

LEAFS SOAR TO NEW HEIGHTS

LEAFS CLAIM A SCHOOL RECORD . . . 7 ALL-STATE MEDALS

On Saturday, May 30th, the Leafs participated in the IHSA State Finals in FIVE EVENTS. That is a school record and the Leafs scored 19 points to place 11th overall (the highest State Meet finish since 1893!) Our special day got started when Junior Will Daniels grabbed 7th place in the Long Jump by sailing 21' 05 3/4". Will was sitting in 11th after the Prelims and climbed up to 8th place with his first jump in the Finals of 21' 05 1/4". He then added a 1/2" on his last jump to move into 7th Place. The competition was extremely close as Will's jump was only 2 3/4" ahead of 12th place. Will became the first Geneseo Maple Leaf to EVER earn All-State Honors in the Long Jump.

Next up was the 3200 Meter Relay team of Nick Swartzendruber, Nathan Soria, David Chenoweth, and Cayson Frerichs. In case you didn't know....that is a freshman, sophomore, sophomore and a veteran senior. Freshman Nick Swartzendruber led off with an impressive split of 2:02 and had us right in the hunt. Sophomore Nathan Soria followed that up with another 2:02 leg and some gutsy racing after going out in 56 seconds. The Leafs were sniffing All-State Hardware and it was time for Senior David Chenoweth who did his best to make sure that would become a certainty by throwing down a 1:58.14cr Lifetime Best as he moved the Leafs into 5th Place. Anchorman Cayson Frerichs held off several teams with a solid 2:01 that saw him barely miss grabbing 4th place. This is the first time in school history that the Leafs have earned All-State Honors in the 3200 Meter Relay.

Arthur Atwell was the next Leaf to compete as the Pole Vault got rolling. Arthur and vault coach Steve Sulfridge "rolled the dice" trying to win the whole thing utilizing a strategy that had him come in at 14' 00" He cleared that on his 2nd attempt and screamed YES! He had at least 4th place locked up (only 4 men still in the hunt.) They then skipped the next height of 14' 03" and waited for 14' 06". At that point only one jumper was still in the competition. Arthur put forth 3 great attempts and just missed clearing the bar. It was awesome to witness Arthur jump the fence (you're not supposed to do that) and go give his mom a MONSTER HUG. Arthur became the first Leaf since Forrest Lowes accomplished that feat back in 1893. SERIOUSLY! Way to go, Art! Being only a junior, Arthur is already "chomping at da bit" for 2016. So am I :)

Just after the 2A High Jump got started, thunderstorms rolled in and forced a 2-hour weather delay. The jumping events that were not completed were all moved indoors into EIU's indoor fieldhouse. Will Daniels continued his day by clearing 5' 11" outdoors before moving indoors.

There was a clerical error and they moved the bar to "evens" by mistake. After allowing the athletes to get their marks re-set, Will cleared 6' 00" and 6' 02" before barely missing his 3rd attempt at 6' 04" He was pretty bummed but he enjoyed a wonderful season. The best news yet is he is only a junior. Look out next year!

Closing our our day was Freshman Reed Vanderheyden who toed the line in the 300 Meter Intermediate Hurdles. Reed was running out of lane two and had "that look" of DESIRE AND PURPOSE as the gun was fired. He proceeded to "roar" to a Fifth Place finish in a time of 38.53

that DESTROYED his own School Record. He ran powerfully and in control the whole race. It is simply jaw-dropping to think that Reed is only a freshman and still has 3 years of high school left. Even more impressive is the fact that he was racing with a hip flexor injury that has limited both his training and racing the last several weeks. Heal up and get ready to "tear it up" in the coming years. DREAM BIG!

STATE PRELIMS

After a trying trip that lasted 9 hours (engine trouble), the Leafs finally arrived at the EIU dorms at 9:30 p.m. on Thursday, May 28th. The team has overcome adversity all season long and this trip certainly added another chapter to that. Making the annual trip to Charleston is always an experience and to have 12 Men (along with the coaches) made it extra special. I always refer to Eastern Illinois University as the "Harvard of the Midwest"....yeah....I attended EIU "a few" years ago. Mrs. Chenoweth actually found a picture of our 1979 XC team and shared it with the lads (yes...I did have "rock and roll" hair at one point in my life.)

We tried something different this year in the week leading up to State by practicing before school at 6:30 a.m. It was a bit ugly but I feel certain that the benefits of getting used to getting up early and being ready to roll came to fruition as every single man competed extremely well.

Our morning got started with junior Will Daniels competing in the Long Jump in flight one at 8:00 a.m. Will upset the form chart as he was seeded 18th following his Personal Best (which he set at the Sectional Meet) by qualifying for Saturday's final with a early morning jump of 21' 00 1/4".

