A week ago, the meet would have been "under the lights." Not this week. Nature herself will light the track for a meet Geneseo will be hard-pressed to win.

Geneseo Invitational crown stays at home

Galesburg edged out Geneseo in the 1600 meter relay, traditionally the finale in most track meets. So, the Geneseo Invitational boys meet was over, right?

Wrong! The title lay with the results of two field events: triple jump and pole vault. At that point Friday night, May 4, LaSalle-Peru led the field with 81 points. Down by six, the Leafs gained three as Lance Hofer took a second place in the triple jump. The Cavaliers captured a fifth and one point. It was an 82-79 margin when Bruce Borkgren, Geneseo's premier pole vaulter, took his best shot and it was good, very good. He won his event and Geneseo won their own meet.

Geneseo faced fierce competition throughout the meet, making a dandy invitational. Several conference schools gathered at Geneseo's track giving a glimpse of the NCIC tournament at Sterling on Friday, May 11.

Two miscues and an injury hurt the Leafs in four events. Handoff problems plagued the varsity 200 meter relay and the frosh-soph 400 meter relay teams. Bryan Colbert fell during the 3200 meter run and was kept from running in the 1600 meter event by the injury.

Geneseo's relay teams were edged in all but two races. The 200 meter high hurdle and 440 low hurdle shuttle relay teams made it look easy in their wins. The only other Leaf winner was Brad Fleming in the long jump.
