### Geneseo Takes Advantage Of Numbers, Enthusiasm

"Wanted. High school runners of all types (boys and girls).
- low pay but high rewards. - See Coach Fredericks."

Though no such sign hangs above Don Fredericks door, the word is out in the halls of Geneseo High School, Geneseo, IL that all comers to the cross country program are welcome.

Many have taken Fredericks up on his offer and his runners are now reaping the rewards. The 1987 Geneseo boys and girls cross country teams total 68 runners - not bad for a school of around 1200.

"The more runners we have the better," Fredericks says. "Every runner is important because cross country is a team sport in every way. We are now developing our junior high program."

These are bold words for a coach who finds himself in charge of both boys and girls teams - without an assistant.

"It gets a little hairy sometimes. We are working on using some parent volunteers. Maybe we can get an assistant in the future."

But the numbers game is not the only area of success for the Maple Leafs squads. Ranked all season in the top 10 Geneseo's girls team has trounced its competition at most meets - including impressive Conference and Regional wins.

The boys team, which has flirted with a ranking all season has similarly made impressive showings at invitationals.

The Geneseo squads established a record in 1987 for being

the first school to sweep the North Central Illinois Conference races (boys sophomore, varsity, and girls) -a feat they nearly accomplished in 1986. While the Maple Leafs won the varsity and girls crowns laste year the sophomores tied in score and lost by virtue of the sixth runner.

Reneec Clifton - A sophomore who runs as a solid fifth runner.

Kirsten Kemmis - A sophomore whose improvement has not gone unnoticed by Fredericks.

Kim Chapman - A junior who has run in the last several State meets.

Here is the boys team profile:

Phil Walsh - Most valuable runner as a sophomore and unior.

Mike Huars - Senior who is the Maple Leafs' captain.

Jason Van Vooren - A sophomore who has run a 4:40 1600.

Adam Boardman - A freshman who was the Illinois Junior

High School cross country champion as an 8th grader.

Brad Baker - A junior who has run 4;37 in the 1600.

Tim Moran - A senior co-captain who missed all last year but came racing back.

Heath Lowe - A senior who Fredericks classifies as an overachiever.

GENESEO — "On paper, Naperville Central and Palatine are the favorites," said Geneseo girls cross country coach Don Fredericks. "But I wouldn't put any money on that race," said the coach.

The state meet is Saturday morning in Peoria, and Geneseo, sectional champions for the third time in four years, is one of 25 teams in the race. Very MUCH in the race.

"It's wide open," said Fredericks.
"There are nine teams which could win. And we're one of them."

He's not saying Geneseo WILL win, just that Geneseo COULD win. "A finish in the top five is realistic for us," said Fredericks. "The top three is possible."

He's at least thinking about first, isn't he?

"It's exciting," he said with a smile.

Fredericks doubles as Geneseo's boys coach, and senior Phil Walsh will be running in the Class AA boys race, after Geneseo's seven-member girls team takes its best shot.

"I'm a firm believer that you can't run two strong races in a row," said Fredericks, and that's one reason he's looking ahead to Saturday. Fredericks knows the Leaf girls didn't have a strong race at the sectional meet.

"We ran OK, but not good," he said.
"Still, it's nice to run like that and still be able to win by 20 points at the sectional level. If we put it together on Saturday, we'll be in the hunt."

on Saturday, we'll be in the hunt."
Fredericks talked about each of his seven state-meet girls, in the order they've run this season, and about Walsh:

CONNIE GRADERT, senior—
"This is the first time in four years she's been healthy all season," said the coach. Gradert didn't have her best race Saturday in Sterling, but Fredericks wasn't alarmed. You'll recall that there was heavy leaf burning in the area last Saturday, and the smoke kicked up Gradert's chronic asthma a bit. "There will be no leaves burning Saturday in Detweiller Park," said Fredericks.

"Connie is talented, has an intense desire to excell, and is a ferocious competitior," said Fredericks. "She had to follow some strong runners her first three years, and it's hard for a person with her ambitions to not be number one all the time. She has done a good job leading us."

Gradert is the only senior among Geneseo's top seven; and this is the third straight year Fredericks has been able to anticipate returning all but one member of his formidable

KARMEN ROEHRS, sophomore, —"She ran out of her mind Satur-, day," said Fredericks. "She's tiny, but does she have a champion's heart. She had been pushing Connie, then she was down for two or three weeks. Now, she has come back with large impact. She finished ahead of Connie on Saturday, the first time all year anyone but Connie has been our first finisher."

