TRACK DRAWS A CROWD

If you're wondering what activity keeps Geneseo High School youngsters busy every afternoon at least five times a week, the answer is track and field.

More than one out of every five GHS students are out for track this spring.

As of this week, there were 217 students participating in track — 128 on the boys teams and 89 on the girls squad.

Track interest seems unusually high this year. Just the numbers are impressive. To have the same percentage of its students on track teams, a school of 3,000 — Quad-City size — would have to have 600 kids out for the sport, and of course, that would be an unwieldy number.

A lot of youngsters are deriving a lot of benefit from the GHS track program this spring. If you're wondering about cost, track is a relatively low-budget sport, which means the activity could be considered a bargain for taxpayers, especially in note of how many individuals are involved this year.
