

Leaf girls among

state's best

They're building a powerhouse in Geneseo. And it has nothing to do with football. Not even close.

It's the girls' cross-country team which has emerged as a state power. The Leafs are ranked No. 4 in the state, a height unprecedented in the Western Illinois Region. Moline and United Township have reached honorable mention in recent years, but fourth? That's unheard of in a sport historically dominated by Chicago's suburban schools.

To put it in perspective, Geneseo's mighty football team is ranked 10th in the latest UPI poll, and that's only for schools in Class 4A. The girls' cross country team's ranking is among all schools, big and small.

THE THREE SCHOOLS ahead of the Maple Leafs, according to Timely Times magazine's poll, are No. 1 Wheeling (the defending state champion), No. 2 Schaumburg and No. 3 Elmhurst York. All are traditional powers. All are located in Chicago's west or northwest suburbs. And all are bigger than Geneseo.

Interestingly, Geneseo is the only non-Chicago area school in the top 14. Belvidere, at No. 15, is the next best non-Chicago area team, and the Leafs have already beaten that school twice.

"At the beginning of the year, our goal was to make it to the state meet," says seventh-year coach Jeff Quick. "But, we think we're way beyond that. We're hoping to win the conference, the regional and the sectional. We're expected to. It'll be a matter of someone bumping us off now."

The way things are going for the Leafs, that's even less likely than Geneseo's football team losing another NCIC conference game. The Leaf girls rely on their pack, and so far it hasn't let them down. They are 10-0 in dual meets. Among their invitational victories are the 15-team Canton Invitational and the 22-team Dixon Invitational. Their big disappointment came in their own meet, the Geneseo Invitational, when they finished a close third to defending Iowa state champion Bettendorf and powerful Pleasant Valley, losses they avenged in a recent triangular.

COACH QUICK points to the girls' willingness to work hard as its main reason for success. "We run the same workouts as the boys. Very few girls' teams are willing to do that," he says.

But a team can't rise from mediocrity (3-5 in duals a year ago) to No. 4 in the state on hard work alone. Three freshmen runners just might have made the difference for Geneseo.

One of the freshmen, Connie Gradert, has been battling junior Priscilla Gomez for the top spot on the team all year. Two more freshmen, Tara Zeitler and Michelle Landrum, are the team's Nos. 5 and 6 runners. Lorri DeBleck, a sophomore, runs No. 4, and senior Amy Alexander, who missed last season with a hip in-

jury, runs No. 3 for the Leafs.

"Our pack is what wins for us," says Quick. "The only difference between the top three teams and us is they all have a girl who is a potential state champion. We'd still like to think we could finish in the top three. Everybody expects Wheeling and Downers Grove North, but I would think on any given day..."

The Leaf pack seems to be unbreakable. A case in point is the Dixon Invitational last Saturday when Leaf runners; remarkably, finished fifth, sixth, seventh and 12th in the 140-girl field.

ONE THING THAT might break them, besides the possible teachers' strike in Geneseo, is injury. Injuries would have more of a crippling effect on Geneseo than most teams because the Leafs do not have a lot of depth. Geneseo is a small school, and the team possesses only nine runners.

If they stay in shape, the Leaf girls may challenge the school's football team, unbelievable as it may sound,

for the glory later this fall.

Moline is emerging as the Western Big Conference favorite. The Maroons have yet to be beaten by a local school, but they haven't faced Geneseo yet either.

That will, or may, all change Tuesday when the Maroons are scheduled to square off against the Leafs. Maroons boast one of the area's best in Leanne Larson, and another good one in Sherry Large, more noted for her half-mile exploits.

The problem is, the Maroons had only five runners, the number needed to compete, until last week when two more came out for the team.

United Township should pose the greatest threat to unseat Moline. The Panthers were hit by an inordinate number of injuries even before the season started, but they are running strong now.

Thursday's 18-38 dual meet victory over Sterling has Coach Dennis Steinmetz bubbling with enthusiasm.

Eight UT girls ran personal bests in that dual meet at Butterworth Park in East Moline.

What has him even happier is that some of the Panthers' hurts are starting to subside.

HIP HURTS HAVE bothered three of the team's top runners. Dede McVey, Carla Duncan and Carrie Natwick have all been sidelined for a spell with bad hips, but only Natwick, the team's No. 2 runner, is still nursing the injury.

The team's No. 1 runner, Alice McLernon, who has a history of injuries and missed a week earlier this season, is starting to run back to her old form. Steinmetz is hopeful McLernon can challenge Larson for second place in the conference meet, which is two weeks away.

The top spot, Steinmetz says, belongs to Kris Watters of Galesburg, who has never been beaten in conference. McLernon came close to beating her at last year's state meet when both girls ran 11:50.

In addition to all the others, Costella Green is back after a two-week layoff with anemia. She's still not quite up to par yet, but when she is, that will be another boost for the Panthers.

Kelly Yeocum, Rock Island's top runner, will miss the next three weeks with mononucleosis.

COACH BOB WILSON, whose Rocks have battled to a 4-4 dual-meet record at full strength, is hoping the other girls will pick up the slack. "The other kids will possibly run better now. That's only human nature; to suck it up when you're missing someone like that."

He is, however, hoping that Yeocum can come back after the three-week layoff for the all-important second half. Meanwhile, there will be some added pressure on No. 2 runner Kristen Kessler, a junior, and No. 3, Chris Coolidge, a freshman and the daughter of Rock Island track coach John Coolidge.