What a great way to start the day. I am certain that Will's success had a positive influence on his teammates. Will then joined the High Jump competition and sailed over 5' 11, 6' 01", and then 6' 03" to qualify for Saturday's State Finals.

Next up was the 3200 Meter Relay Team who competed in the 2nd of 3 heats. The times were a bit slower than we had predicted but a strong south wind certainly had a lot to do with that. Freshman Nick Swartzendruber (2:04), sophomore Nathan Soria (2:03), senior Tri-Captain David Chenoweth (1:59), and sophomore Cayson Frerichs (2:04) placed 2nd in their heat (missed winning it by 4/100's of a second) and qualified for the STATE FINALS clocking the 8th fastest time of the day. Each man put forth strong efforts but left the track wanting more. That is a good thing.

Junior Arthur Atwell made the most of his 2nd time competing in the STATE MEET by clearing 13' 06" on one jump and then put his poles away for tomorrow's Saturday STATE FINALS. Vault Coach Steve Sulfridge pulled a "Super Man" feat by working his shift as a State Trooper and then driving down to Charleston and being their to help guide Arthur. Before he finally laid his head down in his dorm room for a 12-hour "nap", Steve was pushing 27 hours of going without sleep. There was some pretty heavy breathing coming from his room Friday night :)

Next up was senior Tri-Captain Josh Beard who competed in a "loaded" Triple Jump field. Josh was in the first of three flights. Josh won his flight with a strong jump of 42' 07" which was a full foot better than the next best jumper in his flight. When the dust had settled and flights two and three had been contested, Josh was sitting 15th. He barely missed qualifying for the State Finals by a mere 3 places. Josh enjoyed a tremendously successful high school career and Coach Roger Haynes of Monmouth College is going to be VERY glad to have this youngster on his roster in 2016 and beyond.

The long list of competing Leafs continued with Freshman Reed Vanderheyden as he toed "da line" in the 2nd of four heats in the 300 Intermediate Hurdles. Reed had also qualified in the 110 Meter High Hurdles but we, collectively, decided to "scratch" him due to a lingering hip flexor injury that has hampered his training and racing over the last several weeks. The 110's seem to really flair it up so he threw all of his "chips" into the 300's. The gamble paid off BIG TIME when he raced to a time of 40.09 and qualified for the STATE FINALS on Saturday. Reed was visibly unhappy with his time and race. Both were certainly affected significantly by a strong south wind that he faced during his race. The bottom line on Friday, is to try to qualify for Saturday's Final. Mission accomplished. Add in the fact that Reed is only a Freshman and you'll find a HUGE smile on anyone who is a fan of the Maple Leafs.

The last Leaf to compete was Junior Quinn Singbush. Quinn has been dealing with a severe case of shin splints that has hampered his training and racing for quite a while. He has overcome that discomfort to accomplish many great feats this season. Pretty amazing for a junior who hasn't run Track since 8th grade. Needless to say, Quinn has been an unexpected boost to our team and in addition to his individual event success in both the 100 and 200 meter dashes, his contributions to our 400 and 800 Meter Relay Teams has been profound. Quinn's time was hindered by a strong head wind but he competed well and was still "in it" with 80 meters to go. After that the field pulled away but he should hold his head high as he enjoyed a MONSTER season. We are proud (and thankful) to have you "wearin' da green" with us!

Geneseo sends quintet into 2A state finals


CHARLESTON — All of the anxiety and nerves circulating within Reed Vanderheyden on Friday morning had the Geneseo freshman hurdler pacing near the finish line at O'Brien Field. Placing second in his Class 2A 300-meter hurdles state preliminary race meant waiting for him to see if the finish advanced him to the finals.

"I did not think that was going to happen," Vanderheyden said.

What actually happened was historical.

Despite being unhappy with his 40.09-second finish and thinking his season was over, Vanderheyden was able to qualify for the finals as the seventh seed. As long as he completes the race this afternoon, he becomes the first hurdler with a state medal in boys' program history.

"I'm happy I got into the finals, but I'm disappointed the race went like that," said Vanderheyden, a two-time junior-high state champion. "I didn't think the race would go like that. I was prepared for the race, I was strong and I was focused."

Vanderheyden still was frustrated by his performance to see the magnitude of the moment after it became official. Geneseo coach Don Fredericks spoke for him not long after the qualifying

berth was secured and history was made.

"That's amazing. That's huge," Fredericks said. "And he's only a freshman."

Saying he went out too fast and was unable to establish

a consistent rhythm, Vanderheyden, who scratched the 110 hurdles because of a nagging hip flexor, stayed near the front for the entire race.