WENDY WASSELL, freshman "She was 18th in the sectional, fourth in the regional, second in the NCIC, all as a ninth-grader. She has the ability to not worry about things. She just gets out and runs. She'll have fun saturday"

GAIL PERKINS, junior — "She had a touch of flu last week, and that

could be a positive, because it gave her a bit of a rest. It shouldn't hurt her conditioning, and you can't improve physically the last 10 days of the season anyway," said Fredericks.

Perkins was third in the sectional last year, and 42nd in the state meet, but back problems were bothering her. She's over them now, but she has a problem with a tendon popping in the back of her knee, causing her to shorten her stride a bit.

"She's a competitor; she should be OK," said Fredericks. "Our first three have the potential to be all-state (accorded to the first 25 runners) and I don't want to pressure Gail because of her illness and the tendon problem," said Fredericks. "But, she has the potential to be an all-stater, too."

RENEE CLIFTON, sophomore—
"She's extremely solid," said
Fredericks. "Coming up with a strong
number five runner no longer is a
problem for us. She has had a brililant season, and has been perhaps
our most consistent runner. And she's
improving each week."

improving each week."

KIM CHAPMAN, junior — "She ran the race of her life Saturday," braised Fredericks. "She rebounded really well after a disappointment in the regional. She was close to Gail Saturday, and she hasn't been before. Kim works as hard as anyone on the team. She has to work at it in order to be good, and she is good."

KIRSTIN KEMMIS, freshman —; "She has had a bit of a breathing problem the last two weeks which has concerned us, but I've been satisfied with her efforts each week," said

her efforts each week," said Fredericks.
Geneseo will be trying to top its best-ever state finish — fifth — achieved when seniors Michelle Landrum and Tars Zeitler were sophomores, They're not on the top seven now, but they'll be there, rooting on

their teammates. "It's hard for them to be on the sidelines," and Fredericks. "But they're always 100 percent behind the girls who do run."

Fredericks was at once ecstatic and near tears Saturday. The girls caused the jubilation; the sadness came after Geneseo's boys didn't qualify as a team for state, "and I had told them three years ago that if they worked hard, they could make it," said Fredericks, and they could make it," Phil Walsh did make it. "And it's

Phil Walsh did make it. "And it's tougher to qualify for the state meet as an individual than it is to make it as part of a team," said Fredericks. "But Phil wasn't thinking about himself after the race. He was over crying with the rest of the team after they learned they didn't make it. He put in a lot of time with those guys."

And Fredericks has put in a lot of time with Geneseo's runners, male and female. He is one distance coach who literally goes the extra mile for his students. He contacts college coaches about his seniors; he listens, he cares. After the team came home Saturday, he played basketball for an hour with the boys team. "I suppose that wouldn't have been such a good idea had Walsh turned an ankle or something," said the coach. "But, it ngot rid of the tension." We all felt pretty good again afterward."

Fredericks noted that Walsh feels good about himself again after enduring and overcoming a family problem at home. He has been the number one man in a recognized cross country program for three years.

"He has a good shot at the top 50, an outside shot at the top 25," said Fredericks. "We want him to go out with the Moline guys and try to hang on."

# Geneseo girls take seventh in state run

PEORIA — Expectations were high at the girls' state cross country meet at Detweiller Park in Peoria; the results didn't quite meet those high hopes.

Geneseo, Rock Island, and Alleman all were hoping for better results, but couldn't complain with their finishes as they squared off against 22 of the best teams in the state.

For Geneseo, Connie Gradert's 34th-place finish helped boost the Maple Leafs into seventh place overall in the team standings.

Saturday marked the fourth time in a row that the Geneseo girls have placed in the top 10 at the state meet.

For Gradert, it was a satisfying effort, as she bounced back from two defeats at the Geneseo regional and the Sterling sectional.

"Today I came back and beat people who beat me in the last two weeks," stated Gradert. "I got out well and the pace slowed later so I was able to pass some people late in the race.

Although happy with her performance, Gradert still admitted a few regrets.

"I really wanted to place higher here this year than I did my freshman year (31st)," said the Geneseo senior.

