

# Maple Leafs may be front runners at meet

GENESEO—Coach Don Fredericks' Maple Leaf boys and girls cross country teams should be in the hunt for the team titles at the annual Geneseo Invitational Cross Country Meet on Saturday, Sept. 3, in Richmond Hill Park.

Clinton will be the team to beat for the varsity boys, said Fredericks, while Pleasant Valley and Geneseo should battle it out for the varsity girls' team title, he said.

Action gets under way at 9 a.m. with a race for junior high girls. A junior high boys race starts at 9:30. Races for junior varsity boys and girls get under way at 10 and 10:30, respectively, with a frosh-soph boys race starting at 11.

The varsity girls run at 11:30, and the varsity boys go at noon.

Teams entered are Clinton, Davenport North, Davenport West, Freeport, Geneseo, Alledo-Westmer, Pleasant Valley and Sherrard.

The varsity boys will run on a 2.7-mile course, while the girls, the JV boys and the frosh-soph boys will run a two-mile course. The junior high course is 1.5 miles long.

"We'd really like to turn this meet into something special every year," Fredericks said, but he expressed disappointment because he and athletic director Del Nicklaus have found it increasingly difficult to attract big, strong fields of teams.

"Right now, we're fighting to keep it alive," Fredericks said, adding the meet is the year's big fund-raiser for the track and cross country boosters, who run a concession stand at the event.

On the plus side—this year's meet

should still be fiercely competitive for the team title, even though the varsity team title races may be two-team affairs.

Many trophies and ribbons will be

awarded, including team trophies for the first two teams in the varsity boys and girls divisions, trophies for the first 15 individual finishes, and ribbons the eighth through 30th-place finishers.



# Leaf harriers are co-favorites at own invitational Sept. 3

It'll be a dogfight at the Genesco Invitational Cross Country meet Saturday, September 3. At least that's how Genesco head coach Don Fredericks sees it.

"There will be a real dogfight between Clinton and us for the boys varsity title. We got by 'em by just one point last year for the first time since I've been here (he's in his fourth year).

"Clinton's a perennial state power in Iowa."

"For the girls, frankly, it will come down to Pleasant Valley and Genesco. Last year they really nailed us so I'm looking forward to taking them this year," Coach Fredericks continued. "That's how it all looks on paper but you never know. Weather, injuries, that sort of thing can affect the results. And one of the kids could just have an off day."

The varsity girls start at 11:30 a.m. at Richmond Hill park, followed by the varsity boys at noon.

This year there will also be a junior high division with the girls stepping off at 9 a.m. and the boys half an hour later.

Junior varsity boys start at 10 a.m., JV girls at 10:30 a.m. and the frosh-soph boys at 11:00 a.m.

Teams entered are from Clinton, Davenport North, Davenport West, Freeport, Genesco, Westmer, Aledo, Pleasant Valley and Sherrard.

Coach Fredericks is looking forward to an "exciting" year.

"We have 75 kids out and that's a record number. Our junior high program, (coached by Jim VanVooren) has over 20 kids in it and is really coming along well. That's laying a foundation for our future success."

"But, you know," the always-

enthusiastic coach said, pausing. "It's all gotta be fun. I mean, I'm not going to stand on the sidelines and yell at the kids. That's just not me. If we can only win doing that, I'm not going to do it."

"I think you can have fun, too. And that's what this program has to be about first."

Coach Fredericks runs with his team. "They know when I'm not putting out my best effort," he laughed. "I have to tell you, though, either I'm getting slower as I get older or they're getting quicker."

"I like to think they're getting faster!"

The teams' goals for the year?

"To get both boys and girls' teams down to the state finals. If we stay healthy and work hard, we can do it."

"We have two weeks of practice under our belt and I'm very pleased with everyone's progress."

The top two varsity runners are senior Brad Baker and junior Jason VanVooren. Competing to fill out the top seven runners, there's a large group of harriers: Barry Bassier, Darren Cowan, Bryan Glass, Adam Boardman, Cubby Orwig, Brian Walsh, Joe Holevoet, Mike Bell, Jim Henderson and Christian Michaelson.

