Boardman, Leafs finish third at Rocky

Adam Boardman placed first in the 800 and 1600 meter runs to help the Geneseo varsity boys track team to a third place finish in the Rock Island Invitational held Friday, April 19 in Rock Island.

The host Rocks won the 16-team meet with a total of 239 points. Rockford Guilford, which features several sprinters who transferred from the former Rockford West high school, placed second with 194-1/2 while the Leafs were third with 172. UT (133) and Peoria Richwoods (122) rounded out the top five.

The format for this meet was different from the one used in other meets. Each team had three entrants (A, B and C) in each event, with the exception of the relays. The top performer was designated as the A entrant and competed against other A entrants, B athletes competed against B athletes and C entrants squared off against C entrants.

Boardman, competing in the A 800 and 1600 races, turned in winning times of 1:58.7 and 4:27.2, respectively. He was the lone Leaf A athlete to earn first place in an event.

Two Leafs, Mike VanDeVelde and Shane McKibbon, earned runner-up places in A events with season-best times. VanDeVelde turned in a time of 50.7 seconds in the 400 while McKibbon was clocked at a swift 40.8 seconds in the 300 meter intermediate hurdles.

each placed first in B events. Snook was clocked at 9:56.3 in the 3200, Pierce turned in a time of 2:04.1 in the 800 and Glass captured the 1600 with a time of 4:37.4.

Ben Hahn garnered the lone second place finish in a B event, the 400 meter dash while David Farmer was third in the B 300 meter intermediate hurdles.

Brady Rasmussen set a new freshman record as he finished first in the C pole vault. His winning height of 12'0" topped his own record by a whopping six inches.

Second place C finishers for Geneseo were Karl Taets in the 3200, Eric Newton in the 300 meter intermediate hurdles and Pierce in the 1600.

Finishing third in C events was Jeremy Holke in the 400.

On Tuesday, April 23 the Leafs visited Moline for a dual meet against the Maroons and gained an 80-65 victory.

McKibbon was the lone individual to win two events for the Leafs. He was clocked at 15.7 seconds in the 110 meter high hurdles and 42.06 seconds in the 300 meter intermediate hurdles.

Gaining single wins for the Leafs were Andy Porter in the shot put (44'6-1/2"), Nate Culbertson in the discus (129'10"), Holke in the high jump (5'8"), Rasmussen in the pole vault (12'0"), Snook in the 3200 (10:08.2), Boardman in the 800 (2:04.6), Glass in the 1600 (4:45.4) and VanDeVelde in the 200 (23.14).

Also finishing first was the 3200 relay team of Pierce, Glass, Justin VanVooren and Boardman clocked at 9:09.7).

Nabbing seconds for the Leafs were Shawn Wehrspann in the high jump, Allen DeSplinter in the pole vault, Farmer in the 110 meter high hurdles and 300 meter intermediate hurdles, Verbeck in the 100 and VanDeVelde in the 400.

Finishing third were Culbertson in the shot, Pierce and DeSplinter in the high jump, Tom Britton in the long jump, Wehrspann in the long jump, Taets in the 3200, Pierce in the 1600 and Hahn in the 200.

The frosh-seph tracksters, behind a trio of first place efforts from Derek Wright, were victorious in their meet against Moline by a 76-68 score.

Wright captured first place in the triple jump (38'0"), 110 meter high hurdles (18.6 seconds) and 300 meter intermediate hurdles (48.1 seconds).

Landon Neumann captured both short sprint events for the Leaflets. He was clocked at 12.0 seconds in the 100 and 24.73 in the 200.

Single event winners for Geneseo were Todd Gilbert in the high jump (5'4"), Steve Pardoe in the pole vault (10'6") and Eric Misfeldt in the 800 (2:18.8).

Relay wins came from the 400 team of Newton, Gilbert, Neumann and Zach Mayes (no time available) and the 800 team of Neumann, Kris Rusch, Mayes and Gilbert (1:45.76).

