

# Leaf runners seek place at state

ESE — Geneseo's girls' cross country team finished fifth in last year's state meet, and coach Fredericks is sure the Maple Leafs are better than they were a year ago.

Maple Leaf senior Priscilla Gomez, who finished 26th in last year's race, has a chance — and it's an outside chance, says Fredericks — to win the individual title.

Until the Leaf coach is reluctant to do a top-five finish for the team, a state title for Gomez, as he prepares them for the 2.25-mile run which starts at 11:15 a.m. today in Peoria's Detweiller Park.

"It's because there are so many variables," said the first-year coach. "We've got a chance to get all-state runners (individuals placed among the top 25), and if we could finish among the top five teams."

BUT THERE'S MORE depth to this state meet than last year," said Fredericks. "I'd hate to see us not in the top five — that could happen — and then have the girls feel they failed because of what I had predicted before the meet. If each runs the best she can, they won't."

Some 25 teams and 210 total runners survived last Saturday's sectional meets, and will compete in today's final race.

Gomez, said Fredericks, is one of about seven runners who are most likely to win the individual title.

"I think she has been the best high school athlete in the Quad-City area all year," said Fredericks. "She could run for any college in the U.S."

"I think Priscilla began to believe she could be the state champion after she won the Homewood-Flossmoor Invitational back on Sept. 14."

Gomez lost two of her first three races, but has been unbeaten, and is stating, since.

"She's a front-runner, she's ruthless, she punishes herself, and she's not satisfied," said Fredericks.

Until, the Leaf coach believes the rest of his team still has its best race coming.

Gomez is the only senior among Geneseo's seven runners — and five of the Leafs have competed in the state meet before. The others are junior Lorri DeBlieck, sophomores Connie Gradert, Tara Zeitler and Michelle Landrum. Making their first appearance are freshmen Gail Perkins and Kim Chapman.

FREDERICKS BELIEVES Gomez, Gradert, DeBlieck and Perkins all are capable of finishing among the top 25.

Geneseo was rated 10th in the final state poll conducted by The Timely News, a publication about running.

"That ranking is not a fair estimate of where they should be," said Sterling coach Don Mekeel, who saw the Leafs win the NCIC, regional sectional meets on Sterling's Hoover Park course.

They ran the Sterling Invitational without a couple of girls, and placed 10th. The suburban coaches saw their place, and dropped them in the rankings. But they got those two girls healed up, came back, and ran fantastically the last couple of weeks."

The two, Perkins and DeBlieck, have overcome a foot problem and a cold, respectively. But now, No. 2 runner Gradert is battling bronchitis, which inflames the lung area, causing oxygen debt and severe pain when she runs. She has taken the week off from practice, in hopes of cranking

out one big run on today.

"Physiologically, you can't improve these girls the last 10 days of the season, anyway," said Fredericks. "Connie will just try to let 'er rip on Saturday. She ran a courageous race, in pain, last Saturday. We wouldn't have won the sectional without her."

DeBlieck missed a month because of her mono attack, "but she's back, as strong as ever, and Perkins has been matching strides with her," said Fredericks. Chapman, a freshman, ran fourth last week, and Zeitler has been the team's No. 5 finisher much of the season. Landrum, a sophomore, is described by Fredericks as a team-leader type, "and her experience of having run in the state meet before will be invaluable to us," he said.

FREDERICKS SAYS Elmhurst York is the team to beat, followed by Palatine, Wheeling, "and, I think, East St. Louis Lincoln," said Fredericks. "They don't get to run against that good suburban competition much to show what they can do. Then, I'd say Arlington Heights Hersey and ourselves have outside chances."

The best individuals? "Dana Miroballi, a sophomore from Wheeling, is the defending champion, although no girl has ever won twice," said Fredericks. "She and her teammate, Alice Doyle, could go one-two, and that has never been done, either."

"The Kuiken twins, Gloria and Annie, from Chicago Stagg, have run one-two every meet until last week," said Fredericks. "Mary Beth Driscoll from York won as a freshman. She's a junior now, and knows what it takes to win. And Molly Jackson from Charleston won her sectional by 17 seconds."

