Leafs win six relays to clinch victory

When the relay races count 10 points for the winner, a track team can make things easy for itself by winning them.

There were seven 10-point relays in the Northwest Relays Tuesday, and Geneseo won six.

Geneseo won the team title handily, scoring 101½ points, compared with 68½ by second place Alleman. Ten schools competed in the annual event at the Geneseo High School stadium

Geneseo didn't have to score heavily in the 12 non-relay events to win this meet, although the Leafs scored in more events than any other team. Geneseo scored in 17 events; Alleman counted points in 14. The Pioneers outscored Geneseo by nine points in the non-relay events, but were no match for the Leafs in the relays.

The biggest difference was in the hurdles. Geneseo rarely loses a shuttle hurdle race, and the Leafs won both of those races handily Tuesday. Alleman failed to place in either. Still, the Pioneers trailed by just 10 points after 13 of the 19 events. But the next event, the 880-yard relay, decided the issue, if there had been any doubt. Geneseo won it; Alleman again failed to place.

Geneseo awarded T-shirts to the winners in this meet – the first time that's been done in this meet. The Leafs have a bunch of new clothes – and Paul DePauw has four new shirts.

The versatile senior anchored both winning hurdle teams, and ran on the 440-yard relay teams. DePauw was Geneseo's only individual winner. He won the triple jump on his final attempt, going 41 feets for first place honors.

The weather was almost perfect for this meet, and records were either broken or set in three events, and Geneseo athletes were involved in one new mark. The frosh-soph 440 relay team of Larry Boyles, Bob Johnson, Randy Russell and Dave Anderson (the freshman), ran :47.6 to knock a tenth of a second off the old record, set last year by Fulton.

Genesso won the 320-yard high hurdle shuttle relay easily, with Gary Ong, Dave Stevens, Jon Peterson and DePauw clocking :42.9. Stevens, Shawn Hart, Ong and DePauw had an even easier time in the 480-yard low hurdle shuttle, winning in 58.1

Sophomore Dave Anderson, DePauw, Brian Johnson and Pete Pouloa, who transferred to Geneseo from Dixon, won the varsity 440 relay in :45.9. Wayne Strader, Dave Anderson, Johnson and Poulos won the 880 welay in 1:36.7.

Geneseo knocked about three seconds off its opening meet time in the mile relay, when Dave Anderson, Sid Anderson, Stevens and Poulos was in 3:38.8.

Wayne Strader and Beckridge's Mel Blaser lecked in a
shot put dual that seemed as
tonse-mentally as it was
explosive physically. Blaser was
with a dandy threw of 85 feet. 7
inches, but Strader's threw of 61
feet, 5% inches was about two
feet better than he had thrown
in the opening meet against
Monmouth and Hall.

Brian Germant threw a bit beyond 144 feet in the discus to place second. Dan Pitagerald was ascend for Geneses in the two-mile run, and sophomers Dave Anderson elected :10.5 for second in the 100:

Mike Oliveirs piaced third for Genesco in the pole vault, and Poules was third in the 220.
