

# Leaf harriers prepare for Geneseo Invite on Saturday

GENESEO — School just started his week, and already it's time for the Geneseo High School cross country team's major home meet, the Geneseo Invitational.

This year's Invite, with a smaller field than in recent years, takes place Saturday morning, Sept. 2, in Richmond Hill Park.

The Leaf boys and girls will open their seasons this Thursday in Ottawa, where they'll take on Rock Falls, Kewanee, Streator, Princeton and the Pirates.

Action on Saturday gets underway at 9 a.m. with the junior varsity boys race. The JV girls race goes off at 9:30 a.m., the frosh-soph boys compete at 10 a.m., the varsity girls leave the line at 10:30 a.m., and the varsity boys are set for an 11 a.m. launch.

Competing teams are Davenport North, Davenport West, Freeport, Westmer-Aledo, Pleasant Valley, Sherrard and Geneseo.

Geneseo won both varsity races last year, while Clinton, Iowa, won in frosh-soph boys action.

"This year's meet is somewhat watered-down," Geneseo coach Don

Fredericks said. "Coaches don't want their teams running our course."

Richmond Hill is a hilly, rugged layout. Most cross country courses in the region are flat.

"It (the Richmond Hill course) is challenging and beautiful," Fredericks said. "In Europe, they run through plowed fields and have to jump fences. Who is the sport for, the athletes or the coaches?"

Fredericks said he expects a push from the Sherrard boys, based on their strong frosh-soph team from a year ago. He said Davenport West had some strong individuals during the track season.

The Leaf coach said he expects Pleasant Valley's girls to field another strong squad.

Fredericks said Jason VanVooren, Bryan Glass and Adam Boardman form a solid front three for his boys team. He said Brian Walsh, Michael Bell and Justin VanVooren are the next three, "and we've got 10 guys contending for the seventh spot," he said.

Fredericks said his top four girls, not necessarily in order, are Wendy Wessel, Karmen Roehrs, Renee Clifton and Kirstin Kemmis. The next three, he said, are Kelli Miller, Suzanne Patton and Jill Minnaert. Michelle Eagles, a promising freshman, is lost to the squad for from four to six weeks with a stress fracture, he said.

Fredericks said Thursday's meet, to be run on the NCIC championships course in Ottawa, will give his girls a chance to run against very strong Kewanee and Princeton squads. "Kewanee is back intact and they were good last year. Princeton has two all-staters," Fredericks said. The coach also noted that Ottawa had a strong frosh-soph boys team last fall.

"We've had great workouts," Fredericks said. "We're excited about the season."

# Leaf runners double trouble for foes at own invite

GENESEO — Geneseo proved to be double trouble at its own meet Saturday.

For the second straight year, the Geneseo cross country team pulled off the daily double by capturing the boys and girls titles at the Geneseo Cross Country Invitational.

It may be a tad presumptuous, but after Saturday's run, the Maple Leafs appear to have the talent to crown themselves NCIC champions once again in both divisions.

The boys' squad, which is seeking to tie Ottawa's record of five straight conference titles, was led by the mad-dash 1-2 finish of Jason VanVooren and Bryan Glass. VanVooren came in with a time of 14:43 on the 2.7-mile course with Glass right behind him at 14:44. Three additional top-ten finishes by Adam Boardman (third), Brian Walsh (sixth) and Justin VanVooren (eighth) gave Geneseo a total of 20 points. The closest competition came from Davenport West which rang up a score of 63 points.

"We definitely have some teammates who can run together," said Geneseo coach Don Fredericks, who expected VanVooren, Glass and Boardman to be among the top finishers. "Those top three will be up ahead of the rest of the squad, but I think they can key off each other and work together."

Other area schools entered were Sherrard, in third-place with 81 points, and fifth-place finisher Westmer-Aledo with 134. Sherrard coach Lori Baker felt satisfied with the results in the boys division, but didn't think her crew felt the same way.

"The guys are a little disappointed, but they've got to think about the competition," she said.

Even though the co-op entry of Westmer-Aledo failed to reach the top three in the standings, Coach Doug Crowell expects the best to come later in the season when he finalizes his varsity squad.

