Hosting two

Leaflets shine on home oval April 17 and 22

Geneseo hosted a junior varsity invitational on the J. D. Darnall High School oval Tuesday, April 22. In close competition, Moline placed first with 149 points while Rock Island finished in second with 148. The Leaflets earned third with 102 points followed by United Township, East Moline, with 80 points and Galesburg with 57.

Just two firsts were earned by Leaflets competitors. Corbin Shipp took the discus event with a 129'4" effort while Andy Beuster took the 1600-meter run with a time of 4:51.97. Leaflets Tyler Marc and Jared VanAcker competed in the discus as well. Marc took fourth in the event with a 119'8" distance while VanAcker was fifth at 114'3".

A total of four second-place finishes were recorded in Geneseo's behalf including a silver by the 3200-meter relay. Dave Bopp, Dave Whisker, Joel Madsen and Beuster teamed for a time of 9:01.35; 8:50.04 was the winning time.

Bobby Ristau earned a silver in the 3200 run with a time of 11:11.11 behind the winning time of 11:08.58. Leaflet Tim Nelson took the 1600 in 11:27.59 for fifth.

Whisker, Jared Anderson and Bjorn Myhre all placed for Geneseo in the 800 run. The winning time was 2:10.70 with Whisker's time of 2:11.53 earning second, Anderson, third, 2:11.93 and Myhre, fifth.

win. However, Geneseo took the next three slots to overtake the score. Andy Henry took second with an 8' effort. Mike Heitzler and Mike Windy tied for third with a 7' effort.

Dave Bopp, Jared Anderson, Matt McGaugh and Joel Madsen combined talents in the 3200-meter relay to take the tape in 10:13.38. Ofslager, Venema, White and Marquis kicked out a 49.58 to win the 400 relay.

Ofslager teamed with Aaron Anderson, White and Marquis to win the 800 relay in 1:41.84 while Curnyn, Brendan O'Rourke, Bopp and Venema took the 1600 relay in 4:01.02.

A number of the Leaflets recorded more than one win. Beuster took the 3200 in 10:34.08 and the 1600 run in 5:07.31 for the gold. In the 3200, Tim Nelson and Jon Lake took second and third, respectively, with times of 11:48.99 and 12:45.05. Beuster was joined in the 1600 by Madsen, second, 5:17.59; Will McCombs, third, 5:21.46 and McGaugh, fourth, 5:26.27.

Neil Russell cleared the 110-high hurdles in 18.37 for a win and the high jump at 5'8" for another. Parrish was second in the hurdles with a time of 18.73 and Hazelett took third in 18.84. Hazelett joined Russell in the high jump as well, earning second with a 5'4" jump. He was followed by Aaron Anderson, 5' and Parrish, also at 5'.

Marquis was another double winner for Geneseo, taking the 100 and 200 dashes. Marquis clocked an 11.95 in the 100 followed by teammate Ofslager in third, 12.47 and Venema, fourth, 12.89. In the 200

Bobby Ristau earned a silver in the 3200 run with a time of 11:11.11 behind the winning time of 11:08.58. Leaflet Tim Nelson took the 1600 in 11:27.59 for fifth.

Whisker, Jared Anderson and Bjorn Myhre all placed for Geneseo in the 800 run. The winning time was 2:10.70 with Whisker's time of 2:11.53 earning second, Anderson, third, 2:11.93 and Myhre, fifth, 2:13.93.

The other silver earned for Geneseo came from Jason Marquis in the 400 with a time of 54.76; 54.33 won the event.

Other third places for Geneseo were recorded by Aaron Anderson and Corey Parrish. Parrish took the 300 intermediate hurdles in 46.83 (42.20 won the event) while Anderson cleared 5'2" in the high jump (6'2" took the event). J. J. Hazlett also cleared 5'2" in the high jump for a fourth place finish.

Ty Noard was fourth in the shot put with a distance of 38'2" while the 800 relay team of Grant Venema, Bill Curnyn, Shannon White and Ryan Scherer took fourth with a time of 1:41.66.

Rounding out the scoring for Geneseo was the 400-meter relay team of Bart Reed, George Ofslager, White and Marquis which clocked a 47.82.

