## Harriers prepare for Saturday's regionals

IHSA regional competition for the cross country teams in the area will begin at 10 a.m. Saturday, October 25 in Geneseo with the girls' 2-mile race. The boys' will take to a 2.75-mile course at 10:30 a.m.

Both the Geneseo varsity boys and girls have a good chance to advance to the sectional meet and could "really use the support" to make this a "dream come true," according to their coach.

Harriers will hold the meet at Richmond Hill park, located next to I-80, Geneseo. The meet will be held, rain or shine, except in the case of an electrical storm.

A tour of the course will be

available at 9:15 a.m., prior to the race. The race will conclude at the neck of the funnel.

Geneseo's varsity girls will be running against some tough competition from Kewanee, Moline and Rock Island. Only the top five teams will advance to sectional competition. In addition, the first five individuals who are not members of the first five placing teams will advance to sectional competition.

Other schools participating in the girls division include Aledo, Amboy, Dixon, East Moline, Fulton Unity Christian, Mendota, Orion, Princeton, Prophetstown, Rochelle, Rock Falls, Rock Island Alleman, Sherrard, Ster-

ling and Sterling Newman.

According to cross country coach Don Fredericks, seven teams in the boys' division have a realistic chance of sectional advancement. Among those teams are East Moline, Geneseo, LaSalle-Peru, Rock Island, Sterling and 11th ranked Moline.

Just the top four teams will be headed to sectional competition in the varsity boys division as well as the top five runners who are not members of the first four teams.

Other teams running in the varsity boys race are Dixon, Kewanee, Rochelle, Rock Falls and Rock Island Alleman.

# Survival is the key

## Tough course for regional X-C meet

In cross country, winning is great - but not winning isn't necessarily the end of the line.

Survival is the goal of the participants in Saturday's regional meets, the objective being to advance to next weekend's sectionals - and ultimately, to the state finals in Peoria.

Geneseo's Richmond Hill Park, home of a hilly, treacherous course, will be the site for the area's Class AA boys and the single-class girls meets. Meanwhile, other area Class A boys teams will be at Elmwood, Liberty, and at Winnebago.

In the 10:30 a.m. boys meet at Geneseo, the top four teams will advance to the Sterling sectional, along with the top five individuals who aren't members of those four top teams. It'll be the same procedure at the Class A sites.

In the 10 a.m. girls race, the first five teams move on, as do the first five girls not members of those teams.

### THE TEAMS

Class AA Boys - This is a meeting of the Illinois Quad-Cities schools, and the best in the NCIC. There are 11 teams, including Dixon, United Township, Geneseo, Kewanee, LaSalle-Peru, Moline, Rochelle, Rock Falls, Alleman, Rock Island, and Sterling.

Some 19 girls teams are entered, including Aledo, Amboy, Dixon, United Township, Fulton Unity Christian, Geneseo, Kewanee, Mendota, Moline, Orion, Princeton, Prophetstown, Rochelle, Rock Falls, Alleman, Rock Island, Sherrard, Sterling, and Sterling Newman.

### THE COURSE

The Richmond Hill Course will be 2.75 miles long for the boys; 2.0 miles for the girls.

It's a beast.

If you thought all the land east of the Quad-Cities is flat, think again. Some 10,000 years ago, the Wisconsin Glacier moved to what's now the edge of this park. North of Richmond Hill, the land is pretty flat. From the park on south, it's one small hill after another.

The course is a washboard, with one murderous, 100-yard-long upgrade about midway through the race.

"The course is in absolutely horrible shape," reports Don Fredericks, coach of hosting Geneseo. "The footing is treacherous. It's been wet, and the moles have been running wild - they've had an enjoyable fall season out there."

The poor footing and numerous hills favor the strong, powerfully-built runners.

"Some coaches don't like this course," said Fredericks, noting that Richmond Hill is the antithesis of the state meet course, Detweiller Park in Peoria, and its flat clone, the sectional course in Sterling.

"Those flat courses favor the Chicago area runners, because that's all they run on," said Fredericks. "Yet, I think this course is what cross country is, or should be, all about."

