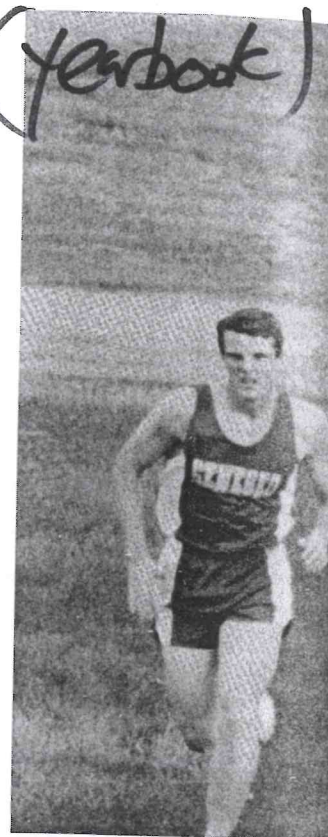

# Cross Country 1994 (yearbook)

To the knowledgeable observer, competitiveness and camaraderie are the first two words that come to mind when considering Geneseo cross country. Running may seem to be an individual sport, but lumbering up and down hills for three or more miles is so challenging that an encouraging and talented group of friends to run with is necessary. Sara Rutledge explained, "Cross country really is a team sport, so how well you bond with your teammates can be surprisingly important. What we do together besides running makes the difference." Mike Hanson confirmed that to the participants, there is much more to cross country than running. "When I look back on cross country, I won't just think of running, I'll remember playing frisbee, throwing around a football, getting muddy at Palatine, and eating Little Ceasar's after races in Peoria."

In 1994, strong records of 9-4 for the varsity boys and 10-3 for the girls disguised the disappointment that many of the runners felt. A chief girls' goal was to beat state powerhouse Sterling, but the Warriors finished barely ahead of our Leafs at both conference and regionals. The season's goal for the varsity boys was to win the conference championship for the tenth year in a row. Instead of formally concluding their decade of dominance, they finished a respectable third. Coach Snook put his perspective on the season. "Well, we tried. We'll just start again next year." The season ended for both harrier teams at sectionals, where the boys finished nineteenth and the girls tenth.

The girls' MVP was Natalie Myers. Boys' MVP Jeremy Michaels summed up the season and the sport, "Cross country is a great sport filled with charismatic people. I regret that this is my last year."