On Thursday, April 17, the junior varsity squad hosted Galesburg and Alleman, Rock Island. This time the Leaflets showed its strength with a 156-point finish. Galesburg took second with 19 points followed by Alleman with two.

In the single event not won by Geneseo, Leaflets placed second, third and fourth. In over 10 events, Geneseo took at least the first two slots to block out the competition.

The pole vault was the only event not won by a Geneseo athlete. Patch of Galesburg cleared 8'6" for the

time of 18.73 and Hazlett took third in 18.84. Hazlett joined Russell in the high jump as well, earning second with a 5'4" jump. He was followed by Aaron Anderson, 5' and Parrish, also at 5'.

Marquis was another double winner for Geneseo, taking the 100 and 200 dashes. Marquis clocked an 11.95 in the 100 followed by teammate Ofslager in third, 12.47 and Venema, fourth, 12.89. In the 200 dash, Marquis covered the track in 24.89 and was followed by two more Geneseo runners. Ofslager was second, 25.92 and White, third, 26.12.

The stacked field continued as the Leaflets took all four positions in the 800. Bopp was first in 2:21.79 followed by Anderson, second, 2:28.26; Schwigen, third, 2:28.43 and Ristau, fourth, 2:29.34.

Curnyn, O'Rourke and Venema went one-two-three in the 400 dash. Curnyn clocked in at 56.88 for first followed by O'Rourke (57.65) and Venema (57.81).

Parrish and Russell teamed again in the 300 intermediate hurdles, this time Parrish taking the tape, clocking in at 47.02. Russell was second in 48.66.

Geneseo also took the long jump, triple jump, shot and discus.

Hazlett went 17'4-1/4" in the long jump for first followed by teammate Aaron Anderson in second at 15'7". O'Rourke went 35'7" for first in the triple jump while Aaron Anderson was second at 33'3" and Todd Verheecke, third, 25'4".

Gabe Possin took the shot put event with a 41'7-1/2" effort. Helping his cause were Leaflets Jake Verstraete, third, 38'1" and Marshall Freeman, fourth, 37'6-1/2".

Freeman improved his effort with a first in the discus with a 122' distance. Jeff Bowling finished in second with 112'6-1/2"; Marc, third, 108'8" and Jared VanAcker, fourth, 107'7".

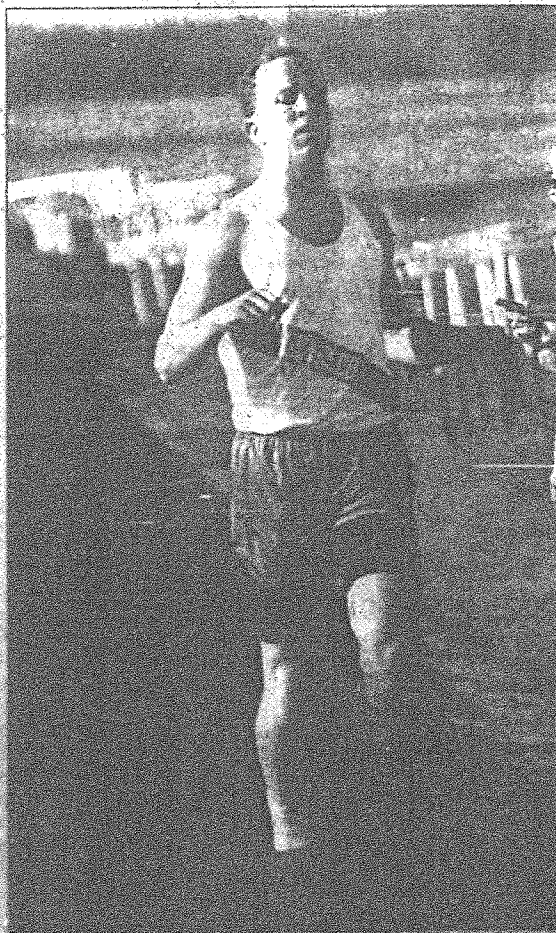

Hitting stride

Leafs pack place finishes in home meet

Galesburg may have won the event but the J. D. Darnall High School varsity boys track squad made it known they were also at this meet, taking more than one place finish in several events.