"They all have the potential to be among the top seven," Coach Fredericks noted.

Letterwomen returning for the Lady Leafs are "in no particular order," according to Coach Fredericks: Rachael Perkins,

Kirstin Kemmis, Renee Clifton, Karmin Roehrs, Gail Perkins, Kim Chapman and Wendy Wassell. Others who have the potential to break into the top seven are freshmen Brandi Hilton and Suzanne Patton, sophomore Kelli Miller and senior Karen Miller.



# Leafs run off with top awards in invitational

**GENESEO** — It was a sensational day — outdoors in general, and for Geneseo's cross country teams in particular.

Maple Leaf runners won four of five team races, including the varsity boys and girls events against strong opponents, at the annual Geneseo Cross Country Invitational. The meet was conducted Saturday, Sept. 3, in breezy, sunshine-filled Richmond Hill Park.

Geneseo's varsity boys had five of the top 10 runners in the race as they edged Iowa powerhouse Clinton 33-52 for the first-place plaque.

The Leaf varsity girls placed five runners among the first 11 as they nipped another Iowa power, Pleasant Valley, 34-43, for first place. And, Geneseo sophomore Wendy Wassell was the individual winner, covering the two-mile course in 13:08, one second ahead of Pleasant Valley's Mary Sorenson.

Leaf runners also won the junior varsity girls and boys team races, and placed third in the frosh-soph boys team race. Suzanne Patton of the Leafs was the individual winner in the JV girls race.

Special junior high races were run, too. Michelle Eagles won the girls' race, and Chad Pankey was the boys' winner.

Geneseo's varsity boys won without their top runner, Brad Baker, who was nursing a tender knee. But there were two major individual breakthroughs. One was by sophomore Bryan Glass, who led the Leafs with a stunning second-place finish.

"He went nuts out there," exclaimed a delighted Geneseo coach, Don Fredericks. The other breakthrough, said the coach, was by Brian Walsh. He was the fifth Leaf into the finish chute, and the 10th-place finisher overall, "but he took a minute off his previous best time," Fredericks said.

Other top Leaf finishers included Adam Boardman, fourth; Jason VanVooren, eighth; and Cubby Orwig, ninth. All five of Geneseo's top place finishers are underclassmen.

"We're really, really pleased," Fredericks said. "All of our top guys got in more than 500 miles this summer. We get in some speed work in practice now, and I'm sure we'll be pleased with the rest of our season."

Glass said his best previous finish in a major invitational was 12th place, "and that was in a frosh-soph meet. I was in eighth place toward the start today, then moved up to fifth with my teammates."

The varsity boys run a 2.75-mile course, and about 1.5 miles into the race, the runners ascend a steep "draw" hill, from the flat area near

runners from the rest, and it was "the draw hill which told me I should get out and go," Glass said. "I went up to second place, and maintained it."

In the girls race, Wassell led pretty much from start to finish, but Pleasant Valley's Sorenson and Carey Dieleman were right behind her, and finished in second and third places, respectively. That meant the team race was decided by the two teams' "packs" of runners, and Geneseo's pack beat PV's. Leafs Gail Perkins, Kirstin Kemmis, Karmen Roehrs and Kelli Miller placed sixth, seventh, ninth and 11th, respectively, while the next three scoring members of PV's team were fifth, 15th, and 18th overall. In fact, the two non-scoring members of Geneseo's team, Kim Chapman and Brandi Hilton, placed ahead of some of PV's pack members with their 13th and 14th-place finishes.

"Pleasant Valley is strong, but we really packed it in," Fredericks said. "We're a much stronger team than we were at this time last year."

Fredericks called Wassell's win a "gutsy" performance. He said Roehrs was coming off an ankle sprain suffered the Monday before the race, and said Kemmis may have put in more miles over the summer than anyone else on the team.

"She's very determined," said her coach.

Wassell's win was her first victory at a major invitational meet. She spent some time toward the end looking over her shoulder.

"Coach tells me that's bad, don't do that," Wassell said. "But I like to know where the others are at. The

closer they are to me, the harder I push myself. People beat me in practice, but I run harder in meets."