### THE TEAM RACES

Making the bold, and with high school kids, unlikely - assumption that all athletes will be healthy, eligible - and running at peak form - here's what could happen Saturday: Coach Jeff Quick's Moline team should win the boys race, and Fredericks' Maple Leafs should have little trouble taking the girls event. Behind them, there will be ferocious competition for the remaining qualifying spots.

Maroons Joe Perez, Eric Edmunds, Mike Lester and Rob Harvey finished second, fifth, ninth and 10th, respectively, at the Western Big 6 meet, and if that front-running pack gets out quickly, no team in this field will catch Moline.

Rock Island, with Steve Tanner and Mario Vesey figuring to run near the top, has a chance for second; so does balanced NCIC champ Geneseo, which is especially tough on its home course. There is balance among the NCIC

powers, though: both LaSalle-Peru and Sterling were expecting to beat Geneseo at the NCIC meet, and will be anxious to do better than last week. And, Dixon and United Township have young, oncoming squads.

In the girls race, Geneseo's trio of Lorri DeBieck, Gail Perkins and Connie Gradert usually pack together - and all are threats to win the race. All seven of Geneseo's runners were among the top 17 at last week's NCIC meet; the other squads just can't match that quality at the top, or that depth.

Moline, Rock Island and Kewanee - not necessarily in that order - should fill the next three spots, with Rock Falls, Sterling, and UT figuring to battle for the all-important fifth qualifying spot. And don't count out Sterling Newman.

### THE INDIVIDUAL RACES

Sterling's Brian Wilson has won 15 races this fall, and has the capability of blowing the doors off the field, especially if he gets and holds an early lead. He's got a great finishing kick.

Moline's Perez could contend, and so could Geneseo's Phil Walsh. Moline's Edmunds and Rock Island's Tanner and Vesey could be near the front; so could Dixon's Rob Dowell. And, keep track of Kewanee's Mark Petersen and L-P's Jack Weberski. Petersen's home course is hilly, too, and Weberski has the powerful build which can be useful at Richmond.

Kewanee's Amy Reecy and Alleman's Colleen Doak appear to be the girls to beat - but it could be a photo-finish. Reecy, the NCIC champ, has been strong all season, and Doak has had success at Richmond Hill. Both are strong, physical runners, which should help.

