Maroon harriers lead area Class AA crews to state

Winning a state cross country trophy last year was a dream come true for Moline coach Jeff Quick, whose boys team finished third.

Now, he has thoughts of this weekend being twice — or even three times — as nice.

Heading into Saturday's Class AA boys 3-mile state meet at 12:45 p.m. at Peoria's Detweiller Park, the Maroons are again in position to garner Class AA state hardware that goes to the top three teams.

"I think a team trophy is there for the grabbing," said Quick. "It's hard for me to say that because last year was the first time it had happened and to think you have a chance to have it happen two years in a row... That's nice."

Quick said Stagg is the only team to beat the fifth-ranked Moline boys this season. He also includes highly-ranked York as a contender simply because of its tradition as a powerhouse and includes Fenton and Schaumburg along with the Maroons in the trophy chase.

"If our kids run up to their abilities, I think they are right there for a trophy," said Quick of his healthy boys team. "If they put it all together, there's no reason they can't be

there."

Quick also sees junior Cesar Lopez as a legitimate all-state candidate. "I see him fitting into the 10th-to 20th-place range," said Quick of the Western Big 6 and Rock Island Regional champ.

Also filling big roles for the Maroons will be seniors Tauwon Taylor, Dave Krauel, Carlos Rivera, Brian Spriet, and Mike DeSmet; and junior Travis Waters.

Geneseo's team and Rock Island's Marlon Hall also will be competing in the race, with both Hall and Geneseo's Jason VanVooren coming off top 10 sectional finishes, having shots at earning all-state honors.

Moline's girls in hunt

While Quick thinks his boys have the best shot at the school's highest finish Saturday, he's not counting out his girls team, either.

His 10th-ranked Maroon crew, led by sophomore Trista Lester, should be in the trophy hunt. "Looking at results of sectionals, we should be one of nine teams (with a chance to finish high).

"I think Trista is in position to run in the Top 10. Trista and the girls look at running for fifth, realistically, if we get them in the sixth, seventh,

or eighth position, it will be a nice improvement from last year's 12th place."

Lester, an all-stater last year as a freshman, will need to get plenty of support from freshmen Stephanie Dyer and Jenny Seuss, seniors Trisha Rounds and Laura Clark, and juniors Jennifer Arnett and Sherry Rounds during the 2.1 mile race at 11:30.

The United Township Panthers were surprise qualifiers for the state finals and Coach Bob Feller is ecstatic about that fact alone. After last week's sectional, he is looking toward the future while hoping for good runs by juniors Chris Lamers, Amber Turf and Sarah Rodts, sophomore Valerie Hines and freshmen Julie Dowdal and Erin Colbrese.

UT beat the Maroons earlier in the season, but injuries have forced Feller to field a much younger team than the one which rated among the state's top 10 earlier.

Rock Island's Kris Braet also will be looking for all-state honors. Last year she finished 127th.

Maroons on the move

Moline's cross country teams are both shooting for top 10 finishes at this week's Illinois Class AA state meets in Peoria.

"We're at a point now where we're maintaining where we're at," Maroons Coach Jeff Quick said.

"We're having short practices and concentrating on the mental

aspects. That's where the improvements will come this week."

Moline's boys showed needed a strong rally before outdistancing the competition at Sterling in last Saturday's sectional.

"We really haven't clicked yet as a team so the state meet is where I hope that happens," Quick said. "We had a big obstacle to overcome last week and we did when we came from behind, to win and place five runners in the top 30. I hope we learned something there."

Moline will be gunning for a top five finish in the boys' race, where Cesar Lopez rates as the Maroons' best chance.

As a team, Quick figures his team and the rest of the field will chance Stagg and Elmhurst York.

"They're by far better than anybody else but the battle for third is wide open and I'd say we could finish anywhere from third to eighth — that's what we're hoping for," he said.

In the girls' race, Moline's Trista Lester hopes to improve on an eighth-place finish she earned last year as a freshman.

Moline finished 12th last year in the team competition and Quick believes the Maroons can earn a top 10 finish this season.

"Our runners have rotated finishing behind Trista so if they can all have strong efforts, we can do very well but of course you can't predict that," Quick said. "We're capable of quite a bit though. I can say that."

Trista Lester isn't even thinking about the Illinois Class AA state cross country championships on Saturday.

