'We're in it for the journey'

Rocks are motivated by last year's poor performance

When breaking out of its starting position Saturday at the Illinois Class AA state boys cross country championships, Rock Island will be in it for the long haul.

As second-year coach Dave Terronez puts it, "We're in it for the journey, not the destination."

The Rocks are taking those words to heart.

Not satisfied with a string of up-and-down seasons, Rock Island athletes believe they are building on a foundation that the Rocks helped lay a year ago.

Rock Island has enjoyed a season filled with success, winning Western Big Six and regional championships in addition to topping a powerful field at the Clinton Invitational.

The 15th-rated Rocks have adopted a pack approach to the sport this season. But although the pack may have separated physically as the races have become more competitive, the mental edge remains.

"That's the important thing," Lawrence said. "There may be a few people between us now, but mentally, we still must compete as one. We have

to trust that the guy in front of us is doing what he can and that the people behind are doing what they can.

"We're all still working together as a team, and that will be important this weekend," Lawrence said.

In recent weeks, junior Sean Mendoza has been leading the way.

He led Rock Island with a second-place finish at the Class AA regional at Sterling two weeks ago and earned fourth place in sectional competition at East Peoria.

Like his team, Mendoza is in it for the long haul this season.

"I'm finishing stronger than I did a year ago. When I get to that last mile, I have more of a kick left," he said.

"That has helped me improve."

Terronez said Mendoza had plenty of energy left at the end of last Saturday's race.

"He can compete with the best. Some people felt that running as a pack held him back earlier this year, but I feel like it's allowed him to relax and use his energy more wisely," Mendoza said. "He's stronger in the second and

Three ways to look at girls race

Contenders at the Class AA girls state meet will be sporting a three-tiered look.

There will be annual contenders (Palatine, St. Charles and York); the perennial also-rans (Naperville North, Sandburg and Lincoln-Way); and the upstarts (Downers Grove North, Wheaton North and Lake Zurich) competing for trophies at 11:30 a.m. at Peoria's Detweiller Park.

"There's always a darkhorse," said Wheaton North coach Ron Piro, whose team qualifies. "You have those that have been down there and know the park. You have those that make that annual trek and are racing with that history. Then you have the ones that have nothing to lose and seem to come out of nowhere."

"I don't know which have the advantage."

Mt. Assisi coach Bill Bradna says six teams have a chance to win and his X-Index identifies defending champion Palatine as the favorite. Illinois Prep Top Times (and most coaches) rank St. Charles No. 1 and Palatine No. 2.

The Saints won the toughest regionals and sectionals with little difficulty, but have never won a state title.

"It will be interesting," Naperville North coach Dan Iverson said. "I have an idea there will be some very high team scores. It should be a pretty exciting state meet — and nerve-racking."

Locally, the best hopes seem to ride with the upstarts, No. 3 Downers Grove North and No. 8 Wheaton North. No. 4 York and No. 6 Naperville North may have slipped a bit in experts' estimations, but both are serious trophy contenders. No. 11 Glenbard West is a good long shot because of its continual improvement.

"Lake Zurich's a team that's making big inroads," Downers Grove North coach Bruce Ritter said. "Six or seven might be the maximum that can win, but when I look at this thing I'm not sure anybody can score under 100."

"In the old days, 110 or 155 would win. It could be that way again un-

less somebody really steps up."

Downers Grove North may be the only team other than St. Charles with potential for three runners in the top 25 (all-state). Top-flight individuals like defending state champion Rebecca Mitchell of Geneva, Jenny Arnold of Libertyville and Lissa Vogley of Benet who are competing without teams will raise the scores.

"It's hard to get all-staters with the number of (good) runners there," Ritter said. "If you can get two, you're in good shape. But you never know, one year Palatine won with no all-staters."

The advantage of having low-scoring individuals like Downers Grove North's top three, Wheaton North's Rachel Endress, Glenbard West's Kyna Forkins, Naperville North's Joy Brzana and York's Celi Williams is in reducing pressure on their teammates. The lesser known runners, however, are likely to have a greater stake in determining the title.

"A lot is going to depend on the No. 4 and No. 5," said Ritter, who has coached two state championship teams. "You need to get your front runners close to the front, but the Nos. 4-5 can be very dominant."

Each of the local contenders is solid at those positions. York may be the strongest, but the Dukes have to rebound from a sectional slump. With five state-experienced runners, that's a strong possibility.

Naperville North was fourth at the Lincoln-Way sectional after making steady progress in four consecutive meets. The Huskies have five runners with state experience in their seventh straight appearance.

"We're very confident going in," Iverson said. "They were disappointed (at sectionals), but I have

an idea that's a good thing. We didn't move as well at the mile as we needed to and the girls identified that right away."

