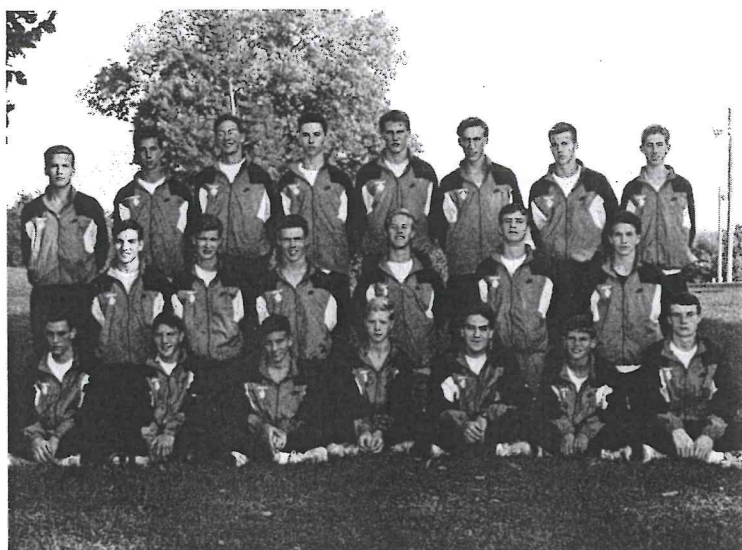
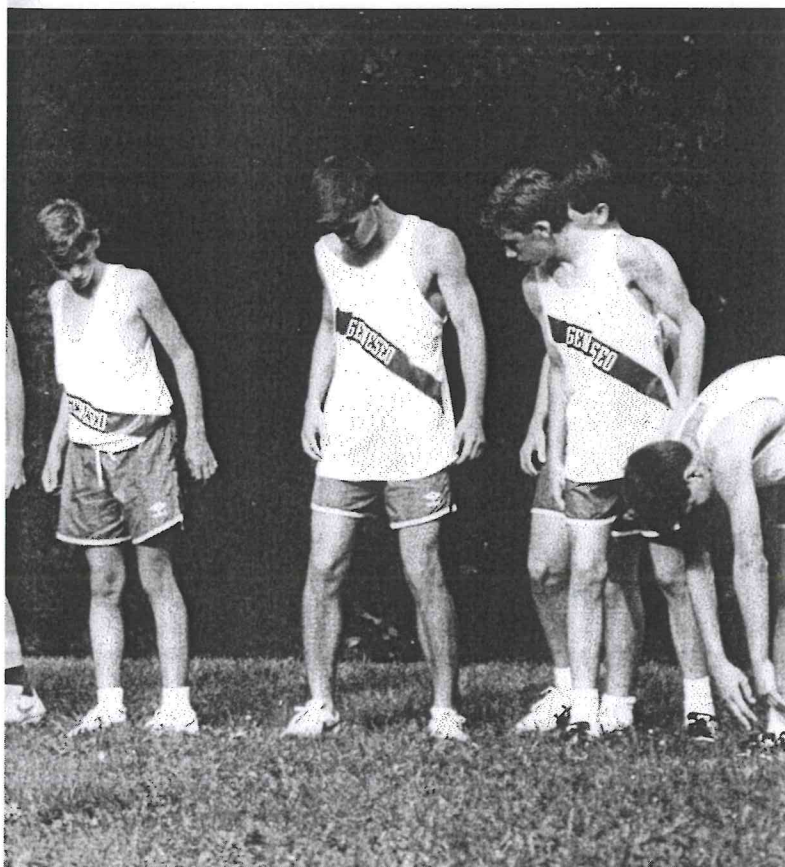

