# Leafs, Leaflets dominate in first nome meet

Pure domination by the Leafs track and field team boosted the J. D. Darnall varsity squad to an overwhelming 72-point victory over Galesburg and Alleman.

Geneseo hosted the Silver Streaks and Pioneers in the first of two home. meets for the Leafs on Thursday, April 13.

The Leafs racked up 114 points behind 12 titles in the 18-event meet. Galesburg took second in the team standings with 42 points followed by Alleman, 29.

Of the Your relay events, Geneseo took first in three, the 3200-meter, 400-meter and 800-meter relay events.

Tim Nelson, Wil McCombs, Andy Bouster and Dave Bopp covered the 3200 event in 8:41,84 to take the tape, nearly eight seconds ahead of Alleman in second place.

Mike Dietsch, Andy Thurman, Dallas Drummond and Cory Partish took the ribbon in the 400 event with a time of 45.37 with Galesburg in second at 45.79.

Leafs came from the 800-meter relay run by Dietsch, Thurman, Drummond and Asron Anderson. The foursome finished in 1:39.41 to best Galesburg 1:40.65 and Alleman 1:40.68

Galesburg took first and third in the 1600-meter relay with Genesco's contingent splitting the pair. Parrish, Beuster, McCombs and Bopp combined for a time of 3:37.0 for the silver-medal spot. The two Silver Streak teams were timed at 3:36.77 and 3:37.72.

Dietsch and Jelf Bowling were both double individual winners for the Leafs.

Geneseo packed into all four scoring positions in the discus event with Bowling leading the charge. HIs effort of 142'9.5" won the event. Ben Gerhardt captured second with a 117' effort while Gary Jahns scored in third place at 102'3.5". Rounding out

the scoring was Jake Willet who took fourth with an effort of 97'3".

Bowling earned his second title in the shot put with an effort of 52'0.5" with Gerhardt wrapping up second with a 44'4" effort. Galesburg's putters took the final two scoring posi-

Dietsch won his titles in the 100meter dash and the long jump.

In the dash, three of the top four places were claimed by Leafs. Dietsch took the ribbon in 11.42 ahead of Drummond in 11.55, edging out the Allemaif runner who was clocked in third at 11.56. Thurman wrapped up the final slot with a time of 11.68.

Dietsch was recorded at 18'11" to win the long jump, six inches farther than the second place effort put in by Galesburg, Kyle Read finished at 17'11" for third place.

Marc Brunner won the pole vault event for the Leafs, reaching 12'6" for the title. Again the Geneseo contingent packed into the scoring positions, tallying more points for the win.

Behind Brunner, Jeremy Heaton took second with an Il'6" vault while Joe Johnson took third at 9'6".

Bopp was the sole Geneseo topfour finisher in the 400 meter run, taking the tape in 50.96. His closest competitor came in at 53.30.

Heaton added a first place for Geneseo in the high jump, clearing 5'6" for the title. An Alleman jumper and Reade both marked in at 5'4" with Reade claiming third place.

Nelson earned an individual tilt to go with his relay ribbon by winning the 1600-meter run with a time of 4:45,14. Teammate Dave Mattic took The third relay title won by the second in 4:49 while Leaf Bill Bean came in fourth in 4:59.

Drummond and Anderson both ran the 200-meter dash, with Drummond taking top honors with a time of 24.98. Anderson finished third at 25.59.

Alleman's runner may have won the 3200-meter run but Genesco scored in the following three slots for more points, Josh Franks led the Leafs' contingent, taking second in 10:32. Bob Ristau took third, 10:38 while Bean captured fourth, 10:46, The winning time was marked at

Parrish edged out a Galesburg runner in the 110-meter hurdle event to take second with a time of 5.20. The third-place hurdler stopped the clock at 15.21 while the winner recorded a time of 14,48.