The Silver Streaks earned 97 points for the win while Geneseo tallied 78 for second. Alleman of Rock Island also competed, tallying seven points at the meet which was held Thursday, April 17 in Geneseo.

Five firsts were claimed by Leaf runners. Added to that were 11 seconds and six third places.

Adam Forest, Dave Whisker, Adam Anderson and Ben Forest teamed for the 3200 relay, taking the tape in 9:51.96 for the win.

Geneseo athletes took the top three places in the 3200 with Chris Studer earning first with a time of 10:07.80. He was followed by Jason Gray, 10:29.32 and Mark Keplinger, 11:15.09. Gray followed with a first in the 1600 run with a time of 5:06.73 while Studer took the silver in 5:07.02. Chad Bulman also competed in the 1600, earning fourth place with a time of 5:48.46.

Leafs took one-two in the 110 high hurdles with Nick DePauw covering the course in 16.50 for first followed by Andy Esche in 16.62 for second. Leaf Seth Hanson also competed, taking fourth in 17.84.

The packed field in Geneseo's favor didn't end there. Ben Forest won the 800 run with a time of 2:07.98 while Adam Forest took third in 2:13.25; Adam Anderson,

fourth, 2:14.07 and Dave Whisker, fifth, 2:17.26.

Leaf runners may not have taken first in the 300 low hurdles but they did place in the next three. DePauw cleared the hurdles in 44.97 for second followed by teammates Esche in third, 45.02 and Hanson, fourth, 47.75. The winning time was 43.05.

Tom Anderson earned second-place ribbons in the 400 dash and in the triple jump. Anderson covered the 400 in 56.94 behind the winning time of 55.81. In the triple jump, Anderson cleared 37'5" while teammate Lance Hackwith put in a 35'1" effort for fourth. The winning distance was 40'3-1/2".

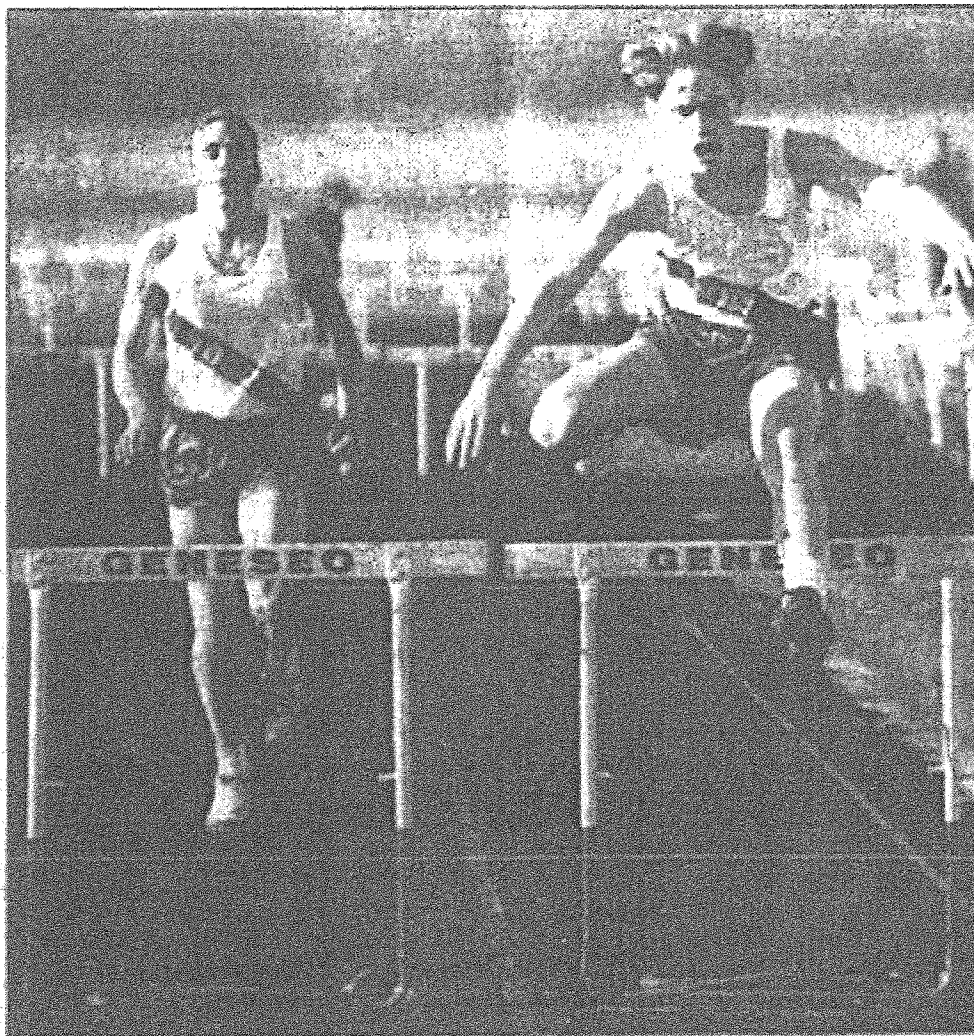
Nick Henthorn and Corbin Shipp also earned silvers for the Leafs. Henthorn cleared 10'6" in the pole vault; 11' won the event. Shipp earned second in the shot put with a 44'8-1/2" toss while his teammate, Ty Noard was fourth with 39'9-1/4". The winning toss was 46'5-3/4".