Finishing second for the Leaflets were Heath DeGoei in the discus, Nate Durick in the triple jump, Scott Durian in the 3200, Bradley Johnson in the 110 meter high hurdles and 300 meter intermediate hurdles and Ryan Sheddan in the 100 and 200.

Thirds were earned by Kevin Wachtel in the shot put, Adam Radicic in the 3200, Ryan Egert in the 100 and Rusch in the 200.

On Monday, April 22 Geneseo's freshman boys track team placed fourth in its own invitational.

Teams and scores in the meet were Rock Island (113), Bettendorf (100), Sterling (95), Geneseo (83), UT (52), Clinton (49), Moline (18), Alleman (15), Galesburg (14) and LaSalle-Peru (11).

Newton captured first place in the 300 meter intermediate hurdles and set a new meet record in the process with a time of 42.61 seconds.

The other first place finish for the Leafrosh came from Rasmussen, who cleared 11' in the pole vault.

Gaining seconds for Geneseo were Durick in the triple jump and Newton in the 110 meter high hurdles.

Placing third were Chad Pankey in the 3200 and the 400 meter relay team of Shoemaker, Phil Smith, Matt VanDe Voorde and Newton.

In a non-scoring event, the Geneseo 400 meter weightman relay team of Erron Halen, Wachtel, Todd Capps and Andy Verbeck placed third.

The Geneseo varsity team is scheduled to compete in the Sterling Invitational on Friday, April 26 before squaring off against the Golden Warriors in a key dual meet Tuesday, April 30 in Sterling.

Leafs successful against big school competition at meet

ROCK ISLAND - Geneseo track coach Don Fredericks was more than pleased with his team's performance at the Eighth annual Rock Island Invitational, especially considering the weather conditions and the caliber of competition.

The Leafs took third in the 15-team meet with 172 points. Rock Island took the championship hardware with 239 points followed by Rockford Guilford with 194 1/2. United Township placed fourth with 133 followed by Peoria Richwoods (122), Rockford East (118 1/2), Rockford Auburn (98), Lockport (96), Galesburg (79), Homewood-Flossmoor (76), Moline (69), Metamora (46),

Aurora East (24), Alleman (15) and Rockridge (0).

Adam Boardman was a double winner for the Leafs in the A division, winning the 800 with a time of 1:58.7 and the 1600 in 4:27.2. Bryan Glass won the B division 1600 (4:37.9) while Josh Pierce won the B division 800 (2:04.1). Glass also took third in the A division 3200 with a time of 9:46.8.

Other Geneseo cindermen to place in the A division competition included Seth Graham with a sixth in the discus (117'4"), Shane McKibbon with a second in the 300 low hurdles (40.8) and third in the 110 highs (15.2), Mike VanDeVelde with a second in the 400 (50.7) and fifth in the 200 (23.5).

The 400 relay team of Chris Widowski, Ryan Verbeck, Ben Hahn and VanDeVelde took sixth (44.7) while the 800 foursome of Widowski, Shawn Wehrspann, Nick Sable and Verbeck placed fourth with a 1:35.2. The 1600 squad of Sable, Darin Lavery, McKibbon and David Farmer place sixth with 3:40.4.

Placing in the B division was Andy Snook with a first in the 3200 (9:56.3) and Ben Hahn in the 400 (52.4). Brady Rasmussen set a new meet record in the C division pole vault and placed first with a mark of 12'0".

Despite the appearance of worldclass runner Craig Virgin at Friday night's Rock Island Boys Track Invitational, the efforts turned in on a cold night were less than comparable to the bests Virgin clocked in his

Illinois high school prime.

But the efforts put forth by the champion Rock Island Rocks (239 points) and third-place Geneseo Maple Leafs (172) were pleasant sights to those teams' respective coaches. Coach Jim Wesselmann's United Township club also received some great outings en route to 133 points and a fourth-place finish in the 16-team field.

