Just like home

Leafs win McCormick meet in Sterling

DuWayne Dietz Field in Sterling proved to be a favorable site for the Geneseo varsity boys track team as the Leafs claimed top team honors in the annual John McCormick Invitational held Friday, May 8.

The meet, normally held in Geneseo, was moved to Sterling due to work being done on the track at J.D. Darnall high school. Work on the track was completed on Wednesday, May 6 but it was too late to change arrangements.

The change in sites had little effect on the Leaf tracksters, something which pleased Coach Don Fredericks.

"We had a number of kids who had personal bests and it is hard to ask for more than that. The hard work they have put in is starting to show. This was a big step forward for us," he said.

Teams and scores in the meet were Geneseo (115), Metamora (96), Ottawa (83), Dixon (72), Kewanee (51), Galesburg (47), Rock Falls (37), Princeton (36), Sherrard (7), Alleman (6), LaSalle-Peru (5) and Rochelle (3).

Ben Hahn had a huge meet for the Leafs, winning two individual events and anchoring one first place relay team. His time of 11.01 seconds in the 100 was a personal best, as was the 50.10 second clocking in the 400. Hahn's 400 time is behind only Mike VanDe Velde's 1991 time of 49.2 seconds in J.D. Darnall high school history.

"Ben had a monster meet for us. He has been improving all season and something like this was bound to happen eventually. He is peaking at the perfect time of the season," said Coach Fredericks.

In addition to Hahn's first place finishes, winning efforts were turned in by the 400 relay team of Derek Wright, Jon Smith, Nick Sable and Hahn (44.12 seconds) and the 800 relay team of Smith, Eric Newton, Jeremy Holke and Sable (1:32.80).

Also earning first place was the

weightman's relay team of Ryan Sheddan, Andy Porter, Seth Graham and Nate Culbertson, which was clocked at 49.15 seconds. This was a non-scoring event.

Second place finishers for the Leafs were Tom Britton in the triple jump; Andy Snook in the 1600 and 3200; Hahn in the 200 and Newton in the 110 meter high hurdles.

Britton's effort of 43'1/2" in the triple jump was fourth in school history and his personal best by over 10 inches. Snook's time of 9:36.1 was third in school history and chopped five full seconds off his pervious best. He finished second to Metamora distance ace John Weigle in both distance events.

Third place finishers for the Leafs were Jim Van Acker in the shot put and Newton in the 300 meter intermediate hirdles. Van Acker's heave of 49' in the shot put was a personal best.

Also achieving personal bests, but not cracking the top three in their events, were Britton in the high jump (5'10"), David Farmer in the 110 meter high hurdles (15.8 seconds) and 400 (53.1 seconds) and Eric Misfeldt in the 1600 (4:39.97).

The Geneseo freshman boys team competed in the Sterling Frosh Invitational held Monday, May 11 and placed second in the six-team meet. Teams and scores were Sterling (88), Geneseo (79), Princeton (50), Dixon (28), Kewanee (20) and Rochelle (14).

Jeff Causemaker led the Leafrosh with a pair of wins, capturing the triple jump (37'7-1/4") and 110 meter high hurdles (10.11 seconds).

Single event winners were Josh Inch in the 3200 (10:54.2) and Jeremiah Waggoner in the 1600 (5:18.8).

Also placing first was the 1600 relay team of Troy Boelens, Eric Durian, Mike Poppen and Dan Flood (3:57.68).

Second place finishers for Geneseo included Poppen in the shot put and discus and Boelens in the high jump, long jump and triple jump.

Finishing third were Andy Nissen in the pole vault; Shane Hudnall in the 100 and 200; Eric Durian in the 800; Flood in the 400 and the 400 relay team of Nissen, Steve Jerbi, Flood and Hudnall,