Mixed emotions also described

Geneseo coach Don Fredericks' sentiments about the meet.

"I have mixed emotions about today's meet; I had hoped to finish higher," said Fredericks. "But this is the highest state-placing team I've ever coached, so I'm very pleased about that.

"Connie had also hoped to place higher, but today's race pace was extremely quick. However, we only have one senior on the team this year (Gradert), so we plan to be back."

Meanwhile, Rock Island was looking forward to its first appearance in the state meet. Rock Island was the surprise team of the sectional, and Coach Bob Wilson hoped the element of surprise would again be on his side.

Chris Coolidge led the way with a 65th place finish, and Kris Braet did her part as she grabbed 74th. But a lack of backup after that dropped Rock Island to a 22nd team place.

"Our first runners were pretty good; the rest of our girls were off," explained Wilson. "But being here alone is a testament to how much these girls have improved throughout the year."

For Rock Island's Coolidge, actually running in a state cross country meet was a different experience than merely tagging along with her dad and Rock Island's boys' coach John Coolidge to the boys' previous state meet.

### Vesey 8th, Perez 11th, Moline 7th in Class AA

PEORIA — There is nothing like classic sports confrontations.

The boys' Class AA state cross country meet at Detweiller Park, Peoria, offered great potential for one of the best individual battles around.

First and foremost, there is always the Eric Edmunds/Mario Vesey matchup. Regardless of when or where it is, this battle always proves to be an exciting down-to-the-wire affair. And what better place for a nail-. biter than the state meet?

Surprise. What was tabbed as another Edmunds/Vesey battle turned into an Perez/Vesey battle. Perez as in Moline's Joe Perez.

Rock Island's Vesey and Moline's Perez battled it out throughout the race, with Vesey holding down third and Perez on his heels in fourth during the early going.

In the end, it was Vesey taking eighth and Perez grabbing 11th place. Perez's effort helped the Moline team garner a seventh-place, while Vesey ran as an individual for Rock Island along with teammate Steve Tanner (35th place). Edmunds finished in 20th place.

"Mario went out with the leaders. but didn't reel them in in the stretch, said Rock Island coach John Coolidge. "He looked tight in his neck and shoulders. But his finish is the highest finish in modern Rock Island cross country history, so I'm very happy about that.

"I was very pleased with the way we ran today," added Coolidge. "We didn't run defensively; we competed from the opening gun. Our times were good considering the weather and the field of runners.

Meanwhile, Moline coach Jeff Quick was pleasantly surprised by Perez's performance, but a little disappointed with his team's finish.

Joe really surprised me today; I had projected him as a 20-25 finisher and Edmunds as a top 15 finisher," said, Quick. "Those two kind of reversed roles today."

As for the Maroon team?

"There are at least six teams in the state that are even, and the ones that ran well today proved themselves," explained Quick. "We've beaten the top three teams here before, but those teams ran better today.

"I thought we'd be second or third today, but I'm not disappointed. I figured we'd get sixth of seventh if we ran good, and that's what we got."

Joe Perez's clocking of 14:47 was his fastest of the year and his personal best. His performance sur-

prised Perez himself.

"My races during the season weren't really positive toward a top 15 finish," admitted Perez. "But I got a fast start, and felt good. I wanted to keep up with Vesey, but the pace was really fast. I didn't expect myself to be up there."

Meanwhile, Edmunds' 20th palce finish was a letdown, even to Edmunds himself.

"I expected better," said Edmunds. "My goal all year was to be All-State and I wanted to finish in the top 15."

"The middle of the race was not good for me," explained Edmunds. "I tightened up and the second mile hurt

"The pace was fast, but I have trained for that and expected it."

Metamora's Mark Scheirer was the individual winner with a 14:22 on the 3.0-mile course.

Schaumburg took the team title with a total of 120, followed by Naperville Central in second with 124, Roselle third with 132, York fourth at 198, and Downers Grove fifth with

# Vesey, Edmunds eye big cross country finish

The prospects for the Quad-City area boys in Saturday's Class AA state cross country meet are looking

For Moline, ranked third in the last Coaches' Power Rankings, this weekend is the end of a year-long project that was set in motion after last year's 18th-place finish. For Rock Island's Mario Vesey and Steve Tanner, both who qualified as individuals, this is their chance for a spot in the limelight. Geneseo's Phil Walsh will also have his work cut out for him Saturday, as he will also run as an individual qualifier.

