RUN FOR IT

Tim Arnett is going to Peoria to run in the state cross country meet - and he's taking his suit.

Geneseo's girls will take some fancy clothes, too. Armett and the Leaf girls have chances to place high in Saturday's state finals at Detweiller Park, north of Peoria, just off state route 29.

The girls have a good chance to finish among the top 10 teams. Their key - being able to relax, and run their race.

The girls will run a 2.25-mile course at 11:15 a.m. Armett, the lone Leaf in the Class AA boys meet, take off on a 3-mile run at 12:30.

The first 25 individuals in the boys race get awards, said Geneseo coach Jeff Quick. Armett, whose goal is to finish among the top 10, wants to be decked out when he visits the awards ceremony later at Central High School.

Arnett was 66th in the state meet two years ago; 73rd last year. "This year, he's ready," said Quick. "The meet is wide open. There is no unbeaten runner. If he's relaxed, the top 10 is within his reach."

First place, maybe? "Tim will try to win it," confirmed Quick. His key will be to get out front early, and stay there."
There will be 202 runners.

Geneseo's fifth-rated girls showed signs of pressure, even though they won the Sterling Sectional last Saturday. "Our girls are inexperienced in races like these," said Quick. "Priscilla Gomez ran at state last year, but this will be

the first trip to state for the rest of our girls."

"It will boil down to packing, and that has been a strong point for us," said Quick.

"Wheeling (the top-rated team) is untouchable," said Quick. After that, this week's ratings are: 2 - Downers Grove North.

3 - Schaumburg. 4 - Elmhurst York. 5 - Leaf 6 - Crete-Monee.

"If any two girls on any of those second through sixth-rated teams don't run well, you could see dramatic changes in the placings. So, if WE run well, we could do well.

There will be 205 runners. "Our first four like to get out quickly, and go for the front of the main pack," said Quick.

Geneseo's runners: Gomez, Connie Gradert, Amy Alexander, Lorri DeBlieck, Tara Zeitler, Michelle Landrum and Kerry Meade.

Last week, Arnett won the Sterling Sectiona with a two-second win over Bart Bodoh of Rockford Guilford, who tried to pass Arnett five times during the last 400 yards.

The girls had a comparatively close 15-poin winning margin over Belvidere, a team they beat easily in the Geneseo Invitational. They were helped mightily by a very strong race from fifth-place runner Zeitler, who was 51st overal1.

Gomez was third overall, with Gradert 8th, Alexander 12th, DeBlieck 32nd, Zeitler 51st Landrum 65th, and Meade 118th.

"Our girls are young," said Quick, noting that Alexander is the only senior. "A lot was expected of them, and that was their first sectional championship. The first time is maybe the hardest."

Geneseo is hest bet

Area schools look to

Not long ago, Quad-City schools merely hoped to qualify for the state cross-country meet. Now, they're out for blood.

Today the blood test begins. The state cross-country meet starts at 10 a.m. with the Class A boys' race at Detweiller Park in Peoria. The girls follow at 11:15 and the boys AA go off at 12:30.

Three area girls' teams and one boys' team will be trying to show the Chicago schools that cross country is alive and well downstate. Chicago area teams have dominated the event for years, but the Quad-Cities are bringing some of their most talented teams ever this year.

"We have developed into probably the second strongest area in the state," said UT coach Dennis Steinmetz.

And, accordingly, local coaches are

aiming higher than ever before.

MOLINE COACH Gene Shipley, whose 1983 squad owns the Q-C best ever finish for a girls' team (14th place), is gunning for a similar finish this year. "We're going all out for top 15," Shipley said. "We're not quite as strong as the last two years. So we figure with the competition so strong, anything in the top 15 would be good."

Steinmetz has set "easy goals" and "hard goals" for his team. The easy goals include bettering the finish of the last UT team to compete at state, the 1980 squad which finished 22nd. The hard goals include having their top five girls finish in the top half of the field and having the team finish in the top half of the field.

"We want to do better than the best a Quad City school has ever done," said Steinmetz. "If we run the way we ran at sectional where the first through fifth runners finished within

a minute of each other, we could do it."

Geneseo's Jeff Quick, whose team is acknowledged as the best girls' squad ever in the Quad Cities area, is looking for a top-10 finish from his girls

"Since we have only one girl who's been there before, our goal is to finish in the top 10. That would be really good for us. The power of Chicago is awesome."

Chicago possesses the four highestranking teams in the state — Wheeling, Downers Grove North, Elmhurst York and Schaumberg — and nine of the top 10. The only downstate school in the top 10 is Geneseo.

"They have a chance to break into the top five," predicted Steinmetz. "That would be just a fantastic finish for a non-Chicago area team, one of the highest ever."

ONE OF THE main reasons the

join running elite

Chicago area dominates, says Steinmetz, is that many Chicago schools run year-round. "They have the TAC club and AAU summer and winter programs," said Steinmetz. Plus, with more than 50 schools, they have a definite numbers advantage.

The Maple Leafs, with any kind of luck, should attain their goal of a top-10 finish. However, a disappointing run in the Sterling Sectional and some end-of-the-year nerves has Quick worried.

"Right now, they don't seem relaxed," said Quick. "The other top teams have all been there before. For us, it's just a matter of reacting to the pressure of running at the state meet."

