## Trackmen win in the pits; Rock Falls, Kewanee fall

Out where most of the people were watching-on the track-Rock Falis looked pretty good in Tuesday night's track meet involving the Rockets, Geneseo and Kewanee.

But over in the pits, Geneseo won the track meet.

The Maple Leafs made use of vast superiority over Rock Falls in the field events to offset the Rockets' edge in speed, and Geneseo beat Rock Falls and Kewanee in a meet on Geneseo's track.

Final taily: Geneseo 76, Rock Falls 59, and Kewanee 44.

It was a more competitive meet than it had been for several years. Rock Falls has a number of fine athletes in the running events, and Kewanee has more boys (70) out for track than it has had out in years. The Boilers opened their season with a win over Princeton, and few in Kewanee remember the last time Kewanee best Princeton in track.

Rock Falls, with blazing sophomore Ted Nehrkorn leading the way, scored 50 points in 11 track events, compared to 87 by Genesso.

But in the six field events, the Leafs had a whopping 29-9 edge on Rock Palls.

Geneseo took first and second in three field events-the pole

vault, and the triple and long jumps.

Geneseo won eight events, to six by Rock Falls, and three wins by Kewanse.

Geneseo fans had reason to be uneasy as the meet wore down to the last running event, the mile relay. Rock Falls had a five-point lead after the next-to-last event, the 220-yard dash.

But, the pole vault and triple jump results hadn't been reported, and the high jump hadn't been completed. As it turned out, Genesee had such a large margin that the mile relay wouldn't have mattered.

But, it mattered plenty to Geneseo's crack mile relay quartet of Eric Reschke, Dave Hillman, Dan Carton and Dave "Red" Anderson.

They ran an excellent clecking of 3:32.3, clipping about from recentle off their time in the Northwest Relays. Already, they're within five seconds of the school record, and the qualifying time for the State Meet.

Anderson earlier ran a fine :52.1 to win the open 440. He won the race in the first 330 yards, hitting that mark in :37.5, which is the time needed to maintain pace for a 50-second quarter. Wind in the north turns were a factor in this meet, and

may have slowed Anderson a bit. Red's goal is to break the school record of :60.5 set in 1971 by Roger Boyd, then to take the mark below 50 seconds.

The other Dave Anderson, the tail junior known as "Bones" by some, fueled Geneseo's surge in the field events by winning both the long and triple jumps. Anderson soured 19 feet, 7 inches, barely beating Randy Russell again, this time by a whole inch-and-a-quarter. In the triple jump, Anderson went 42 feet, 9½ inches, three feet farther than second-place Lance Hofer.

In the pole vault, Bob Korthals picked up his first win of the season, clearing 12-0 to edge teammate Derrick Skiles.

Norm Singbush cleared 5 feet, 10 inches to win the high jump, and sophomore Keith Kincaid stayed shead the last lap to win the 880 in 2:05.1.

Geneseo also got a win from its two-mile relay team of Dave Mitchell, Kirk Hodgson, Greg Myers, and Kincaid.

Rock Fall's state class sprinter, Ted Nehrkorn, won both dash events, but got good competition from Geneseo's "Bones" Anderson.

Anderson exploded from the blocks and led for 90 yards. Nehrkorn, who is a weak starter in the first place, kept his head down and caught Anderson 10 yards from the finish, then beat him by a half-step to the tape. His time: :1018. Anderson recorded :10.85 in his first 100-yard race of the spring.

Nehrkorn was stronger in the 220, winning in :23.5, but Anderson's clocking was a

respectable :24.0.

The only other double winner in the meet was Kewanee weightman Bruce Hadsall, who heaved the shot 48 feet, 11% inches, and spun the discus 138 feet, 7% inches. Geneseo, though, swept the next three places in the discus, and took second and fourth in the shot, outscoring Rock Falls 10-2 in those two events, an important

aspect of the Geneseo victory.

## Soph thinclads thunder to triangular victories

Geneseo's frosh-soph boys track team has crushed four schools in rolling to a pair of wins in its first two triangular meets of the season.

Tuesday night of this week, the Leaflets were overwhelming, winning 15 of 17 events to bounce Kewanes and Rock Falls. Geneseo scored 104 points, to 42 for Kewanes, and 33 by Rock Falls.

Kevin DeBlieck won both hurdle races for Genesso, Scott Rink won the 100 and 220-yard dashes, and Brad Fleming took the long and triple jump events.

Geneseo didn't win quite so many events in its first meet of the season, back on March 31 on the Geneseo track, but the results were about the same.

The Leaflets claimed nine of the 17 events, and rolled up 108½ points. Monmouth was second at 44½, and Hall totaled 26.

DeBlieck and Fleming were double winners for Geneseo.