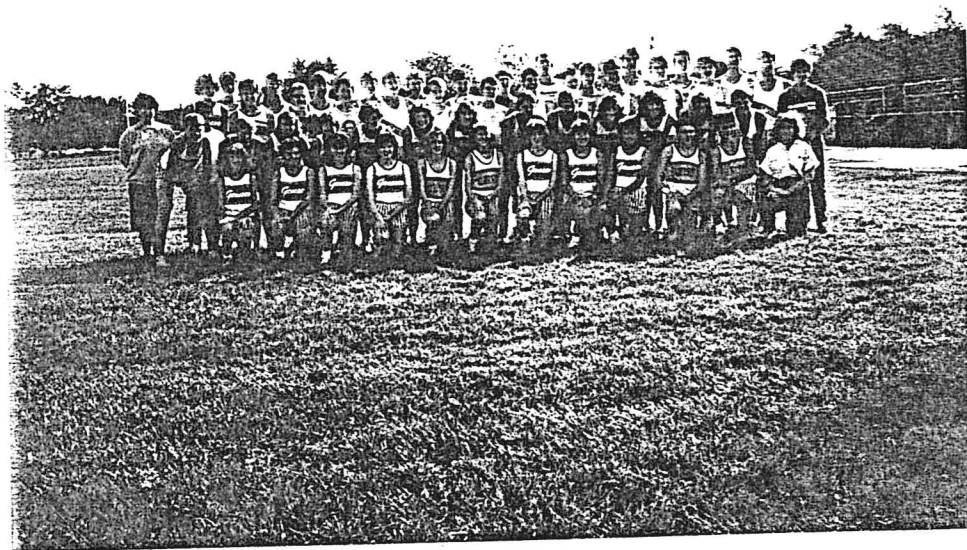

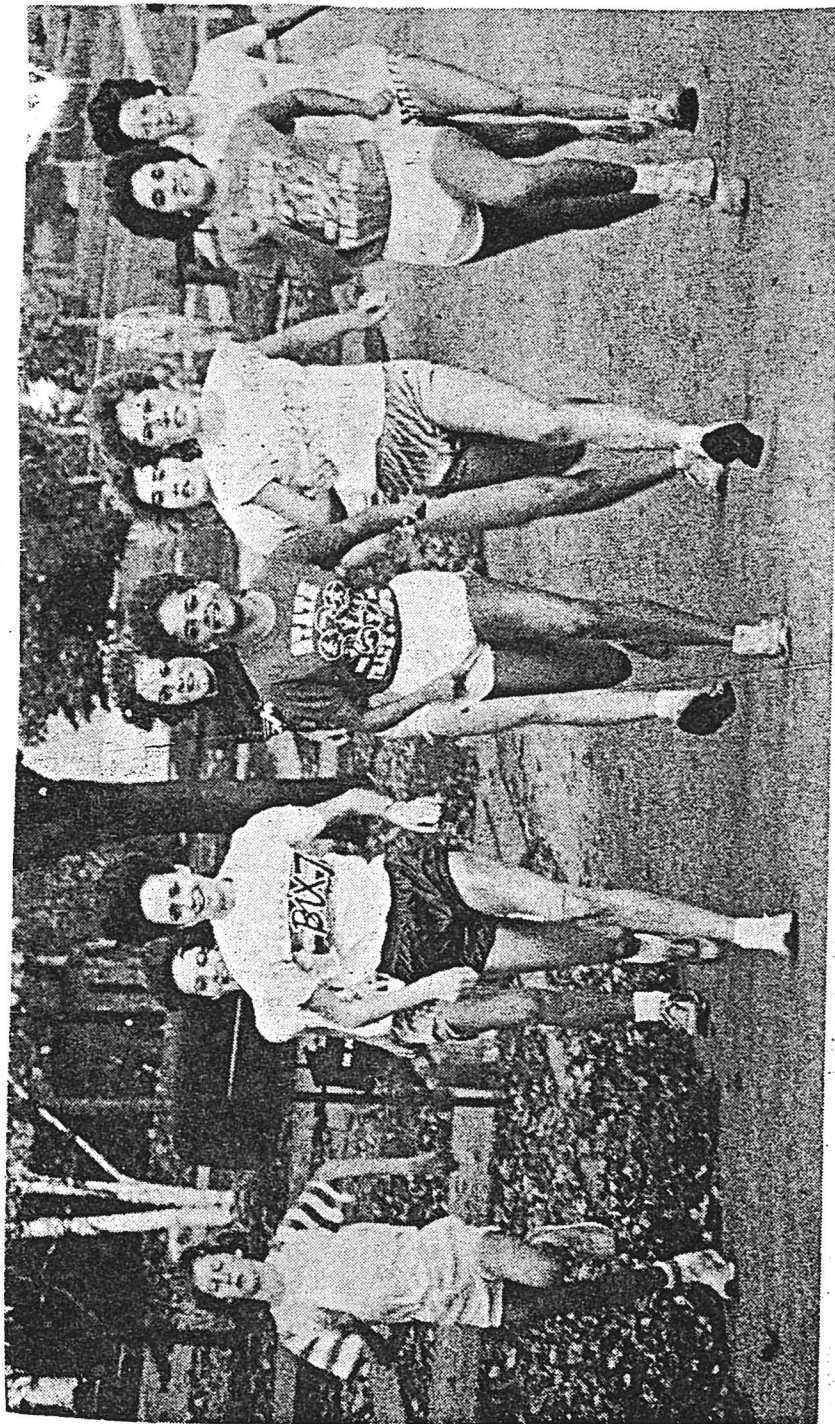

# Harrier girls win regional; boys qualify for sectional

A third straight regional championship title was won by the Geneseo varsity girls cross country squad during the IHSA regional competition Saturday, October 25 in Geneseo.

It was an "outstanding team effort," Coach Don Fredericks beamed. "The team is really coming together and has a lot of momentum moving in the right direction."

The girls scored 45 points for the victory followed by Kewanee with 76 in second and Sterling, 117, in third.

