
Geneseo's Atwell ready to soar at state meet

GENESEO — Acceptance is what initially kept Geneseo senior Arthur Atwell from joining the track and field program four years ago.

"I was never good at any events:" Atwell said.

A trip to a gymnastics center changed his perspective.

Waiting for his sister, Shalana, to complete gymnastics practice during his freshman year, Atwell "started messing around on the uneven bars" to kill some time. One of the coaches, who noticed his technique, athleticism and coordination, asked him if we wanted to pole yault on the spot.

Two weeks later, after doing walking drills in preparation, Atwell was vaulting.

"It was something new," Atwell said. "I liked it right away."

Atwell had a gymmastics background, so he could contort his body in a way that made him a prototypical pole vaulter. The experience also helped him get over the fears of being 10 feet in the air.

Two years into this endeayor, Atwell realized he could be good.

His sophomore year featured him qualifying for the Class 2A state meet after reaching the 13-foot mark.

As a junior, the heights kept increasing and he eventually finished fourth in state. The medal was Geneseo's first in the event since 1893.

"Going to state, I really enjoyed the atmosphere," Atwell said. "At that point, I said I wanted to be the best at it. I wanted to win state."

Now that is not a farfetched idea.

A 15-foot, 5-inch clearance at the Mendota Sectional last Friday not only gave him the title, but the top seed at the Class 2A state meet. Atwell's height is five inches better than any other sectional performance.

Clearing the 15-foot mark for the first time in several weeks was a culmination of a process. Atwell finally found the right pole to use in his vault, giving him comfort and confidence heading into the final meet of his prep career.

"I'm more prepared for state this year," Atwell said. "I've been pretty consistent and have had a good season. I have a good chance at winning."

That is the ultimate goal for Atwell, who is the Maple Leafs' only top seed. Winning the pole vault would give Geneseo its second state champion in three years, but also be key in a trophy push.

Ahead of the state meet, which opens Friday at O'Brien Stadium, the Maple Leafs are seeded to score 48 points. Reaching that would give them the chance to win their second state trophy and first in 123 years.

"I want to see us walk home with a state trophy." Atwell said.

Scoring 10 points in the pole vault would help in that quest. He is "OK with the pressure" of delivering

LEAFS QUALIFY 11 TO SATURDAY'S I.H.S.A. FINALS

The Leafs opened the I.H.S.A. State Finals Preliminary round on Friday, May 27th. Action began at 8:00 am on the campus of Eastern Illinois University (AKA...."da Harvard of the Midwest....yeah, Coach Freddy attended school there.) The weather looked ominous as a huge storm front was approaching from the southwest. The I.H.S.A. games committee decided to move all of the field events indoor (except the discus) due to the threatening weather. This "log jammed" the action as there are only one jumping runway for the long jump and triple jump and only one throwing sector for the shot put. The storm front stalled over St. Louis and the threatening weather never hit. It was too bad that they didn't eventually move outdoors. I understand the pressure the the officials are under but it certainly made things more challenging for all of the athletes. None had it tougher than the shot putters who were forced to throw "indoor shots" that they had never touched before. Granted, the same situation existed for all the athletes but it was unfortunate none the less since we had two men in the shot put prelim's who were seeded to advance to the finals.



The Leafs entered the meet having enjoyed a season on unparalleled success and sky-high expectations. After tying for 11th place last year (2nd best team place in school history) the team carried a plethora of experience and confidence into the meet. Onto the meet. In the field events, the Leafs were represented in all six events. Arthur Atwell and Will Daniels easily qualified for Saturday's Finals clearing 13' 03" and 6' 03" in the Pole Vault and High Jump respectfully. Will also qualified for the Finals in both the Long Jump and Triple Jump soaring 21' 03 3/4" (sitting 9th) and 43' 06 3/4" (sitting 10th.) In the Shot Put, Sam Thomas and Josh Mathis battled the challenge of throwing shot puts they had never seen before that were indoor shots (much larger than outdoor shots due to the shells that cover them.) The men fought hard and ended up 12th and 13th with throws of 51' 09 1/2" and 50' 11 1/2" respectfully. The top 12 qualified for Saturday's State Finals. Senior Josh Mathis missed making the finals by a mere one place. Luckily, he still had the Discus to go and he made the most of it. He had every teammate's attention as he was just outside of qualifying after his first two tosses. "Mr. Clutch" came through on his final opportunity heaving the discus 153' 04" to qualify for Saturday's State Finals sitting in 7th place.

