

Leaf girls win Peoria meet

PEORIA - Genesco's girls cross country squad won easily once again at the Peoria High Invitational here Saturday, but it was a sprained ankle that kept the Leaf boys from a top-five finish.

Cathine Grader of Genesco took first place overall for the girls with a time of 12:21 for the 2.1-mile course. She was followed up in 3-5 places by teammates Carmen Rojas, Gail Perkins and Wendy Wassell as the Leaf girls scored 27 points to crush runner-up Peoria with 118 tallies in the 29-team field.

"For our girls to get out there and destroy the field like they did was really outstanding," said Genesco coach Jon Fredericks.

The Leaf boys managed a ninth-place finish in the 41-team boys field, but that came as a slight disappointment because of a key injury.

"Our boys really ran well," said Fredericks, "but unfortunately our second runner (Brad) Baker sprained his ankle and didn't finish, and that kept us out of third place."

Phil Walsh led the Genesco boys in 27th place overall, and he was followed up by other Leafs Mike Harris, Jason VanVooren and Adam Boardman who all cracked the top 100.

The boys' field was also topnotch with the presence of Belamora's Mark Scheirer. Scheirer won the overall boys title with a time of 14:31 for 3 miles, 30 seconds faster than the second-place finisher.

"Scheirer was ranked 5th (in the state of Illinois) last year as a junior," said Fredericks, "and he was rated No. 2 coming into this season behind Blake Stepien of St. Charles."

Scheirer had already defeated Stepien in another meet this season.

Harriers ready for NCIC and regional competitions

One thing a coach tries hard to do is not let his team look too far into the future without realizing the obstacles between the beginning and the end. But with the strength and will power of the Genesee boys' cross country team it is hard not to let them set sights . . . at least a top five finish at sectionals on Saturday, October 31.

Coach Don Fredericks believes in his harriers. They know it takes stamina, dedication and determination. All which the varsity harriers have exhibited this season.

According to the coach, seven of the varsity Leafs logged in more than 500 miles in hot summer temperatures in efforts toward a trip to state. Coach Fredericks admits the returns have been good for both the individuals and the team.

Genesee's boys won two major invites, the Genesee Invitational and the recent Dixon meet. The Genesee harriers placed first last year in conference, the second year in a row, while finishing third at sectionals.

The squads' major goal right now is to defend its title as NCIC champs on Saturday, October 17. Then it's on to regional competition Saturday, October 24. Genesee will be hosting the boys' regionals as well as the girls'. Among the nine teams involved in the boys' regional, besides the hosts, are Dixon, United Township of East Moline, Galesburg, Moline, Rochelle, Rock Falls, Rock Island and Sterling high school.

The Saturday, October 31 sectional competition will be held in Sterling with the state finals to be held Saturday, November 7 in Delweiler park, Peoria.

Topping the list of Genesee's potential is senior harrier, Phil Walsh. His strength as an individual and team runner has been evident for two years. Walsh was running near the front of the field at the Dixon

Tournament when he stepped into a hole about a third of the way through the race.

Walsh dropped back to fourth runner for Genesee with his twisted knee but he still kept on pushing. "Had I known at the time what he had done, I would have pulled him from the race," Coach Fredericks stressed. "Our other guys zipped up and filled in," the coach explained.

The injury mended quickly and Walsh took the win from Pleasant Valley Tuesday, September 29 in Genesee's final dual meet of the season.

Keeping close tabs on Walsh are harriers Brad Baker, a junior, Mike Haars, a senior and Jason VanVooren, a sophomore. Tim Moran, a senior squad member, has developed into the team's fifth runner along with freshman harrier Adam Boardman.

Coach Fredericks explained, "A tendon problem kept Moran out of action last year. He has been courageous and has given us great leadership."

Several other harriers have been running strong, solid races in the varsity Leafs' behalf. They include seniors Mike Morris and Heath Lowe, junior Joe Halevort and freshmen Bryan Glass and Jason Leigh.

Coach Fredericks and his Leafs figure to be in the top five regional finishers to advance to sectionals. The coach believes this sectional, which includes the Quad Cities, Rockford and Peoria areas, may be the toughest in the state this year.

"It'll be an uphill battle for the boys to get to state," Coach Fredericks realizes, "but it's our goal to get both our girls and boys to the state meet."

And the Leafs are well on their way for the uphill climb. Saturday, October 3 the squad placed ninth at the Peoria high school cross country invitational, they took a first place finish in the Dixon invitational Saturday,

September 20 and they grabbed a victory over Sterling, LaSalle-Peru and Streator Thursday, September 24.

