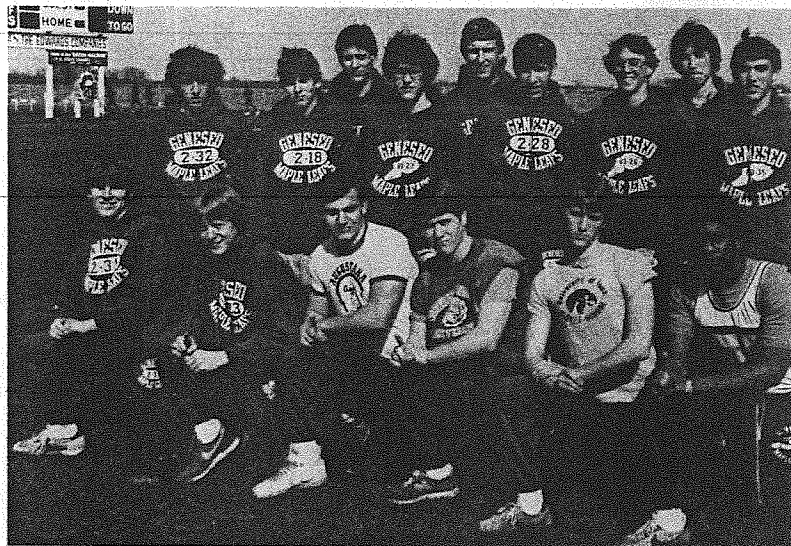


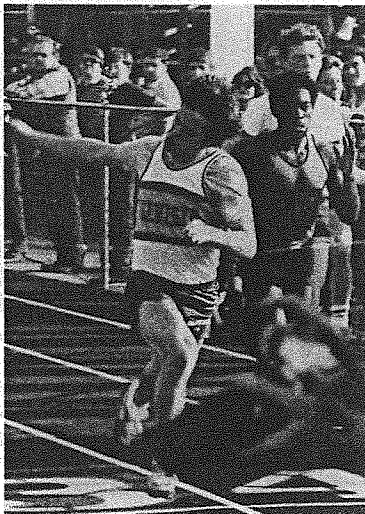

The 1983 boys team was a very young team led by several very good seniors. Senior Tim Renihan was elected captain and set the school record in the 800; he was conference champ, sectional champ, and 6th place finisher at this year's state meet. Randy Clary was the 300 low hurdler and finished 2nd in the conference and Wayne Anderson pole vaulted. The team was 5-2 in dual meets with victories also at the Dixon and Geneseo Invitationals. Trent Foltz was the most valuable trackster, and he also tied the school record in the 100 meter dash. Fred Little, a conference champ and state qualifier in the 300 low hurdles, was elected most improved. Sophomore Tim Arnett was also a state qualifier in the 3200 meter run. A total of 103 boys participated in track this year. Most of this year's top performers will be back next year so the future looks good for the Geneseo boys team.

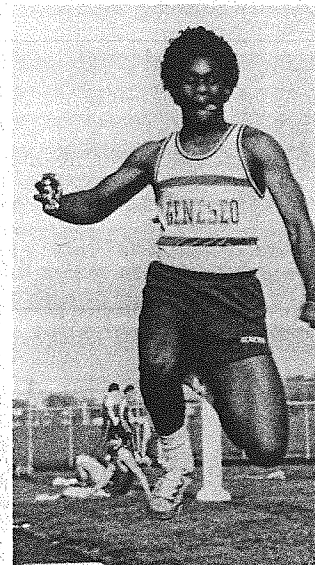

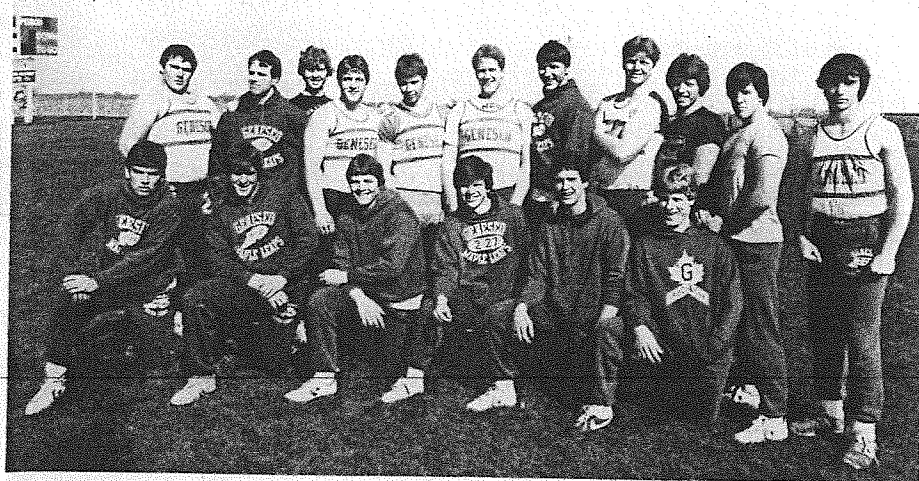


Wayne concentrates before his vault.