And Gomez? "She has as good a chance as any of them," said Fredericks.

"It's exciting to know she has a chance to win. She will need to build a lead. But she hasn't run her best race yet. I know she hasn't shown all her cards."

In a short while, all the cards will be on the table.



## Watch the runners first

GENESEO — With Geneseo's football and girls' cross country teams competing Saturday in important events at sites less than 15 minutes apart in the Peoria area, Maple Leaf athletic officials are urging their fans to attend both the girls state cross country meet in Peoria, and the 4A playoff quarterfinal football game in Washington.

The cross country meet will start at 11:15 a.m. in Peoria's Detweiller Park (see story page 17), with the football game in Washington set for a 1 p.m. start.

The football game will not be played in Peoria Stadium, a rumor which began in the parking lot of that facility after last Saturday's game there, and has spread through the Geneseo community this week.

### Geneseo to Detweiller Park

Take I-74 to War Memorial Drive (also Highway 150), eastbound exit, the same as last week's trip to Peoria Stadium. Continue east on War Memorial, to the Route 29 exit, just prior to crossing McCluggage Bridge over the Illinois River. Exit right onto Route 29, northbound. Continue north a few miles — Detweiller Park will be on the left at Peoria's far northeast edge.

### Detweiller Park to Washington

Turn right out of the park onto Route 29, southbound. Pass under the McCluggage Bridge, and exit right onto Highway 150, eastbound, and cross the bridge. Five miles beyond the bridge, and just beyond Illinois Community College, there will be a "T" intersection. Go left at the "T," into Washington. About a mile into town, there will be an intersection with a Hardee's and a Pizza Hut. Turn left, onto Wilmor Road, and proceed to the stadium. Gates will open at 11 a.m.

### Football Only

Save as above, only don't exit onto Route 29. Or, remain on I-74 through Peoria, cross the river, and exit onto Route 118, northbound. After five miles, turn right onto Washington Road, which is Highway 24. Upon reaching the "T" intersection, follow the directions in the Detweiller Park to Washington segment above.