Onto the track. The 3200 Meter Relay team of: Nick Swartzendruber, Andrew Benhart, Nathan Soria, and Cayson Frerichs qualified for Saturday's State Finals by winning their heat in a time of 8:05.45 which was the 5th fastest qualifying time. Next up was Andrew Pischke and Reed Vanderheyden who weren't seeded to make the 9 man final but were hoping to "shock da state".

Andrew was up first and blasted out of the blocks and ran a lifetime best of 14.97 that saw him lean so far forward that he was unable to recover and "kissed da track". Reed was up next and got out nicely but had his finals hopes dashed when one of the top seeds started "banging" hurdles and throwing Reed off stride. When "the dust had settled", Andrew "squeaked" in sitting in 9th while Reed just missed and ended up placing 12th overall with a time of 15.30. The 800 Meter Relay was up next with two substitutions inserted to allow Reed and Andrew to have a better opportunity to qualify for the Saturday's State Finals in the 300 Meter Intermediate Hurdles. Quinn Singbush and Lucas Hofer (the other two men who along with Andrew and Reed) had broken the School Record THREE times this season. After seeing that they were seeded 15th, they spoke with Coach Matthew Deets and suggested the idea. That sums up this team....TEAM FIRST. Quinn led off and handed off to Erik Sammons. Logan Weber ran the third leg and handed off to Lucas Hofer who roared home with a fine time of 1:33.42 and ended up 20th in STATE. Up came the 300 I.H.s and Reed and Andrew were in the same heat and placed 1st (38.42) and 4th (39.95) to each qualify for Saturday's State Finals. Reed's time was the fastest of all the prelims. Next up was the 1600 Meter Run where we had asked Nathan Soria to consider NOT racing to save it for the two relays he had also qualified in. After carefully analyzing the circumstances, he decided to sit the 1600 Meter Run out this year. Next up was Senior Quinn Singbush who ran the 200 Meter Dash in a time of 23.70 which placed him 23rd overall in the STATE. Quinn has been nursing a stiff hamstrings and a sore knee for several weeks and was a bit hindered to say the least. He gave it his best as always. Closing out the Leafs day was the 1600 Meter Relay team of: Nick Swartzendruber, Lucas Hofer, Nathan Soria, and Reed Vanderheyden who flew to the 3rd fastest time in school history with a time of 3:22.91 and was the 5th fastest qualifying time. The Leafs were in GREAT SHAPE for Saturday's Finals.

LEAFS EARN THE RESPECT OF THE MIGHTY CAHOKIA COMANCHES


On Saturday, May 28th, the Leafs competed in the I.H.S.A. State Championship FINALS. They had 11 qualifiers and had moved themselves up from a Top 10 Contender to a TROPHY CONTENDER. That dream was certainly far from a "slam dunk" but the possibility was there if "the cards fell

right". The team's highest place ever occurred in 1893 (that's NOT a typo.) For those of you who enjoy history that is 3 years BEFORE the first Olympics were held in Athens, Greece. That is before automobile were available. The first State Meet was held in Champaign, Illinois and Forrest Lowes of Geneseo won both the Triple Jump and the High Jump and placed 2nd in the Pole Vault. He placed 4th as a team all by himself and his winning Triple Jump of 43' 01" still ranks in our school's top 15 ALL-TIME. I don't know if he had to qualify for the meet or if athletes just showed up. Additional events included the Baseball Throw, the High Kick, the Football Kick, the 1-mile Bicycle Race, plus a lot of the traditional events.

The field events started at 10:00 a.m. and Senior Captain Will Daniels didn't waste any time in "jump starting" the Leaf effort when he "soared" 22' 06" on his 5th jump (2nd of the day.....all field events except the High Jump and Pole Vault carry Friday's performances over to Saturday) and literally shocked the field by placing 2nd OVERALL after he was sitting in 9th place after the prelims. That was 8 HUGE points. At the same time, Junior Sam Thomas was competing in the Shot Put. Sam was unable to improve on his preliminary throw and ended up 12th overall and was the 5th returner (the other 7 men were all seniors.) Sam has come a long way in a short time and had a HUGE first throw (4th overall) that was well over 54 feet and would have placed but was unable to stay "in da ring". Great Effort, Sam!