The Rocks won the Rock Falls Invitational and finished second at the Galesburg Invitational, so even without Yeocum, they could finish in the top half in the conference meet.

Alleman, also 4-4 in duals, hasn't been able to escape the injury bug either. Its No. 3 runner, Margaret Doak has one of the most common of runners' pains, shin splints.

DOAK; THE SISTER of the team's No. 1 runner freshman Colleen Doak and of Alleman running back Owen Doak, will be kept out of two to three meets, according to first-year coach Joe Lopez.

Colleen, and Mary Gende, a quarter-miler in track season, provide the Pioneers with a strong one-two punch. The question marks for Lopez are Margaret's health and finding a solid fifth runner to go along with their top four girls.

Shipley confirmed that after 32 years as track and cross-country coach at Moline he will be getting out after this school year — and he'd like to make it a good one.

"We don't have any super front-runners right now, but we're pretty grouped — and that's great," he said. "We should win a few meets on bunching, but we may have a different winner each time."

That's held to date with Alfredo Torres and Willie Taylor taking individual victories in Moline's first two meets. "Taylor and Alfredo are our front-runners, but the others will push them all year," said the coach. "Paul Parryman is in his first year of cross country, but is doing a super job."

Others in the Moline top group include Steve Stolbon, a hard worker off the junior varsity; junior John Sanders; ninth-grader Chris Wallaert and Carl Shock.

ALLEMAN

At Alleman, Lopez inherits one of the top runners around in Mike Blomme. "He'll be in the top five everywhere he goes," said the new coach. "He's going to be our hottest prospect."

A strong second is expected to be Tom Carton, who still needs to work on his base. Fighting for the decisive third through fifth positions are senior Ray Campos ("who has the best form of any of our runners"), Scott Bance, Mark Buyck, Gabe Cerda and Tim Phillis. Chad Martel also rejoins the varsity after a bout with mononucleosis.

"We're fairly young," admitted Lopez, who moves over from Black Hawk College. "Hopefully, we'll learn from Mike. If we do, I'm inclined to think we'll be competitive."

Geneseo should be in the hunt, too, although coach Jeff Quick didn't think his team should be the favorite — yet.

"We have the potential to be respectable," he said. "But you never know."

But you do know about some of the Leafs, like four-year varsity racer Tim Arnett and junior John Huyvaert.

"Tim never was a summer runner, so he always is struggling in the fall," said Quick. "But he runs hard during the season, and he got there in a hurry, this year."

"And Huyvaert should be No. 2. He's in tremendous shape physically."

Others running in the Leaf pack are seniors Jim Verkhaiser and Cam Castelein, and Todd Puckett and Tony Linnabery, a transfer from Erie. Those without varsity experience include Cliff Harker and Whitney Sieben.

"A lot of the back kids have done some work," said Quick. "I'm really pleas-

Geneseo boys run

quite well in shadow

GENESEO — Geneseo's girls cross country team is casting a rather long shadow, what with a 10-0 dual meet record, a fourth-in-the-state ranking, and invitational meet wins at Canton, Rockford and Dixon.

Geneseo's boys are 10-1 in duals — and in the shadow. "They're a bit envious of the recognition the girls are getting," said Jeff Quick, who coaches both the boys and girls at Geneseo. "But, hey, the girls deserve it." The boys deserve some, too.

The Leaf boys have duals left with Moline, North Scott and Muscatine; Quick is hoping for a 13-1 finish. Today, they're competing with 44 other teams at the Peoria Invitational, which includes the state's two top-ranked teams, defending state champ Elmhurst York, and Hoffman Estates Conant.

SENIOR TIM ARNETT continues to pace Geneseo, with junior John Huyvaert the usual No. 2 man, while junior Tony Linnabery, "is improving rapidly now," said Quick, and has become the usual No. 3 man.

Runners four through seven finish in a different order each meet, says Quick, and therein could lie this team's strength, he thinks. Those four are seniors Cam Castelein and James Werkneiser, and juniors Cliff Harker and Todd Puckett.

"We ran well at the Dixon Invitational last weekend for the first time since I've been coach," said Quick. "We have Arnett, who can get keyed up for every race. The other six have relatively equal ability, and on any given day, at least four of them figure to perform. We've maybe had a strong top five in the past; but the talent fell off markedly after that. So if one of those top five didn't perform well, our team score would fall off," said Quick.

Quick said Arnett doesn't train during the off-season, "but he gets stronger every day during the season. Overall, it's hard to stay keyed up as a team over an entire season."

QUICK SAID THE squad's only problem has been, "consistency. But if we run to our abilities and conditioning, we can be more competitive with Rock Island and Galesburg, the two top teams in our regional."

That regional will be Oct. 27 in Geneseo, with the top four teams moving on to the sectional. Quick says Rock Falls and Moline also are strong.

"Our boys would like to place among the top four in regional and the top five at sectional, which would qualify them for state," said Quick. "We're young, and I really think we'll be stronger next season. We've got a good fresh-soph group."

Quick is training 42 runners, including 32 boys.

Quick also is looking ahead to the NCIC meet Oct. 26 in Kewanee. There, he wants his teams to achieve something that's never been done by an NCIC school: championships in the varsity girls and boys' races, and in the fresh-soph boys competition.