Newly healthy Naperville Central is making its second consecutive trip with four experienced runners.

On the other end of the spectrum, Wheaton North and Glenbard West have no returning state runners. Both competed well at pressure meets, however, so that may be a minor concern.

"This will be the first time we're all healthy," Piro said. "I've told them it's our last race. It's the time for each individual to do her best."

Class A

St. Francis hopes to improve on its eighth-place finish from 1996 while Wheaton Academy seems fully capable of matching it.

■ No. 9 Hinsdale Central could claim the school's best state finish.

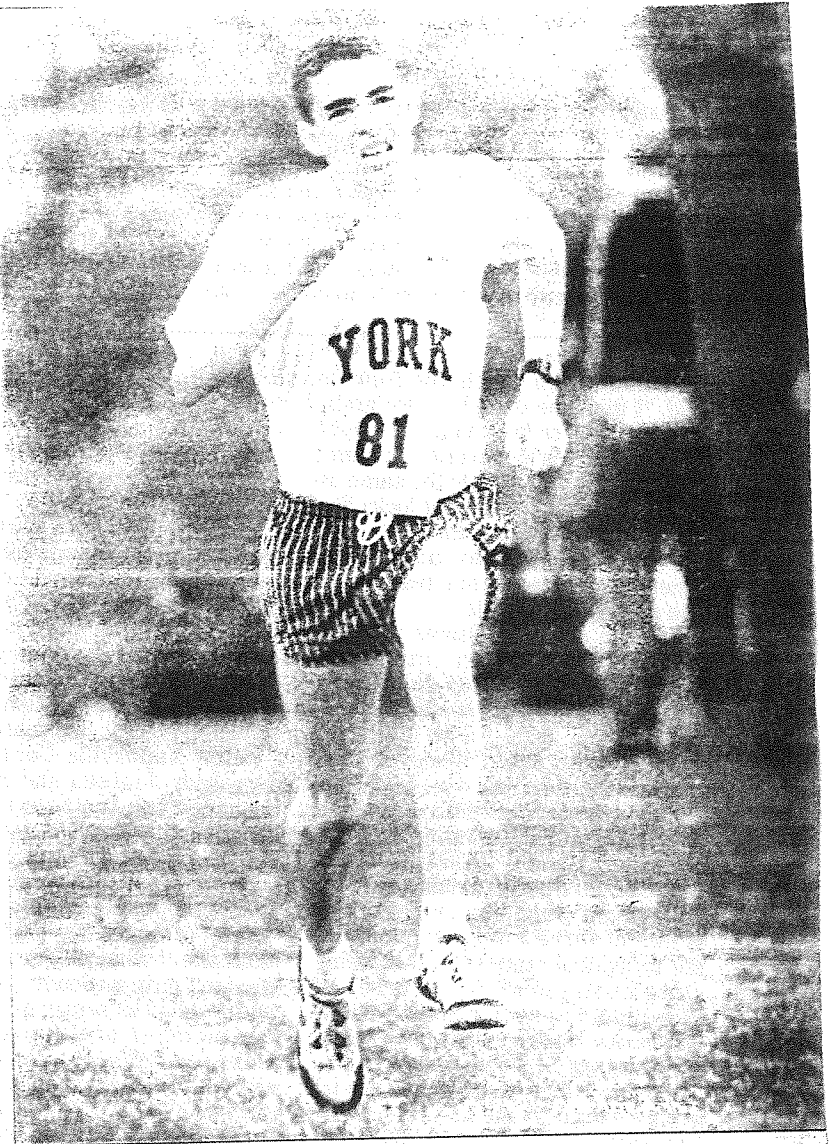
■ Unranked Fenton and Downers Grove North have lived a dream in getting to the 12:45 p.m. finals at Detweiller Park in Peoria.

sectional," York coach Joe Newton said. "I think the thing is up for grabs between four or five teams, but right now Lockport is the favorite. Schaumburg matches up exactly the same as York, and all of a sudden it looks like Naperville Central is in there."