The 1600 relay, 800 relay and 400 relay all won seconds as well. Bart Reed, DePauw, Steve Schaaf and Matt Fuelling teamed for the 400 relay and clocked in at 46.66. Fuelling and Reed joined forces with Kyle Misfeldt and Ryan Scherer for the 800 relay while Adam Forest, Tom Anderson, Whisker and Ben Forest ran the 1600-meter event.

Hackwith earned third in the discus, hurling the disc 118'9"; 132' was the winning throw.

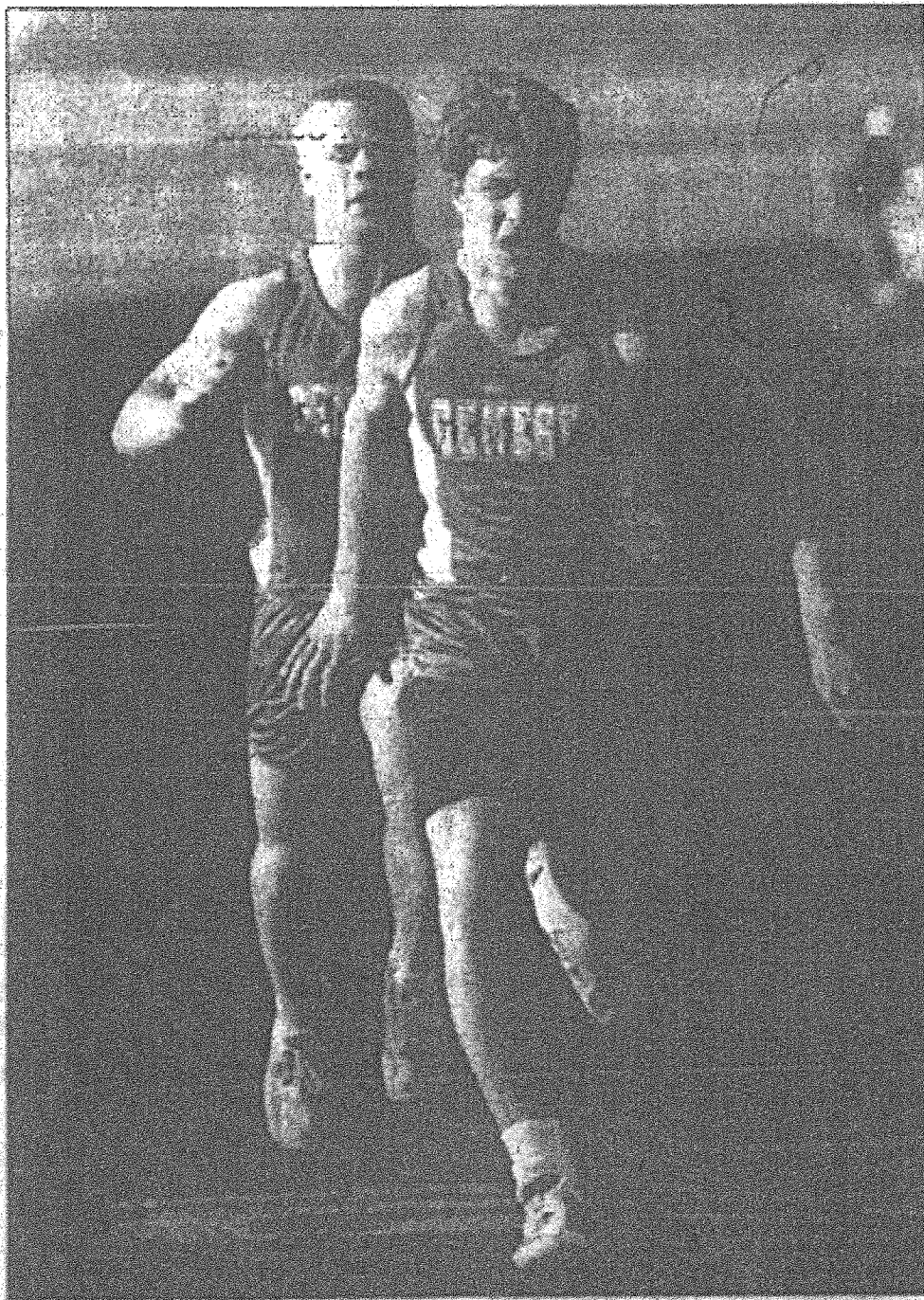
Scherer also took a third for Geneseo, clearing the high jump at 5'6"; 6' won the event.

