# Quick: Moline boys may contend for state crown

Big possibilities. That's what the Moline and Geneseo boys are looking at Saturday at the IHSA Class AA state cross country meet.

"I'm probably going to open my mouth and put my foot in, but I think there are four teams that have a real chance of winning the state title and we're one of them," said Moline coach Jeff Quick, whose team has been ranked in the top 5 in the state all season.

Geneseo coach Don Fredericks, whose Maple Leafs also qualified as a team, hopes Quick is right.

"I would say that out of St. Charles, York, Schaumburg and Moline, one of those will be the state champ. That's my prediction," said Fredericks. "And I would love it to be Moline with us finishing second right in their jet stream. I think Moline has a real shot at doing some amazing things."

Those four teams, by no coincidence, finished in the top four in the final state-wide ranking released two weeks ago. St. Charles was No. 1, Schaumburg 2nd, and Moline and York tied for third. York beat St. Charles in one of four sectionals last weekend and Moline has run well against the other three this season.

For the Maroons, this is their sixth team trip to state in the last seven years, while the Maple Leafs have made it four straight years.

Both coaches also have another common thought: this could be one of the highest scoring state meets in history. That's not because of a lack of talent across the board, but just the opposite.

"There's a lot of balance out there," said Fredericks. "And that lends itself well to teams with two or three front-runners."

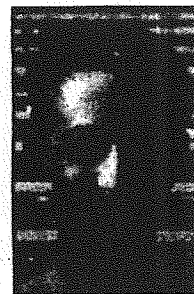

# Maroons among favorites at state

■ Moline has been gearing up for Saturday all season long

All season long, the Moline boys cross country team has been pointing toward Nov. 9 and a date with history.

Saturday at Peoria's Detweiller Park, the Maroons will make a run at becoming the first downstate team since 1958 to win an Illinois Class AA state boys cross country championship.

"It's out there and if our guys run to the best of their abilities, it's a possibility," Moline Coach Jeff Quick said. "How high we place at state will depend on our team. We cannot have a 20-second gap between our first runner and the second runner. If that happens, fourth or fifth is the best we can hope for."

Ranked third in the state, the Maroons are expected to battle two-time defending champion Elmhurst York, top-ranked St. Charles, Schaumburg and Glenbrook South for the title.

Quick said the Maroons, led by seniors Kevin Hubbard and Steve Cunningham and sophomore Jamie Verstraete, must run as a team.

Junior Mike Leemans, senior Rick Babcock and sophomores John Roehr and Chad Panky have given Moline depth to rank the Maroons among Illinois' elite.

The Maroons had their strongest effort of the season Sept. 22 on Detweiller's flat 3-mile course, finishing second to St. Charles at the Peoria Notre Dame Invitational.

"We are not as good individually as we are as a team and I think that is something we found out that day," Quick said. "It was a real positive learning experience for us. I think everybody on the team ran a PR (personal record)."

Moline has not been at its peak in recent weeks although the Maroons rolled to relatively easy wins at the Western Big Six, regional and sectional meets. Quick is hopeful that the state tourney field will spark his team's competitive drive.

"I'm not sure that the last couple of weeks we have put the maximum physical effort into it," Quick said. "I think we'll see a different team this week; one that has seven guys running as tight as they can toward one goal."

The Maroons' boys team will be joined by Geneseo in the Class AA field that will compete at 12:45 p.m. Coach Don Fredericks' Maple Leafs have been led by Andy Snook and Josh Pierce.

Led by sectional champion Trista Lester, the Moline girls team is the only Quad-City team in the Class AA girls race at 11:30 a.m.

"I think a top 15 finish would be a good effort for our girls team," Quick said. "I think Trista has a good opportunity to be an all-stater again. The cooler weather suits her fine."

Jen Wilson of Rock Island, Heather Myers of Galesburg and Jacqui Vasquez of Sterling will compete as individuals.

In Class A, boys and girls teams from Rock Island Alleman and Westmer, the boys team from Monmouth and the girls team from Kewanee are among the state field.

Alleman's girls team is paced by Jenny Welch, Kim Hills and Tiffany Crowder while the Pioneer boys are led by Bob Strabley and Nate Harrison.