When he crossed the finish line and saw the time, he was visibly upset. That set off a 10-minute pacing session that had the heart pumping. Once the advancement became official, Vanderheyden was more excited about getting one more race to improve.

"It's a chance to redeem myself," Vanderheyden said.

One individual set a new standard in the preliminaries. Two other events can end extended droughts today.


Geneseo has a chance to earn its first relay medal in 25 years after the 4x800 advanced to the finals with the seventh seed. Senior David Chenoweth, sophomores Cayson Frerichs and Nathan Soria and freshman Nick Swartzendruber finished second in the preliminary race in 8:11.29.

"We really didn't think we would run a good 4-by-8 this year," Frerichs said. "We've come together and we've fought hard. Going into finals, it will be great for us and our confidence."

Sitting fifth in the last 100 meters, Frerichs made a move to the outside of the pack and sprinted toward the finish. He crossed the finish line fourth-hundredths of a second behind the winner.

"I was surprised I had more in the tank," Frerichs said. "I had quite a bit of energy left."

Junior Arthur Atwell is

one of 12 individuals who reached the pole vault finals. Atwell, a state finalist last year, had a 13-foot, 6-inch vault, tying him for the top mark with seven others. The Maple Leafs have not earned a medal in the event since 1893.

"I placed 13th last year," Atwell said. "This year, I want a medal. I've prepared myself well for this."

In the high jump and long jump, junior Will Daniels advanced in both. Daniels is one of 14 participants who cleared 6-3 in the high jump and his 21-0 $\frac{1}{4}$ long jump places him tied for 10th. The top nine individuals in each event earn a medal.

"Once you make finals, anything can happen," Daniels said. "It's fun from here."

Although only one finalist is guaranteed a medal, the Maple Leafs have a chance to win five today. Geneseo has never won more than three in a single state meet.

"We had a lot of days where we had no one in the finals," Fredericks said. "To have that many alive, we're happy."

Yodts advances: Alleman junior Kyler Yodts sits third in the shot put entering the finals after a 53-foot, 3-inch toss. Yodts, a first-time state qualifier, seeks the Pioneers' first state medal since 2013.

"I want to hit that 55-foot mark," Yodts said. "I'm not trying to chase anybody. I'm trying to throw my best. That's the plan."

In previous meets, Yodts said his best distances come as the meet progresses.

"I'd say I'm saving the best for last," Yodts said.

Neither Alleman senior Andrew Lekowski (133-11) nor sophomore Nathan Graves (130-7) advanced to the discus finals. Senior Brady Hoskins scratched all three of his triple jumps.

Erie-Prophetstown junior Dylan Binion qualified for the 110 hurdles finals as the ninth seed. Binion, who finished in 15.03, will earn the program's first-ever Class 2A medal.

"I stumbled out of the blocks, but (the race) went pretty well the rest of the way," Binion said. "I really wanted (to make the finals), but I didn't know if I could be able to. I knew I had to run well to make it. An awesome feeling to make it."



Geneseo track soars to new heights

CHARLESTON — Remembering that it shared the Northern Illinois Big 12 Conference title and won a sectional crown, the Geneseo boys' track team truly believed success would not be required at the Class 2A state meet to confirm it had a strong season.

"But," Geneseo junior jumper Will Daniels said, "it definitely helps."

The finish provided an exclamation point for the Maple Leafs' run.

Earning a program-record four medals — including its first in the 4x800-meter relay, hurdles and long jump — at O'Brien Field on Saturday afternoon, Geneseo capped its season with its deepest showing at the state meet. Other days may have featured a state champion, but the sheer number of accolades make this run different.

"It's awesome to be part of a special team in Geneseo's history," Daniels said. "We have people on our team who can stand toe to toe with some of the best in the state. We have depth, and we have a few big guns who can do some things."

Three of the four events featured top-five finishes, with junior Arthur Atwell leading the charge. Atwell

had a 14-foot clear in the pole vault, taking fourth overall for the program's first medal in the event since 1893.

"I wanted first," Atwell said, "but I can't wait to try again next year."

Making his state debut, freshman Reed Vanderheyden placed fifth in the 300-meter hurdles with a personal-best time of 38.53. Vanderheyden gives the Maple Leafs boys their first hurdling medal.

"I felt good," Vanderheyden said. "I went in there and gave it my all. I'm extremely proud of myself."

For the third time overall, and first since 1990, Geneseo earned a relay state medal. Senior David Chenoweth, sophomores Cayson Frerichs and Nathan Soria and freshman Nick Swartzendruber ran an 8:03.71 during a fifth-place 4x800 finish.

The quartet started running the relay together exactly one month ago.

"Once we ran that first 4-by-8, we thought that this could really be a great relay," Chenoweth said. "It was a goal (to win a medal), but to see it happen is so surreal."

