Geneseo ready to defend NCIC boys track title

It took more than 40 years for the Geneseo boys track team to regain the NCIC title, but the time for savoring the 1988 championship is over.

The Maple Leafs have to defend that hard-earned '88 title this Friday at the DuWayne Dietz track in Sterling. The league gathering is slated to begin at 3 p.m. with preliminaries in the running events in both the varsity and frosh/soph events. Field events then get under way at 5:30 p.m. and the running finals get the gun at 6 p.m.

If the Maple Leafs are going to retain their title, two things are going to have to happen. First, the Leafs are going to have to run at the top of their game, and secondly, they are going to need some help in order to hold off Sterling, which looks like it has everything going for it.

"Sterling has a real strong team and they are certainly the favorites, no question about that," said Geneseo coach Don Fredericks. "We saw them in a dual meet last Tuesday and they beat us 96-50. We didn't have a particularly good meet and they did."

But Fredericks is hoping that his club got some of the momentum back Friday night with the championship of their John McCormick Invitational, a meet in which Sterling did not participate.

"We performed fantastically well Friday night and I think we have a lot of momentum going our direction right now," said the fourth-year coach.

"Can we go head-to-head with them and beat them at the conference meet?

"That's what we'll find out Friday night. We're certainly not afraid of them. We're very excited about the opportunity and chances of doing well this meet. The way I look at it, the pressure is on them. They are expected to win, there is no question about it.

"We can go in relaxed and perform as well as we can. We certainly can't control how well they perform. The only thing we thing can control is how well we perform. We have to concentrate on that and try to get our season and personal bests. If we can do that, then I think we'll be real pleased with the way things turn out."

On paper, it looks as if the Golden Warriors will be about 35-point favorites over Geneseo, while Princeton, Dixon and Ottawa also could

have a hand in figuring in the top five spots in the 12-team field.

According to Fredericks, his team and the hosting Golden Warriors match up fairly well in just about every event.

For the Maple Leafs to get things going their way Friday, some specific things are going to have to happen. The Leafs are going to have to outscore the Golden Warriors in the weights.

That means senior Derek Allen weight sensation Derek Allen is going to have to either win or place very high in both the shot and discus.

Glenn Klopp is going to have his work cut out for him in the pole vault where Sterling and Ottawa both field very strong vaulters.

The Leafs, however, will give up quite a few points in the jumps—long, triple, and high—and that could be a big downfall.

On the track, Fredericks sees his team as very competitive in just about every event. Some of the key people include Ty Jackson, Chad Blunt and Shane McKibbon in the hurdles, Ben

While history may not be on Geneseo's side in the NCIC meet, you can bet the Leafs remember last year when they also were a decided underdog. Another Geneseo surprise might just be in the offing.

STERLING — "Am I disappointed at getting second?" asked Geneseo boys track coach Don Fredericks, who quickly answered himself, "Yes, because I thought we could contend for first. We had our chances, and I don't like to lose when I think we can win."

But it was Sterling which won the NCIC varsity track and field championship on Friday night, May 12. For the Golden Warriors, it was the 25th NCIC crown in DuWayne Dietz's 35 years as head coach.

Taking first in five events, Sterling compiled 123 points to regain the title Geneseo had taken away from it last year. The Leafs took three firsts, and outdistanced Dixon 91-79 for second place.

Sterling was without injured sprinter Tom VanOsdol and two other regulars were out with academic injuries. The Warriors, who are deeper, didn't have a particularly outstanding meet; still, Geneseo would have needed a sensational performance to beat them. The Leafs were solid - but not everything went well.

Leafs run second to Sterling

Early on, Leaf weightman Derek Allen uncorked the best discus throw and shot put effort of his life, and didn't win with either one. It was an omen.

Early in the running finals, a disqualification in the 3,200-meter relay hurt; the Leafs were headed for a fifth-place finish in that event.

Sophomore quarter-miler Mike VanDeVelde, who figured to score heavily in his event, injured his hip,

collapsed, was unable to finish the race and spent a few anxious moments in an ambulance. He was treated and released from Community General Hospital.

A bit later, Leaf low hurdler Tyrone Jackson was headed for an easy victory and a record time when he stumbled over the last hurdle and fell to the track. He got up and still took fourth place. The horse was out of the barn by then - but the scenario seemed to sum up the kind of evening the Leafs had.

Individually, several Leafs had super nights. Sophomore Adam Boardman was one, winning varsity championships in the 800 (1:58.33) and 1,600-meter runs (4:32.28).

