

# In "Ship" shape

## Leafs keep pace with QC teams; take third at Shipley Invite

Just three meets into the 2000 schedule and the J. D. Darnall High School boys track team is keeping in close contention with the Quad City contingents.

Sixteen teams took part in the annual Gene Shipley Invitational at Moline on Saturday, April 1.

The Leaflets entered the event with the hopes of keeping competitive and did just that.

Since last year's event was cancelled, the Leaflets were looking to better their fifth-place finish of two years ago with a score of 164 points. Rock Island won in 1998 for the second consecutive year with 254 points, 20 points ahead of Sterling in second at 230.

Rock Island topped the field again this year, scoring 200 points followed by Moline in second with 184.

The Leaflets compiled 156.5 points to take third, nearly 30 points ahead of fourth-place finisher Bettendorf, Iowa at 129 points.

Other team standings include United Township, 127; Pleasant Valley, 124; Rockford Guilford, 88; Davenport West, 81; Davenport North, 80; East Peoria, 48; Ottawa, 46; Davenport Assumption, 41; Princeton, 35.5; Sherrard, 35; Davenport Central, 30 and Alleman, 9 points.

The meet ran its traditional A, B, C format which is designed to emphasize team depth as well as recognizing individuals.

The Leaflets were led by senior Jeff Bowling who recorded two titles for Geneseo and fellow senior Dave Bopp who had a single first-place medal.

Bowling recorded his victories in the discus and shot put.

His discus throw of 147'3" took first place in the A competition and was nearly four feet farther than John Schabillon of Bettendorf who took second with an effort of 143'6".

Ben Gerhardt and Jake Willet also represented Geneseo in the discus competition. Gerhardt finished fifth in the B division with an effort of 115'10" behind Doug Boblett of Rock Island who won the event with a throw of 126'7". Willet claimed fourth in the C competition with a throw of 111'3". McMurray of Rock Island claimed first with a 130'5" effort.

A distance of 50'7" was good for enough to earn Bowling first in the A competition of the shot put. Travis Lingle of Davenport West was his closest competition, taking second with an effort of 48'10.5".

Gerhardt claimed sixth with a tie at 41'7" with Paul Bergstrand of Rock Island in the B division. Both top finishers beat the meet record set in 1998 by Fetzer of Princeton at 45'11" for the B division.

Bryan Waggoner of Davenport West took the event with a hurl of 48'0.5" while Kevin McVey of Bettendorf finished second at 45'11.5".

Kyle Sullivan earned sixth for the Leaflets in the C division of the men's shot put event, lading the last scoring position in the event. Sullivan reached 38'2.25" for the honor. Jon Zurinski of Bettendorf won the competition with a hurl of 45'5".

Bopp won the A division of the 400, clearing the track in 50.8. He beat out Mitch Cooper of Davenport North and Matt Jones of Davenport Assumption who finished second and third, respectively with times of 51.3 and 51.4.

Grant Venema ran the B division of the men's 400 meter dash and took third with a time of 53.8. Dillon Smith of Rock Island won the event in 52.9 and was followed in second by Derrick Beechum of North, 53.0. Venema beat out fourth-place Nate Kramer of Moline by nearly a second.

Representing Geneseo in the C division of the dash was Garrick Wayne. The freshman finished in 55-flat to score for Geneseo. Eric Rodriguez of Moline topped the field in 54.2 and was closely followed by Aaron Frazier of United Township, 54.5 and Quentin Jefferson of Rock Island, 54.6. Following Wayne through the gate was Harry Sutherland of Pleasant Valley who finished in 55.9.

A number of second place finishes throughout the division of competition also boosted the Leaflets to third in

the event.

In pole vaulting, Jeremy Heaton scored five points for the Leaflets with a second place in the C division. He ended in a three-way tie at 9'6" and edged the other two for the second-place honor. Tim Hollman of Rockford-Guilford took first at 12-even.

Marc Brunner claimed second and scored six points for the Leaflets in the B division of the event, ending in a tie with first-place finisher David Few of Rockford Guilford at 12'. The third and fourth place finishers tied at 10'.

Andrew Henry represented Geneseo in the A level of competition. He was one of three athletes to finish at 11'6". First-place finisher Casey Friske of Guilford not only took first but also beat the IHSA qualifying mark with his effort of 14'. The second and third place finishers were both recorded at 12'.