## Wassell leads Lady Leafs

The Geneseo girls, which hold the NCIC record of five consecutive titles and looking for a sixth this year, had a mixture of one runner taking command and a group of girls finishing high among the pack.

Wendy Wassell guided the Maple Leafs by finishing in a time of 13:16, second to the winning time of

West's Heather Brown, who ran 13:07.

And by grabbing the 5 thru 8 positions plus the ninth which didn't count in the scoring, the Geneseo

girls turned in a first-place total of 28 points. The group comprised of Karmen Roehrs, Kirstin Kemmis, Suzanne Patton, Rene Clifton and Kelli Miller all finished within 23 seconds of one another.

"She's (Wassell) our most valuable runner coming back from last year," Fredericks said. "She's definitely our frontrunner at this point

## Leaf runners streak to Invitational title

GENESEO — "It's a start," Geneseo cross country coach Don Fredericks said, after his varsity boys and girls teams opened their seasons by easily defending their team championships in the Geneseo Invitational Saturday, Sept. 2. The meet was run on Geneseo home course in Richmond Hill Park.

"We've seen our team in competition, and now we hope to keep improving," Fredericks said.

With Jason VanVooren, Bryan Glass and Adam Boardman pulling off a one-two-three individual finish, the varsity boys easily beat second-place Davenport West, 20-63, for championship honors.

The varsity girls, getting a second place finish from Wendy Wassell and packing which saw Geneseo runners grab the fifth through ninth place spots, were 28-67 winners over second place Pleasant Valley.

Geneseo also won the frosh-soph and junior varsity boys races.

It was a "somewhat watered-down field, Fredericks said, in the sense some of the big-name cross country powers in the region shied away from the meet, and the number of teams and runners in general was down from past Geneseo Invites.

"Regardless of who showed or

didn't show, we were pleased with our performances," Fredericks said. "We looked at our times compared to previous performances on our course. Things went pretty much as I thought, with a few surprises. And they were pleasant surprises."

Jason VanVooren and Glass ran away from the varsity boys field, finishing the 2.7-mile course in 14:43 and 14:44, respectively. Adam Boardman did a good job to come back and get third (in 15:13), Fredericks said.

In the girls race, Wassell was second in 13:16, nine seconds behind winner Heather Brown of Davenport West. "Brown is an outstanding runner," Fredericks said. "We got tremendous packing behind Wendy," the Geneseo coach said.

Placing fifth through ninth were Karmen Roehrs, Kirstin Kemmis, Suzanne Patton, Rene Clifton and Kelli Miller, in times ranging from 13:57 to 14:20.

Fredericks got some questions answered in the frosh-soph race when Andy Snook, Alan Sand and Bill Lofuis finished first, third and sixth. Snook's winning time over a two-mile course was 11:52. All three Leafs are freshmen.



# Leaf, Lady Leaf harriers dominate own invitational

Geneseo's varsity boys and girls cross-country teams showed they are squads to be reckoned with this season as they both captured team titles in the Geneseo Invitational meet held Saturday, September 2, at Richmond Hill park.

The Leaf team totaled just 20 points to defeat second place Davenport West by 43 points. Sherrard (81) placed third followed by Freeport (96) and Westimer-Aledo (134). Pleasant Valley did not field a full team.

The Lady Leaf team had just 28 points to defeat second place Pleasant Valley by 39 points. Davenport West (72) and Freeport (112) were the only other schools to field full girls teams.

The field for the Geneseo Invitational has slipped in recent years and this was the last year it will be held, according to Coach Don Fredericks.

"It has just turned into a weak meet. The course has received a lot of bad press and teams just don't want to come here. It isn't a really fast course but it is a beautiful and challenging course. Is the meet for the kids or the coaches anyway?" wondered Coach Fredericks.

"We'll just have to pick up another meet next year, I guess," he added.

Teams that did not participate in the Geneseo Invite this year would have had to deal with Leaf and Lady Leaf teams that placed their top five runners in the top nine overall in each race.

Jason VanVooren won the boys with a time of 14:33 followed close behind by Bryan Glass in 14:34. Adam Boardman was third in 15:13. Brian Walsh sixth in 15:33 and Justin VanVooren eighth in 15:49.

