Hosting Leafs roast field in N.C.I.C. meet

A home meet is something the Geneseo varsity boys track team hadn't had all season. The first, and only one, however, was something to remember as the Leafs shocked the field and claimed the team title in the North Central Illinois Conference (N.C.I.C.) meet held Friday, May 15 at J.D. Darnall high school.

"There must be some magic in the new track," beamed coach Don Fredericks, whose teams have now won the N.C.I.C. title three consecutive years and four of the last five.

The shocking part of the evening is that the Leafs trounced Sterling, a team which registered a 92-54 dual meet win between the two teams on Tuesday, May 5. Coach Fredericks conceded the Warriors were favorites coming into the meet. Going by the seeds, they were supposed to win by 44 points.

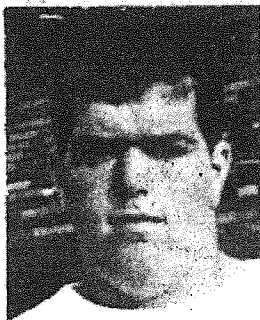
"It was just a great night for Geneseo track. We had so many kids come through in a big way it was unbelievable," stated Coach Fredericks.

The Leafs received a huge contribution from their field event athletes to amass 124-1/2 points to easily outdistance second place Sterling, which totalled 105. They were followed by Dixon (81), Ottawa (71), Kewanee (55), Rock Falls (49), Hall (30), Mendota (23), LaSalle-Peru (11), Princeton (10-1/2), Rochelle (2) and Streator (0).

The Leafs received three first place finishes, the most surprising of which was from Jim Van Acker in the shot put. He was unseeded entering the competition but unleashed a personal best heave of 50'5" to win it all, giving the Leafs 10 unexpected points.

"Jim shocked the field by winning the shot put. In fact, the field events were the key to winning for us. Sterling was supposed to have a 50-

point advantage on us but we ended up out-scoring them 38-32," noted Coach Fredericks.

The second individual winner for the Leafs was junior sprinter Ben Hahn, who captured the 400 with a time of 51.70 seconds. He also earned second and third place finishes in the 100 and 200, respectively, and anchored the winning 400 relay team.

"Ben had his usual fantastic night for us. He has just been outstanding the last month," said Coach Fredericks.

The third first place finisher for the Leafs was the 400 relay team of Derek Wright, Jon Smith, Nick Sable and Hahn, which turned in a season best time of 43.76.

"This was a good upset for the kids. Sterling had beaten us every time this season but we got them this time. Their time put them in the all-time top ten in school history, which is quite an accomplishment when you consider the type of athletes we've had here," said Coach Fredericks.

Tom Britton had a big meet for the Leafs, nabbing second place finishes in the long jump and triple jump. Following two scratches in the long jump, he uncorked a 20'10" effort, behind only Dixon junior Eric Collier, who placed first in the long jump, triple jump and 300 meter intermediate hurdles.

Also nabbing second place finishes

for the Leafs were a cold-weakened Andy Snook in the 3200; Hahn in the 100; Josh Pierce in the 800; Eric Misfeldt in the 1600 and the 800 relay team of Smith, Eric Newton, Jeremy Holke and Sable.

Finishing third in the meet were Newton in the 110 meter high hurdles; Snook in the 1600 and Hahn in the 200.

While the Geneseo varsity team was outstanding in the conference meet, equally impressive was the Geneseo frosh-soph squad, which captured its second consecutive league title. Prior to last season, no conference team had won varsity and frosh-soph crowns in the same year and Geneseo has now done it twice in a row.

"This was just a tremendous meet for the younger people in our program. We were seeded behind Sterling and Dixon coming into the meet and to win it by the margin we did tells a lot about the kids we have," smiled Coach Fredericks.

The Leaflets amassed 148 points in the meet, 43 more than second place Dixon. They were followed by Sterling (87), Kewanee (54), Princeton (50), Rochelle (33), LaSalle-Peru (30), Ottawa (28), Mendota (12), Rock Falls (6) and Hall and Streator (2 each).

Brad Johnson had a big meet for Geneseo, nabbing three individual wins. They were in the long jump (19'5"), 110 meter high hurdles (16.56 seconds) and 300 meter intermediate hurdles (43.06 seconds).

Earning single wins for the Leaflets were Nate Durick in the triple jump (41'3") and Andy Snyder in the 3200 (10:27.5).

Second place finishers for Geneseo included Jason Causemaker in the triple jump and 110 meter high hurdles; Jeremiah Shoemaker in the long jump; Ryan Carter in the 3200; Snyder in the 1600 and the 3200 relay team of Chad Sellman, Nathan Andon, Jeremiah Waggoner and Josh Inch.

Finishing third were Troy Boelens in the high jump; Shoemaker in the 100; Dan Flood in the 400 and the 1600 team of Matt Wilson, Mike Poppen, Phil Smith and Flood.



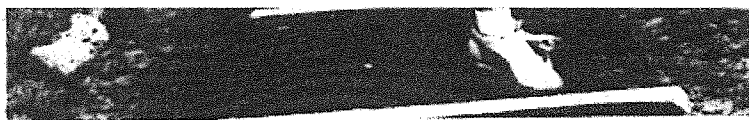

On Friday, May 22 the Leafs will compete in the Rock Island sectional meet at Rock Island Public Stadium. Preliminaries will begin at 3 p.m. with the finals slated for 6:30 p.m.

First and second place finishers in each event, as well as those that equal or better Class AA qualifying standards, will move on to the state meet next weekend in Charleston.

The Leafs will be facing a strong field in Rock Island, including the Quad City schools, fellow Western Big Six teams Galesburg and Quincy and conference rival Sterling.

"Our sectional is loaded and I feel it is among the best in the state. Would we rather be in another sectional? No way. I say bring it on. Our kids relish the role of being giant killers," noted a confident Coach Fredericks.

The sectional is so strong that just one Leaf, Hahn in the 400, was expected to be seeded to advance to Charleston.

Seedings, however, are not always the best indicator of what will happen in a meet, evidenced by the results in the conference meet. Coach Fredericks will be looking to take more than one of his athletes to the campus of Eastern Illinois University in Charleston next weekend.

"If the kids step up like they did in the conference meet, it is a safe bet we will have more than one state qualifier," stated Coach Fredericks.
