

Geneseo nabs narrow win from Davenport

Temperatures may have started to drop from the nice warm weekend temps but the momentum of the Geneseo boys varsity track team didn't. Geneseo and Davenport West took to the Geneseo field Tuesday afternoon, April 21 to windy 60° conditions.

The varsity squad took the meet with a narrow 65-63 final. Geneseo swept the 110-meter high hurdles on the way to the victory.

In the high hurdles, Bryan Eyrich glided his way to the first place finish in 15.75. Leafs Steve Zobrist and Lee Eastburn finished out the field of scoring finishers by taking second and third.

The relay squads also proved strong for the home town team. Mike Haars, Scott Johnson, Mike Morris and Ged Woelke combined efforts in the 3200 relay for a time of 8:43.34 and first place.

The 400-meter relay team of Rod Bennington, Steve Zobrist, Scott VanHoutte and Todd Smith crossed the line ahead of the pack with a time of 47.58.

Johnson went on his own in the 800 meter race and took first place with a time of 2:07.22.

Phil Walsh led a pack of Davenport West cindermen in the 1600, taking the tape in 4:40.4.

There was no contest in the pole vault and scores were not kept in the triple jump. Jay Reed, however, took the triple jump event with a leap of 39'.

Todd Akers took the high jump at a height of 5'10".

Geneseo recorded 10 second place finishes and six thirds. Those earning the silver medal were Matt Shoemaker, discus, Zobrist, 100 high hurdles, VanHoutte, 100 meter, Rod Sand-

berg, 800 meter, Haars, 400 meter, Eyrich, 300 low hurdles and VanHoutte, 200 meter. Also earning seconds were the 800 relay team of Bennington, VanHoutte, Sean McNeal and Todd Smith and the 1600 relay of Eyrich, Sandberg, Zobrist and Ted Leamen.

Bronze medal positions were finished by Jeff Sandy, discus, Reed, high jump, Eastburn, 100 high hurdles, Shawn Alexander, 3200 meter, Bennington, 100 meter and Zobrist, 300 low hurdles.

In the triple jump Don Turner would have finished second and Eric Carlson third had the event been scored.

Frosh-soph harrier team dumps Davenport

Where were Davenport West's frosh-soph cindersmen the day they were to compete in Geneseo against the Leaflets? Geneseo's frosh-soph team took the Tuesday, April 21 meet by walloping Davenport West, 114-13.

The clue to the victory was not which events Geneseo won, which were almost too many to list, but how many Davenport West won. The visiting squad took two firsts for the day, the shot put and the long jump. However, Geneseo also took the long jump event.

John Do and Robertson of Davenport each leaped 16'9" for the tie.

Geneseo recorded all second place finishes except one, the discus and took all third place slots.

In the field events Leaflet Brad Ottis took first in the discus event with a hurl of 103'11" while Do tied for first in the long jump. All three positions were taken by Leaflets in the triple jump and high jump while there was no contest held in the pole vault.

Triple jump results showed Scott Hemm in first with a distance of 35'10 1/4" followed by Dan Allen and Brian Klopp in second and third, respectively. Allen pulled ahead in the high jump to take first at a height of 5'2" followed by Brian Klopp, second and Glenn Klopp, third.

Ottis couldn't quite get the strength needed for a first place finish in the shot but his toss of 36'9 1/4" was good enough to earn

him the silver medal slot. James Walker took third in the event.

Out on the track Geneseo racked up the points. All spectators could see were green and white jerseys crossing the line ahead of the Davenport West young cindersmen.

All track events were taken by the Leaflet team. A combined effort by the 3200 relay team nabbed first with a time of 9:30.12. Members of the relay were Brad Baker, Brian Walsh, Barry Bassier and Joe Holevoet. The 400 relay also captured first. Corey Gradert, Eric Carter, Jim Roberts and Tony Schefsky added their times for first place in 48.49.

The top three slots in the 3200-meter race were taken by Leaflets. Jason VanVooren clocked in at 11:01.49 for first followed by Christian Michaelson, second and John Stone, third. Chad Blunt took the 110 high hurdles in 18.17 for first while Leaflet Jon McAvoy took second.

Do again took a first place ribbon when he competed in the 100 meter. Do took the tape in 12.37 followed by Leaflet Gradert in second and Andy Hahn in third.

All three honors were also taken by Geneseo in the 800 meters. Mike Bell clocked in at 2:25.7 for the gold while James Henderson took second and Rob Nanni finished third.

Geneseo's 800 relay team of Gradert, Carter, Roberts and Schefsky took first in 1:48.2 while the 1600 relay team of Baker, Bell, Michaelson and Chad Harder took first.

Harder finished the 400 in 59.6 and took first while Leaflets Todd Versluis and Scott Hemm tied up second and third, respectively. In the 800 low hurdles, Blunt took first in 44.7. Baker finished just .21 seconds behind him for second while Chris Bush

took third.

Blunt also took first in the 200 meter race. Blunt's time of 24.56 beat Leaflets Eric Carter and Schefsky in second and third.

VanVooren clocked a 5:07.1 in the 1600 meter. Bassier and Walsh scored for Geneseo in the second and third place slots, respectively.
