2. The other record to fall was in the metric mile, where Streator's Charlie Kinkade set a fast pace and held off Dow to win in 4:26.83.

He didn't break any records, but LaSalle-Peru sprinter Torrist Cannon put on a show, taking 100 meters in 11.12, 200 meters in 23.01, and anchoring the winning Cavalier 800-meter relay team.

GENESEO'S QUICK was especially proud of his winning 3,200-meter relay team, which consisted of Tim Renihan, Todd VanHyfte, and Pat Smith, all sophomores, and freshman anchor Chris Gomez, who brought an 8:19 effort in with a 2:01.8 final leg.

"We could perhaps insert Werkheiser and cut three or four seconds off that time, but we'd still be a few seconds off what we need (8:02) to qualify for state," said Quick, who indicated Werkheiser and miler Eric Zeitler will run in individual events, while the underclass quartet remains on in this relay.

"THEY THINK THEY'RE the fastest frosh-soph team around, and we want to keep them together," said Quick. "They've already gone six seconds faster than the NCIC frosh-soph record."

Quick said the four will run in the frosh-soph division of next week's NCIC meet, and will be Geneseo's varsity 3,200 relay team at district.

"It was a super meet for us," said Quick. "We had improvement in every event on the track. Kent Shriver's 23.6 was the fastest 200 meters we've had all year (he placed fourth), and Jeff Barr's 51.6 split in the mile relay was our best quarter time. And Chris Swain ran strong in the quarter. We really competed well. Our relays were faster, too, despite not having good handoffs."