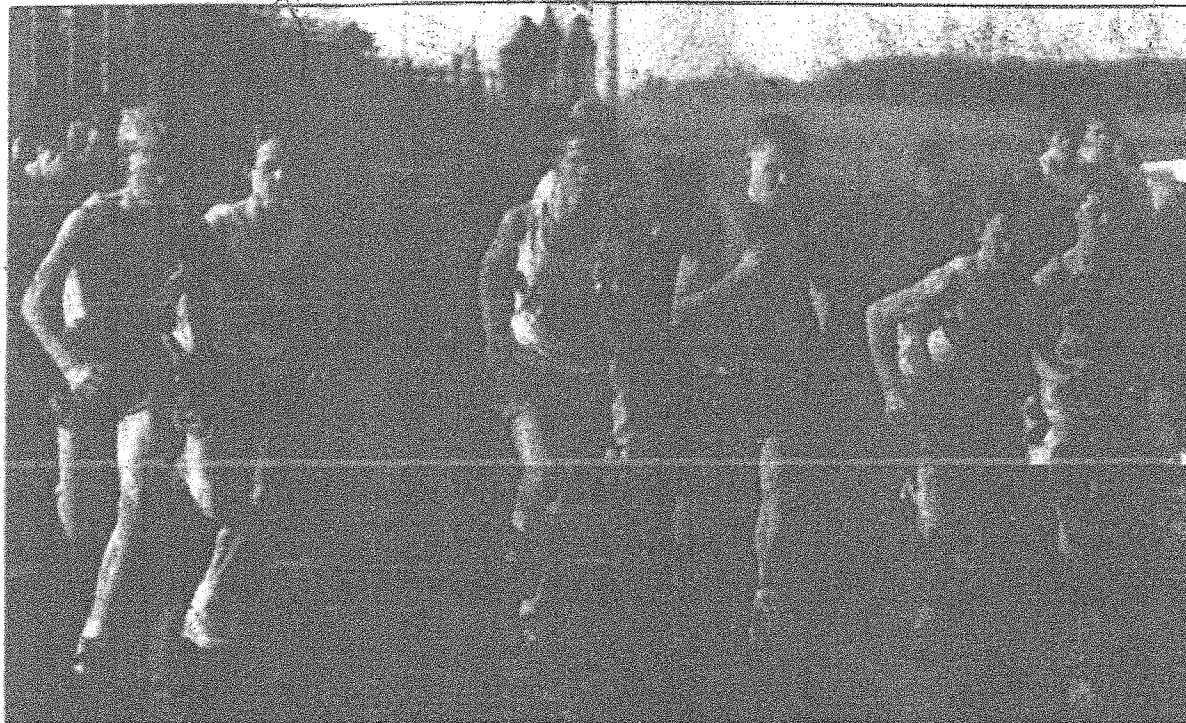