But an eighth-place finish at last year's meet does have the Moline sophomore shooting for bigger and better things.

"I may talk a little bit about it the night before but I really try to keep my mind away from it so I don't get too nervous," Lester said. "I don't want to think too much about it until I'm on the line and they're shooting the starting gun off."

The Detweiller Park layout in Peoria is to Lester's liking and that can't hurt.

"I've always run my best times there and at Sterling so I always look forward to running there," she said.

Lester ran the 2.1-mile course at Sterling in 12 minutes, 16 seconds last week to claim the Class AA sectional championship and she feels physically set to run a strong race this week against the state's elite.

Now, she'll concentrate on mental preparation as the 11:30 a.m. race time nears.

"Last year, I really didn't know what would happen down there and this year, I know mentally what I have to do and I'll have to run better than I did a year ago. What I ran last year there would get me about 15th place this year," Lester said.

Maroons Coach Jeff Quick said his sophomore standout can improve on that.

"She has had the type of season we expected," Quick said. "The schedule has prepared her and our team to fare well in this meet."

For Lester, that means getting a stronger start.

"I really have to go out and get after it," Lester said. "Last year I started slow and I was even a little scared — it was my first time at state. But I know I have to come out fast."

"It's so much harder to pull yourself back into the race if you don't get an early lead," she added.

Lester does feel some pressure in helping the Maroons achieve their team goal of finishing in the top five.

"The pressure is there. I know that. But the pressure is my own. I want to do the best I can," she said.


Buses were decorated and plastered with banners. Signs were positioned in trees and teams set up their own campsites, making the outskirts of the course look like Jellystone Park.


officials to keep the mob off the course.

Leaf boys 20th at state

PEORIA — For early November, no one could have asked for a better day than Saturday, Nov. 4. Especially, if you were one of nearly 750 racers competing in this year's Class A and AA girls and boys state cross country championship races.

Detweiller Park was buzzing with enthusiasm as an estimated 10,000 spectators roamed the course for the 43rd annual IHSA boys state meet, (11th annual for girls).

As expected, Elmhurst York came away with the team championship in the Class AA boys race with 75 points, followed by Palos Hills Stagg with 128.

Possibly a little overanxious, Geneseo fell behind in the pack, taking 20th in the field with 430 points.

The boys were hoping to finish in the top 10, and wanted all-state honors so bad. They went out too fast and by the half-mile mark they were really starting to feel it," Geneseo coach Don Fredericks said of his team. "The conditions were perfect for this final

meet. Actually, the weather has been incredible all season. We've had a great season and even though the boys would like to have finished higher, they did a terrific job."

Senior Jason VanVooren and junior Adam Boardman took off at the sound of the gun like a flash. At the quarter-mile mark, the Geneseo duo was running one-two, leading the pack down the long open stretch and clocking a :57 split.

Unfortunately, that lead didn't hold as the Leafs faded into the stampede.

Bryan Glass, a junior, kept stride throughout the race, focusing on the leading group. His effort resulted in his best performance of the year.

There wasn't a spot on the three-mile course that wasn't occupied by screaming parents, coaches and fans, cheering on the state's elite runners.

A roar could be heard for miles by the well-wishers as the runners approached the end of the third mile, and the finish line.

Palatine's Bob Watson was crowned the Class AA meet champion, cruising the course in a winning time of 14:35. The meet record, set by Tom Grave of

Orland Park Sandburg in 1977, with a time of 13:56.6 still stands.

After the dust had cleared, and the results tallied, Geneseo settled for a lower place than the Leafs had hoped for. Last year, the Leaf harriers took 12th in the team standings.

Glass was Geneseo's first competitor into the chute, taking 47th with an official time of 15:29. Boardman and VanVooren finished in the middle of the mob with 101st (16:09) and 116th places (16:21), respectively. Brian Walsh (senior), like Glass, ran his best race of the season, possibly of his life, with 16:33 for 133rd.

Taking 181st place, Justin VanVooren turned in a time of 17:38. Running in their first-ever state meet, Travis Stroh, a sophomore, and Andy Snook, a freshman, rounded out the Maple Leafs' solid finish. Stroh took 190th with 17:50 and Snook was just behind with 195th in 17:58.

"Glass ran a magnificent race. He ran strong throughout the entire course. Brian Walsh improved by tons. He really busted it to move from

seventh man to almost third," Fredericks said of his placers. "I'm pleased with all the kids' efforts. These kids care so much."

