action awa track squad in co

After a relatively quiet week, the Geneseo high school boys track and field teams will swing into some very heavy action this coming week.

Two of the most important meets of the season are set for the boys Monday and Tuesday nights.

On Monday, the freshmen and sophmore boys visit Mendots for the annual Mendota Frosh-Soph Invitational. Starting time is 5

On Tuesday, the Leaf boys visit Bryant Field for the Princeton Invitational

At both Mendots and Princeton, the competing teams are division of the NCIC; the same six who battle in football in the fall. Both are prestige meets, and they give the souches a chance to look at and evaluate some of the athletic talent the others will have coming back next season.

Geneseo once dominated the Princeton Invitational, but the hosting Tigers have been the southwest division's track and field power the last few years. This Princeton meet should be a dandy, with Princeton, Rock Falls and Geneseo all very close in ability.

Princeton has five quarter milers who have run under 55 seconds, and the Tigers also the six schools in the southwest have a good discus thrower and a strong pole vaulter. Princeton Rock Falls probably has better sprint speed. Rock Falls also has strength in the distance races. Rock Falls and Geneseo were almost dead even in a triangular meet with Kewanee not long

The Leafs hope their depth will carry them to victory, and Geneseo should be strong in several field events, the hurdles, and the relava.

The meet will be an all-metric meet on the Princeton track. Princeton started measuring distances in meters last year, and last year's Tiger invite was an official Bicentennial Event.

The track was a traditional 440-yards around, though - but that's been changed. Work has been completed, and it's a 400-meter track now.

After Tuesday, the boys are idle until Friday, when they host the Maple Leaf Classic. More about that in next week's Republic.

Geneseo's girls had quite a week, with thrilling races in the meet against Moline and Galesburg, and a super track meet against Sterling on Monday night of this week.

The Geneseo girls have now cracked eight school records out of the 16 events they've run in thus far.

Two attractive nights are on tap for the girls, who will have three meets in all this week. Monday night, Geneseo and Monmouth are at Rock Island, and posted times would indicate that Geneseo and Rock Island could stage quite a battle. The 880-yard run should be worth the price of admission, with a total of five Rocks and Leafs capable of turning the distance in 2:30.

On Tuesday, Geneseo is at home, with Kewanee and Dixon coming to town. Kewanee's girls beat Geneseo's in every meeting last season.

Then on Thursday, another has good sprint speed, although attractive triangular, with Fulton and East Moline coming to Geneseo. East Moline has some outstanding individuals, and perhaps will win more races. Geneseo will counter with depth and some outstanding individuals of its own.

Frosh-soph team buries Trojans

Geneseo's freshman sophomore track team started off a superb week for the Leafs boys teams with a devastating win Monday night in the Mendota Frosh-Soph Invitational.

Taking eight victories and eight second place finishes, Geneseo rolled up 99 points in this meeting of the six NCIC southwest division schools, compared to just 55% points by second-place Princeton.

Geneseo athletes were first and second in five of the individual events, and several of the hoys went on to do well Tuesday night in the varsity meet at Princeton.

Bruce Borkgren was a double winner for the Leaflets, taking the 120-yard high hurdles in 16.7, and the 330-yard lows in 43.5. Geneseo was one-two in both these events. Dennis Robertson followed Borkgren across in the highs, and Randy Russell was a very close second in the lows, with a time of :43.7

Robertson had quite a day of second place finishes. He was also runnerup in the Jong jump and triple jump, both times finishing behind a teammate. Randy Russell won the long jump with a leap of 18 feet, 11½ inches, while Dave Anderson's leap of 41 feet, 9 inches topped the triple jumpers. Anderson and Russell jumped even farther Tuesday night, when they won the varsity competition at Princeton.

Anderson, Russell, Randy Farrell and Robertson teamed to win the 440 relay, and Dave Hillman, Dan Carton, Kevin DeBlieck and Kelvin Hipkins captured the mile relay

Carton ran the 440 in :55.0 to take a first, and Geneseo was one-two in the pole vault, Jay Siefker winning at 11 feet, with Derrick Skiles second.

Second places were grabbed by Norm Singbush in the high jump. Chris Ford in the discus, and by the two-mile relay team.