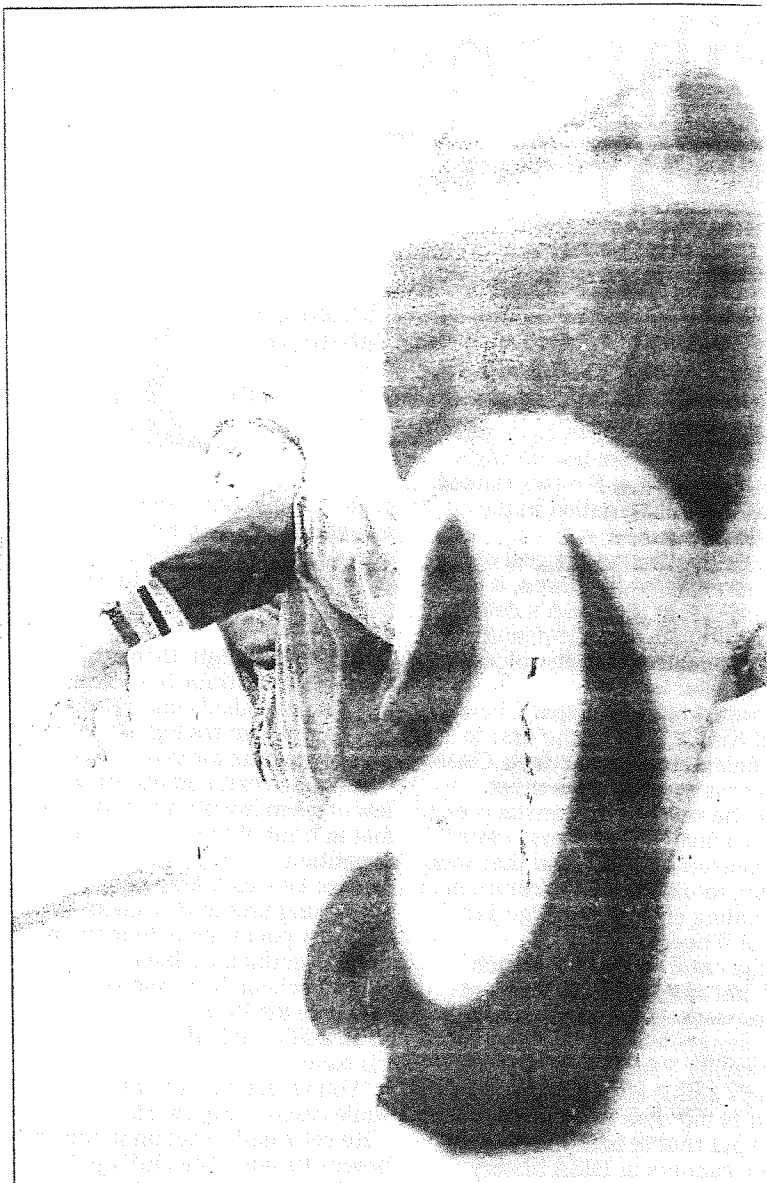

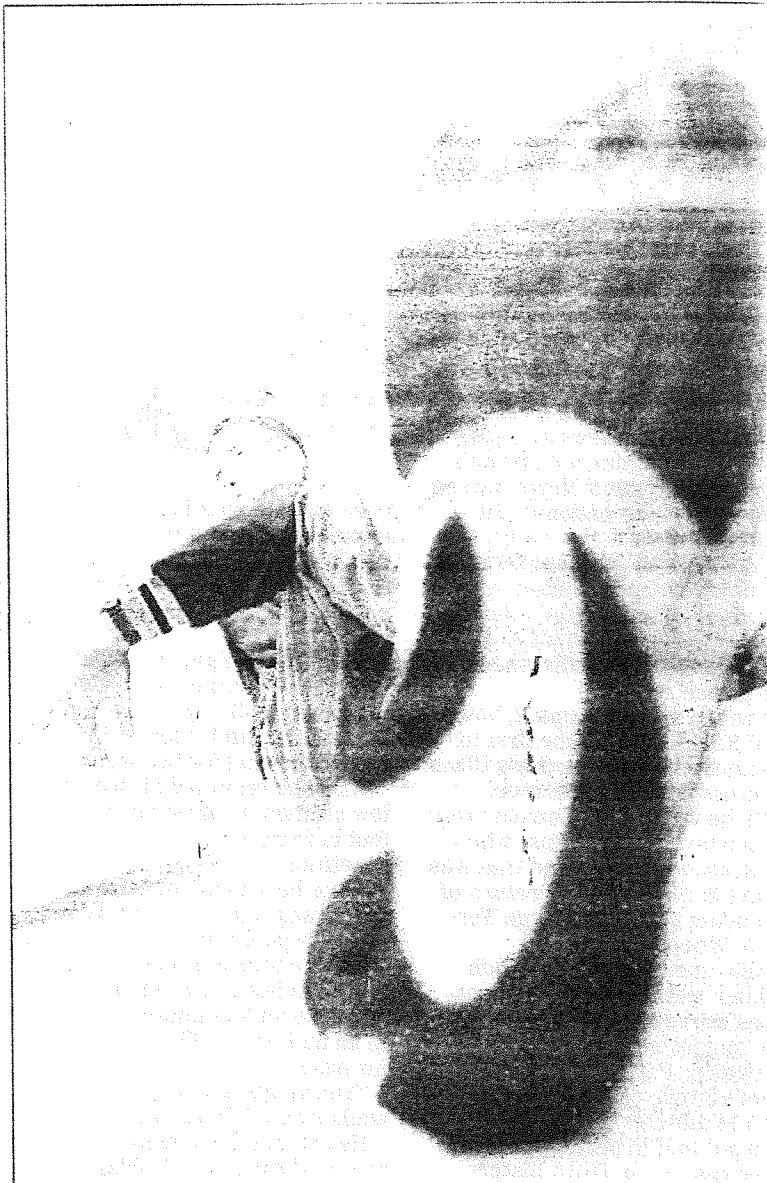

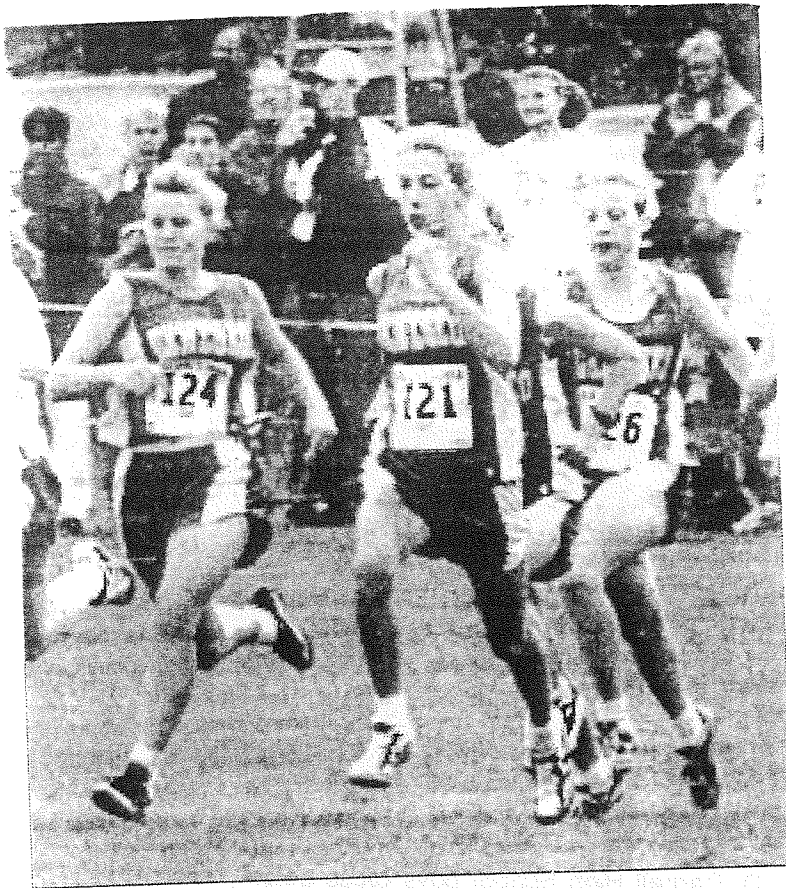

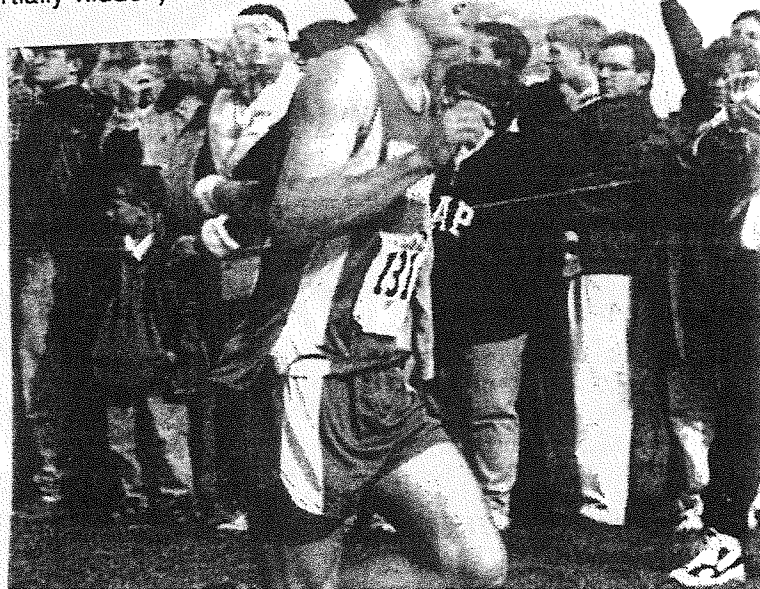

PEORIA, Ill. — If Geneseo freshman cross country runner Jennifer Lake keeps returning to state, she probably will not be able to keep away from the "Good Luck" wishes she receives from Geneseo fans when she trains on her hometown streets.

Geneseo has experienced a number of firsts this year out of the sports department at J. D. Darnall High School.