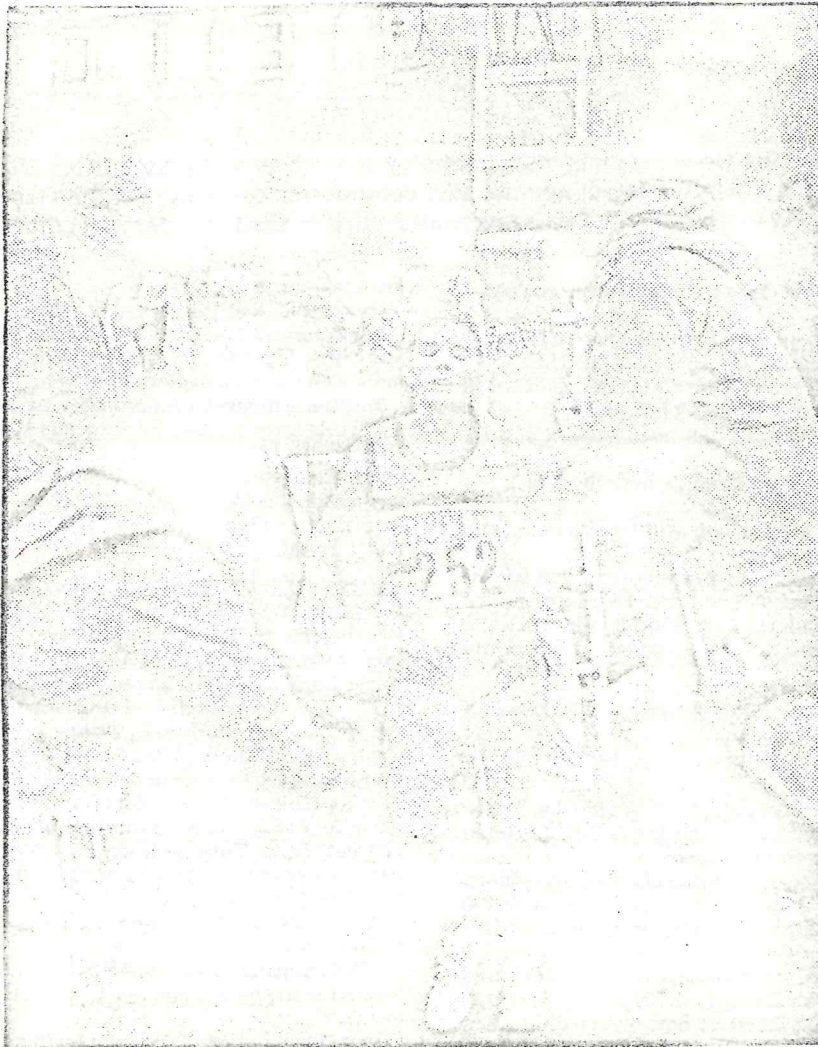

# Soph Miroballi repeats in girls

Wheeling High School sophomore Dana Miroballi broke tradition Saturday morning at Detweiller Park, and the Downers Grove North High School girls cross country team broke a jinx.

Miroballi won an unprecedented second straight girls individual state cross country championship with a time of 11:29.5 for the 2.1 miles — almost 10 seconds faster than teammate Alice Doyle, the runner-up.

Downers Grove North shed its bridesmaid status by edging Palatine 131-146 for the team championship. The Trojans had been runners-up to Wheeling two years in a row.

Miroballi knew what she was up against in her quest to repeat as champion. "People were saying I couldn't do it again," she said. "They said there was an omen over me, but I wanted to prove them wrong."

Miroballi, who was pictured in the "Faces in the Crowd" section of the Feb. 18, 1985 edition of *Sports Illustrated* for her come-from-behind victory last season, was just a face in the crowd early Saturday. She trailed the leaders by 29 seconds after one mile.

But Miroballi made her move in the next three-quarters of a mile. "As I was going in the loop, I started passing people," she said. "Coming out, I told myself I had to do it now."

Miroballi moved by everyone but Doyle. But then the junior fell by the wayside too. "She got me in the last 220 yards," Doyle said.

Despite the one-two finish, the Wheeling team finished seventh.

Downers Grove North's victory shocked its coach and runners. The Trojans were seventh in final ratings by the newsletter *Timely Times*.

"We were happy to get out of the sectional," coach Bruce Ritter said. "We kidded about beating Wheeling, but we were hoping just to beat anybody."

"This was the first time we've been down here without people say-

ing we had a chance to win. We were relaxed with no pressure on us, and that made a big difference."

The Trojans were led by senior Becky Rusch, who finished 23rd. Rusch had dropped out of the Hinsdale South Sectional a week ago with strep throat and an injured heel.

"Oh, my God," Rusch cried, tears welling in her eyes, as she reached out to touch the championship trophy.

"Mr. Ritter said if we could finish in the top five that would be fantastic. We were hoping for the top three, but we didn't expect it because we knew it would be hard."

Sophomore Steffie Stump of Bergan was the leading finisher from the Peoria area. She finished 49th in 12:33.9.

Freshman Kris Hahn of Central ran 12:37.5 for 56th, Jennifer Lewis of PORTA was 72nd in 12:46, Kewanee's Amy Reecy 81st in 12:50.4 and Tammy Riekana of Limestone 97th in 12:58.5.

### Gomez 10th;

### Leafs ninth

PEORIA — For about half the 2.25-mile race, Priscilla Gomez's dream for the girls state cross country championship remained alive. The Geneseo senior was amidst a pack of five runners who were shoulder-to-shoulder when they passed the one-mile pole Saturday morning in Detweiller Park.

The dream would soon end. But Gomez' 10th-place finish, and Geneseo's ninth-place finish as a team, both were a long ways from being nightmarish endings to a successful season — even though Gomez and the Maple Leafs had been hoping for higher finishes.