"To the average spectator it may not seem to take much out there on the course, but they have no idea how much these kids invest in their sport," Fredericks said.

Even though the Leafs didn't finish as high on the list as they would have liked, Geneseo's cross country program had a banner season that can be looked back on with pride.

"Everyone has goals and at the state meet there is only one happy individual and one happy team. That's the one taking first. But our kids have nothing to be ashamed of," Fredericks said. "One competitive effort doesn't make a season. These kids are winners, and athletics prepares kids for life."

"We have a strong group coming back next year, and will be returning five of our seven state runners. We peaked at the right time. Physically we were ready for Saturday, mentally we weren't."

Leaf lady missed her team

PEORIA — Although Wendy Wassell has been the pace setter and leader for the Lady Leafs' cross country team, the absence of her teammates trailing behind her was something she hadn't faced all season.

Wassell, a junior and a returning state runner, was the only Leaf to qualify and advance to this year's Class AA state cross country meet on Saturday, Nov. 4 at Detweiller Park in Peoria.

In what is generally considered an individual sport, Wassell and her teammates depended immensely on

each other's support and love of running to make Geneseo cross country as successful as it has been.

Not having her counterparts at her side, may have made the difference in Wassell's performance. Staying bunched in the middle of the pack, the perky runner covered the 2.1-mile course in a time of 13:20 for 94th place.

"Wendy went out too hard but the biggest thing was the fact she was running all by herself for the first time. Not taking anything away from her, she ran a great race, but she has always had the companionship and closeness of her teammates on the course and while warming up,"

Geneseo coach Don Fredericks said of his lone girl runner.

"She ran a strong race. Time-wise it was one of her best this year but it's a little deceptive," Fredericks said.


As happened to a great many runners, Wassell took off at the start with blazing speed. And like many of those quick-start runners, the Lady Leaf representative soon found herself winded and falling back into the middle of the group of the nearly 200 racers.

The sea of colors moving throughout the course was a sight to see and when it was all over, East St. Louis Lincoln's Marques Sanders shifted into high gear up the final hill to take

first place. Sanders finished in 11:51, not coming close to the Class AA record of 11:42 set by Erin Boland of McHenry in 1988.

Boland fell short of her record-setting performance, running ninth this year with 12:12. Wassell's area rival, Trista Lester of Moline, was named all-state with her 11th place effort (12:16).

"I was proud of Wendy's efforts. She gained some good experience and will be back next year," Fredericks said. "Illinois is in the top two or three states in the nation in terms of quality in cross country. We're pleased with how we fared."

Leaf cross country team takes 20th at state meet

Geneseo's varsity boys cross country team finished its season with a 20th place finish at the Class AA state meet held Saturday, November 4 at Detweiller Park in Peoria. Lady Leaf Wendy Wassell, competing as an individual in the girls race, finished 94th overall.

"The kids wanted to do well in this meet so bad they raced with their hearts instead of their heads. They tried to do something they just weren't capable of and finished behind some teams they probably could have handled. I have to give them credit for trying though," said Coach Don Fredericks.

Leaf harriers Jason VanVooren and Adam Boardman blazed through the first quarter mile of the race in 57 seconds to lead the pack but Coach Fredericks knew that would lead to trouble.

"Van Vooren and Boardman simply went out too fast and went into oxygen debt about a mile into the race. They took a shot and came up empty," he said.

Boardman finished 101st overall with a time of 16:09 with Van Vooren close behind at 16:21, a time good enough for 116th.

Two Leafs, Bryan Glass and Brian Walsh, ran very solid races according

to Coach Fredericks.

"Glass paced himself very well in the beginning and just ran an outstanding race. He is already one of the state's top 10,000 meter runners and is going to do nothing but get better. Walsh saved his best race of the season and it couldn't have come at a better time. Our overall finish would have been quite a bit lower had he not come through for us," noted Coach Fredericks.

Glass was clocked at 15:29 and finished a strong 47th while Walsh was timed at 16:31, a time good enough for 133rd.

Justin Van Vooren, like his brother Jason and Boardman, went out too fast and faded at the end. He was clocked at 17:38 and finished in 181st place.