Last Saturday, November 8, proved no exception.

Freshman Jenny Lake finished eighth at the Class AA cross country state finals and became the highest placing Lady Leaf in school history, taking the title from Priscilla Gomez who earned a 10th place ranking in the 1985 state finals.

Lake's eighth place also earned her All-State honors.

The finals were held at Detweiller Park in Peoria under overcast skies and mild temperatures.

Though conditions were considered to be "perfect," the following the Geneseo cross country team has gathered played another important part in the day's results.

"There were over 10,000 screaming fans at the state meet," Coach Don Fredericks recalled. "Plus the largest Geneseo contingent that anyone could remember," he marveled. "We've had tremendous fan support. A number of the runners said they could hear cheers for Geneseo everywhere along the course."

In addition, Coach Fredericks believes this is the largest crowd to have attended the state cross country meet. "I don't remember more people being there in general."

Wurth took the East Peoria Sectional individual crown just last weekend.

It was a tight field between fifth and tenth place. A time of 11:49 earned Lissa Vogley of Lisle Benet fifth, just four seconds ahead of Lake. Jenny Arnold of Libertyville took sixth, 11:50; Katie Hartmann of Woodstock, seventh, 11:52, then Lake in eighth. Both Ann Gaffigan of Springfield Sacred Heart and Lisa Martin of Lake Zurich clocked in at 11:54.

Natalie Myers was the second Lady Leaf to cross the gate. Myers clocked a 12:43, taking 80th overall. Her time last year was 12:50, though it earned her a higher overall finish.

Andrea Blondell, Geneseo's third

harrier, improved her time and place finish as well, taking 113th overall this year with a time of 12:55. Her time in 1996 was 13:14.

Jill Hinrichs took 146th overall with a time of 13:14; Rachael Williams placed 187th with a time of 13:45; Rhonda Loftus earned 194th in 13:56 while Becky Riewerts brought up the pack with a 215th-place finish and a time of 14:30.

Williams, Riewerts and Loftus all competed on the 1996 state team as well.

Taking the team Class AA crown was St. Charles with a total score of 75 points. Orland Park Sandburg was the closest competition but was still over 80 points behind the leader, earning 157 points over the course.

Elmhurst York rounded out the top three places, scoring 165 points.

Geneseo's 404 points earned the team 16th place.

"I'm very proud of where our kids are," Coach Fredericks stressed.

"We're competing with a number of larger schools and still remaining competitive."

The head instructor also noted 12 of the 14 harriers competing for Geneseo (in both the boys' and girls' races) earned personal bests in times at Saturday's meet.

Coach Fredericks shares the glory of a winning year with both the football team and the soccer squad. "Hopefully our success will be contagious to both the winter and spring sports," he quipped.

"Geneseo has the potential to have one of the greatest years in school history with its sports program."

Fluck leads Leafs at state Class AA harrier meet

For the first time in six seasons, the J. D. Darnall High School varsity boys cross country team has qualified for the state meet. This was also the second time in school history both the boys' and girls' teams qualified for the state finals the same year, the last time being in 1988.

Behind the powerful running of Justin Fluck, the Leafs took 21st place at the state meet. Twenty-seven teams took to the course with Lockport Township earning the Class AA state title with 134 points. Elmhurst York earned second with 135 while Wheeling scored 165 for third.

Geneseo's harriers combined for 478 points.

Fluck, the first Leaf to finish the 3.00-mile course, placed 42nd overall with a time of 15:16.

Jorge Torres of Wheeling won the individual crown with a time of 14:15, seven seconds ahead of Donald Sage of Elmhurst York in second at 14:22.

Chris Studer, the second Leaf to complete the course, took 95th overall with a time of 15:46.

Also running were Jason Gray, 139, 16:08; Mark Keplinger, 171, 16:22; Grant Venema, 188, 16:32; Andy Beuster, 194, 16:36 and Tim Nelson, 209, 16:59.

According to Coach Don Fredericks, 12 of the 14 harriers representing Geneseo at the state meet clocked personal bests at Saturday's meet. This would include both the boys' and girls' divisions.

Coach Fredericks noted, if another class were formed within the state of schools closer to Geneseo's enrollment, the Leafs would have earned more like a third-place finish.

"There's a lot of tough competition out there from a lot of bigger schools," he explained. "But that doesn't make me any less proud of our kids. However, it does show how misleading the 21st-place finish can be.

"The state of Illinois has really surged forward the last couple of years and is as competitive (in cross country) as it has ever been," Coach Fredericks further explained.

"It's exciting to see the talent on the state level, though it makes it tougher for us to compete. But it's also more of a challenge and you see everyone rising to that level."

Geneseo's varsity harriers earned a right to compete at state following a first-place at the conference meet, second at regionals and fourth at the sectionals.