Neil Radicic placed 11th with a time of 16:16 and Travis Stroh 14th in 16:28 but did not count in the team scoring.

In the varsity girls' race, Wendy Wassell was the top Lady Leaf finisher with a second place time of 13:16. Heather Brown of Davenport West was the winner in 13:07.

The Lady Leaf used the pack running strategy to claim the 5th through 9th spots in the race. Grabbing those spots were Karmen Roehrs (13:57), Kirstin Kemmis (14:02), Suzanne Patton (14:04), Rene Clifton (14:10) and Kelli Miller (14:20).

Aimee Ellis (15:12) finished 15th for the Lady Leafs.

The boys and girls teams did a nice job but they still have an awful lot of work to do," said Coach Fredericks.

Geneseo also captured titles in the frosh-soph boys and junior varsity boys races.

Geneseo defeated Freeport and Westimer-Aledo in the frosh-soph race and Davenport North in the junior varsity race.

Andy Snook was clocked in 11:32 to claim victory in the frosh-soph race.

Other Leaflet runners, their places and their times were: Alan Sand (3rd, 11:40), Bill Loftus (6th, 12:07), Chris Walters (7th, 12:09), Scott Durian (9th, 12:11), Mitch Prey (10th, 12:18) and Mike McVetty (16th, 13:08).

In the junior varsity boys' race, in which teams could enter an unlimited number of runners, Geneseo had seven of the top eight times.

Justin VanOpdorp placed second in 12:27, followed by Shane McKibbin (12:31), Steve Miller (12:34), Bryant Crawford (12:41), Gary Martin (12:48), Kris Keegan (12:48) and Jim Henderson (13:12).

Also competing for the Geneseo junior varsity were George Stone (10th, 13:20), Jason Jolly (11th, 13:24), Micah Miller (12th, 13:25), Matt Lotz (16th, 13:58), Darin Lavery (22nd, 14:49), Dave Benhart (24th, 15:07), Craig Thompson (26th, 15:31), Chris Kutsunis (27th, 15:50), Chris Steinkopf (28th, 16:20) and Dan Yarger (29th, 16:26).

In the fifth race of the meet, the junior varsity girls race, Pleasant Valley was the only school to field a full team.

Geneseo runners were Julie Ghys (5th, 15:34), Jenny Wurslin (8th, 15:57) and Molly Boardman (9th, 15:59).

The Leaf and Lady Leaf runners were also in action on Tuesday, September 5, in a meet against Ottawa, Princeton, LaSalle-Peru, Sreator and Rochelle at Ottawa in a meet which was originally scheduled for Thursday, August 31 but was cancelled due to inclement weather.

The conference meet will be held Saturday, October 14 in Ottawa and Coach Fredericks wanted his team to see the course.

"The course wasn't in very good shape due to the rain but I just wanted the kids to get a feel for the course for when conference rolls around," he said.

In the boys' race, it was Geneseo 17, Ottawa 42, Geneseo 15, Princeton 47, Geneseo 15, L-P 44 and Geneseo 18, Rochelle 43.

Jason VanVooren captured the boys' race in 15:40 followed by Glass in 15:41.

Boardman, Walsh and Justin VanVooren finished fourth, fifth and sixth in the race for the Leafs.

In the girls' race, it was Geneseo 20, Princeton 40, Geneseo 20, Ottawa 40, Geneseo 15, Rochelle 48 and Geneseo 15, Sreator 48.

The Lady Leafs claimed the third through seventh places in the girls' meet. Wendy Wassell placed third with a time of 14:56 followed by Karmen Roehrs (15:09), Renee Clifton (15:27), Kirstin Kemmis (15:35) and Suzanne Patton (15:40).

The frosh-soph boys claimed easy wins over Princeton, L-P, Rochelle and Ottawa in their division.

Geneseo claimed the top six spots in the frosh-soph boys' race, led by Andy Snook with a time of 12:41.

Bill Loftus (13:45) was second followed by Scott Durian (13:50), Alan Sand (13:50), Mike McVetty (14:17) and Chris Walters (14:20).

The conference meet will be held Saturday, October 14 in Ottawa and Coach Fredericks wanted his team to see the course.