Freshman Andy Snook caught an elbow early in the race and was buried in a slow pack of runners. By the time he caught up to his teammates in a quicker pack, he was "cashed," according to Coach Fredericks. Snook was timed at 17:50 and finished 190th.

Travis Stroh, running in his first state meet, completed the three-mile course in 17:58, good enough for 195th place.

Wassell, the lone representative from the Geneseo girls, went out too fast like some of her male counterparts and faded at the end. She was clocked at 13:20 and finished 94th.

"Wendy just looked lost out there running without her teammates. I warmed up with her to make everything as normal as possible but everything was just so alien. She still gave everything she had and that's all any coach can ask," noted Coach Fredericks.

This was the first time in five years that the Lady Leafs have not sent a team to the state meet and Coach Fredericks is concerned whether the program can get back to the level it once was.

"We have some strong individuals but overall, the numbers are down. The success of our girls team the next couple of seasons will depend on people who don't currently run cross country," he said.

Perennial power Elmhurst York won the boys team title this season with a mere 75 points. They were followed by Palos Hills Stagg (128), Bensenville Fenton (161), Moline (161), Schaumburg (170), Lincoln-Way (230), Peoria Notre Dame (230), Naperville Central (265), Glenbrook South (269).

St. Charles (294), Hoffman Estates Conant (315), Palatine (327), West Chicago (377), Pontiac (390), Homewood-Flossmoor (391), Tinley Park Andrew (394), Peoria Richwoods (402), Springfield Laphier (419), East St. Louis Lincoln (427), Geneseo (430), Normal Community (461), New Trier (508), Mt. Vernon (570), St. Laurence (576), Chicago Lane (613), Chicago Vocational (637) and Decatur MacArthur (661).

Bob Watson of Palatine was the overall boys winner with a time of 14:35 while Cesar Lopez of Moline was the top finisher with a time of 15:02, good enough for 14th overall.



Moline boys grab fourth at state cross country meet

PEORIA — The lineup has changed since last year, but the results were almost the same for the Moline boys cross country team Saturday here at the IHSA Class AA state finals.

After the final runner had finished the 3 mile Detweiller Park course and results were posted, the Maroons had just missed repeating their third-place team finish of a year ago. By a mere nine points, Cesar Lopez, the Maroons had to settle for fourth place behind Bensenville Fenton in the trophy race.

Elmhurst York won the team race followed by Palos Hills Stagg in second.

While the results were clear in black and white, Moline coach Jeff Quick still didn't believe it.

"I believe and I know the kids believe that we are still the third best team in the state," said Quick. "I think we should be third-and-a-half and get half of the trophy."

While the Maroons were not able to bring home team hardware again this year, two individuals did get state medals. Junior Cesar Lopez and senior Tauwon Taylor each garnered All-State top 25 finishes as did Rock Island's Marlon Hall.

Lopez, who finished 76th last year, recorded a marvelous 14th-place Saturday in a time of 15:02; Hall finished 19th with his fastest race of the year in 15:05; and Taylor just made the honor, in 24th, with a

15:12 time.

The news was not as good from the Geneseo camp where the over-anxious Maple Leafs burned themselves out early and had to settle for a 20th-place team finish.

Lopez, Taylor get support

While Lopez and Taylor carried their weight out front, they got plenty of support from in back.

Seniors Dave Krauel finished 43rd overall (26th in the team event) in a time of 15:28; Brian Spriet was 69/46 in 15:42; and Carlos Rivera was 98/70 in 16:07.

"You have to have everybody running together at state and today we didn't get that," said Quick. "It was a disappointment. You don't get a trophy for fourth."

While the Moline runners were melancholy about the team finish, Lopez and Taylor were more than happy about their efforts.

"I ran the race I expected," said Lopez with wide grin. "I got out quick today and stayed close to the leaders."

Said Taylor, who improved on his

112th-place '88 effort: "I was thinking before the race that I could finish 30th if I was close in the last 800 yards. I passed about eight people coming into the finish line."

But the team disappointment was not lost amongst the individual celebrations, including Trista Lester's All-State 11th-place in the Class AA girls race.

"The good thing about this was that most of us ran our best," said Taylor, in hushed tones.

Saturday, that best just wasn't enough.

Hall impressive

Rock Island's Hall showed that his reservations about running as an individual were for naught as he ran the race of his life — one that

won't be forgotten.

