Team Geneseo overpowers opponents in combined meet

"Team Geneseo" did it again. Geneseo's girls and boys track teams joined forces Tuesday night May 9 to win the H.F. Brockman Relays in Kewanee for the second straight year.

Geneseo's girls broke two meet records, although they were nipped by Peoria Limestone for top honors in their division.

No matter. The team trophy goes to the school with highest combined boys and girls score. And Geneseo's boys creamed their foes.

Relays counted 10 points for a first in this meet—and Geneseo's boys won six of the seven relays that were contested!

In addition, Geneseo boys swept the top two places in three of the six field events.

The girls were nipped 64½-58 by Limestone for division honors. The boys, though, scored 96 points, to just 63 for Kewanee. As it turned out, the boys could have won the whole thing without the girls—but rest assured, both the Leaf boys and girls were glad the other was around.

Geneseo totaled 154 points for first. Kewanee was second with 94, and really, throw out Geneseo's score, and it was quite a track meet. Limestone scored 93½, Dixon had 90, Princeton had 87, and Aledo scored 59.

Jacque Fields of Geneseo won the shot put at 36 feet, 5 inches, a meet record. Leaf Julie Luetke

Geneseo's all-freshman-sophomore relay team of Jacquie Carton, Jan Jacobs, Kelli Davis and Tina Booth put on quite a show.

They ran the frosh-soph 440 relay and won it in :51.8, the second meet record for Geneseo. The very next race was the varsity 440 relay, and the same four girls won that one, although they slowed down to :52.9 and missed the record—barely.

Then, a bit later, those same four came back and cruised to victory in the 880 relay.

Diane Fortune was second in the discus, and Jacobs got a second in the long jump.

The only record for the Leaf boys came when Geneseo won an event being contested for the first time, the 880 medly relay. Runners were Dave M. Anderson, Jeff Chadd, Scott Rink, and Dave R. Anderson.

Geneseo won another hurdle shuttle relay..but then, you can see the complete relay story below in the results.

In the field events, Jeff DeNeve and Bob Korthals were one-two in the pole vault, DeNeve clearing 11-6. Dave M. Anderson and Lance Hofer were one-two in the triple jump, Anderson leaping 40 feet, 3 inches. And Randy Russell and Dennis Robertson went one-two in the long jump. Russell going 19 feet, 4 1/4 inches for the blue ribbon.