On this day, Wheeling's Dana Miroballi and Alice Doyle were making history. They finished one-two, the first time that's ever been done by teammates in the state meet. And for sophomore Miroballi, the championship was her second in as many tries, and no girl had won the title twice.

"IT WAS A crazy day," said Geneseo coach Don Fredericks. "I spent 45 minutes in an ambulance with Connie Gradert and her parents, and I don't ever want to go through that again."

Gradert, Geneseo's No. 2 runner, ran despite suffering from bronchitis. She finished the race, but hyperventilated and collapsed. She was treated and released from a Peoria hospital.

Gradert was the sixth Leaf to enter the finish chute, meaning she didn't enter into the team scoring. "And without her scoring, I would have guessed we would have problems finishing among the top 15," said Fredericks. "That's why, given those circumstances, I felt our girls reached their potential."

Gomez's 10th-place finish earned her all-state honors, which go to the top 25 finishers. She had placed 26th a year ago, and 40th as a sophomore.

"It was definitely the best I've run down here," said Gomez, whose finishing kick prevented her from falling back a place or two. "I didn't want people to pass me at the end, which has happened before here," she said.

"Priscilla ran a smart race," said Fredericks. "She just got beat by some kids who, on this day at least, were a little better."

GENESEO'S OTHER place finishers in the 210-runner field: 62 — Lorri DeBlicke, 63 — Gail Perkins, 143 — Kim Chapman, 154 — Tara Zeitler, 170 — Gradert, 189 — Michelle Landrum.

Downers Grove North, rated seventh coming in, put its act together and won the state championship, with Palatine second and Arlington Heights Hersey third. Favored Elmhurst York placed sixth.

# Wheeling sophomore beats 2d-year jin

## Miroballi, Lake Forest's Gibson have golden touch at state meet

PEORIA, Ill.—Dana Miroballi wanted to become the first two-time state girls' cross-country champion, but she wasn't consumed by the thought.

Lake Forest's Jim Gibson felt the same way about his chances of winning his first state title. Both of them left here without ulcers or gray hair—and with gold medals.

Miroballi won her second title Saturday at Detweiller Park with teammate Alice Doyle finishing right behind her, while Gibson won the Class AA boys' title by almost 10 seconds.

Miroballi, a sophomore, had heard all the horror stories about state champions Madlyn Morreale of Glenbard South [1979], Laura Haggerty of Evergreen Park [1980], Shelly McBride of Crete-Monee [1982] and even Mary Beth Driscoll of York, who won the 1983

title. She had heard how their state championships had been followed by slides down the ladder of cross-country success.

"Being a two-time champion was important, but I didn't want it to be too important," said Miroballi, whose winning time of 11 minutes 29.5 seconds was a tenth of a second faster than her time a year ago. "I didn't want to be devastated if I didn't win. It wasn't my top priority. I was hoping to do it, but I didn't want to be crushed if I didn't."

"After the state track meet [where she won the 3,200-meter run], everybody was saying it would be downhill from there. They said the names of everybody who had won as a freshman and what had happened to them. I just said no."

Miroballi and Doyle hung back during the first half-mile of the 2-mile race to try to help the team in its chase for a third straight title.

The Wildcats' streak ended at two with a seventh-place finish, but their top two runners finished 1-2 for the 11th time in 12 races.

The Wheeling pair went through the first mile in about 5:50, about 20 seconds slower than leaders Anne and Gloria Kuiken of Stagg. Miroballi passed no less than 15 runners in the final half-mile, and Doyle was right behind her.

"Our pack broke apart a little early," Miroballi said. "I don't really know when we went. We didn't take off together. At the mile I was very far back ... I kept saying this is the state meet, I've got to do it now. I knew I had to do it."

"I was kicking and I tried to go with her, but I was tired," said Doyle, who had beaten Miroballi in five of their 12 races. "She just ran a really good race. She's good at the end."