Amy Reecy finished first overall in the 2.0-mile race for Kewanee in a time of 12:33. Lorri DeBlick and Gail Perkins ran strong races, according to Coach Fredericks, finishing in second and fourth, respectively.

Coach Fredericks continued with "Those two freshman... wow...they really helped carry the team on a day when it would have been real easy to make excuses."

The two freshmen he was referring to are Karmen Roehrs and Kirstin Kemmis. Roehrs, with a tremendous break through, finished seventh in the field while Kemmis, running the best race of her life, came in 17th.

A solid effort by Tara Zeitler rounded out the scoring for the Lady Leafs with her 20th place finish.

Two of the main cross country Lady Leafs gave what they could following illness. They were Connie Gradert, 22nd place overall and Kim Chapman, 39th place.

The Moline Maroons walked away with the title in the cross country varsity boys division. The squad tallied 45 points for the slot while Rock Island earned second with 82 and Geneseo took third place with 117.

"We didn't run as well as hoped but we are satisfied," Mr. Fredericks stated. "The bottom line is that the boys did qualify for the sectional championship in Sterling."

The Geneseo Leafs had hoped to give Rocky a run for second but a 35 point spread wasn't narrow enough. "It is a nice situation when we can run a sub-average race and still easily qualify for the sectionals. I feel that speaks very highly of our program," Coach Fredericks commented.

According to the coach, the boys had a hard time getting psyched up after last weekend's "emotional" N.C.I.C. victory. "But we'll be ready for the sectionals," he affirmed.

A steady race by Phil Walsh earned Geneseo its first place

finisher, seventh overall. The next Leaf runners to cross the line were Jason VanVooren, 21st overall and Brad Baker, 22nd. Finishing up the five-man scoring for the Geneseo squad were Scott Johnson, 28th place and Bill Holevoet, 39.

Mike Haars gave his all following illness for a 44th place finish. John DeGrande gave "a hundred percent effort" for his 51st place finish.

The weather may have made a difference on the outcome of the meet for both the boys and girls divisions. The hilly Richmond Hill course gradually turned into slippery mud as the wind and rain of the day plagued the site.

"The course was just in terrible condition. It's a rugged course in the first place, but when you couple that with the adverse conditions that were present, it made it quite a struggle to just finish," Coach Fredericks said. "Anyone who finished accomplished quite a feat."

Sectional competition will be held this Saturday, November 1, in Sterling.

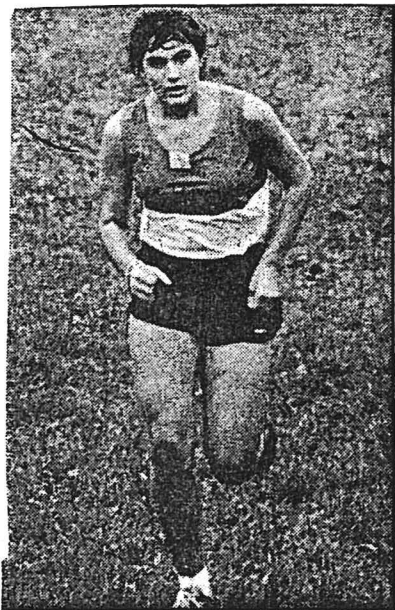

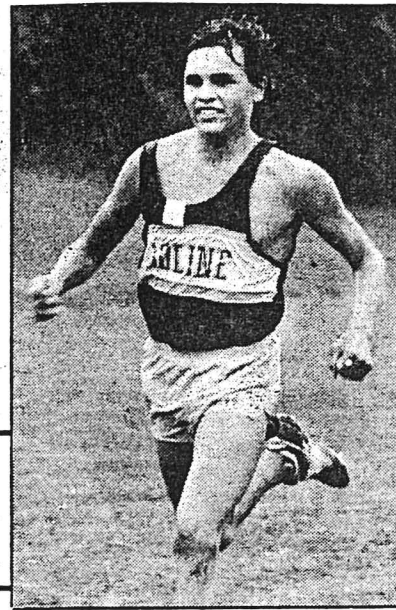

# Maroons, Leafs win

**GENESEO** — Well, kids, here's mud in your eye. And rain in your face.

But, you Moline boys and Geneseo girls, it seemed like that cold, raw wind was at your backs.

