

# Doak, Geneseo team loom large in girls cross country action

Geneseo's team and Colleen Doak. That combination will be among the key factors in Saturday's girls sectional cross country meet, scheduled for Woodlawn Elementary School and Hoover Park in Sterling. The girls' 2.1-mile event is scheduled for a 10:30 a.m. start.

Geneseo's team, fresh from victory in its own regional championship and ranked ninth in the latest power rankings, appears to be an odds-on favorite for the team title, while Doak, coming off an impressive individual title at the same regional, should contend for the individual title of the meet.

"Looking at times turned in from last week's regionals, I would have to say that on paper we would have to be favored," said Geneseo coach Don Fredericks of his 9th-ranked Maple Leafs.

"I don't see any way that Geneseo can lose," surmised Moline coach Jeff Quick.

The Leafs are one of only four ranked teams in this sectional. Oswego is ranked 14th, Rockford Guilford 16th and Peoria Bergan 17th in the latest *Best Times Coaches' Power Rankings*.

Most coaches heading into this event are pointing toward those four teams to lock up team berths for the state meet the following weekend at Peoria's Detweiller Park, but that still leaves one team spot open and 16 other teams shooting for it.

Included in that group of hungry hopefuls will be Rock Island, Moline, Galesburg and United Township, which finished in that order behind Geneseo in regional action last week. A team from Belvidere that could surprise.

"I'd like to think that right now we have a confidence factor on our side," said Fredericks. "We've been here for the last three years, and we're finally getting the recognition that we deserve."

Connie Gradert, Geneseo's No. 1 runner, should be a contender for the individual title along with Doak. She finished third to the Alleman ace last Saturday.

The big story could be Doak. She qualified for the state meet as a freshman, when she went on to finish 21st in the state. She also qualified for state last year, but she didn't live up either to her own or to her coach's expectations in either state run.

Now she's facing her final shot, and she's running the best she ever has at this time of year.

"She's running the best right now she has in in the past three years," said Alleman coach Joe Lopez. "Early in the season her times were off, and a lot of people were asking a lot of questions like 'what's happened to Colleen.' Look at her now. She's showing that nothing is wrong with her."

And it doesn't look like there should be too many obstacles between her and a return engagement at Detweiller Park. "Yes, I think she has a great chance at qualifying,"

said Lopez.

"I think it will be about a ten-girl race, and most of those girls should

be on a qualifying team, leaving her enough spots to make it."

Back in the team race, Rock Island coach Bob Wilson sees Galesburg, Moline, UT, Peoria High and Richwoods as teams to battle it out for that fifth spot and, of course, isn't counting his team out. But it would take another surprise like last week's second-place regional finish to do it.

"We're running pretty close to potential," said Wilson. "If we run as well as we did last week, then I would have to say it's a very good possibility that we will qualify."

It's a flatter course and that favors speed, and I have my entire mile relay team out there. I would say that might favor our girls a little bit."

Even if Rocky doesn't make it as a team, Chris Coolidge and Kristen Kelewae could be individual qualifiers. Those two finished in sixth and seventh places, respectively, last weekend on a much hillier Richmond Hill course, and would benefit from the flatter course this week.

Coach Quick is facing a probable all-or-nothing situation with his Moline girls. Employing a strong pack-running team, all of Moline's girls will have to be right up there near the front to do well.

"We have to run the best race of the season and have all seven girls up there," said Quick. "It's as simple as that."

UT coach Dennis Steinmetz has to worry more about who isn't going to run than who is. Gail Conley, who has been running No. 1, is out with a stress fracture and Chris Hunter, who was the team's No. 3 performer, won't run this week because of a throat infection.

That leaves depleted troops, but not depleted spirits.

"We're thrilled that we're moving on," said Steinmetz. "The girls really showed me some things. Now our goal is to finish in the top 10 teams."

An undefeated dual meet season, some impressive invitational wins, the Western Big 6 Conference title and the Geneseo Regional championship already are etched in the record book.