Gibson didn't have to kick past anyone. The Scout senior was at

the front almost all the way, was in a group of six runners which toured the first mile in. At the 2-mile mark, Alton's man Bilsbury had a slight lead 9:42. Bilsbury paid the price Gibson opened a big lead with than a half-mile to go en route winning time of 14:28, 10 sec ahead of runner-up Mitch Mick of Leyden.

"I figured the first mile would be that much of a key," Gibson, who cut 22 seconds off third-place finish of last year. "Half the field can run a 4:45. When there were that many people, I wasn't worried. If there been that many at the second I would have been."

"The top five or six finishers were who I expected. I figured would be wrong to key on any of them, so I just ad-libbed. I was prepared to do what I had to do."

# Elmwood repeats in Class A

■ Schaumburg wins Class AA C10  
■ Miroballi keeps girls' title C10

Streator Woodland's Troy Maddux did the expected Saturday in the Class A state meet at Delweiller Park. Elmwood did the unexpected.

Maddux crushed the Class A field and won the individual title for the second consecutive year with a time of 14:18.5. Maddux's time beat runner-up Tony Fernatt of Beechers by 28.5 seconds and topped the Class AA time by 9.5 seconds.

Despite being the two-time defending champion, Elmwood was considered a dark horse for the state title behind favored Pontiac and Yorkville.

"I thought we had a shot at it coming into the race," Elmwood coach Tom Meyer said. "We were running well the last couple weeks and I felt good about our chances."

Meyer didn't feel so good after the Trojans fell well off the pace in the first mile. But Elmwood stormed back into contention and caught Pontiac.

Elmwood finished with 69 points, well ahead of Pontiac's second place 93. Yorkville took third with 126 followed by Joy's 152 and Woodland's 170. PORTA finished seventh, Rushville 10th and Henry 17th.

"We got buried the first-quarter mile of the race," said Meyer. "But Tom Gorham, Brent Simpson and Ralph Phillips brought us back from oblivion."

As in most cross country meets, the third, fourth and fifth runners made the difference for Elmwood. Gorham finished 23rd, Simpson 31st and Phillips crossed the finish line in 40th place to key the Trojan victory.

"I think people tended to overlook us," said Elmwood's Stan Johnson, who finished third behind Maddux and Fernatt. "It's true that we were not running that well earlier in the season, but we were the defending champs."

Maddux won the individual title with the greatest of ease. Fernatt, who also finished second in 1984, stayed with Maddux through the first mile. But Fernatt was no match for the state's top cross country runner.

"I'm happy with the race," Maddux said. "The conditions hurt the times, but I thought I ran well."

Johnson, Woodlands' Scott Maddux, Rushville's Mark Couch, Elmwood's Tony McCoy, Mason City's Roger Rivera, San Jose's John Waller, Gorham, and PORTA's Doug Thurman all received individual ribbons.

Monmouth's Rob Billingsley finished 33rd, Walnut's Ky Borgstadt 36th, Delavan's Ron Zimmer 56 and Princeton's Dwight Darling finished 88th.

# Schaumburg ends York's

## five-year AA reign

After five years of dominance, York High School relinquished its grip on the Illinois Class AA cross country title Saturday in the state meet at Detweiller Park.

This was expected. After all, Homewood-Flossmoor beat the five-time defending state champions in the sectionals, setting the stage for the first state champion other than York since 1979.

But it wasn't H-F who carried the championship trophy back to the Chicago suburbs. An unheralded Schaumburg team stunned H-F and the rest of the field by winning the first cross country title in the school's history.

"I knew we were at least one of the top five teams in the state," Schaumburg coach Jim Macnider said. "If they ran this race next week, who could pick the winner. All I know is we won the one that counted."

Lake Forest's Jim Gibson won the state individual title by ten seconds over Franklin Park Leyden's Mitch McCormick, completing the muddy three-mile course in 14:28. Washington's George Patterson, 19th, and Metamora's Mark Scheirer, 23, won ribbons in the individual race.