Daniels actually started the day with history, soaring 21-5 3/4 in a seventh-place long jump finish. The medal is the program's first in the event.

"I didn't think I would make it to state. I didn't think I would make it to finals. I didn't think I would medal," Daniels said. "I guess it shows I should have more confidence."

Based on what went down this weekend, the Maple Leafs should exit state with confidence. Four medals obviously is a good showing for a program that went years without getting one.

The best part? Six of the seven individuals who had

medal-earning finishes return next year.

"We're going to be even better," Vanderheyden said. "It's going to be crazy."

Yodts takes third: Alleman junior Kyler Yodts' heave of 54-5½ in the shot put gave him third place. The personal-best throw came on his second attempt in the finals.

"I really wanted 55 (feet), but you have to be excited about getting a medal and bringing one home," Yodts said. "Getting a (personal best) is good enough."

The Pioneers earned

their first medal since 2013 and also their highest finish in a field event.

"That's crazy to think that I'm able to do that in a sport that I'm not overly concerned about," Yodts said. "It's surreal."

Erie-Prophetstown junior Dylan Binion snagged the program's first-ever Class 2A medal by placing fourth in the 110 hurdles. Binion completed the race in 14.91.

"I didn't expect to do this well," Binion said. "That feels awesome."

Eiker earns two golds: Junior Josh Eiker won the 100

and 200 state titles, helping Galesburg tie for second place with 37 points. Eiker set a state record in the 200 with a 21.2 clocking. His title-winning 100 time was 10.57.

Eiker becomes the third athlete in Western Big 6 Conference history to win the 100 and 200 crowns, joining Rock Island's Thomas Adams (1984) and Tim Newsome (1989). United Township's Merlyn Hood accomplished the feat in 1969, a year before the league crowned a track champion.

Leafs set new standard at state

An historic season for the Geneseo boys' track team left coach Don Fredericks dusting off the record books searching for an equivalent effort.

It makes sense considering this season's team left many of the Maple Leafs' records in the dust.

The Leafs capped the season by earning four medals at the IHSA 2A state meet and had five competing in the finals on Saturday, May 30.

Geneseo finished tied for 11th place (19 points) in the team race, the best finish for the Leafs since a fourth-place finish in 1893.

"Having success at the state level is a difficult thing to do," Fredericks said.

"We have never had success like this. These guys they didn't just open the door — they kicked it down."

This is unparalleled."

With the Geneseo boys' track team, nothing was unattainable this season.

For the first time in program history, the Leafs medaled in the 4x800 relay, hurdles and long jump.

Prior to six weeks ago, Geneseo's Will Daniels had never competed in the long jump.

Following the IHSA state meet, Daniels was a state medalist.

Daniels finished seventh with a mark of 21'5" to become the first Leafs' long jumper to earn all-state honors.

A junior, Daniels added a 12th place finish in the high jump clearing 6'2".

Led by senior David Chenoweth, the 4x800 relay team was made up of underclassmen Nick Swartzendruber, Nathan Soria and Cayson Frerichs.

The group performed beyond their years, finishing fifth clocking in at 8:03.7, notching another program first for Geneseo.

In the pole vault, Arthur Atwell cleared his jump of 14' on his second attempt freeing him up to go after the leaders.

Atwell was unable to clear the 14'6" mark, which would have earned him second, but he became the first Geneseo pole-vaulter to medal since Forrest Lowes in 1893.

Being cautious, Geneseo's Reed Vanderheyden was scratched from the prelims in the 110-meter hurdles to help him deal with a hip-flexor injury.

Vanderheyden felt disappointed by his time in the prelims of the 300-meter hurdles (40.09), but he still was able to advance to the finals.

The two-time state middle school state champion, Vanderheyden found his top gear in the finals finishing fifth with a school record time of 38.53.

Vanderheyden became the first Geneseo boys athlete to medal in the hurdles, and saw another serious drop from the record time he set earlier in the year at the John McCormick ABC Invite (39.16).

On their way to the state meet, the trip started ominously when the team bus broke down.

And has the Maple Leafs thinking, a trophy might be in their future next season.





NATHAN SORIA, left, runs a relay during the John McCormick Invitational.



QUINN SINGBUSH, left, takes the hand off from August Stamp at the John McCormick Invitational.



QUINN SINGBUSH, left, takes the hand off from August Stamp at the John McCormick Invitational.



LOGAN WEBER runs a relay during the frosh/soph Geneseo Invitational.



CHANDLER SCHWARTS runs a leg of a Geneseo relay during the John McCormick Invitational.



SAM THOMAS launches the shot put during the John McCormick Invitational.



NICK FOX runs determinedly during the John McCormick Invitational.