The Class A boys race is scheduled for 9:30 a.m. with the Class A girls race set for 10:30 a.m.

## Leafs come up short in state meet

For the second consecutive week, bad luck beset a member of the J.D. Darnall high school cross-country team and the result was a somewhat disappointing finish in the Class AA boys state cross-country meet held Saturday, November 9 at Detweiller Park, Peoria. Entering the race, the Leafs had top ten aspirations but finished 21st among 27 teams.

On Saturday, November 2 in the sectional meet, the Geneseo girls cross-country team had a fighting chance to advance to the state meet until number one runner Kristy Windy came down with a severe case of the flu the night before the race. Though the Lady Leafs ran one of their finest races of the season, they came up short in their bid to advance.

The boys team did advance from the sectional meet and were looking towards a possible top ten finish in the state meet. Once again, however, bad luck struck a Geneseo runner.

On Friday, November 8 members of the Leaf squad gathered for bowling and dinner, then went to a friend's house to watch movies. At the house, Josh Pierce, Geneseo's number two runner, slipped on a freshly waxed floor and broke his arm. Though Pierce ran with a cast on his arm, the Leaf squad that competed in the meet was not the same squad that had ran away with victories in most of their meets this season.

"On Friday, I was very optimistic about our team's chances in this race. I truly felt they were on the verge of doing something special. When I got on the bus Saturday morning, the kids

were a bit subdued and I sensed something was wrong," said Coach Don Fredericks.

"All of the kids were shaken up by the whole affair on Friday night and it really showed in the race they ran. That was not the same team that I had watched since August," he added.

Andy Snook, who had finished 28th individually last year as a sophomore, earned 61st place this year with a time of 15:58. He was followed by Pierce (16:33, 127th), Karl Taets (16:38, 134th), Andy Snyder (16:54, 163rd), Chris Pobanz (16:57, 170th), Mitch Pray (17:36, 202nd) and Eric Misfeldt (17:45, 211th).

Perennial power Elmhurst York high school won the AA meet for the third straight time with a total of 76 points. They were followed by Schaumburg (161), Lisle Benet (186), St. Charles (191), Moline (214), Marist (219), Glenbrook South (220), Oak Park River Forest (238), Libertyville (246), Oswego (307), Rockford Guilford (330), New Lenox-Lincoln Way (353), Lockport (367), Champaign Central (382), Chicago Brother Rice (401), New Trier (406), Palatine (408), Decatur MacArthur (416), Chicago Heights Bloom (466), Geneseo (495), Pontiac (501), East St. Louis Lincoln (506), Jacksonville (508), Mt. Vernon (550), Chicago Lane (855) and Chicago Steinmetz (897).

Six of the seven Geneseo runners listed above, except Pray, a senior, will be back for the Leafs next season and big things will be expected, according to Coach Fredericks.

"The kids were not satisfied with their performance in this meet and that is good. This should be a learning experience for them, as well as the younger runners in the program. I think the kids will put in the miles over the summer and we'll be ready to go in the fall. We'll be back," he predicted.

# Moline boys run to fifth-place finish

PEORIA — It was indeed a strange day for the local Class AA boys cross country runners Saturday at a cold and sloppy Detweiller Park.

The Moline boys team endured a topsy-turvy outing to finish fifth in the state, while the Geneseo Maple Leafs found it tough to bounce back from a freak Friday accident that left junior Josh Pierce with a broken arm and running in a cast. The Maple Leafs finished a disappointing 21st.

Three months ago, says Moline coach Jeff Quick, nobody would have thought much about the Maroons' boys chances at the state cross country meet. This past week, talk in the Moline camp turned to a possible state championship.

Quite a gamut for a tradition-rich program to run in a short time. But that was nothing compared to what the Moline program went through Saturday.

The Maroons suffered an up-and-

down day as their runners found themselves in different positions. While Kevin Hubbard, one of the team's normal top three, dropped well off the pace and was not a factor for the team, junior Mike Leemans picked up the slack and put together one of his best races of the year.

He was following sophomore All-Stater Jamie Verstraete, who finished a remarkable 18th in his first state meet, senior Steve Cunningham (52), sophomore John Roehr (59), and sophomore Chad Pankey (86).