Kyle Wickwire was another second-place finisher and strong contender for Geneseo in the high jump.

Wickwire, along with four other jumpers, landed at 5'10" to lead the B division. The final four tied at 5'6". Rodney Blue of United Township ended up with the win, edging out Wickwire for the title.

In the A level of jumping, Heaton finished fifth for the Leaflets, tying two other competitors at 5'8". The winners, Ron Steverson of Davenport West and Bryan Tyson, Rock Island, tied at 6'2".

The knotted competition continued in the C division of the high jump with Kyle Reade taking third above two others who marked at 5'8". Corey Lewis of U.T. and Jay McAdams-Thornton of Moline tied for the top slot at 5'10" and matched the meet record held by three athletes, Johnson of U.T., Sandelback of East Peoria and Peirce of Ottawa.

Reade came back and took second in the A division of the triple jump with an effort of 41'6.5". First place went to Matt Ploog of Sherrard at 42'9" while R. J. Severtsgaard of U.T. finished behind Reade with a 41' effort.

In the B division, Wickwire took third with a leap of 37'7" to score five points for the Leaflets. James Hood of U.T. and Ryan Johnston of Moline took first and second, respectively, with jumps of 39'2" and 39'0.5".

Scoring for Geneseo in the C competition was Aaron Anderson who finished fourth at 35'6.25". Nathaniel Blazier of Princeton was the first-place finisher at 37'5.75".

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Anderson followed up with a second-place finish in the long jump, C category, with an effort of 18'11.5", nearly a full foot farther than the third place competitor. Ron Steversen of Davenport West took the title and beat the 1998 record set by Lillis of Rock Island at 19'5". Steversen was marked at 19'7".

Kyle Reade also competed for Geneseo in the long jump and finished sixth in the B level of competition. His effort of 18'4" claimed the last scoring position. Chris Hintgen of Davenport West took the overall division with a 19'4" effort.

None of Geneseo's athletes were in the top seven of the A long jump. Matt Comella of Moline won with a 20'6.5" mark.

Just one level of competition was fielded in the men's 4x800 meter relay and Geneseo's contingent came in second to score 10 points towards the team's tally.

Moline took the tape in 8:11.1 while Andy Beuster, Matt Travis, Venema and Bopp combined for a time of 8:22.9 for the silver. Guilford's foursome wrapped up third with a time of 8:24.0.

Two Leafs took second in their respective races in the 3200-meter run.

Bob Ristau finished the B division run in 10:35.9 for second behind Drew Patterson of Moline in 10:22.9. Steve Gates of United Township finished after Ristau and was clocked at 10:39.6.

Bill Bean was second to Jeff Decker of Moline in the C level with times of 10:38.4 and 10:53.0. Matt Simmons of U.T. finished well behind Bean at 11:08.4.

Tim Nelson represented the Leafs in the A division, claiming third for the varsity contingent. Ben Schutman of Bettendorf took the tape in 9:44.2 followed by Reed Patterson of Moline in second at 9:58.3. Nelson's time of 10:00.7 edged out Phillip Grothus of Pleasant Valley who stopped the clock at 10:01.0.

Cory Parrish earned a couple of third-place honors for the Leafs in hurdle events.

In the A division of the men's 300-meter intermediate hurdles, Parrish covered the course in 40.8 for the bronze-medal position. The top two runners beat the IHSA qualifying mark of 39.8. Ellery Stewart of Rock Island took the tape in 39.0 followed by Matt Comella of Moline at 39.3. Dave Trasper of Ottawa followed Parrish over the line with a fourth-place time of 42.9.

In the B competition, Heaton scored in the fifth-place position for Geneseo. His time of 46.5 just edged out Kyle Wolf of Princeton's 46.6 effort. Patrick Wren of Moline won the division with a time of 43.0.

Wickwire claimed the final scoring position for the Leafs in the C category, coming through the hurdles course in 48.7. He finished just ahead of Eric Adams of Sherrard at 49.0. Jeff Beck, Rock Island, broke the tape in 43.6.