Moline coach Jeff Quick is looking for his team to fare well in the 25-team team event, while Rock Island coach John Coolidge can hardly wait to set his speedy juniors loose on the 2.9-mile Detweiller Park course in Peoria.

"Our kids know exactly what they have to do this Saturday," said Moline coach Jeff Quick. "They have been talking about going back down there the past 12 months. Most of them started working out for track in January, finished that at the end of school and started working toward this right after.'

While it has been a long road, maybe the biggest task the Maroons face is bouncing back from a disappointing showing in last week's Sterling Sectional where they finished fourth. Quick was thinking a sectional championship for this team, but they settled for the major task of qualifying for this Saturday's meet.

"We're in a better frame of mind," said Quick. "Only two of our kids were loose and ready to run last Saturday and this week, I think we are both physically and men-

tally ready for this meet.'

Quick will be looking for the leadership out of his three junior standouts - Eric Edmunds, Joe Perez and Rob Harvey. Harvey, who was ill last weekend, is reported back at near full strength. Also lacing up the spikes for Quick will be Jeff Black, Julio Raya, Brian Mayfield and Chris Wallaert. All of those kids, with the exception of Raya, ran on last year's team.

Edmunds and Perez are Moline's top prospects for top-25 individual finishes which would earn them All-State honors. Also in that group would be Vesey and Tanner from Rock Island.

"I would have to think that Vesey and Edmunds would be in line for a shot at All-State honors," said Quick. "I can't believe that there are 25 guys better than those two in the state.'

Vesey will be coming off an excellent regular-season in which he went undefeated before losing three straight races to Edmunds. Last Saturday at Sterling, Vesey regained his form and walked off with first-place individ-

"I'm looking forward to the race," said Rocky coach John Coolidge. "Our expectations are high. We think Mario can realistically look for a medal finish and Steve knows he's in a situation where he is close to a medal.

"I like their attitudes right now and like last weekend, we're just going to put them both on the course and let them run. Neither one of these kids has to be over-

coached to get them ready."

If the two Rocky kids did get a break, it would be in their starting-box assignment. Both will be lining up with pre-race favorite Mark Schierer of Metamora. Vesey beat Schierer last Saturday at Sterling, but Detweiller is a very familiar course to the Metamora standout.

Both Vesey and Tanner ran on the same course in the state meet two years ago as freshmen. Vesey finished

161st in that race, while Tanner was 20 spots back.
"I like both their chances," said Coolidge. "It's not going to be easy for either one of them, but it is something for them to aspire to. There was no pressure on us last weekend and the kids came through and there shouldn't be any pressure on either one of them this weekend, either."

No pressure on them, but before the end of Saturday's race, all the local kids could be applying some pressure to the rest of the field.

#### Moline runs to seventh

PEORIA, Ill. — Rock Island's Mario Vesey and Moline's Joe Perez and Eric Edmunds are going to have a lot to live up to next year.

Their coaches will see to that.

Vesey was eighth in the Illinois Class AA state cross country meet Saturday at Detweiller Park, while Perez was 11th and Edmunds 20th to help Moline to a seventh place team finish.

The trio earned all-state honors for their finishes in the top

Phil Walsh, Geneseo's lone entrant, ran a 16:06 for 112th place.

Vesey's strong performance was almost required if talk around the starting blocks is worth anything, but the junior didn't shy away.

"He showed some tightness in his neck and shoulders - he might have been nervous," said Rock Island Coach John Coolidge. "But he dealt with the situation. He had his head down and he was chopping off runners."

Steve Tanner was 35th in 15: 12 - and Coolidge had to say a few words about his second stand-


out junior.

"I got a special delight in how Steve did," he said. "I like the way both competed. They were not defensive - they competed from the time the gun went off."

Moline Coach Jeff Quick figured the Maroons had a shot a second or third place if they were ready. Instead, he had to settle for seventh - still an improvement over last year's 18th place finish.

"If we ran bad, we could still get 11th or 12th," Quick said. "If we ran good we could get sixth or seventh. So, we ran good."

Metamora's Mark Scheirer set a fast pace on his way to winning in 14:22.