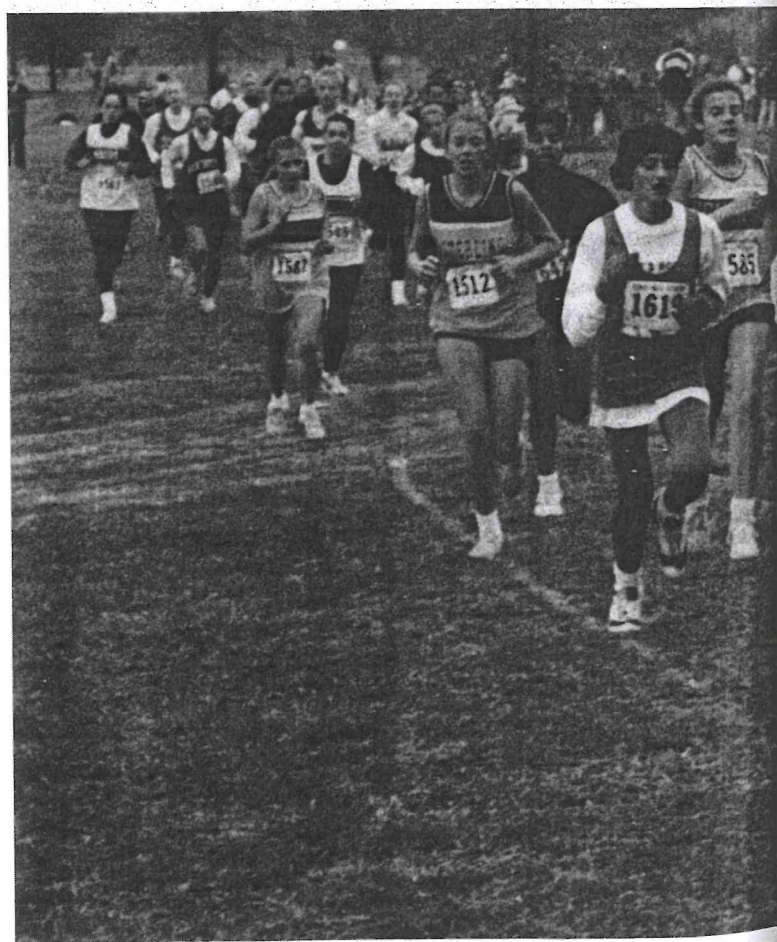

1991 record: 13-1 overall, 1st in the North Central Illinois Conference. Last year's state appearance was the seventh in a row for the Maple Leafs.

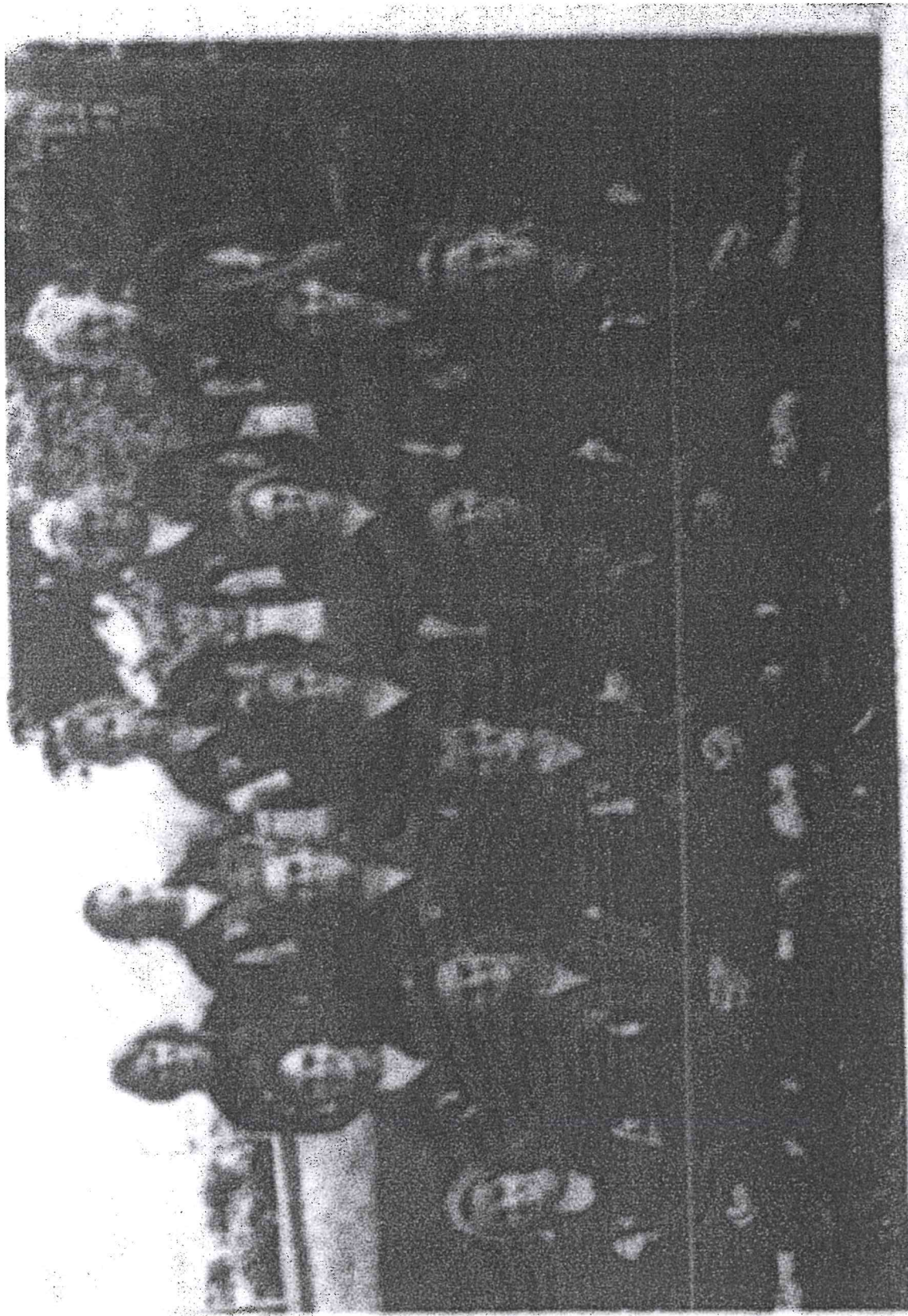