Saint Charles runs away with team title

PEORIA—Geneva's Rebecca Mitchell can now call Tera Moody, her friend and rival from St. Charles, a champion.

Don't mistake that for a loss by Mitchell. She won her second straight Class AA cross-country championship Saturday in 11 minutes 19 seconds, 3 seconds off the state record set by Wheeling's Dana Miroballi in 1987.

The sophomore was pushed by Moody, who fell short in her quest for an individual title by finishing second in 11:27 but led St. Charles to its first cross-country state championship.

It was the fourth encounter between Mitchell and Moody this year. Both have dominated cross-country races in the Chicago area this year, though Moody never has beaten Mitchell.

"I don't like to lose, but it's better to lose to a friend," Moody said. "I had a great race. I knew I could stay with her."

"Someone told me to think 'I can, I can, I will,' and I kept saying it during the race."

Bloomington's Christin Wurth, the only runner to beat Mitchell in a high school race, faded behind the leaders after 1,200 meters, leaving Mitchell and Moody alone in their closest race of the year.

Mitchell said Moody, who was either at her side or a step behind until the final 400 meters, helped her run the second-fastest time ever on the 2.1-mile course at Detweiller Park.

"Tera had good surges in the race," Mitchell said. "I just tried to counter them."

Mitchell called her victory "10 times sweeter than last year's" because her brother, Justin, whom she says encouraged her

to join cross country, finished 23rd in the boys race. She also stressed the importance of her improvement in the last year. She beat her 1996 time by 11 seconds.

"If you get winning too much into your head, you miss the point of running," she said. "The point is improving."

Moody, a junior, has been a title contender every year. She was sixth in the state final as a freshman and fourth last year, leading the Saints to a runner-up finish to Palatine in 1996. Saturday, she had a parade of teammates behind her. Senior Carrie De Piazza finished 24th, earning all-state honors. Carrie Phelps (37th) and Kelly Tetzlaff (38th) both finished a second behind the Saints' No. 3 runner, Lauren Brannon (34th).

St. Charles scored 75 points, giving coach Tom Roderick his first title trophy. The Saints beat runner-up Sandburg by 82 points and York by 90. Palatine, which had won the last two Class AA finals, finished fourth.

"When I found out we had five runners in the top 40, I was thinking we had enough to win," said Roderick, who has coached track and field for 22 years and girls cross country for nine. "When I heard we won, I couldn't breathe. I

Moody had each team member bring 10 packages of Jello orange-flavored dessert, which was prepared Friday night in the runners' hotel rooms. Coaches and team members were covered with it and Gatorade shortly after the race. The bottle of Gatorade traveled with the team for the two years.

"In 1995 we said we'd open it when we won," Moody said.

There were no title celebrations for Chicago teams in Class A. Sandwich had All-State finishers in Kristen Curtin (11th) and Adrian Ricci (12th), but finished second to Petersburg Porta 72-123. Herscher was third in 149. Rushville's Alana Crisman (12:14) beat Marian Central Catholic's Catie LaBracke by 3 seconds for the individual title.

York girls excel to garner third-place finish

PEORIA — The scenario York coach Larry Bassett envisioned in the girls Class AA state meet Saturday at Detweiller Park played itself out, and the Dukes' sectional detour was nullified.

York was the only team to beat first-time state champion St. Charles this season, but seemed on a six-week downward spiral since. The Saints scored just 75 points Saturday

while surprising Sandburg edged York 157-165 for second place.

Weeks earlier, Bassett relished the possibility of entering as an underdog with big-time capability. The Dukes set it up with a fourth-place finish at the East Aurora sectional Oct. 1.

"Celi (Williams) was fantastic. I'm so proud of her," Bassett said. "I knew this was going to happen all week. We had a problem, but they came back. I have a lot of respect for them for that."

Williams, a junior, ran a career-best

race for 14th place (12:02).

"It was kind of like the state (3,200-meter) relay," said Williams of the Dukes' track championship. "It was like we knew we could do it, but we didn't really believe it until we did it."

Williams planned to race with Downers Grove North's Elizabeth Tumpach (19th, 12:07), but was ahead of her. It was the first time Williams beat the Trojans leader.

"I felt great the first mile, so I made my move," Williams said. "My state meets in the past, I've just walked

through. The team ran great all the way through."

The Dukes' pack started fast and finished strong, led by senior Nancy Steinbach (39th) and freshman Maria Cicero (49th).

"We all stuck together as much as we could the first mile," Steinbach said. "The (remote) Triangle is where we tried to surge and pass. Our goal was to stay together and we did that extremely well."

Benet's Lissa Vogley was the area's top individual despite being in 100th place after three seconds into the race. The junior moved up one place from 1996, finishing fifth (11:49), and earned a used, aquamarine Mustang from her parents for repeating as an all-stater.