Parrish's other third-place honor was accomplished in the 110-meter high hurdles. In the A division, Parrish tied with John Fitzpatrick of Davenport Assumption at 15.8 to take the higher finish. The level of competition was tight as the second-place finisher, Adam Schricker of P.V. was clocked at 15.6 and the fifth-place runner, Jon Meyers of Davenport Central, was marked at 15.9. The winner, Moline's Comella, surpassed the IHSA qualifying time with a mark of 14.5.

Heaton and Wickwire also ran the high hurdles event for the Leafs and scored in Geneseo's behalf.

Heaton took fifth in the B division with a time of 17.7 just a slight step behind Ryan Peters of Central who was marked at 17.6 for fourth. Moline's Wren took first in 15.3.

In the C division, Wickwire scored in the number four position with a time of 18.5. Seth Denato of Moline was the title holder at 16.3.

Among Geneseo's fifth-place finishers was David Mattie who finished the B division of the men's 1600-meter run in 4:48.6. He was well ahead of Guilford's Banum Abbott who took sixth overall at 4:58.4, but just a second behind the fourth-place Brent Clawson of Moline at 4:47.8. The times were tight after the winner (Ben Schutman of Bettendorf finished in 4:41.5) with the second through fourth runners recording times of 4:47.6, 4:47.7 and 4:47.8.

Tim Nelson claimed the last scoring position in the C division of the run with a time of 5:14.7. The winner, Bettendorf's Kyle Messmer, set a new record for the class with a time of 4:37.4. The old record was set in 1996 by Casas of U.T. at 4:44.40.

Parrish, Venema, Wayne and Bopp covered the 4x400 relay for Geneseo and scored two points with a six-place finish. Their time was 3:40.3. Davenport North took the overall title at 3:27.0.

Pat Schwigen was the only Leaf representative in the 800 meter run to score, getting one point for his sixth-place finish in the C division. He stopped the clock at 2:17.2. Tim Davies of Moline won the class in 2:07.5. The top time in the A competition was recorded at 1:58.2 by Ben Schumaker of Moline while Kyle Messmer of Bettendorf broke the record in the B competition with a time of 2:01.7. In 1996, O'Neil from Davenport Central set the mark at 2:02.80.

The Leafs were slated to open the outdoor portion of the 2000 season on Tuesday, March 28 at Princeton against Sherrard and Princeton but the meet was cancelled.

Saturday's Shipley Invite was the first outdoor competition for Geneseo high school's track and field team.

After a week's break, the Leafs are slated to participate in the United Township High School Invitational on Saturday, April 8 in East Moline beginning at 10 a.m.

The junior varsity squad will take part in the Rock Island J.V. Invite on Tuesday, April 11 at 5 p.m. while the varsity prepares for the first home competition.

Geneseo is scheduled to host Galesburg and Alleman at J. D. Darnall High School Thursday, April 13 beginning at 4:30 p.m.

The only other home competitions for the Geneseo boys will be a frosh-soph invite on Monday, April 24 and the annual John McCormick Invitational set for Friday, May 5.

# Rock Island survives close call

## Rocks collect ninth straight Shipley crown

Thanks to the efforts of a trio of Rock Island sprinters, the Rocks captured an unprecedented ninth straight championship at the 34th Annual Gene Shipley Invitational at Moline's Browning Field.

Sophomore speedsters Maurice Jones and Steve Burnett and junior Bryan Tyson collected the top prize in the three flights of the 200-meter dash to vault the Rocks from a two-point deficit with 42 events in the books to a 22-point lead heading into the final event.

Rock Island finished the A-B-C meet with 200 points to win the team crown with a 16-point cushion over second-place Moline. The Maroons, who had forged a comfortable lead on the 16-team field early in the afternoon, registered 184 points.

Geneseo rang up 156.5 points to finish third with Bettendorf (129) and United Township (127) placing fourth and fifth, respectively.