Will the Sterling Sectional title be the next milestone for the 1987 Moline boys' cross country team?

The Maroons are going to be one of the favorites going into Saturday's 11 a.m. meet at Woodlawn Elementary School and Hoover Park in Sterling, but the event is shaping up to be one of the Maroons' most challenging yet.

In what ranks as the second-toughest of the four Class AA sectionals, the fourth-ranked Maroons will be joined by six other teams in the Top 20. Ninth-ranked Pontiac (which

won the Class A state cross country title last year), No. 10 Oswego, No. 13 Rockford Guilford and No. 14 Rockford East should supply most of the Maroons' team competition. They'll be joined by Peoria Richwoods, ranked No. 18, and 20th-ranked Galesburg.

Rock Island and Geneseo also qualified as teams for the Sterling gathering. But they have their work cut out for them if they hope to be one of the teams qualifying for the state meet at Detweiller Park in Peoria the following Saturday.

The top five teams, along with the top seven individuals not on one of the qualifying teams, will advance to the state meet.

"There are five teams that really stand out in this sectional, and we have beaten them all at one point or another in the season," said Moline coach Jeff Quick. "So I would say that we have to be favored."

"I don't know if being fourth-ranked and favored will be good or bad," said Quick. "We never have won a sectional meet, so that might put a little more pressure on our kids."

Leading Moline have been juniors Eric Edmunds, Joe Perez and Rob Harvey. Those three, with Edmunds probably having the best shot, could all be in the individual title hunt. Adding plenty of support have been Chris Wallaert, Jeff Black, Julio Raya and Brian Mayfield.

"We're going to need three guys in the top 10 finishers," said Quick. "The next four will have to be in the next 25 places, so we will need all seven kids in the top 35 places."

While Quick has his team's game plan all laid out, Rock Island coach John Coolidge is going to run this race off the cuff.

"We're not even thinking about sectionals," said Coolidge, "We're just showing up and running."

No, Coolidge doesn't think his team doesn't have a chance. He just thinks that's the approach to which his kids will respond.

"Each team I've had has responded differently and this team is really loosey-goosey — we don't need to sit down and discuss strategy with them, just get them to the line. They know what to do once they get there."

Pacing Rocky's "doing" will be another pair of juniors in Mario Vesey, who could contend for the individual title, and Steve Tanner. Also lining up for the Rocks will be sophomores Chris Green, Marlon Hall, Mike Morrow and Greg Wilkening, and freshman Mike Gustafson.

"We know there are five favorites, and we'll just have to give it our best effort and see if we can break things up at the top. I think at least four of those teams could be vulnerable," said Coolidge.

Geneseo finds itself in the same position as Rock Island — in the second pack of five strong teams along with Galesburg, Richwoods and Pekin.

"We have a tremendous challenge in front of us," said third-year Maple Leaf coach Don Fredericks. "I'm optimistic. I really believe if we run the way we are capable of running we can qualify as a team. It's not going to take super-human efforts, the kids just have to run to their potential."

## SCRAMBLE IS ON FOR CLASS AA QUALIFYING BERTHS

Once again this year a couple of the state's best Class AA boys cross country teams will be left on the outside looking in when the Illinois High School Association convenes its state meets in Peoria next weekend. Over the years the Sterling sectional has developed into one of the tougher, if not the toughest, of the state's sectionals, and 1987 is no exception. Seven of the state's top 20 teams, based on the "Best Times" power rankings, will compete for the five state-qualifying spots, meaning two of the better teams will be left out in the cold come Nov. 7.

Moline, the Western Big Six Conference and Geneseo Regional champion, heads the list with its No. 3 ranking. The Maroons, who return five runners from last year's state-qualifying team, appear to be the ones to beat today. However, Pontiac may take exception to that assessment. The Indians won the Class A state championship last year and return four of the seven runners from that team. But a consolidation of school districts has bumped Pontiac up to Class AA this season and the Indians are ranked No. 9 by the "Best Times."