Moline and Alleman, still struggling with injuries and illness, finished 11th (69 points) and 14th (15), respectively, with what their coaches called "frustrating and dis-

appointing efforts."

"It was just a lot of balance for us," said first-year Rock Island coach Ed Lillis of his mostly peachfuzzed club. "With our youth, the biggest advantage is enthusiasm. Because of the youth they are a little infamiliar with what good is. They are finding out that in big meets like this they can compete with a lat of people and they are surprising temselves."

Said Geneseo coach Don Fredericks, "We'19 just ecstatic. To finish behind teans as strong as Rock Island and (Rockford) Guilford, we're thrilled to get hird."

The Rocks have turned in some impressive efforts so far this season. Friday night relatively speaking, was no different... except the youthful Rocks also showed they

had depth.

After nearly 300 medals had been awarded, the defending champion Rocks had hammered home the point that youth shall be served. With a mostly underclass team, the Rocks scored in all but three events — that's putting up points in 43 of the 46 divisions as the individual events were broken down into three classes.

"It says a lot for the kids that they have that kind of stick-to-it-iveness," said an elated Lillis, whose kids nickled-and-dimed their way to a lot of points. "That's just something you have to admire. They go as hard as they can and if it turns out to be a third- or fourth-place finish, it's not a blow to their ego or their pride."

The Rocks only won one relay and six individual events, none in Class A where the top seeded athletes , were pitted.

The 800 relay unit of freshmen Aaron Taylor and Tito Veasey, junior Victor Jones and senior Terence Parks clocked a 1:32.5 to nip Guilford, which, with 194½ points, also finished second in the team race.

Sophomore Brent Fisher led the Rocks' individual winners with a

pair of wins up on the hill. He won with two personal bests — a 46-11 in the Class B shot put and a 146-2 in the Class B discus.

Also adding individual wins to help the Rocks were DaShawn Guy (11.6) in the Class C 100; freshman Adrian Dunbar (16.0) in the 110 high hurdles; sophomore Greg Whitcomb (4:40.8) in the Class C 1600; and Veasey again with a 23.2 in the Class C 200.

Senior Adam Boardman was the big stud for the Maple Leafs as he won two Class A individual events — the 800 and 1600. While his times, like most of those on a night when only three records were set, were relatively slow, but he looked good in winning both.

He clocked a 1:58.7 in the 800 and came back four events later to stop

the clock in 4:27.2.

"His double was tremendous," said Fredericks. "I thought our hurdlers did a tremendous job and scored some major points for us, as did our distance runners.".

The milers had the best efforts across the board as they picked up two firsts and a second. After Boardman's win in the Class A run, Bryan Glass won the Class B race with a 4:37.9 and Josh Pierce was second in the Class C run with a 4:42.3 clocking.

In the 3200, Glass was third in Class A (9:46.8), Andy Snook won Class B (9:56.3), and Karl Taets (10:22.5) was second in Class C.

"Last year we finished second here and used that as a springboard to a great finish," said Fredericks, who last year watched his club close strong and win the NCIC crown and have a good sectional meet. "We hope the same thing happens this year."

The night started out ominously for UT's Wesselmann, who watched star Ken Wyatt drop out when his sore hamstrings couldn't loosen ap in the cold weather. But after that, things went well for the Panthers.

"We've had a great night so far," said Wesselmann just before the final events were completed. "Maceo Strickland was great with wo first and anchoring two relays that placed. He's really turning into a fine runner."

Strickland was impressive in winning a tough Class A 100 in 11.3 and the Class A 200 in 23.3. The 800 relay finished third and the 400 relay was fourth.

United Township also picked up big points in the field events. Dameon Dunbar won the Class A shot put (52-1¼); Souk Kongkousonh won the Class A pole vault (13-0); Josh Crisp set a meet record in the Class C long jump (20-8½); and Dave Stone set a Class C record with a 39-10 best in the triple jump.