Pressure indeed. The Maple Leafs have faced a few of the state's top teams this year such as Crete-Monee (ranked 6th) and Belvidere, but they haven't seen the four ranked above

them. At the state meet, they'll see them all at once.

In sum, 25 girls teams and 35 individuals will compete. That's 210 of the best runners in the state. That would be nerve-wracking for any team, especially one like Geneseo which has only one girl, Priscilla Gomez, who has been there before.

"I'm pulling for Geneseo," said Shipley, who coached Quick at Moline High School in the mid-1960s. "They have the best local team and they have the best chance to win of all the local schools. They have to run better than they did at the sectional.

"Maybe they're slowing down a bit.
You can only go to the well so many

Quick says his team is in good physical shape and is running well in practice.

"Connnie Gradert has been running better, so it looks like our 1-2 punch (of Lopez and Gradert) is back at it. Our whole thing hinges on our first four girls," said Quick.

THE ONLY QUAD CITY boys' team still alive, Rock Island, is hoping to finish somwhere in the middle of the 27-team boys' field. However, Coach John Coolidge said he really doesn't have a clue as to where his team will finish.

"I'm really puzzled," admitted the personable coach. "At this point of the season, kids either run way above what they have been doing all year, or far below. I really don't know what to expect."

Traditionally, boys' teams from this area haven't fared much better than the girls in state cross country competition. So the Rocks have put in a serious week of training, and the coach heard more than a few gripes about it.

"At least, I have them thinking about it," he said. "After the intension pressure of the sectionals, sometimes they don't realize there are greater mountains to climb.

"I asked them what they thought and got answers ranging from 13th to 17th," he said. "I'd say that is a realistic goal."

Wherever the Rocks finish, though, the coach says his runners will benefit from running in the state meet. Steve Carlson is the lone senior in the starting group. "We'll be getting experience for next year," said Coolidge. "But what we really want is for them to feel good about what they have accomplished."

PEORIA - The Geneseo girls' cross-country team cap- toward the finish," said Quick. ped its greatest season Saturday by finishing fifth at the IHSA state meet at Detweiller Park here.

The race went pretty much to form, with the top five teams finishing exactly as projected. Wheeling, the defending champion, easily won with 50 points, while Downers Grove North had 94, Elmhurst York 146, Schaumberg 186 and Geneseo 201.

Moline, led by Leanne Larson's ninth-place finish, came in 15th with 404 points in the 25-team race. UT, with Alice McLernon (18th) earning a medal for the third time, came in 19th with 457. The top 25 finishers in each race earn a medal.

Dana Miroballi of Wheeling captured the 2.1-mile race in 11 minutes, 29.6 seconds.

In the boys' AA race, Geneseo's Tim Arnett earned a medal with his 12th-place finish, but the other area runners, the Rock Island boys' team, finished a disappointing 24th in the 27-team field. The boys' race, which was run in a downpour, was won by York High School with 98 points. Rockford Guilford was second with 129 and third-place Wheeling had 197.

THE LEAF GIRLS finished in a tight pack with their top four girls coming in between 26th and 38th in the field of 210 girls. Priscilla Gomez led the way with a 26th-place finish, just missing a medal by one place.

"We ran as well as we could today," said Geneseo coach Jeff Quick. "I figured the best we could do was fifth, and

that's what we got."

Following Gomez in the Leaf pack were Connie Gradert (31st), Lorri DeBlieck (34th) and Amy Alexander (38th). "Our girls moved up from four to seven runners each

The Maaroons also finished about where they expected. "We went in thinking if we finished in the top 15 we'd be satisfied," said Moline coach Gene Shipley. "They did a good job and Leanne did a super job.'

The Panthers didn't run as well as they had been running. "My front four ran pretty well, but I didn't feel two of my other girls ran quite as well as I would have hoped," said Dennis Steinmetz of UT.

The Rocks' finish was even more disappointing for Coach John Coolidge and his runners. He had hoped they would find the middle of the field, but the Rocks' 589 points put them well down in the standings. Darren Kerschieter led the Rocks with a 112th-place finish, but no other Rock runner had a particularly good day.

"Our kids would have to put in a lot of miles over the summer to have a chance against the suburban schools, and they didn't do that," said Coolidge. "You have to run with courage if you're going to win in the state of Illinois."

GENESEO'S ARNETT RAN with courage — but didn't win. He finished the 3-mile course in 15:06, more than 30 seconds behind winner Jim White of York whose time was 14:30.

"He made the same tactical mistake he made last year," said Quick of his four-time state qualifier. "He went out too quickly. This time, though, he felt himself going too quickly and pulled back a bit.

"He ran real well considering the conditions. He was hoping to finish in the top 10, but he seemed pretty happy with 12th. The thing that got him was that he was passed by the kid from Dixon (Sid Aurand) who he had beaten three times before.''

Geneseo girls 5th state x-c meet

Geneseo PEORIA. III. grabbed a fifth-place finish in the Illinois High School Association girls state cross-country meet on a cold and rainy Saturday at Detweiller Park.

The balanced Maple Leafs were one of three area schools in the 25team field. Moline finished 15th and United Township 19th.