Other top 20 entries include No. 10 Oswego, which has the three underclassmen back from last year's state team and finished second to Pontiac at the Pontiac Regional; No. 13 Rockford Guilford, the Rockford Regional champion and a perennial state qualifier; No. 14 Rockford East, the NIC-10 Conference champion but the runnerup to Guilford at the Regional; No. 18 Peoria Richwoods, which also returns the three underclassmen who ran on last year's state-qualifying team; and No. 20 Galesburg, a relative newcomer to cross country power rankings but a strong second to Moline at last week's Geneseo Regional.

The race for individual honors appears to be just as tight, although several of the runners automatically will qualify for state if their teams do (the top seven individuals not on state-qualifying teams advance to Peoria). Nearly two dozen of the sectional qualifiers have state meet experience, although several coaches have tabbed Metamora's Mark Scheirer as the runner to beat. Scheirer was fifth in last year's Class AA state meet with a time of 14:33 over the Detweiler Park course and he's already run 14:31 on that same course this season. In addition, he was fifth in the 3200m run and 10th in the 1600m run at last spring's Class AA state track and field meet in Charleston. Seven other runners finished in the top 100 at state last fall, including Pontiac's Todd Lopeman, who was second in the Class A race (although his time of 15:07 would have placed him 31st in the Class AA race). Moline's Joe Perez was 40th at state last year, although teammate Eric Edmunds has supplanted him as the Maroons' No. 1 runner; Oswego's Ben Wolf was 43rd; Rockford Guilford's David Koch finished 57th; Peoria Richwoods' David Schroff was 76th; Rockford East's Corey Howard was 84th and Moline's Rob Harvey was 94th. Other top individuals entered in today's race are Toby Peters of Chillicothe (IVC), Brian Richey of Morton, Mario Vesey of Rock Island and Rob Dowell of Dixon. ## Vesey grabs top honors, Maroon team advances

STERLING — Moline's boys' cross country team may have been favored to win the Sterling Sectional Class AA cross country title here Saturday, but as it turned out, the third-ranked Maroons had to earn their trip to the state meet via a fourth-place finish.

Joining Moline on Peoria's Detweiller Park course Saturday will be sectional champ Mario Vesey and Rock Island teammate Steve Tanner. Geneseo's Phil Walsh and Galesburg's Jon Leegard will also make the trip to Peoria.

"I was disappointed we didn't win the team title," said Moline coach Jeff Quick. "We had been running so well all year and it would have been a plus for us going into the state meet had we won today."

As it turned out, ninth-ranked Pontiac, last year's Class A champs, won the team title with 73 points. Rockford Guilford, ranked 13th, was a close second with 77 points.

Rockford East, ranked 14th, was a distant third with 109 points, just in front of third-ranked Moline which finished with 115. Tenth-ranked Oswego was the fifth team to qualify finishing well ahead of Galesburg, Rock Island and Geneseo, who followed in sixth, seventh and eighth place.

"Pontiac, Guilford and East were better than we were today," added Quick.

Better than anyone else in the field was Rock Island's Vesey who, under partly cloudy skies and dry footing, walked off with the individual overall crown. Vesey had been beaten the last three weeks by Moline's Eric Edmunds and employed the Moline runner's attack on the 1-mile Woodlawn Elementary School/Hoover Park course.

Coolidge reported that Vesey overtook Metamora's Mark Scheirer and Pontiac's Tom Lopeman in the homestretch for the win. Vesey's winning time was 14:52. Ironically, that was the same time Edmunds

posted in beating Rocky's No. 1 runner three weeks ago at the Sterling Invitational on the same course.

Tanner also ran a solid race and finished in 15:34, a time that was three seconds slower than he posted three weeks ago.

Joe Perez and Edmunds led Moline with seventh and eighth place finishes. Perez crossed in 15:13 and Edmunds in 15:22. Jeff Black (15:54), Rob Harvey (16:06), Julio Raya (16:10), Brian Mayfield (16:18) and Chris Wallaert (17:12) helped the qualifying charge.