McCombs and Beuster packed in the points for Geneseo in the 800meter run, taking second and third, respectively. McCombs recorded a time of 2:04.23 while Beuster was marked at 2:06. It was a tight competition, with the winner marking a time of 2:04.13.

Ocneseo also scored in the second

and third-place positions in the 300meter intermediate hurdles. In just a blink of an eye, the Galesburg hurdler beat out Parrish for the top ribbon. The winner's time was recorded at 40.43 while Parrish stopped the time at 40.44. Heaton came in third with a time of 43.37.

Reade was the top Geneseo finisher in the triple jump, taking second with a 40'10" effort. Anderson scored for the Leafs with a fourthplace effort of 35'2". Galesburg's jumper reached 42'3" for the win.

Geneseo also dominated the junior varsity competition, scoring 125 points for first place. Galesburg finished in second with 41 points while Alleman ended the day with just two

All but two events were captured Sy the Leaflets.

Though Galesburg won the 110meter high hurdles, the Leaflets tied up the next three scoring slots. Kyle Wickwire took second in 19.09 ahead of Andre Jackson, 19.31 and Justin Kempher, 19.62. Galesburg's winning time was 17.67.

Galesburg also won the 800-meter run but again it was Genesco who tallied the most points, placing finishers in the final three scoring positions. The winner was clocked at 2:25.52, Derck Wahlheim earned second place with a time of 2:33.48 while Steve Loftus captured third in 2:43.86. The final scoring positions was taken by Grant Jobe with a time of 2:52.76.

Nick Eberhardt, Kyle Fluck, Paul Kretschmar and Eric VanEarwage finished the 3200-meter relay in 10:20,52 for the win.

Erik Norin, Kempher, Aaron Kuban and Alex DePauw combined for a win in the 400-meter relay, taking the tape in 47.15 ahead of Galesburg at 49.58.

Norin and Kuban joined talent with Adam Hock and Grant Wyffels to take the ribbon in the 800-meter run with a time of 1:44.09.

Completing the sweep in the relay events, Geneseo took first in the 1600-meter relay. Eberhardt. Kretschmar, VanEarwage and Garrick Wayne finished the event in 3:58.15 for the top honor. Galesburg took second in 3:59.72.

In individual competition, Wickwire and Wayne took the top two positions in the high jump for Geneseo. Wickwire finished with a jump of 5'6" while Wayne finished at 5'2".

Wayne topped the field in the 400meter run, taking first in 56.60. Kretschmar finished between two Galesburg runners for third place woods, Rochelle and Rock Falls.

Wickwire also won the triple jump with an effort of 38'2", nearly three feet ahead of the second-place jumper, Adam Blank scored in third place with a 30'8" effort.

Eric Wallace, Chris Burk and Mike Akey swept the 3200-meter run with respective times of 13:20, 13:21 and 13:21.

Anthony Rokis won the discus with an effort of 113'1" to beat out the Galesburg hurler by nearly 10 feet, Kory Klemmer finished in fourth place with a distance of 943.5%

Norin and Kuban finished well ahead of two Galesburg sprinters in the 100-meter dash. Norin stopped the clock at 12.00 with Kuban hot in pursuit at 12.01. The closest Silver Streak was recorded at 12.62.

Kempher and Kuban finished on either side of a Galesburg jumper in the long jump event. Kempher took the tile with a distance of 169°, four inches better than the Silver streak. Kuban finished at 15'2".

Wyffels was the only competitor in the pole vault and scored first-place points for the Leaflets with his 8'

He also won the 200-meter dash, leading two teammates over the line. Wyffels finished in 25,40 ahead of Novin at 25,75 in second. Hock took fourth with a time of 27,96.

Kyle Sullivan nailed 41' to win the

shot pat. Brian Blank took second for Genesco with a 39'1" effort while Dave Mapes finished fourth at 37'1".

On Friday, April 21, the Genesco track and field stars will take part in the Rock Island Invitational beginning at 4 n.m.