Jackson was another, winning the 110-meter highs in 15.17, then making an unforgettable run in the intermediates before his fall at the end.

Allen was yet another. His discus throw, 165'9", was a Geneseo school record, but a throw of 173'3" - second best in NCIC history - beat it. His shot put of 51'7 1/2" was his personal best. It took third.

Sprinter Ben Mayes had a big meet, too. He was second to Sterling's legendary Donnie Dittmar in the 100 (11.25) and 200-meter dashes, (22.90) and anchored Geneseo to second in the 400 relay.

Then there was Brad Baker, taking second in the 3,200 in 9:55.10.

Boardman was that rarest of things - a varsity double-winner as a sophomore. His time of 1:58.33 in the 800 was his personal best, and it was needed - he was in a race. Boardman used a burst of speed down the stretch to outrun two opponents who had led him into the final turn.

"If I hadn't gone for it, I could have gotten third," Boardman said. "I saw an opening, and blasted by 'em. It felt good."

Fredericks said Allen, "is a little disappointed, but you can't control what the other athletes do. He had a tremendous final throw in the shot, to move him from fifth up to third.

"Tyrone ... what a meet. He was incredibly strong all the way through," Fredericks continued. "In the 300, he had the race won, and he looked up at the clock for an instant to see if he could be under 40 seconds. He had a 39 going. He was on his nose for at least two seconds, but he showed a lot of character to get up and take fourth."

Jackson's time in the intermediates, including the time spent on his nose, was 42.27. "Oh my god," Jackson said, as he got off the ground and crossed the finish line. But, he quickly tried to forget it.

"He could have eased off over that last hurdle," sprint coach Vic Boblett said. "But that's not the way he is. He wanted to attack. He's thinking about the sectional next week."

Earlier, Jackson had just enough left at the end to edge Eddie Rodriguez of Rochelle in the highs. His time of 15.17 was his personal best. Jackson seemed to have more kick at the end than even last week. "It's being a senior," Jackson said.


Sophs take second

Geneseo's frosh-soph team placed second to Ottawa. The Corsairs outdistanced the Leaflets 106-81 for the team title.

Geneseo got individual championships from Matt Jacocks in

the long jump (19'7") and from Bryan Glass in the 1,600-meter run (4:43.28).

The Leaflets took second in the 800 and 3,200-meter relays, and a third in the 1,600 relay.

Boardman wins two but Sterling dethrones Leafs

Paced by double winner Adam Boardman, Geneseo's varsity boys track team placed second behind Sterling in the North Central Illinois Conference boys track meet held Friday, May 12 in Sterling.

"Our guys gave everything they had and that's all you can ask for as a coach. It was just Sterling's year," said

Coach Don Fredericks.

The Golden Warriors totalled 123 points while second place Leafs had 91. Dixon was third with 79 followed by Princeton with 59, Mendota 54, Ottawa 42, Rochelle 32, LaSalle-Peru 30, Kewanee 29, Rock Falls 12, Streator 2 and Hall 0.

The title was the last for Sterling Coach DeWayne Dietz, who will retire at the end of the school year.

"He has been a credit to his school and to the conference. If we couldn't win it, it was good to see him win it and go out in style," said Coach Fredericks.

Sophomore distance ace Boardman led the Leafs with wins in the 800 and 1600 meter runs. He was clocked at a speedy 1:58.4 in the 800 and 4:32.9 in the 1600.

"Boardman did an outstanding job for us. That 800 time was just outstanding against some quality competition," said Coach Fredericks.

Tyrone Jackson was the other first place finisher for the Leafs as he was clocked at 15.17 seconds in the 110 high hurdles. He was on his way to a possible second win but clipped the last hurdle in the 300 intermediate hurdles and wound up fourth.

Junior sprinter Ben Mayes had a strong meet for the Leafs as he finished second in the 100 and 200 meter dashes and ran the anchor leg of the second place 400 meter relay team. Sterling speedster Donnie Dittmar won both of the short dashes.

Brad Baker, Derek Allen and the 400 relay téam also recorded second place finishes in the meet.

Baker was clocked at 9:55.1 in the 3200 while Allen tossed the discus 165'9". Members of the 400 team clocked at 44.25 seconds were Chad Loucks, Ryan Verbeck, Chad Blunt and Mayes.

Allen nabbed the only third place finish for the Leafs as he tossed the shot 55'7 1/2".

"We can be proud of the way we

defended the title we won last year. Sterling had to win it from us and with the people we have returning next year, we'll be back," concluded Coach Fredericks.