Up next was Arthur Atwell who cleared his opening height of 13' 06" to be "in the money". Coach Moe and I ran over to the tent to wish the 3200 Meter Relay crew "all the best" as they prepared to roll. Nick Swartzendruber handed off the baton in the lead and Andrew Benhart did his best to stay close to Cahokia's second man who was flying. Andrew threw down a lifetime best of 2:01 to keep the Leafs in the hunt but was several seconds back in second. Next up was Junior Nathan Soria who SPRINTED after the Cahokia number three man and caught him a lot quicker than we thought possible. Nathan ROARED past the 400 in 54 seconds as Coach Moe covered his eyes saying "I can't watch this....he's going to tie up". Nathan did slow down (he wasn't going to run 1:48) but did run 1:58 and had the Leafs in front by several seconds. Junior Cayson Frerichs got the stick last and reacted well as the Cahokia anchorman ran him down and took the lead. The two exchanged "jabs" the whole last lap and had all 10,000 fans on their feet as they battled down the homestretch. Cahokia barely beat the Leafs as Cayson (running hurt the last 5 weeks of the season) ran a season best time of TWO FLAT and the Leafs had the second fasted time in school history and 8 critical team points. Back to Arthur Atwell. He then battled his close friend, Tyler Naftzger, from Erie-Prohpetstown. Tyler was guaranteed at least 2nd place when he cleared 14' 03" and then Arthur claimed the title by soaring over 14' 06". He then cleared 15' 00" and barely missed 3 attempts at a new school record (he already had it) at 15' 06". Arthur became the 4th Maple Leaf to win an individual STATE CHAMPIONSHIP. WAY TO GO, ART!

Next up was the final of the 110 Meter High Hurdles where Junior Andrew Pischke had qualified as the 9th and final individual. Andrew exploded out of the blocks and proceeded to run the a magnificent race that saw him wrestle 5th place away from the "loaded field". Andrew's time of 14.90 barely missed the school record by a scant 6/100's of a second. 5 more HUGE points for the Leafs. At about the same time, Senior Josh Mathis was participating in the finals of the Discus where the field was battling 18 to 20 mph head winds (very difficult conditions for the Discus.) Very little movement occurred and Josh's throw from Friday's Preliminary's held onto 8th place and 2 more HUGE points for Geneseo. Way to compete, Josh! About the same time Will


Daniels was completing his busy duties running back and forth between the High Jump and Triple Jump. Will and two other athletes had this difficult challenge. The I.H.S.A. official made it tough because as soon as Will had "checked out" of one event to report to the other, it was announced over the P.A. system that, "Will Daniels from Geneseo needs to report to the ______ immediately or he will be scratched." The same thing was true for the other two men. Will was able to improve on Friday's preliminary jump by jumping 44' 04 3/4" which barely missed "da medals" but placed him 10 overall in THE STATE. In the meantime, Will was having himself quite a day in the High Jump as he cleared 6' 03'; 6' 05', and then 6' 06". That left Will and the two 7 Footers. Will had placed 3RD IN THE STATE and added another HUGE SEVEN TEAM POINTS for "da Leafs".

Things were really exciting as the Leafs were battling mighty Cahokia for the team title. Reed Vanderheyden and Andrew Pischke didn't disappoint when they toed the line in the 300 Meter Intermediate Hurdles. Reed exploded out of the blocks and chased his fellow sophomore and rival, Deion McShane from Freeport while Andrew was doing his best to try and score some critical points for the team in the "loaded field". When the "dust had settled" Reed had destroyed his own school record as he dipped under the magical 38 seconds with a time of 37.86 to place 2nd. Andrew battled every step and placed 9th in 40.62. That's 9 more team points.

The Leafs were trailing Cahokia by only two points as they entered the final event. The Leafs toed the line for the finals of the 1600 Meter Relay as the stadium "buzzed" with excitement. Cahokia was not to be denied their 6th straight title as they ran away with the race winning in an excellent time of 3:20.54. Meanwhile, the Leafs were fighting for every point they could get as Nick Swartzendruber, Lucas Hofer, and Nathan Soria all ran solid races with 51 second legs as the baton was handed off to Super-Soph, Reed Vanderheyden. Reed proceeded to run a lifetime best of 49.54cr to run down several teams in the homestretch and secure a 4th place finish and 6 more TEAM POINTS FOR THE LEAFS. The Leafs had once again out performed their seeds (as a team) and had scored an amazing 55 TEAM POINTS and were the SECOND BEST TEAM IN THE STATE OF ILLINOIS IN 2A!

