The 1987 Girls' team has maintained their position as a formidable power in Cross-Country, despite a somewhat shaky beginning. After sustaining an early-season defeat by Moline, the girls steadily improved to earn 3rd place at Homewood Flossmoor, 2nd at the Spalding and Sterling Invites, and 1st at both Dixon and Peoria High Competitions. The girls also contributed to earn the first ever NCIC "triple-Crown" by finishing with a near perfect score of 16 points. The lady harriers won their 4th straight regional crown and three out of the past four Sectional titles. The season was capped off when the girls ran to a 7th place state finish marking their 4th consecutive top 10 performance in the perennially tough field.