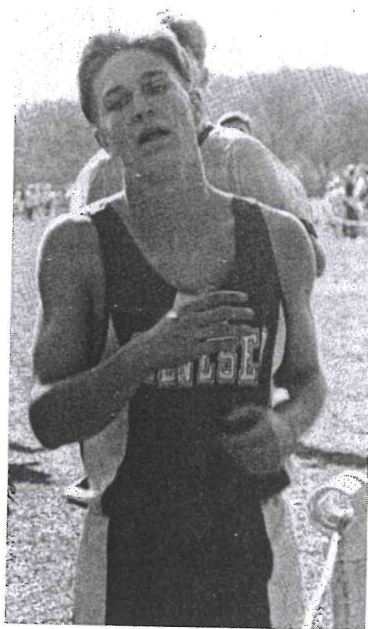

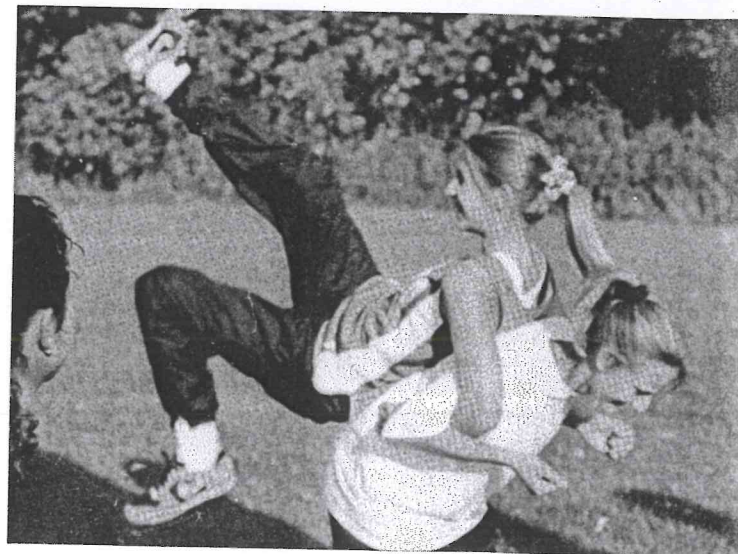