The team then enjoyed "Pizza on da Freddies" at Pagliai's in Charleston before heading for home. The wonderful day was made even better when Coach Matthew Deets announced that he and his wife Lauryn are expecting their first child in December. WHAT A DAY! The Cubs even WON!




TEAM HONORED AT SCHOOL

Geneseo remains in 2A trophy hunt with 11 events in finals

CHARLESTON—Chasing a Class 2A state trophy would include the Geneseo boys' track and field team experiencing highs and lows with a mixture of surprises in its journey.

Halfway through the Maple Leafs' quest, everything appears positive____

The highs outweighed the lows and the surprises were strong at O'Brien Stadium on Friday morning, keeping the Maple Leafs in the mix for a coveted trophy. Geneseo will

have 11 scoring opportunities in today's finals after a business-like preliminary display.

'We knew we had the potential," Geneseo senior jumper Will Daniels said. "It looks like we're starting to realize some of that. There will be better

things to come (today)." Seeking a first top 10 finish since 1893 and its first state trophy, Geneseo had only two events — the 200-meter dash and 4x200 relay — eliminated on the first day. The surprise came on the track, with junior Andrew Pischke making a

move in the 110 hurdles.

Seeded 12th entering the day, Pischke grabbed the ninth and last qualifying spot after finishing his race in 14.97 seconds. His move gives the Maple Leafs 26 seeded points on the track, an increase of five based on prelim seeds.

"There was some pressure," Pischke said. "(Geneseo coach Don Fredericks) told us at the beginning of the week we were seeded to contend for a trophy. I knew I had to really dig deep and give it all I've

Pischke and sophomore Reed Vanderheyden both advanced from the same 300 hurdles preliminary race. Vanderheyden clocked the best time in 38.42 seconds and Pischke sits seventh at 39.95.

Geneseo and Chicago Morgan Park are the only teams with two finalists in the same running event.

"The big picture is the team," Vanderheyden said.
"All of us are putting in the effort and doing our part. This is something special. We can really do something great."

The day went better than expected, with Geneseo exceeding its seed points by seven. Within one hour of the first event, the Maple Leafs already had 26 points.

Juniors Andrew Benhart and Nathan Soria and sophomores Nick Swartzendruber and Cayson Frerichs placed second in the 4x800-meter relay, giving Geneseo its highest relay medal and eight points. Daniels placed second in the long jump with a career-best mark of 22-feet, 6-inches.

Capping the start was senior Arthur. Atwell, who cleared 15-feet to win the pole vault.

"It was definitely a team effort," said Atwell, the Maple Leafs' second state champion in three years. "Everybody gave us points."


Senior Josh Mathis netted one point with a ninth-place discus finish and junior Andrew Pischke, seeded 12th entering the state meet, placed fifth in the 110 hurdles. At that point, the Maple Leafs had 32 points.

Daniels finished his day with a thirdplace high jump medal, followed by sophomore Reed Vanderheyden and Pischke taking second and ninth, respectively, in the 300 hurdles.

"Everyone stepped up," Vanderheyden said. "Everyone did the best they could."

Guaranteed a state trophy entering the last event, the Maple Leafs trailed Cahokia by two points. The Comanches won the 4x400, but Vanderheyden, Swartzendruber, Soria and junior Lucas Hofer placed fourth.

Geneseo finished with 11 more points

than third-place finisher Chicago Morgan Park.

"Everybody showed up ready to compete and do better than they were supposed to do," Soria said.


The last Illinois Quad-Cities Metro team to finish as the state runner-up was Rock Island in 2003.

For the second time, and first since 1893, Geneseo has a top three state finish. The runner-up trophy is its best result ever.

"When you go into athletics, you dream about having moments like these," longtime Geneseo coach Don Fredericks said as he fought back tears. "To actually have that come to fruition, it's beyond my wildest dreams. It will take a long time for this to sink in."

Pioneers take 3rd in Class 1A; Maple Leafs finish 2nd in 2A

CHARLESTON, Ill. — As the events progressed and medals mounted, track and field teams from Alleman and Geneseo marched toward history Saturday at the Illinois boys state meet at O'Brien Stadium.