"Qualifying for state and making it through is what the sectional is all about," said Coolidge. "I hope Moline looks at it that way and then can come back next week."

Geneseo's Walsh finished two spots behind Tanner in 17th place with a 15:36 clocking to earn his trip next Saturday, but their just wasn't enough depth to get the Maple Leafs a team berth.

## Geneseo handles field; Rocks surprise of sectional

STERLING — Yes, Geneseo's girls' cross country team won the Sterling Sectional meet here Saturday in easy fashion as expected.

Yes, Alleman standout Colleen Doak qualified for Saturday's state meet at Peoria's Detweiller Park.

And yes, there was even room for a surprise. That was supplied by Rock Island's quintet which finished fourth in the team race and earned a spot in the state finals along with the other 19 best teams in the state.

"I said we had to run well and we did," said Rock Island coach Bob Wilson. "We had three of our girls turn in their best times of the year by over 20 seconds and our other two were right on their best times. Basically we had everybody running their best times of the year. This is the first time any Rocky girls team has qualified for the state meet."

The ninth-ranked Lady Leafs racked up 80 points to outdistance 4th-ranked Oswego's 100 points. Rockford Guilford, ranked 16th, finished third with 129 points, followed by Rock Island's 164. Beaveride grabbed the last team spot or the state meet with 181 points.

Saying a lot for this area's running, all five of the teams from the

For the second week in a row the Rocks did surprisingly well. At last week's Geneseo Regional, Rocky came from nowhere to finish second behind the hosts. Saturday, it was Kristen Kelewae who led the

Senior Chris Coolidge was six spots back, covering the Woodlawn Elementary, Hoover-Park course with a time of 12:51. Also aiding the Rocky cause were Priscilla Perez (13:19), Kris Braet (13:27), Shelly Reed (13:50), Ali Miner (14:16) and Shelly McReynolds (15:23).

Wendy Wassell finished 18th with a 12:48 clocking, while Gail Perkins was 28th with a 13:03, Renee Clifton was 34th just two seconds behind Perkins, Kim Chapman was 46th with a time of 13:19 and Kirstin Kemmis turned in a 13:44 clocking.

Leading the Moline bunch this week under partly sunny skies and dry conditions were Jenny Puck and Jane Johnson who were 24th and 27th, respectively. But from there, the Maroon times and places slipped. Loellyn Gentry was 63rd overall (13:37), Nicky Van was 82nd (13:52), Deanne Day was 94th

(14:00) and Jenny Whitcomb Kirsten Woods were 121st 123rd with times of 14:38 14:39.

"We had to have all of our girls run solid races," said Moline coach Jeff Quick, "and today we just didn't get the right combinations."

While UT coach Dennis Steinmetz may not have had the key to a better sectional showing, it's to say he found the door to the future. His top five girls were comprised of two freshmen and three sophomores.

Leading the way was freshman Chris Lammers who clocked 13:10, good enough for a 36th-place finish. Also in that top five were Amber Turf (48th place, 13:22), Stephanie Polios (68th, 13:44), Amber Nichols (72nd, 13:45), Dorene Mohr (85th, 13:53). Other runners for UT were: Julie (92nd, 13:57) and Darlene (95th, 14:01).

"We were in the top half of the field and I can't be disappointed with that," added Steinmetz. "Amber Turf and Stephanie Polios were exceptional and Amber Nichols looked great also."

Other contenders include Naperville Central, Schaumburg and Moline. Defending champion York is not the favorite but remains a threat. York has won 12 state titles since 1962 under coach Joe Newton.

"He always seems to get his guys ready," Lake Park coach Ed Wardzala said. "He's done it before with less talent."

Individual title contenders include St. Charles' Blake Stepien, Metamora's Mark Scheirer, Downers Grove North's Tony Laskowski, Sandburg's Andy Homoly, Fremd's Bill Gould and Lake Park's Derek Olenek and Tony Karas.