"With 200 meters to go, we were in second place," said Quick, who at that point saw Leemans hot on the heels of Roehr. "Then Leemans got tripped and fell down and lost about 40 places."

Leemans eventually finished 104th.

While York ran away with its third straight team title (and 16th overall) with 76 points, second place was there for the taking. Schaumburg grabbed it with 161, Lisle (Benet Academy) followed with 186, St. Charles had 191 and Moline 242.

"You look back to the first week of the year and nobody would have thought we'd even be here," said a surprisingly upbeat Quick who predicted his team would finish in the top five, but was looking at one of the top two. "We were running two kids who had never run before and three sophomores and we got fifth place in the state. We're the fifth-best team in the state of Illinois, you can't be disappointed in that."

But the possibilities for so much more were there, finishing only 53 points out of second.

Just like the possibilities were for the deflated Maple Leafs.

"Friday night, I was on Cloud 9," said Geneseo coach Don Fredericks. "I really thought this team was primed for something special."

What Fredericks got Saturday morning was a rude awakening. When he walked

on the bus, he said he sensed something was wrong, but just thought the kids were nervous. A couple of minutes later, Pierce displayed the cast on his arm.

"The kids all got together for bowling and pasta last night," said Fredericks. "The kids then went to a friend's house to watch movies. Josh said he was going down a set of stairs, stepped on a waxed wood floor and slipped and fell."

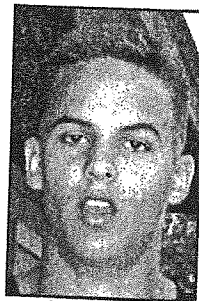
Junior Andy Snook, this year's NCIC individual titlist who just missed All-State honors last year by three places when he was 28th, was the top Geneseo runner at 61st.

"A bomb dropped on us," said Fredericks, "We were nuked, absolutely nuked."

"The kids are disappointed and I'm glad for that, that they aren't satisfied with how they ran. This is a stepping stone for us. We'll be back next year."

The Maple Leafs lose just one senior in their top eight and return four sophomores.

Snook was the only Leaf to finish in the top 125. Pierce, carrying the cast, finished second at 127th.

# Lester ends career with third medal

PEORIA — She knew what she had to do and went out and did it. Simple as that.

Moline's Trista Lester etched her name in the Moline running records Saturday by earning her third Class AA All-State medal. Her wonderfully gutty 11th-place performance puts her in a class by herself as she is the first female runner at the school to do that.

"This was my last chance and I knew had to do it," said Lester, who had a huge family backing here to watch her cruise the soggy 2.1-mile Detweiller Park course in 12:28. "I just wanted to finish in the top 25. This was a nice surprise."

Lester was thinking about the record before the race and said it did add some pressure — even though she didn't show it.

"Yeah, but I think it was good," said Lester. "I think it was better that I realized it and went out after it."

With her 11th-place finish, Lester adds to her 1989 11th-place and 1988 8th-place med-

als.

This capped a great cross country career that has been hampered the last 1-½ years by medical problems. Last year at this time, she was recovering from an appendectomy and still finished 69th as the team finished 10th.

This year, the Maroons finished in 18th place. The only other local representative in the field was Rock Island freshman Jen Wilson, who finished 60th with a time of 13:05.

But the Class AA girls' story was all Lester. She surprised herself with a quick start, one in which she led the first ¾ of a mile and clocked an opening mile of 5:40 — her fastest of the season.

"Going out that fast, I did surprise myself," she said. "I was surprised I was up that far."

But her adrenaline, along with some great intestinal fortitude, carried her all the way.

"She may be one of the toughest runners I've had," said Moline coach Jeff Quick. "That's something either you have or you don't."

"It was sloppy out there and she just thrives on that. She's such a strong runner."

Lester, while leading early, never fell out of the pack of the top 15 runners.

"I'm kind of sad it's over," said Lester. "I'm glad I went out the way I did."

While Lester's prep cross country career ended, Rock Island's Wilson got off to a solid start with her placing in her first state meet.

"She ran solid," said Rock Island coach Bob Wilson, her father. "She went out and was 50th in the first ¼-mile and stayed right there."