The most medals Geneseo had ever won at one state meet was the four it took home last year. The Maple Leafs more than doubled that Saturday, earning nine medals and finishing second in the Class 2A team standings with 55 points. Cahokia finished six secutive team title.

"I am extremely proud and I keep pinching myself to see if it will wake me up from a dream," Geneseo coach Don Fredericks said. "It's just so beyond what I ever envisioned us being able to accomplish. As the season progressed, we obviously realized we had something special."

And spurred by a shot put title by senior Kyler Yodts, Alleman finished third in the Class 1A standings with 31 points and had six medals to win its first-ever team trophy. New Berlin claimed the 1A title with 46 points. St. Bede was second with 32.

Yodts became just the second Alleman athlete to win an individual state title and first-ever to win a title in a field event with a points ahead for its sixth con- heave of 60 feet, 7 inches to win

the shot put by nearly six feet. The Northern Iowa signee was third in Class 2A last year.

"I had a lot of momentum from last year and coming out here this year, knowing I could come out here and throw big throws this weekend," Yodts said. "The biggest question was, could I duplicate the big throws? To come out here and throw 60-7 and have a big throw at the end, it's something I take a lot of pride it. To say I am a champion is huge."

Alleman junior Nathan Graves took third in the discus (169-10) and seventh in the triple jump (43-71/4). Senior Connor Rafferty earned Alleman's first-ever medal in the 200-meter dash by placing fifth in 22.68 seconds and

anchored the Pioneers' eighthplace 800 relay team that also included John Huntley, Seth Sottos and Kelan Whan. Senior Aaron Golding added a sixth-place finish in the 3,200 (9:45.54).

Outshined by schools from larger classes in many meets, the Pioneers got their moment in the spotlight

Saturday.

"Words cannot describe how proud I am of them, how they stuck together, and these guys run in a lot of big meets," Alleman coach Kenny Lee said. "They don't win a lot of things, but they understand how to compete and that's what they did."

Senior Arthur Atwell was Geneseo's lone state champion, taking first in the pole vault by clearing 15 feet. He was fourth last year.

"There's nothing better than I could've asked for. There were a lot of people who expected me to win," Atwell said.

Senior Will Daniels was second in the long jump (22-6) and third in the triple jump (6-6) to rack up points for the Maple Leafs' team total.

"(A team trophy) means everything. We felt all year we were a pretty special team in Geneseo history," Daniels said.

Among other medalists for Geneseo, sophomore Reed Vanderheyden was second in the 300 hurdles (37.86), junior Andrew Pischke was fifth in the 110 hurdles (14.90) and ninth in the 300 hurdles (40.62), and Josh Mathis was eighth in the discus (153-2). Geneseo also got second in the 3,200 relay and fourth in the 1,600 relay.

Erie-Prophetstown took eighth in the 2A team standings with 25 points thanks in part to senior Dylan Binion, who was second in the 110 hurdles (14.57) and sixth in the long jump (21-10 ½). E-P's Tyler Naftzger and Kyle Kruthoff took second and eighth in the pole vault, respectively, and Jack Heflin was seventh in the shot put (54-3 ¾).

The only other local 1A state champion besides Yodts was Rockridge's 1,600 relay team of Alex Harris, Anthony Coppess-Buikema, Nathan Parchert and Dylan Peterson, which won in 3:26.73.

Annawan-Wethersfield's Alex Landwehr was fourth in the 400, Fulton's Rodney Gossard was fifth in the triple jump and on the Steamers' second-place 800 relay team, and Mercer County's 800 relay team took fourth.

Rocky's Foulks shines in 3A: Rock Island senior Tyler Foulks joined rare company Saturday, becoming the fifth Rock Island male athlete to win four medals at a state meet.

Foulks took fifth in the 100 (10.69) and eighth in the 200 (22.76). He also ran on Rock Island's fourth-place 400 relay team with Doug Wilson, Courtney Lindsey and Andre McKinney (42.05) and was on the fourth-place 800 relay team with Lindsey, McKinney and Carlon Steward (1:27.47).

Galesburg's Josh Eiker won both the 100 (10.48) and 200 (21.66) after doing the double last year in Class 2A.