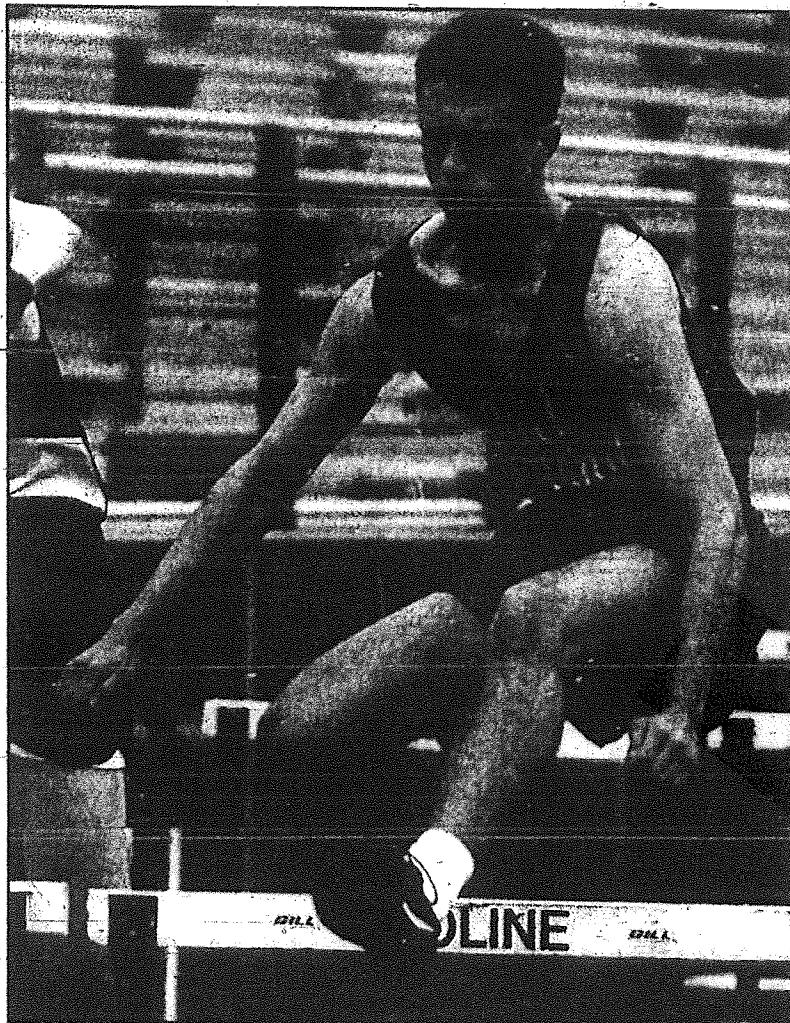
"I am just so impressed with the effort my kids gave," said Rock Island coach Ed Lillis. "We knew we were going to be young this year going into this meet, and not real heavy with seniors. But we've found we have some kids who can compete."

Senior Ellery Stewart grabbed the gold in the A-flight of the 300 low hurdles with a 39-second clocking while sophomore Jeff Beck earned the top prize in the B-flight in going the distance in 56 ticks.

"Dillon Smith, only a freshman, did great, Maurice Jones and Steve Burnett, only sophomores, did great," Lillis said. "We had a lot of the younger kids do an excellent job in a big meet like this."

Smith picked off the gold in the 400 while Burnett collared his second gold medal in the 100 with an 11.3 second clocking.

The Rocky distance crews were also a factor in the victory. Juniors Boomer Greger and Jerrod Roessler finished second in their flights of the 1,600 and 800 run, while Stewart, Tyson, Burnett and Jones teamed to run away for the gold in the 400 relay.

"We picked up a pair of second place finishes in the mile and half mile," Lillis said, "and came within a hundredth of a second of getting a second in one of the mile races. So I think the distance kids deserve a little credit for what we did."

The Maroons were flexing their collective muscles early in the meet in racing to the lead. Junior Matt Comella collected a gold medal for his 20-foot, 6.5-inch leap in the long jump, while Jeff Decker, also a junior, and freshman Drew Patterson took the top prizes in the B and C flights of the 3,200 run.

Nate Medinger, Tim Davies, Brent Clawson and Ben Shumaker teamed to win the 3,200 relay with an 8:11.1 clocking for Moline, while Comella, Patrick

Worn and Beth Denz put the triple whammy on the gold in all three flights of the 110 high hurdles.

"We don't have a lot of depth and if one kid goes down then we're hurting," Moline coach Jeff Quick said. "We have one down — Brent Hines, senior sprinter — and that causes us to do some shifting."

The Maple Leafs' Dave Bopp registered a 50.8 clocking in the A-flight of the 400 in earning a gold, while Jeff Bowling was a double winner, taking the discus and shot put.

UTs Rodney Blue and Corey Lewis were tops in the B and C flights of high jump and Jeff Hood captured the gold in the B-flight of the triple jump.