The Maroons and the Maple Leafs claimed regional cross country team championships Saturday morning, "in conditions that were among the worst I've ever seen kids run in," said Geneseo coach Don Fredericks.

Really, only the weather and the footing on the course were poor; otherwise, it was a great day for area runners.

Full boys teams from Rock Island, Geneseo and United Township all will join Moline at next week's sectional in Sterling. And, full girls teams from Rock Island and UT will join Geneseo.

Individually, Alleman's Colleen Doak advanced with a third-place finish in the girls race; Pioneer Tim Phillis moves on after his 12th-place run in boys competition. And, sixth-place Monica Holliday from Sherrard and 12th-place Kris Koelz from Orion also will be running next week.

"It was a great day for the Quad-Cities, and I think you'll be hearing more from Quad-City teams, at the state level, in the coming years," said Fredericks. "There's a lot of enthusiasm and good, young talent in the programs around here."

Moline roared to the boys title, placing four runners among the top 11 in the 77-runner meet. Three of those four are sophomores, and one of them, Joe Perez, won the whole thing, covering the hilly, mole-eaten 2.75-mile course in 14:47,

beating Dixon's Rob Dowell by nine seconds, and favored Brian Wilson of Sterling by 11.

Moline's number seven runner, this day, Brian Mayfield, got the Maroons off to a fast start by leading the field up the first long hill. "I knew I had to get out fast," said Perez. "I caught Mayfield and went, and gave it 110 percent."

"We pack behind Perez," said Moline coach Jeff Quick. "All seven of our guys were in the top 10 or 15 at the top of the first hill, then we just eased back into our pace. We've run well, and we told the guys, 'you've got a reputation; if you get off well, maybe the others won't come after you.' What I'm not used to, though, is sophomores who are so strong."

Maroons Rob Harvey, Mike Lester and Eric Edmunds were fifth, 10th and 11th; Harvey and Edmunds are sophomores.

Moline had a 45-82 edge on second-place Rock Island.

In the girls race, one of Geneseo's top runners was ill and finished, but out of the scoring. Still, the Maple Leafs put three of the first seven runners into the finish chute, led by senior Lorri DeBleck's second-place run.

DeBleck was just eight seconds behind a strong winner, Kewanee's Amy Reecy, and 11 seconds ahead of Alleman's Colleen Doak.

"I held back on the hills, and stretched it out on top," said a happy DeBleck.

Doak said she "didn't feel real strong at times, then at other times, I did. I just want to get to state."

And what about the winner, Reecy? "I like to think we've got good individuals on our team, but

she has beaten them all year," said Fredericks. "She just blasts out, and in effect says, 'to beat me, you'll go through a lot of pain.' I thought about three-quarters through the race she was tired, then came that long draw hill (a steep, 150-yard upgrade) and she increased her lead by 30 yards - on that hill," praised Fredericks.

Geneseo, which beat Kewanee 45-76 for the title, got a strong, steady fourth place from sophomore Gail Perkins, great runs (seventh and 17th) from two ninth-graders, Karmen Roehrs and Kirstin Kemmis, and when steady junior Tara Zeitler hit the chute, five Leafs were among the first 20 finishers in the 91-runner field.

Back to the boys race, where sophomores Mario Vesey (fourth place) and Steve Tanner (eighth) led coach John Coolidge's Rocks to a runnerup finish. "I know John was elated with his kids," said Quick. "He said they'd like to ride our coattails to state. Rock Island is a good young team."

Geneseo's boys advanced with a third-place team finish, and junior Phil Walsh paced the Leafs with a seventh-place individual finish.

Coach Gary Phillips' consistent United Township team got in ahead of LaSalle-Peru for the fourth and final team qualifying spot, and the Panthers just missed nipping Geneseo for third. Travis Gates, a sophomore Phillips moved up for this meet, led his team with a 16th-place finish.

The girls teams from Rocky and UT will move on to Sterling, too, after placing fourth and fifth, respectively. Ann Carlson (11th place) and Chris Coolidge (14th) paced Bob Wilson's Rocks.