Foulks joins Thomas Adams (1984), Tim Newsone (1989), Aaron Taylor (1994) and Ben Sparkman (2009) as the only Rocks to win four medals at one state meet.

"It really is a big accomplishment. As a varsity runner for the last two years, I've come a long way," Foulks said. "It means a lot because a lot of great athletes come out of Rock Island and for me to be the fifth one is a big accomplishment."

Moline's Darius King became the Maroons' first shot put medalist since 2011 by taking fourth with his throw of 59-2. The Northern Iowa signee was within two feet of champion John Meyer of Lockport Township (61-2).



"We've expected these

performances all year," said Geneseo senior Will Daniels, who finished second in the long jump and third in the high jump. "To see it happen is the big shock. This confirms everything."

Some wondered if the Maple Leafs were as good as their depth after winning the sectional by 100 points. Only one team proved to be better in the biggest meet of the season.

Two relays settled in with top five seeds. Vanderheyden joined juniors Nathan Soria and Lucas Hofer and sophomore Nick Swartzendruber in the 4x400 that finished in 3:22.91. The time gives Geneseo the fourth seed.

Soria and Swartzendruber joined juniors Andrew Benhart and Cayson Frerichs in the 4x800, which scored the fifth seed in 8:05.45.

"Everybody," Soria said, "is excited and ready to make some noise."

The field events did their part, too. All six events have a representative.

Top-seeded senior Arthur Atwell needed one attempt for a 13-foot, 3-inch pole vault clearance, sending him into the finals. Atwell is seeking the Maple Leafs' first state title in the event.

"This felt great," Atwell said. 'It was a nice warmup for the final. I didn't have to take many jumps, so I didn't wear myself out at all. That will save me and help me a lot for the finals."

Daniels had some anxious moments jumping indoors, but survived and advanced in the three jumps. He is one of 13 individuals who cleared 6-3 in the high jump and sits ninth in the long jump (21-3.75) and 10th in the triple jump (43-6.75).

"I'm not really happy with the distances," Daniels said. "(Today) will be a lot better day."

Senior Josh Mathis (discus) and junior Sam Thomas (shot put) sit seventh and 12th, respectively, heading into finals. The addition of both

Panthers advance four: Erie-Prophetstown qualified four individuals in five events. Senior Dylan Binion, who finished second in his heat, grabbed

the fourth seed in the 110 hurdles in 14.71. Binion is guaranteed his second consecutive state medal in the event.

"I ran a good race," Binion said.





old during state runner-up finish

This year, Arthur Atwell became the fourth boys' track athlete to earn a state championship in Geneseo history winning the pole vault by clearing 15'0".

Fredericks said Atwell would be in the team photo as one of the hardest working Geneseo athletes the school has ever seen.

"The more you invest, the more it means to you," Fredericks said.

The Leafs' Will Daniels showed his grit by having to perform under the threat of disqualification.

"With Will triple jumping and high jumping at the same time." Fredericks said, "He and two other boys kept being threatened to be disqualified if they didn't report to the high jump or the triple jump. It's something that the IHSA is going to need to work on because you can't be in both places at the same time."

Daniels earned All-Sate honors in

both events finishing runner up in the long jump with a mark of 22'6", and he finished third in the high jump clearing 6'6".

"Will handled it extremely well," said Fredericks. "He was not supposed to get third in the high jump, but he did. With all the jumping and running back in forth, I'm blown away by that."

Daniels added a 10th-place finish in the triple jump 44'4.75", and he scored 15 points for Geneseo, a school record for an individual.

The Maple Leafs' 4x800-meter relay team of Nick Swartzendruber, Andrew Benhart, Nathan Soria and Cayson Frerichs raced to a runner-up finish in 8:00.7.

"It was one of the greatest races I've ever witnessed," Fredericks said. "They had this amazing home stretch run. The last couple steps the Cahokia runner barely pulled ahead of (Frerichs)."

Frerichs hurt his upper quad and groin during the season and had been limited by the injury.

"He was back in time for conference and sectionals," said Fredericks. "The question was can he do it two days in a row? He's got the heart of a champion."

After the prelims, Geneseo's Reed Vanderheyden had the top time in the 300 hurdles (38.42).

In the finals, Vanderheyden ran down a school record time of 37.86 to finish runner-up and earn all-state honors.

A sophomore, Vanderheyden earned all-state honors for the second season in the 300 hurdles.