Schaumburg came out of no where to win the championship. The *Timely Times* ranked Schaumburg eighth in its final regular season poll. The Saxons didn't even win their sectional, finishing second behind Hoffman Estates Conant at Hinsdale.

Schaumburg won the meet with 116 points. H-F followed with 172, Conant scored 190 to finish third and York settled for fourth with 192.

"We just didn't have it today," said York coach Joe Newton, who was shooting for his 13th state title. "To win a race with this many talented teams, you need great races from all your runners. We didn't get it."

H-F raced without the full services of its top runner. Don Bonfiglio, who finished eighth in the sectionals, aggravated a sprained ankle and was unable to run at full speed. He finished 193rd.

"I can't take anything away from Schaumburg," H-F coach Ted Van Dorn said. "But if Don races and does what he is capable of, which might be somewhere in the top 15, it's a different race. The scores certainly would be much closer."

Macnider didn't need a reminder of the historical significance of Schaumburg's state title.

"What's great about winning the state title now is the importance of someone finally beating York down here at Detweiller," Macnider said. "Years from now, my runners and the rest of the state will look back and say Schaumburg is the team that beat York. That is something this

team and the school can be proud of for years to come."

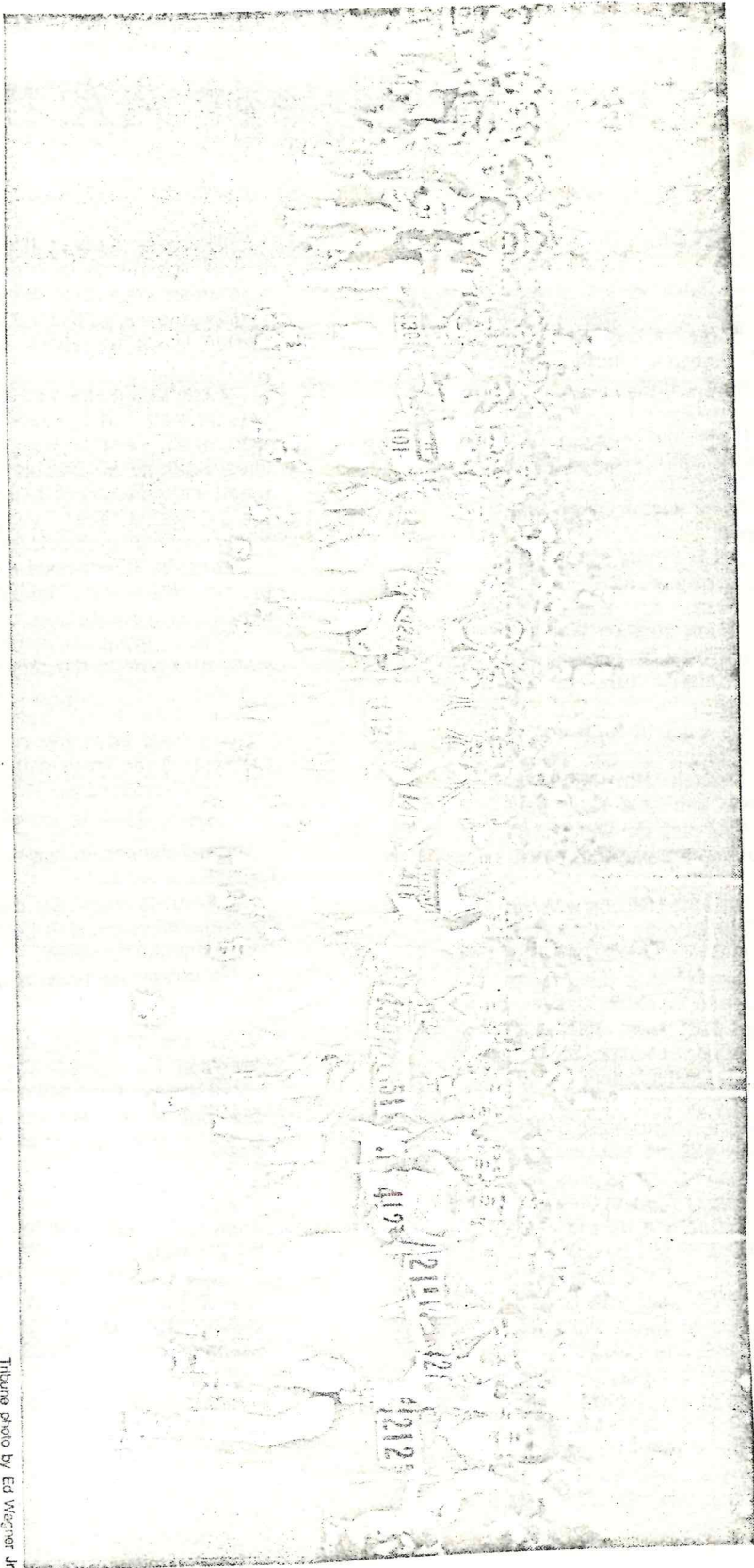
Richwoods aimed for the top ten, but Knights' coach Bob LaCroix was satisfied with 13th place.

