#### Leafs thrash UT and Orion; Klopp shines in pole vault

Senior Glenn Klopp vaulted 13'6" in the pole vault to highlight Geneseo wins over UT (89 1/2-84 1/2) and Orion (89 1/2-3) Tuesday, March 27 at the Soule Bowl in East Moline.

The height which Klopp cleared is the qualifying standard for the state meet, much to the delight of Coach Don Fredericks.

"It was just an outstanding effort on his part. It is very exciting to have him vaulting so well this early," he noted.

Ben Mayes and Adam Boardman paced the Leafs with three wins each, including one relay.

Mayes captured the 100 (11.3 seconds) and 200 meter dashes (23.3) and teamed with Chad Loucks, Shane McKibbon and Chad Blunt to win the 400 meter relay (45.6).

Boardman took first in the 800 (2:06.3) and 1600 meter runs (4:35.1) and teamed with Darin Lavery, Justin VanVooren and Mike VanDeVelde to win the 1600 meter relay in 3:40.7.

Also grabbing firsts for Geneseo were Bryan Glass in the 3200 (10:04.9), VanDeVelde in the 400 (51.9) and the 3200 meter relay team of Justin VanOpdorp, Brian Walsh, Jason VanVooren and Justin VanVooren.

Second place finishers for the Leafs were Neil Simon in the discus, Klopp in the high jump, Mark Chaney in the pole vault, Justin VanVooren in the 800, Lavery in the 400, McKibbon in the 300 intermediate hurdles and VanOpdorp in the 1600.

Nabbing thirds for Geneseo were Jon McAvoy in the shot, Travis Stroh in the 3200, McKibbon in the 110 high hurdles, Loucks in the 100, Walsh in the 800, Blunt in the 300 intermediate hurdles and Kevin Fuhr in the 200.

"This was still a developmental meet for us but it was a very good way to start the outdoor schedule," said Coach Don Fredericks.

The Geneseo sophomore tracksters were also successful in the meet as they gained 124-51-10 wins over UT and Orion, respectively.

The Leaflets, paced by Ben Hahn and David Farmer, won 15 of the 18 events contested.

Hahn captured first in the 100 (12.2), 200 (25.2) and 400 meter dashes (56.2) and teamed with Farmer, Jeremy Mier and Dave Roetz to win the 400 meter relay in 47.9 seconds.

Farmer's individual wins came in the 110 high hurdles (17.6 seconds), 300 intermediate hurdles (44.4) and triple jump (37'1").

Josh Pierce, Jeremy Holke and Mier were also multiple winners for the Leaflets.

Pierce claimed wins in the 800 (2:12.5) and 1600 meter runs (5:02.1). Holke placed first in the high jump (5'6") and teamed with Nate Culbertson, Andy Porter and Mier to win the 1600 meter relay.

Also claiming wins for Geneseo were Andy Snook in the 3200 (10:34.7), Steve Pardoe in the pole vault (9'6"), Garrin Woelke in the discus (104'4 1/2") and the 3200 meter relay team of Jason Gibson, Mitch Pray, Karl Taets and Matt Lotz.

Placing second for Geneseo were Scott Durian in the 3200, Holke in the 400, Derek Wright in the 300 intermediate hurdles, Snook in the 1600, Culbertson in the shot and discus, Adam Stokes in the pole vault and the 800 relay team of Roetz, Randy Carton, Chuck Webber and Nick Sable.

Third place finishers for the Leaflets were Mier in the 110 high hurdles, Matt Jacocks in the 100, Gibson in the 400, Pray in the 1600, Landon Neumann in the 200, Jim VanAcker in the shot, Carton in the pole vault, Pierce in the high jump and Wright in the triple jump.

The Geneseo tracksters will have their first home meet of the season Tuesday, April 3 when they host Sherrard and Princeton. Meet time is 4:15 p.m.

Geneseo's frosh-soph was also victorious with 124 1/2 points. UT took second with 46 1/2 and Orion third with 13.


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