Geneseo had the only tandem to earn All-State honors in hurdles in Class 2A.

Andrew Pischke raced to a ninthplace finish in the 300 hurdles (39.74), and he added a fifth-place time of 14.90 in the 110 hurdles for

another all-state finish.

The Leafs' 4x400 relay team of Swartzendruber, Lucas Hofer, Soria and Vanderheyden nabbed all state honors with a fourth-place finish in 3:23.5.

"The fact that they had been to state and been successful last year was a factor," Fredericks said. "Even the guys who it was their first time there, they didn't seem overwhelmed by the moment."

In the discus, Geneseo senior Josh Mathis uncorked his best throw on the final throw of the day for a mark of 153'4" to finish eighth and earn All-State honors.

Sam Thomas landed in 12th place in the shot put with a throw of 51'9.5"

Mathis was just shy of qualifying in the shot put with a throw of 50'9.5".

The Leafs' 4x200 relay of Quinn Sinbush, Erik Sammons, Logan

Weber and Lucas Hofer finished seventh in their heat (1:33.4) but didn't qualify for the finals.

A captain, Singbush battled through injury to give all he could at state.

"He was not himself the past few weeks," Fredericks said. "He's battled hamstring tightness all season long, and he has a knee injury he sustained during football, which flared back up at the sectional meet. At state, he was not 100 percent."

With the graduation of several key members, Fredericks remain confident that new talent will heb fill the void to help Geneseo cone back strong again next season.

Benhart was on the fence about running track this season, and in his first year he earned All-State honcrs.

"Every school has kids walking the halls with the potential of having that kind of result." Fredericks said











Coach Fredericks: This team had no weakness

GENESEO — Senior jumper Will Daniels views Geneseo boys' track and field coach Don Fredericks as a historian of the sport.

Fredericks does disagree with the assessment, admitting he does enjoy research. Inside the living room of his home rests a table used specifically to record notes on his track and cross country programs. Sometimes the work is geared toward the history of both programs.

"This isn't a job," Fredericks said. "It's a love affair."

Curiosity sparked his recent research, wanting to examine Geneseo's only



track team that finished among the top 10 at the state meet. All he knew was the Maple Leafs finished third at the first one.

That was in 1893.

"Three years before the first Olympics," Fredericks said. "I don't know if you qualified for the meet or just showed up. There were no cars. One of the events was the high kick. I don't even know what that was."

Forrest Lowes scored all 13 points for the Maple Leafs, registering wins in the triple jump and high jump and placing second in the pole vault. Once that state meet was complete, Geneseo would not appear in the top 10 for another 123 years.

Fredericks felt his current team, coming off a Class 2A 11th-place finish a year ago,

could end that streak. The pieces were in place, so he kept researching the past so he could properly understand the scope of what might

happen.

What he found is no other team is better than the one that finished as the Class 2A state runner-up on Saturday.

"This team didn't have a weakness," Fredericks said. "Our team brought it in all 18 events. It will take a long time for the significance of this team to set in. The impact this will have on our program will be tremendous."

Before this recent state meet, the Maple Leafs totaled 30 individuals medals and three in a relay. One weekend increased the number to 37 and five.

Geneseo scored in eight events and had a pair of topfour relay finishes. Senior
Arthur Atwell became its
fifth state champion after
winning the pole vault.
Daniels (long jump) and
sophomore Reed Vanderheyden (300-meter hurdles) were
state runners-up. The 4x800
relay took second.

All that helped the Maple Leafs score 55 points.

"We've been competing against every other Geneseo team," Daniels said.

None in school history come close to this one. Only one team in the state was better this season.

Cahokia, which won its sixth consecutive title, needed all 61 points to outlast the Maple Leafs. Ahead of the last event on the day, the Comanches held a two-point advantage. The margin was their smallest after 17 events during this title run.

"They might have actually been a little scared this year," Atwell said.

A program that went more than a century without a finish like this pushed the current standard throughout the day. Cahokia needed three state champions to separate itself from the Maple Leafs.

When everything became official, Geneseo gladly accepted its runner-up trophy. The hardware was worth all the work and research. Fredericks now knows this team trumps any other the school produced.


"All of it, just the whole experience, I keep pinching myself because I think it's a dream," Fredericks said. "This truly is beyond my wildest dreams."