"No downstate team beat us and

we're the 13th best cross country team in the state," said LaCroix. "You always think you could do better. But when I see the teams that beat us, 13th looks pretty good. We had an outstanding season. And we

know we're one of the top cross country teams in the state. We'll take it."

East Peoria's Phil Palmer concluded his season with a 49th place finish. Galesburg's Keith VanderMeulin crossed the finish line 154th.

# Underdogs aren't underachievers

## Schaumburg, Downers prevail

PEORIA, Ill.—Until Saturday, the Schaumburg boys' cross country team and the Downers Grove North girls' team had two things in common and one was first-place trophies from the St. Charles Invitational.

The other was they entered the state meet as big underdogs.

Now they have matching state championships. Schaumburg contributed to the end of York's five-year reign in Class AA with 116 points to second-place Homewood-Flossmoor's 172 and third-place Conant's 190. York was fourth with 192. Downers North won its state title with 131 points to 146 for second-place Palatine and 169 for third-place Hersey. Premeet favorite York finished sixth.

Downers North came into the season thinking about rebuilding. Tracy Laughlin, who led the Trojans to a second-place finish last season, had graduated and coach Bruce Ritter had no state championship thoughts.

Injuries and illness prevented the Trojans from winning any invitational after the Aug. 31 St. Charles meet, until the Hinsdale Central regional. At last week's Hinsdale South sectional, only a heroic effort by seventh runner Sharon McCullough, who cut 30 seconds off her personal best, got Downers North to Peoria.

"I had a pie-in-the-sky dream of a state trophy," said Ritter, one of the coaches responsible for initiating a girls' state cross country series. "I thought maybe we could do that. I can't believe it. It caps off an incredible season. I can't say enough about these kids. This is only the second time we've had them all together. They didn't give up. We got buried so many times this season. We were relaxed, there was no pressure. That's a big difference running when no one expects you to do anything."

The Trojans won their state title, the second in the school's history, with solid, not flashy, individual efforts. Senior Becky Rusch led the way with an overall 23d place finish, followed by classmate Jenny Edmonds in 32d. Shellie O'Neal was 36th, Caroline Tracy 46th and Aelise Martin 73d. Rusch dropped out of the sectional meet

because she had strep throat. O'Neal dropped out of the same meet when she fell and Tracy missed several weeks with a stress fracture.

"We really didn't think we could win," said Edmonds. "Our goal was the top five and we thought it would be great if we made the top three. On certain days, some people run their best."

Since Edmonds and Rusch entered Downers North, the Trojans have won two second-place trophies, a third and Saturday's first.

"After two seconds and a third, this is really great for those kids," said Ritter, whose team finished second to York and lost a dual meet 16-46 to the Dukes in the West Suburban Conference. "I feel sorry for Tracy Laughlin. The year before she came to school we won the state and the year after she left we won. Jenny came on near the end of the season and Becky was up and down because she was sick."

