Boys take Princeton

invitational track med

Geneseo sparkles in field events

Genesso's varsity boys track team piled up a stunning amount of points in the field events and walked away with the championship of the 24th annual Princeton Invitational Tuesday night of this week at Bryant Field.

The Maple Leafs scored 69 points - 46 of them in the field events - to outdistance favored Princeton, which scored 57½, and Rock Falls, which also scored 57½.

It was the first Leaf title in three seasons at Prince-ton. The host team wan last year, and in 1975, after Geneseo had was the meet every year from 1969 through 1974. Geneseo has won this meet 12 times; Princeton is next with six crowns.

This, of course, is a prestige meet for Geneseo, as it involves the six schools in the southwest division of the NCIC. The big victory capped a super two nights for the Leaf boys. The same six schools competed Monday night in the Mendots Frosh-Soph Invitational, and the Leaflets ran away with the championship, scoring 99 points, compared to just 55% by second

place Princeton. Story and results of that meet elsewhere on the sports pages.

If fans watched only the track events Tuesday, they would never have guessed Geneseo was running away with the title. The Leafs didn't fare well at all on the track. Rock Falls scored 43 points in the running events, Princeton and Hall both scored 41 - and Geneseo scored just 23.

But in the field events - wew! A green wave engulied the other five teams. Genesco racked up 46 points; Rochelle was next with just 17. Princeton and Rock Falls managed just 161/2 and 141/2, respectively.

What did it? Some excellent performances, by most everybody, and all on the same day. Like in the high jump, where Gary Cathelyn equaled his season's best, 6 feet, 2 inches, to take second. And Frank Gardner, who had not been going much higher than 5-6, suddenly soared 6-0 to tie for third.

And in the triple jump, where sophomores Dave Anderson and Dennis Robertson placed first and third, respectively, and in the long jump, where the same pair were first and third again.

Anderson set a meet record in the triple jump, sailing out beyond 43 feet. This was an all-metric meet, so most distances measured in meters.

In the pole vault, Ken Peal picked up points by tying for second.

Over across the street, the weightmen had their own private little get together, out of sight of most fans. Dressed in their all-white uniforms, and standing in the bright, late afternoon sun, Geneseo's big weight trio of Ed Ryan, Dennis Brooks and Wayne Strader looked like collegiate performers who had stumbled into a prep meet. And they did a number, too.

Strader and Brooks were one-two in the shot put, as Strader threw beyond 51 feet, and Brooks was out past 50 feet for the first time this season.

In the discus, Brooks was an easy winner with his best throw ever, a heave which measured just beyond 149 feet. Ryan placed fourth in the event for the Leafs. In all, that totals to 18 Geneseo points in the weights alone — more than any other team scored in all six field events!

Early in the finals of the running events, the Leafs got a one-three finish from Gary Ong and Dennis Robertson. That put Genesee shead by 20 points, and the Leafs needed only to gain place finished the rest of the way, in several events, in order to secure victory.

Ong clocked :15.5 in the 110-meter high hurdles, which is the same time when converted to the time that would be equivalent for the 120-yard high hurdles.

In all, the Leafs won five events, and placed second in three others.

Princeton had its usual strength in the distance events, but the Tigure lacked the really tough sprinters they usually feature.

Rock Falls had outstanding sprint speed, but the Rockets were not strong in the hurdles, and were in need of more sock in the field events.


Hall hurt both Princeton and Rock Falls - everyone, for that matter - which a fine bevy of sprinters. The Red Devils, though, lacked power in the field, scoring just one of their 42 points away from the track.

The 400-meter relay was an outstanding race, with Rock Falls, Hall and Genesco all cracking the former meet record. The converted Rock Falls time was the same as a :44.9 440-relay, while Genesco ran the equivalent of a :45.8.

The metric mile was a good race, between two fine performers. Steve Arch of Princeton and Larry Schuldt of Rock Palls. Arch passed Schuldt in the final turn, and won in the mile equivalent of 4:28.5. Doug Longman gave Geneseo a solid, important third place finish, and ran with the leaders for about three laps. His time was a converted 4:38.6.

The meet was the second all-metric Princeton Invitational, which makes it the oldest all-metric meet in Illinois. The Bryant Field track is now a perfect 400 meters around – not 440 yards. Sterling will be converting to all-metric, soon, too.

As usual, the meet was efficiently run by Princeton officials, who seem to enjoy hosting this annual meet for the six league schools.

Geneseo's Wayne Strader is set to put the shot during Tuesday's Princeton invitational, and this is his winning throw — 15.55 meters, which is a bit farther than 51 feet. Dennis Brooks was second

with a toss of over 50 feet. In all, Leaf weightmen Ed Ryan, Brooks and Strader combined for 18 Geneseo points — more than any other team in the meet compiled in all six field events.