"She's disappointed and that's a good sign. The plum is out there for her. She knows what this is all about."

In the team race, Palatine was an easy winner with 78 points. Schaumburg (132) and Wheaton Central (139) grabbed the other two trophy-winning spots. Moline had 436 points in 18th place.

Senior Erika Chesney from Downers Grove North won the individual title in 12:06, edging Wheeling senior Amy Siegel, who stumbled near the finish line and finished four seconds back.

# *To kick or to run, Moline's Verstraete made right choice*

PEORIA — Two years ago, Moline's Jamie Verstraete didn't know if he was going to play soccer or run cross country in high school.

After Saturday's Class AA state cross country meet at Detweiller Park, it appears Verstraete made the right decision.

He was Moline's top runner, earning All-State honors with an 18th-place finish with a 15:30 clocking.

So, Jaime, what was it that made you decide on cross country?

"He was," said Verstraete pointing to teammate Chris Quick, Coach Jeff Quick's son.

What did you tell him to get him to run, Chris?

"I told him he could be good. Really good," said Chris.

He apparently was right. Verstraete has been the team's top runner the last two weeks, finishing sixth at last week's East Peoria Sectional.

"He's been saying the last week he could be All-State," said Coach Quick. "He's a confident kid."

"I thought I had a shot of finishing in the top 25 or 30," admitted Verstraete. "Every time people were telling me my place during the race, they said I was 25th or 26th and I knew I had to pick it up."

Verstraete said he was more concerned with helping the team than getting a high finish for himself.

"We wanted to finish in the top

three as a team," he said. "It kind of put some pressure on me being my first time at state.

"It was the seniors' last year and I wanted to help them go out on a good note."

While the team missed on its third-place try, ending up fifth, Verstraete, the second highest finishing sophomore in the state meet, set himself up for 2 more strong years.

And start a great career that almost never was.



# Class A runners have little to show for solid efforts

PEORIA — There were some good performances, but not as much to show for it as they had hoped.

That **Class A** summed up the **state** efforts of the Class A runners Saturday at the state country meet at Detweiller Park.

Monmouth senior Gary Haneghan was the only area runner to pick up state hardware. He capped a tumultuous season — one in which he was a dominant runner, suffered a broken cheekbone when he was attacked by youths outside of his home and missed three weeks of the season including the conference and regional meets — with his second straight All-State medal.

The rest of the morning wasn't as productive. No other runners earned All-State honors and none of the teams finished in the top 10, goals of most of the teams heading into the finals.

In a cold early-morning boys' race, Westmer, Alleman and Monmouth finished 11th, 12th and 13th, respectively, in the team standings.

Alleman's Nate Harrison was his team's top finisher with what to him was a disappointing 45th-place effort.

Steve Leathers led Westmer with a 59th-place run. The Warrior pack closed with Jason Hergert in 107th place, :37 behind Leathers.

In the girls race, Monmouth senior Amy Sproston was a near-miss All-Stater for the second year in a row. She followed up last year's

28th-place effort with a 32nd place this year.

Also not able to improve on a solid 1990 30th-place effort was Westmer senior Jeannie Coulter who ended up 44th.

Alleman sophomore Kim Hills, a 1990 All-Stater when she finished 20th and helped the Pioneers to a third-place team finish, was 51st.

In the girls' team race, Alleman finished 11th and Westmer 14th.

Haneghan's 22nd-place effort, despite not equalling last year's 16th-place All-State outing, was gratifying considering everything he's been through this season.

"Going out there I thought everybody was going to be passing me after missing the training and that I'd get less than All-State," said Haneghan. "I'm pretty pleased."

Monmouth Coach C.P. Pullen was impressed with his senior.

"I was pleased he hung in there, ran tough and got another medal," said Pullen. "He's a deserving kid who works hard."

Haneghan was just 14 seconds out of the top 10, which was his goal.

Also close to making a great showing were the Alleman girls, who finished just five points out of 10th and 29 out of 7th.

"I see all the places between our kids' places and I'm disappointed in that," said Alleman coach Joe Lopez, who last year had three runners earn All-State honors as the team finished third. "The girls really didn't run that bad."

But like others in the Class A race, they didn't get quite as much out of it as they had hoped.