The Leafs brought home the ninth place finish from Peoria from a field of 41 teams. But even that finish came as somewhat of a disappointment to the boys. Coach Fredericks feels his team could have placed third in the invite if it hadn't been for a key injury.

"Our boys really ran well," the coach stressed "but unfortunately our second runner, Brad Baker, sprained his ankle and was unable to finish."

The coach emphasized that Baker is now healed.

Phil Walsh was the first Genesee harrier to finish the 3.0 mile course. He placed 27th overall with a time of 15:51; Mark Scheler of Metamora took the tape in 14:31. The second-place finisher was 30 seconds behind.

Following up Walsh for Genesee's scoring were Mike Haars, 36th overall, in 16:04; VanVooren, 67th, 10:51; Boardman, 77th, 10:59; Glass, 134th, 17:54; Moran, 184th, 18:24.

Top ten team scores were York, first, 46 points, Guilford, second, 137 points, Bloomington, third, 247, Glenbrook south, fourth place, 263 points, Centralia, fifth, 302 points, Maine East, sixth, 305, Salem, seventh, 319 points, Richwoods, eighth, 321, Genesee, ninth, 340 points and Hoffman Estates, tenth, 344 points.

It was an "outstanding day for the Leafs" when the varsity harriers traveled to the Dixon invitational Saturday, September 26. The boys finished on top of the 12-team field, scoring a total of 66 points for the top notch. Rock Island placed second overall with 70 points while Rockford Guilford took third with 90.

Mario Vesey of Rock Island took individual honors for the three-mile course.

main nucleus to the team. "She ran behind some great athletes like Priscilla Gomez and Lorri DeBieck her first three years, but she's just giving us great leadership now," her coach stated.

Sophomore Karmen Roehrs and freshman Wendy Wassell are showing future potential as well as strength now. Their running this year has the coach excited. For instance Wassell is improving her time by 10-15 seconds each race according to the coach.

Junior Gail Perkins is rounding back into top form after recovering from back problems stemming from last fall.

But Coach Fredericks stressed the point the team is not really hurting for a fifth runner. "We have 11," Coach Fredericks smiled, all of which "have potential to be in our top seven."

A third straight regional championship title was won by the varsity girls in 1986 during the IHSA regionals in Genesee. Kemmis and Roehrs ran strong races in regional competition as freshmen. At that time two of the varsity harriers were coming back from illness, Connie Grader and Kim Chapman.

Zietler also made a solid effort in the Lady Leafs behalf during regional action.

The Lady Leafs finished 10th in the 25-team class AA girls field; their second appearance. In 1985 the girls finished ninth. Among the state records for the girls are returning runners Gail Perkins, Grader, Roehrs, Chapman, Zietler and Kemmis.

Three recent meets show the strength in this year's Genesee

runners. Saturday, October 3, the Lady Leafs wiped the field with 27 points for an "awesome" day of competition. Peoria High came in second overall with 118 points followed by Galesburg, third, 119, Richwoods, fourth, 130 and Bergan, fifth, 140 points.

Twenty teams participated in the Peoria high school cross country invitational Saturday. The meet was held in Detweiller park, the same location for this year's state finals.

Sunny conditions and mild temperatures provided the ideal setting for the Lady Leaf victory. And none other than Connie Grader led the pack over the 2.1 mile course. Grader's time of 12:21 won her first place for the field.

Kris Ishaun of Peoria high school broke up the Genesee packing by taking second in 12:34. Genesee lady harriers rounded out the top five positions with Karmen Roehrs, 12:39; in second, Gail Perkins, 12:40, in fourth and Wendy Wassell, 12:50, in fifth.

Renee Clifton placed 14th overall with a time of 13:09 while Kirstin Kemmis' time of 13:36 earned a 29th place finish.

Kim Chapman, Genesee's seventh and final fielded runner, came in 31st overall with a time of 13:39.

"For our girls to get out there and destroy the field like they did was really outstanding," Coach Fredericks gloated.

The Lady Leafs proved "awfully good" in the Dixon invitational Saturday, September 26 also. The girls finished way ahead of the remaining 19 teams with 22 total points. Their closest competition came from St. Charles with 132 points. Other teams in the top five include Peoria Bergan, 133, third place; Rock Island, 136, fourth place, and Sterling, 182, fifth place.

Again Grader took top honors. She covered the 2.1 mile course in 12:49 for the tape. She was followed by three of her teammates to pretty well sew up

the top five slots.

Roehrs held tight to second for Genesee followed by Wassell, third and Perkins in fourth. A St. Charles runner rounded out the top five positions.

The remaining three Genesee harriers placed within the top 20 runners overall. Renee Clifton finished in 12th place while Michelle Landrum took 18th and Kirstin Kemmis finished in 20th.