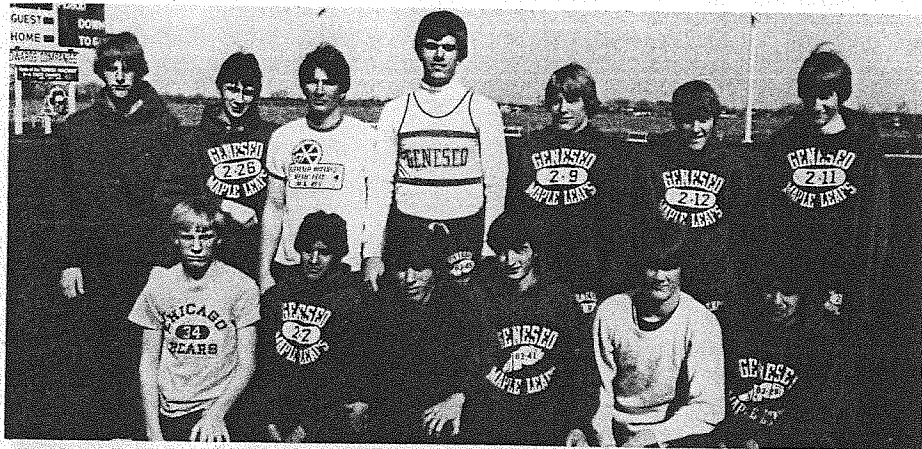


Jack Fields leaps toward a victory.

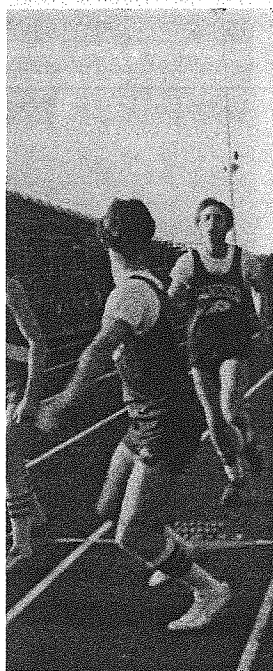

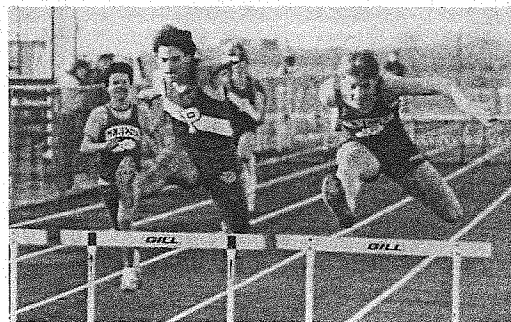

The 1983 Sophomore Team was 6-0 in dual meets with the highlight of their season being named NCIC Team Champions. Tracksters conditioning for running, field events

Almost the entire 1982 running events team is returning for the Geneseo boys 1983 track team season, according to Coach Jeff Quick.

Senior Randy Clary, juniors Trent Foltz, Todd Cahalan and Rich Willemkens and sophomores Doug Emerick and Dave Mirocha are lead people in the sprints this year. Hurdling will be done by Fred Little in the highs and lows and Randy Clary will do low. In the distance races, second year letterwinners Pat Smith, senior, Tim Renihan, senior and Chris Gomez, junior, will handle the 800 and 1600 meters while Tim Arnett, sophomore and Mark Homer, junior, will run the 3200 meter. Cris Bouwens will also be involved in the 800 and 1600 meters.

Geneseo's team is faced with having to replace people that led in five of six field events. Senior Wayne Anderson, pole vaulting,

is the only returning field event leader. He is backed in the pole vaulting event by junior Frank Woodard. Good early season improvement in the shotput and discus is being shown by seniors Jim Thomas, Brent Westemeyer, Darfen Harris and Travis Mackey along with juniors Brad Stohl and Kelly Scott, according to Mr. Quick. Sophomore Tim DeKezel is the leading high jumper having jumped 6'1" last year. In the long jump, Brian Jones, junior and Dave Mirocha, sophomore, have already improved upon their last season's performances. Also, in the long jump and triple jump will be senior Jack Fields and juniors Kurt Selboe and Chris Holmstrom.

"Most of the 93 athletes have been working out now for nine weeks and needless to say the good weather has helped immensely. Our goal this year is to place as high in the conference as possible and to get as many people to state as we can," said Coach Quick.

Returning letterwinners are Pat Smith, 800 conference champ, state qualifier; Tim Renihan, 3200 relay conference champ, state qualifier; Chris Gomez, 1982 North Central Conference champ, state qualifier and Todd VanHylte. All are second year letterwinners. First