Geneseo will see some super competition this Saturday when the Leafs visit the Homewood-Flossmoor Invitational.

# *Geneseo Invite is all Geneseo, harriers capture four team titles*

The Leaf harriers had their name on the invitational. The Geneseo Invitational. And it was their's, virtually all their's.

"We brought a lot of hardware home," said a very satisfied Coach Don Fredericks. "And we didn't have to go too far to get it."

Five high school races were run on Saturday, September 3 and Geneseo won four of them: varsity and junior varsity boys and girls. The only race the Geneseo harriers didn't take was the frosh-soph boys but with the top three sophomores all running varsity that's not surprising.

Wendy Wassell won the first invitational of her G.H.S. career in 13:08, beating a Pleasant Valley runner by just a second on the two-mile course through the aptly named Richmond Hill course.

"Wendy ran a courageous race," Coach Fredericks observed. "I'm very excited about the rest of the year for her."

"I was very pleased with the results for all the teams. The girls' varsity was up against Pleasant Valley which is a perennial state power and we beat them." The Lady Leafs won 34-43.

For the Lady Leafs, Gail Perkins finished sixth with Kirstin Kemmis seventh and Karmen Rochrs ninth.

of the team's top runner, senior Brad Baker who is recuperating from inflammation of his knee. "The prognosis is good," Coach Fredericks noted. "And we expect to have him back soon. It's a real testament to the boys that despite being without their senior leader they reached down and won. We had two sophomores finish in the top four in Bryan Glass (second and 10 seconds behind the winner from Clinton) and Adam Boardman." Junior Jason VanVooren survived being tripped and then sprawling on the course; he finished eighth.

Justin VanVooren finished third in the frosh-soph race. Geneseo finished third as a team.

Coach Frederick was exuberant about the junior varsity girls' race won by Suzanne Patton a freshman from Atkinson. The Geneseo contingent ran as a pack and finished that way with Cindy Mattan second, Jill Minnaert third and Karin Miller fourth. "It shows we have a lot of depth now and for the future. You bet I'm excited," Coach Fredericks remarked.

# Leafs nab CC invite victories

The Geneseo boys and girls cross country teams found their home turf to be very kind Saturday. The hosts came away with team victories in the Geneseo High School Invitational cross country meet at Richmond Hills Park.

The boys' team total of 33 easily outdistanced second-place Clinton's 52 points. Davenport West took third with 70 points, followed by Pleasant Valley in fourth, 78, Sherrard in fifth with 118, Freeport sixth with 175, and the Aledo-Joy-Westmer team bringing up the rear with a 196 total.

Meanwhile, the Geneseo girls had a slightly tougher time, but still prevailed over Pleasant Valley, 34-43. Third-place Davenport West tallied 95 points, with Freeport coming in fourth, 114, along with Sherrard, 120, Clinton, 145, and the Aledo-Joy-Westmer team, 146.

Bill Sattler of Clinton toured the boys' 2.7-mile course in 14:57 to cop top individual honors. Bryan Glass of Geneseo followed in second, while Pleasant Valley's Chris Sell-evold was third.

"I felt pretty good out there, but I did run a better time last year," said Sattler. "I ran up front alone, and that was kind of difficult."

Geneseo coach Don Fredericks was very pleased with his boys team's effort, especially considering the team's condition.

"We're pretty banged up right now," said Fredericks, who also coaches the girls squad. "Our top runner, Brad Baker, twisted his knee and couldn't run today. So we ended up running three sophomores, and our fourth man, Jason VanVooren, got tripped and fell hard on his knee. So things could have gone better, but you have to take what you get."

On the girls side, Wendy Wassell outdueled Mary Sorenson of Pleasant Valley down the stretch to earn first place. Wassell, near the lead most of the way, clocked a time of 13:08, edging Sorenson, 13:09.

Gail Perkins, Kirstin Kemmis, and Karmen Roehrs joined Wassell in the top 10, as they finished sixth, seventh, and ninth, respectively.

Coach Fredericks was also satisfied with his girls' team's performance. They are as battered and bruised as his boys squad.