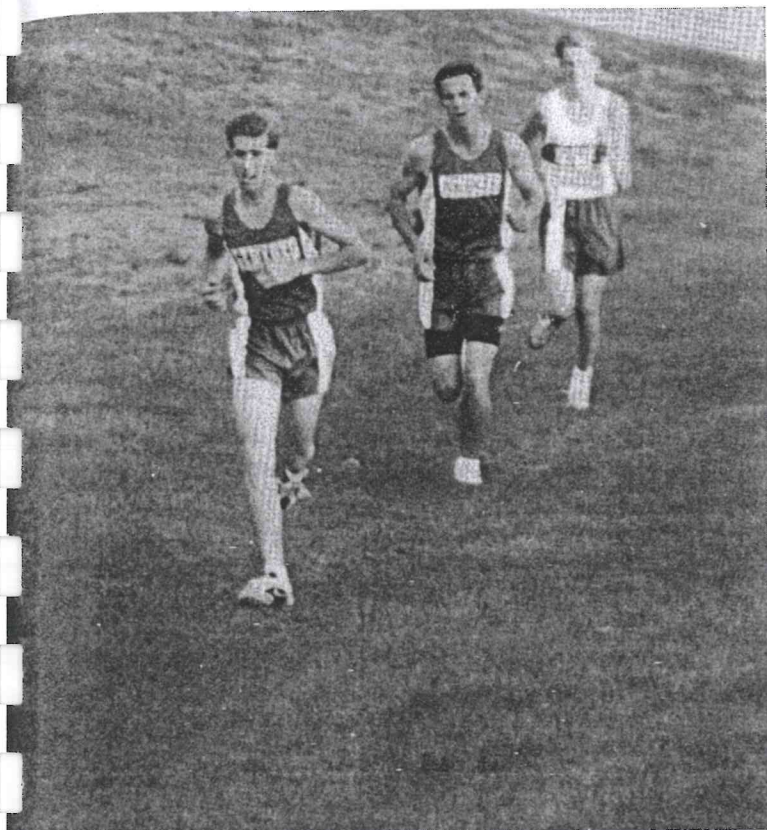

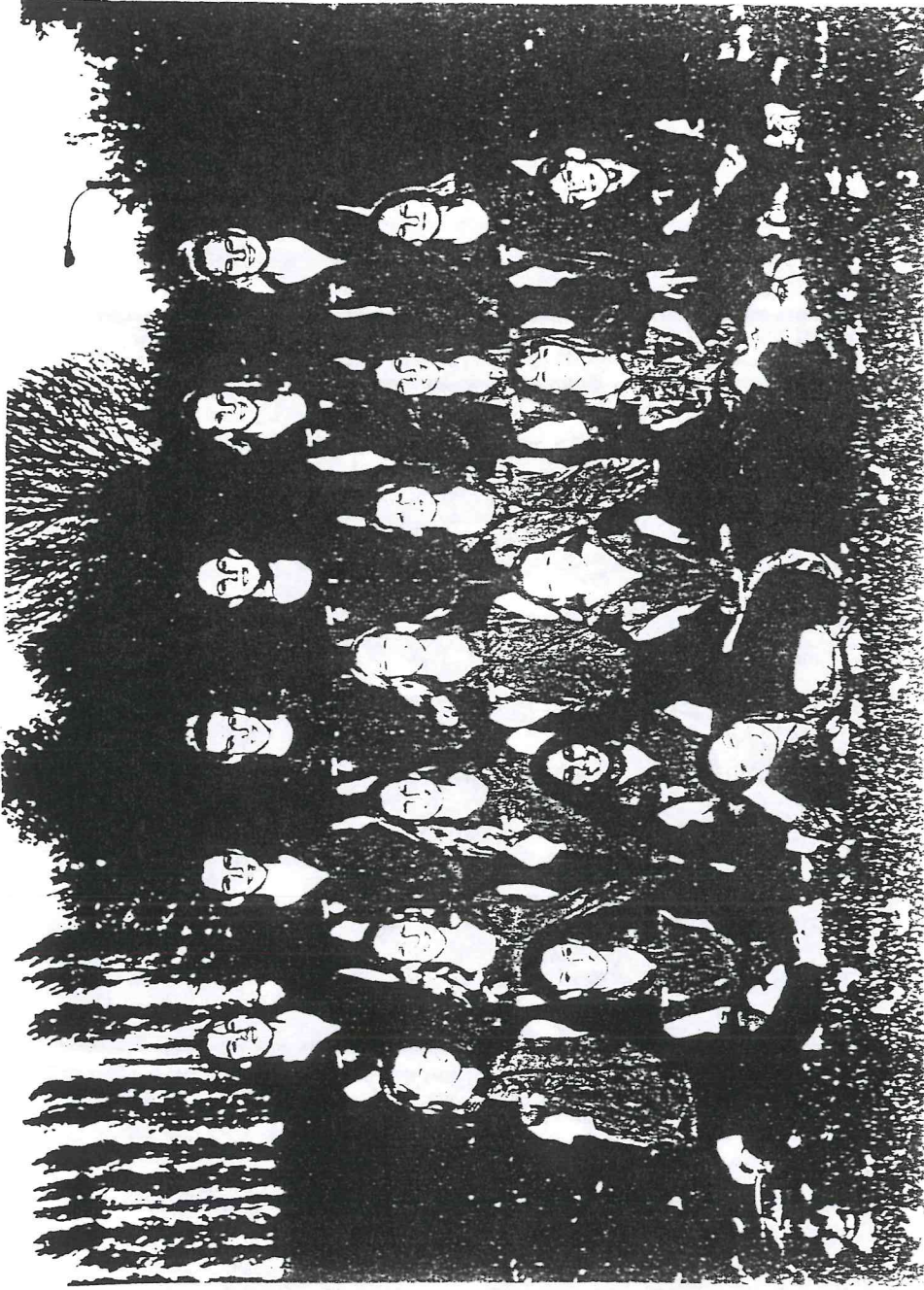

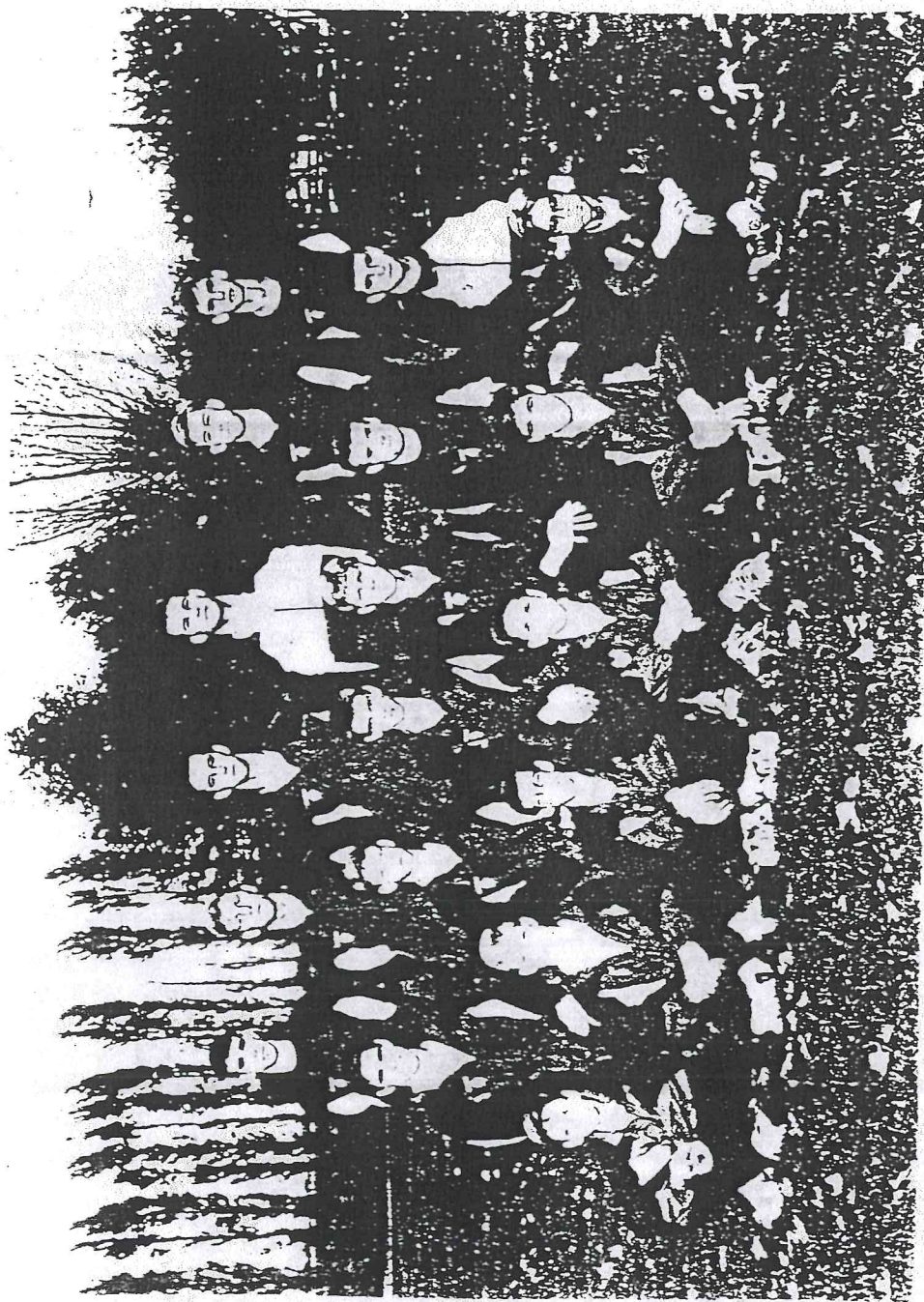