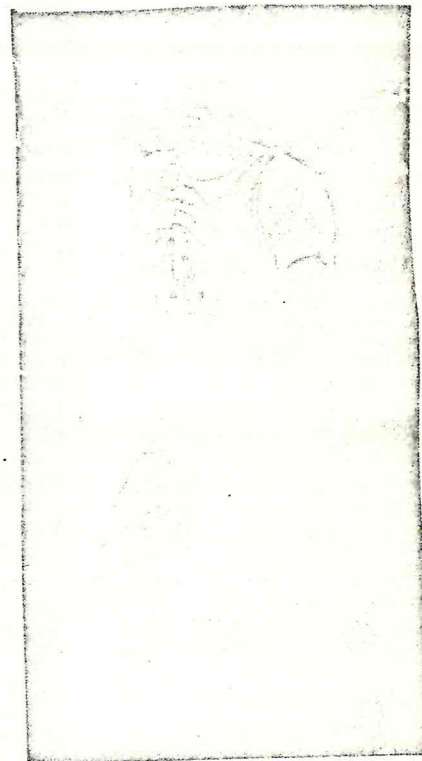
Schaumburg finished second in the Mid-Suburban League and could have been more successful if league rival Conant had run elsewhere. The Saxons lost four of five meetings to the Cougars before the state meet. Saxon coach Jim Macnider didn't make any wild predictions of victory going into the meet.

"I thought we could be in the top five," he said. "You never want to tell them they are going to win the state meet. Our goal is to run our best race in the state meet, and if you win, fine. You could run the whole thing over again and who knows? This is all that counts."

Senior Mark Lishchynsky, the only Saxon scorer who won't be back next year, led Schaumburg with a 10th-place finish. Junior Andrew Bredfield was 18th overall, junior Mike Shuck was 27th, junior James Tobin 69th and junior Robert Skupien 72d.

"I wasn't predicting No. 1," said Lishchynsky. "We were hoping top three and knew in a big meet we could pull it off. We knew sooner or later we'd run well. Right after the race I saw our guys up there in the chute and I knew we had it."

"I told the kids last night, the great thing about this year is the fact anyone can win it," Macnider said. "There were five teams that could have won it, but we did."

# It's a 'total malfunction' as York claims 4th, 6th

PEORIA, Ill.—Almost everything was the same: The York fans and band were on hand, it was November and Joe Newton was coaching the Dukes' five-time defending state cross-country champions.

When the Class AA race was over Saturday, Newton moved to the same area of Detweiller Park where he had received good news before. That's where things changed. The news Newton received was not good. The Dukes' streak was ended by champion Schaumburg. By second-place Homewood-Flossmoor. By third-place Conant. York was fourth.

"I'm shocked, I can't account for it," said Newton, whose top finishers, Dave Braun, Bob Berger and Zack Boudreau, were 36th, 40th and 41st overall. "We've always had guys perform in the state meet. This was a total malfunction. Maybe I'm getting old and don't know how to gauge my guys. I'm confused and I'm going to go home and try to sort this out."

"The pressure was not on us. I just don't understand. Last night we were loose, yet we ran a race with not a York guy near the front at any point."

This was supposed to be the year the boys' and girls' teams from York each had a shot at winning a title. Newton's team wasn't favored, but coach Larry Bassett's girls were. They went out fast, but came in tired and sixth. Downers Grove North won the girls' title.

"We were pretty psyched up to win," said senior Vicky Brown, whose 69th-place overall finish was the next best for York after Mary Beth Driscoll's seventh. "I went out faster and got tired at the middle."

"One bad day can't ruin a great season," Bassett said. "I feel we deserved our No. 1 ranking."

Bassett loses only Brown from his top seven. Newton isn't so lucky. He loses four of his top five.

"We were getting close to the end of the line this year," said Newton, who has coached 12 state championship teams. "Our sophomores lost to Downers Grove North. Our first junior [Kevin Buhrfiend] finished 120th, a net 85. That tells you something. This might be the end of an era. It's not the boys' fault. They didn't want to lose. As a coach, this is frustrating and demoralizing."