"Our girls had their strongest performance all season," the coach remarked. "They're looking very strong, and they're becoming state contenders," he concluded.

Also among the many victories on the Lady Leafs' record is the Thursday, September 24 contest in Spring Creek. Genesee took Sterling, 15-55. Streator also competed in the race but did not have their score tallied.

Genesee finished with runners in all of the top six positions against conference foe Sterling.

Those placing in the top slots for the solid victory include Grader on top with a time of 15:46; Roehrs in second, 15:59; Wassell in third at 16:43; Kemmis in fourth, 16:52; Perkins in fifth at 16:55 and Clifton in sixth with a time of 17:03.

Others completing the 2.5 mile course were Michelle Landrum, eighth, 17:13; Kim Chapman,

Scheirer, York

too much for PHS field

Metamora's Mark Scheirer and the York cross country team left lasting impressions Saturday by recording dominant firsts at the 2nd annual Peoria High Invitational.

Scheirer won the three-mile race at Detweller Park in a season-best 14 minutes, 31 seconds. York placed five runners in the top 16 to win the 41-item race with 48 points. Runner-up Rockford Guilford, the defending champion, scored 137.

One person most impressed was Guilford coach Brad Seago.

"You can write it now: York will win the state meet," Seago said.

Seago speaks from experience. York coach Joe Newton has enjoyed 13 Class AA state titles in 27 years. Seago's team has been runner-up to the Dukes in 1983, 1984 and 1986.

On Scheirer: "The kids behind him were awed by him," Seago said. "He looks too easy out there."

Scheirer and York took different roads to the same destination Saturday.

"We went out slow like always, but I knew

when we had five in the top 35 at the mile that we were right where we wanted to be," Newton said. "We followed our race plan to a T."

Almost everyone was slow compared to Scheirer. The senior ran a 4:40 first mile. His nearest rival was eventual runner-up Nick Schwartz of Centralia, who was at 4:45.

Then Scheirer put Schwartz away with a 4:36 second mile for a 25-second lead.

"I felt real good," Scheirer said. "I was really happy with my time in the second mile."

Schwartz said the second mile was the key. "You lose contact like that, and he can coast from there," the senior said.

Todd Peters, an Illinois Valley Central senior, rallied for a 14th-place finish. "I was coming to the second mile and someone was counting (runners), '40, 41,' and I was back there," Peters said. "It was unreal."

Newton experienced a first by having seven runners finish as medalists (top 35). Senior captain Matt Shell (7th place) led the Dukes. Falling in a green line right behind Shell were Mark Knut, Chuck Martin and Al Kubat.

"This is one of the finest groups of guys I've ever had," Newton said. "They got a good, just reward for all their hard work."

Richwoods led local teams at eighth place. The Knights were just 19 points out of fifth, but usual No. 1 runner Craig Frazer finished 57th. Frazer was in the top 20 after two miles.

"He had a bad race, but he's done a nice job that's allowed us to win some medals," coach Bob LaCrew said.

David Schrott (38th) led Richwoods, followed by Mark Mengo (53rd) and sophomore David Wood (44th). Brian Butchey of Morton was 25th.

Genesee dominated the girls race placing four runners in the top five. Genesee senior Connie Grader won the 2.1-mile race in 12:21. Central's Kris Hahn was 13 seconds back.

"It seemed like I kept getting stronger," said Grader, who was followed by teammates Karmen Roehrs (3rd), Gail Perkins (4th) and Wendy Wassell (5th).

"Connie's matured so much over last year," Genesee coach Don Fredericks said. "I'm pleased to see her doing well her senior year."

Central was second as Marie Winget took 11th and Julie Wade 24th. "Marie ran a helluva race," coach Mike Lawless said. "Julie has been our most consistent runner for the last four years."

Karin Johnson helped Richwoods to fourth place. Johnson was seventh and the Knights also had personal bests at Detweller from: Anne Schmidt (22nd), Adrienne Hennig (27th), Keri Hart (28th) and Tara Prentice (40th).

Bergen senior Steffie Stump was a strong sixth as the Trojans finished fifth. "That's as well as she's finished a race since her freshman year," said coach Mike Sullivan, who had Kelly Beland at 10th and Lisa Swardenska 11th.

Delavan Classic — The hosts won six of seven flights to win their 11th annual race. In flight one, Delavan's Ron Zimmer ran 2.9 miles in 14:32 to outduel Mason City's Roger Rivera by four seconds. Tremont's Jason Anderson was third, only eight seconds back. "They jockeyed for position and it became a kicker's race at the end," Delavan coach Walt Dure said. Steve Hartman of Brundfield was flight two.