"I running as fast as I could," Vogley said. "I think it helped me because I knew I had to go hard and pass people. I was in sixth by the mile."

Glenbard West freshman Kyna Forkins earned all-state honors, taking 23rd place (12:10) and leading the Hilltoppers to seventh (234 points).

"I just had to keep working my way up," Forkins said. "I heard people calling out places and I really wanted to get all-state."

Sophomore Jenny Korrison was West's second runner (48th) and the 3-5 runners packed tightly.

"Three came in right in a row and I think that made the difference," said Glenbard West coach Sue Pariseau.

"Jenny ran a great race again."

Trophy contenders Wheaton North and Downers North had disastrous races.

The Trojans' Anna King accidentally spiked teammate Jessica Brannigan within 20 yards of the starting line. Downers North placed eighth (239).

"For anybody that ran as well as they did all year, that has to be devastating," Bassett said.

Wheaton North (367) also started too slowly and was relegated to 14th

place.

"We got boxed in at the start and were out of it in the first 600 yards," Falcons coach Ron Piro said. "We still had a heck of a season."

DuPage Valley Conference rivals Naperville North (ninth, 252) and Naperville Central (13th, 363) finished ahead of the 1997 champion Falcons.

"Everybody had a (personal record)," Naperville North coach Dan Iverson said.

"I can't be disappointed with where we finished."

Ruling puts York a point shy of boys title

PEORIA — York left the IHSA Class AA state meet course Saturday at Detweiller Park relatively secure that it had won its 20th boys title.

Dukes coach Joe Newton's finish-line watchers had done the math and determined that York had edged 1996 champion Lockport by 2 points. Newton was cautious while advising the York fans from his picnic table perch, but pointed out that his helpers never had steered him wrong.

To the Dukes legions, their record stands intact and the IHSA's credibility is in doubt. Lockport's Nick Setta was collapsed in the chute and was ruled to have finished in 19th place, eight places higher than previously thought.

Lockport defended its title by a 134-135 margin, the closest since 1967. The discrepancy was revealed at the post-meet awards ceremony.

"They said we won on the course," Newton said.

"We worked all year to take it to the top. We rose to the occasion and gave it everything we had to get beat by one point.

"I'm proud of everything we did. I'm just devastated."

York was led by Donald Sage, who challenged 1996 champion Jorge Torres of Wheeling and finished second (14:22). Setta was Lockport's leader as the Porters put three runners in the top 31 for an 8-point edge on the Dukes' top three.

"It was a great state meet," said Lockport coach Larry Thompson.

"We had some kids give an outstanding performance and it was enough to pull it off. When I was talking to Mr. Newton at the course, I thought he had won."

York gained 7 points back with its last two scorers, Jim Mallaney (48th) and Mark Thomas (71st), to offset the Porters' edge up front. Sophomore John Janulis (93rd) nearly beat Lockport's fifth man, Jerry Jaskierny (90th), in his first varsity race, replacing injured Tom Moore.

"It was pretty much a shock," said Thomas, one of three York seniors. "Somebody told me (before the ceremony) we lost by one point and I thought he was kidding. At the end a few guys passed me. Now I wish I would have held off one person."

While Thomas' sentiments are understandable, the Dukes finished with their season-best race.

"We had a meeting (Friday) night and talked about how hard we worked to get here — like running quarter (miles) in 90 degree heat," said Dukes senior Noah Lawrence, who was 44th, eight seconds behind Pete Cioni (35th). "Coach Newton said, 'In 15 minutes, you can justify four years of hard work.' After the meeting, I knew we were ready."

Lawrence's twin brother, Collin, finished 224th because of a hypoglycemia attack.

"Getting second is great, but it doesn't compare to first," Noah said. "I hope, when (officials) see what happened, they fix it. But it won't be the same as getting the trophy."

"It wouldn't be official, but at least we would know in our hearts and minds."

Sage shadows Torres for second in boys race

Naperville North senior Mark Pilja ran fourth (14:32), fending off Morton's Juan Ortega in the last 100 meters to equal his 1996 placing. Pilja ran with co-leaders Torres and Sage for 1½ miles.

"I gave it my all, but I'm not really in great shape," Pilja said. "We probably ran the third 800 meters in 2:10 or 2:15, and that took me out of the race.

"I wanted to get the state record (13:56.6) and in the summer I was on pace to do that. Unfortunately, I couldn't do it because of the (hip) injury."

Sage said looks forward to racing against a healthy Torres and Pilja in track.

"I've always run better against better competition," Sage said.

Sage finished 10 places ahead of Lockport's top runner, but the Porters gained a 134-135 edge at the No. 3 and No. 4 positions.

