WINDY CITY POLE VAULT SUMMIT

After receiving a unique competitive opportunity Maple Leaf Head Coach Matthew Deets and Leaf Pole Vault Coach Arthur Atwell decided to accept an invitation from Rolling Meadows High School and attend their Windy City Pole Vault Summit. The meet was a Pole Vault-Only competition and was open to any returning Pole Vaulter in the State of Illinois who earned All-State Honors at last year's IHSA STATE FINALS. Unfortunately, the Leafs had another meet on the same day. It was pretty cool to see Coach Atwell, Senior Malakai Schaad, and Sophomore Cooper Schaad attend the Pole Vault competition before hitting the road for a trip to Chicago's Northwest Suburbs.

The field included vaulters from all three Illinois Classes (1A, 2A, and 3A.) Cooper got things started for the Leafs when he entered the competition at 12′ 06″. Illinois has gone metric in Track and Field as of last year but this meet was measured in English (I like that A LOT.) Anyway, back to the action, Cooper made things interesting by missing his first two attempts. He needed to clear his final attempt at 12′ 06″ or his competitive day was over. Fear not, "Mr. Clutch" sailed over the bar and all was well. He then cleared 13′ 00″ on his first attempt. He needed two jumps at both 13′ 06″ and 14′ 00″ but nailed them both. 14′ 00″ ties Cooper's lifetime best and earned him a tie for 7th place in the highly competitive field. It also tied Malakai's Sophomore School Record of 14′ 00″ set two years ago. What a way to start his season. Cooper just completed Wrestling season and is a bit rusty to put it mildly so his performance was extremely impressive.

Malakai's came in at 13^{\prime} 06" and sailed over it on his second attempt. After that he was hoping for a big day but it wasn't to be. He achieved great height but had problems in regard to where his standards should be set and ended up going out of the competition at 14^{\prime} 00". Malakai ended up placing 10th overall. The experience that gained was certainly a big plus.

The winning height in the Pole Vault back at Sterling's Gold Medal Invitational was a English conversion of 10′ 09″. The opportunity to go head-to-head with some of the State's very best Pole Vaulters was simply too good of an opportunity to pass up. Geneseo Track and Field fans are in for an exciting spring. "da Flyin" Schaads" are going to be turning heads all season long. All the best, Men. Keep dreaming big and backing those dream up with the hard work that excellence demands.
