Leafs settle for third behind Kewanee, Sterling

Geneseo competed in the N.C.I.C. Boys Conference track meet Friday, May 13 at Kewanee. The varsity squad placed third with 91 points, four short of second place Kewanee at 95. Sterling won with 143 points.

The 3200 meter relay team of Eric Misfeldt, Josh Inch, Jeremy Michels and Eric Anderson won in 8:12.66.

The 400 meter relay team of Matt Wilson, Jeff Causemaker, Brian Krantz and Jeff Michels placed third in 44.57 seconds.

Causemaker placed second in the 110 meter high hurdles in 15.59 seconds. Jeff Michels finished fifth in the 100 meter dash in 11.72 seconds. Andy Snyder won the 3200 meter run in 9:58.67.

Misfeldt won the 800 meter run in 2:01.92. Anderson placed third in the 400 meter dash in 51.33 seconds and Jeff Michels was fifth in 53.39 seconds.

The 800 meter relay team of Wilson, Troy Boelens, Krantz and Nate Durick finished fourth in 1:35.61.

Causemaker placed second in the 300 meter intermediate hurdles in 41.25 seconds. Jeff Michels was second in the 200 meter dash in 23.32 seconds.

Inch placed sixth in the 1600 meter run in 4:44.97. The 1600 meter relay team of Causemaker, Jeremy Michels, Misfeldt and Anderson was fifth in 3:32.62.

Boelens was fifth in the long jump, leaping 20'2-3/4". Brady Rasmussen cleared 12'6" for fifth place in the pole vault.

Boelens was fifth in the high jump, clearing 6' even. Durick was fourth in the triple jump with a 41'9-1/2" mark. Mike Poppen was fourth in the shot put with a 49'1" toss.

The frosh-soph team took sixth place with 49 points. Dixon won with 119 points.

The 3200 meter relay team of Chris Farmer, Jeremy Brown, Doug Patchin and Adam Forest placed third in 9:02.41.

The 400 meter relay team of Steve Schaaf, Ben Forest, Matt Salinas and Troy Collins finished fourth in 47.52 seconds.

Jon Esche was second in the 110 meter high hurdles in 17.16 seconds and Andy Esche was fourth in 19.08 seconds. Farmer was third in the 800 meter run in 2:10.12.

The 800 meter relay team of Jon Esche, Schaaf, Ben Forest and Salinas was fifth in 1:43.61. Jon Esche was second in the 300 meter intermediate hurdles in 44.70 seconds.

The 1600 meter relay team of Farmer, Justin Buechler, Ben Forest and Patchin placed sixth in 3:57.97.

Schaaf placed fifth in the long jump with an 18'4-1/2" mark. Collins was fourth in the triple jump, landing at 37'9".

The frosh-soph squad went to the Molise Frosh-Soph Invitational Tuesday, May 17. Geneseo finished seventh with 29 points. United Township won with 125 points.

Schaaf placed fifth in the long jump with a leap of 17'9". Alan Sikarskie was third in the discus with a toss of 104'9".

The 3200 meter relay team of Farmer, Brown, Patchin and Adam Forest finished fifth in 9:15.98.

The 400 meter relay team of Schaaf, Ben Forest, Collins and Salinas was fifth in 48.41 seconds.

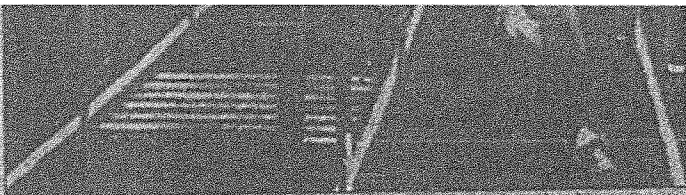
In the 110 meter high hurdles, Jon Esche was fourth in 17.16 seconds. Collins was fifth in the triple jump at 36'5-1/2".

Leaf netters third

Varsity and Frosh-Soph both nab third at N.C.I.C.

Maple Leaf tennis teams competed in the N.C.I.C. tennis championships Monday, May 16 in Sterling. The varsity and frosh-soph teams both placed third.

The varsity team finished with 24 points, one point behind second place Sterling. Ottawa won the meet with 36 points.

Keegan Roth placed second in the number one singles. He defeated his first round Mendota opponent easily, 6-0, 6-0 and breezed in the semi-finals against Sterling, 6-0, 6-1. In the finals, he fell to an Ottawa opponent, 0-6, 5-7.

At number two singles, Erik Peterson placed second. Peterson defeated a Princeton player in the first round, 6-0, 6-1 and a Dixon netter in the semis, 7-5, 2-6, 7-5. In the finals, he also fell to an Ottawa opponent, losing 0-6, 0-6.

In number one doubles competition, Sam Marshall and Jon Kiser placed seventh. They lost their first match to LaSalle-Peru, 3-6, 4-6 and won 10-6 over Princeton in the first round consolation.

In the semis, they fell to Mendota, 5-10, but came back to win the seventh place match over Sterling, 11-10 (6).

Dennis Meade and Kurt Hutchinson, the number two doubles team, placed fifth. They fell in opening round action but came back to win three straight to grab fifth.

The number one doubles team of Jason Andrew and Tony Hutchinson placed seventh. They fell to Ottawa in the first round, 1-6, 2-6 and LaSalle-Peru in the semis, 3-10 before winning the seventh place match over Rochelle, 11-10 (5).

Chris Sellman and Pat Turpin, the number two doubles team, finished in third place. They defeated a Mendota duo in the opening round, 6-1, 6-2 and then lost to Dixon in the semis, 1-6, 4-6. They defeated a LaSalle-Peru team for third place, 6-0, 6-1.

Roth was seeded fourth in singles and will meet a Rock Island opponent in the second round. Peterson was unseeded and will meet a Sterling Newman player in the only first round match.

In doubles, neither Geneseo team was seeded. Clark and Meade will meet Moline opponents while Kiser and Marshall will face another duo from Moline.