"I was ranked 57th coming in and I thought, uh-uh, there's no way I'm not getting All-State my senior year."

He was right. A fast start — 64 seconds at the quarter — carried over into a 4:43 mile and a two-mile time just over 10 minutes.

"I knew I would have to go all-out for 2.95 miles."

The race was perfect, according to coach John Coolidge. "He ran exactly the race I thought he'd have to run in order to get All-State," he said.

He was right.

Too fast, too early

Geneseo didn't get the races it needed out of two of its top point-getters. Jason VanVooren, last week's 8th-place finisher at sectionals, and Adam Boardman, got caught up in the excitement of the start, blistered the first quarter-mile in 57 seconds and were leading the field.

But that didn't last long. The energy supply wore out and they quickly slid to the back, finishing 101st and 116th, respectively.

"Jason and Adam both wanted All-State so bad that they just went out for it too hard," said Geneseo coach Don Fredericks. "They were out of it when they were in the lead that early."

Moline boys grab fourth at state cross country meet

PEORIA — The lineup has changed since last year, but the results were almost the same for the Moline boys cross country team Saturday here at the IHSA Class AA state finals.

After the final runner had finished the 3-mile Detwiller Park course and results were posted, the Maroons had just missed repeating their third-place team finish of a year ago. By a mere nine points,





the Maroons had to settle for fourth place behind Bensonville Fenton in the trophy race.

Elmhurst York won the team race, followed by Palos Hills Stagg in second.

While the results were clear in black and white, Moline coach Jeff Quick still didn't believe it.

"I believe and I know the kids be-

lieve that we are still the third best team in the state," said Quick. "I think we should be third-and-a-half and get half of the trophy."

While the Maroons were not able to bring home team hardware again this year, two individuals did get state medals. Junior Cesar Lopez and senior Tauwon Taylor each garnered All-State top 25 finishes as did Rock Island's Marlon Hall.

Lopez, who finished 76th last year, recorded a marvelous 14th-place Saturday in a time of 15:02; Hall finished 19th with his fastest race of the year in 15:05; and Taylor just made the honor, in 24th, with a

15:12 time.

The news was not as good from the Genesee camp where the over-anxious Maple Leafs burned themselves out early and had to settle for a 20th-place team finish.

Lopez, Taylor get support

While Lopez and Taylor carried their weight out front, they got plenty of support from in back.

Seniors Dave Krauel finished 43rd overall (26th in the team event) in a time of 15:28; Brian Spreit was 69/46 in 15:42, and Carlos Rivera was 98/70 in 16:07.

"You have to have everybody running together at state and today we didn't get that," said Quick. "It was a disappointment. You don't get a trophy for fourth."

While the Moline runners were melancholy about the team finish, Lopez and Taylor were more than happy about their efforts.

"I ran the race I expected," said Lopez with wide grin. "I got out quick today and stayed close to the leaders."

Said Taylor, who improved on his

112th-place '88 effort: "I was thinking before the race that I could finish 30th if I was close in the last 800 yards. I passed about eight people coming into the finish line."

But the team disappointment was not lost amongst the individual celebrations, including Trista Lester's All-State 11th-place in the Class AA girls race.

"The good thing about this was that most of us ran our best," said Taylor, in hushed tones.

Saturday, that best just wasn't enough.

Hall impressive

Rock Island's Hall showed that his reservations about running as an individual were for naught as he ran the race of his life — one that

won't be forgotten.

"I was ranked 57th coming in and I thought, uh-uh, there's no way I'm not getting All-State my senior year."

He was right. A fast start — 64 seconds at the quarter — carried over into a 4:43 mile and a two-mile time just over 10 minutes.

"I knew I would have to go all-out for 2.95 miles."

The race was perfect, according to coach John Coolidge. "He ran exactly the race I thought he'd have to run in order to get All-State," he said.

He was right.

Too fast, too early

Genesee didn't get the races it needed out of two of its top point-

getters. Jason VanVooren, last week's 8th-place finisher at sectionals, and Adam Boardman, got caught up in the excitement of the start, blistered the first quarter-mile in 57 seconds and were leading the field.

But that didn't last long. The energy supply wore out and they quickly slid to the back, finishing 101st and 116th, respectively.

"Jason and Adam both wanted All-State so bad that they just went out for it too hard," said Genesee coach Don Fredericks. "They were out of it when they were in the lead that early."