"We ran a great race and Lockport ran a great race," Sage said. "We gave it a great shot."

Naperville Central was fifth (187) and Fenton sixth (194) with two all-state (top 25) runners apiece. Hinsdale Central was eighth (146) with Mike Seman achieving all-state honors.

Glenbard East senior Joe Zeibert also was among the nine area all-staters, taking 17th (14:54).

Fenton's Arturo Cabral (ninth, 14:43) and Chris Siemers (13th, 14:51) each repeated as all-staters despite losing large chunks of the season due to injuries.

Cabral was disappointed in finishing one place below 1996.

"Even with what happened to me and Chris, I expected to do the same as last year," Cabral said.

Siemers was more philosophical.

"My goal was top 10, but I'm happy just being able to run here after being out 10 weeks," the junior said. "I'm happy about the team. They've come a long way from where they were when Arturo and I were out. Having Alex (Gonzalez, 51st) step up is big for next year."

Naperville Central's first all-state pair were junior Andy Janssen (16th, 14:52) and sophomore Ryan Teising (24th, 14:57). Redhawks coach George Cyr said each of his runners ran close to pre-race projections.

"I never imagined being all-state until this summer," Janssen said. "I started about 20 yards ahead of Ryan, but I knew he was behind me."

Teising finished well in the final mile to push into the top 25.

"I'm really happy with my race," he said. "Throughout the race, I kept hearing them yell out the top 25 places and I knew I was right there."

Seman's personal best helped the Red Devils equal the school's best finish.

"I'm still in shock," he said after the awards ceremony. "My goal was the top 15, but I knew anything could happen."

BOYS CROSS-COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIP

York shocked after Lockport finishes 1st

PEORIA—This was cross-country cruelty, an emotional swing that left a veteran coach stunned and his players in shock.

An unofficial tally at Detweiller Park on Saturday had York winning the Class AA boys state title—and longtime coach Joe Newton stood on a picnic table to declare himself the happiest person on earth as the Dukes runners and fans cheered wildly.

One hour later at the awards ceremony: "I am totally devastated," Newton said.

After a long look by officials, Lockport was the real champion, winning by a blade of grass, 134-135. Wheeling, led by individual winner Jorge Torres, was third at 165.

"Young guys recover from something like this," Newton

said. "But I am old, and old guys just fade away. But I am still so proud of these guys."

At first, his tuxedo-clad players stared at the results sheets in disbelief. But then they rallied, behind teammate and second-place individual finisher Donald Sage, who ran the 3-mile course in 14 minutes 22 seconds, just 7 seconds behind Torres.

"Our team was disappointed after thinking we came in first," Sage said. "But overall I'm happy. Our team ran their hearts out."

Lockport was led by Greg Targosz (12th place, 14:52) and Nick Setta (14th, 14:55). Setta, also the school's record-setting placekicker, drove in Saturday morning after the Porters lost their football playoff game Friday night.

"The fact that Nick is such an outstanding athlete is the only way that we can pull this off,"

said Lockport coach Larry Thompson, who also showed some sympathy for the runners-up. "I felt sorry for the York kids, but on the other side of the coin I was happy for us.

"I told the kids at the park to hold their heads high after we thought York had won. Then when I walked in here and found out we won, I said 'There is a god.'"

Meanwhile, Torres was pushed harder than expected for much of the race, but he roared down the stretch like an Indy car.

"I've been working since June for this," said the Wheeling junior, who won the title last year in 14:29. "I tried to wear those guys out, and that's what I did."

Torres said that this year's title meant a little bit more because of the better time. Next season?

"I would like to break Craig Virgin's double-A record (13:50 in 1972) before I leave high school," he said.

He grinned after hugging his twin brother, Ed, who finished sixth with a time of 14:39.

"For now, I'm going to Disneyland, man. Seriously, I'll keep training for some postseason events, then I'm going home to Mexico over winter break to

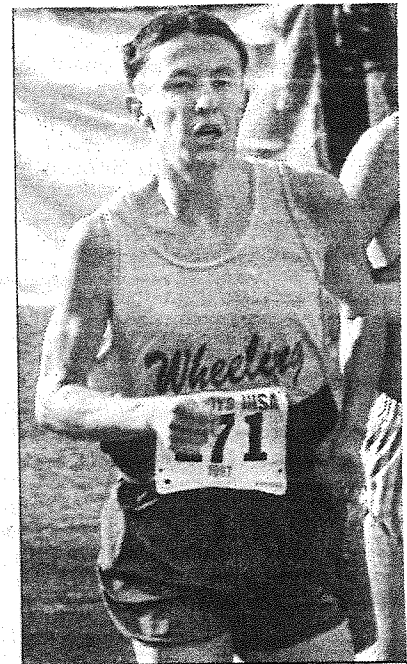

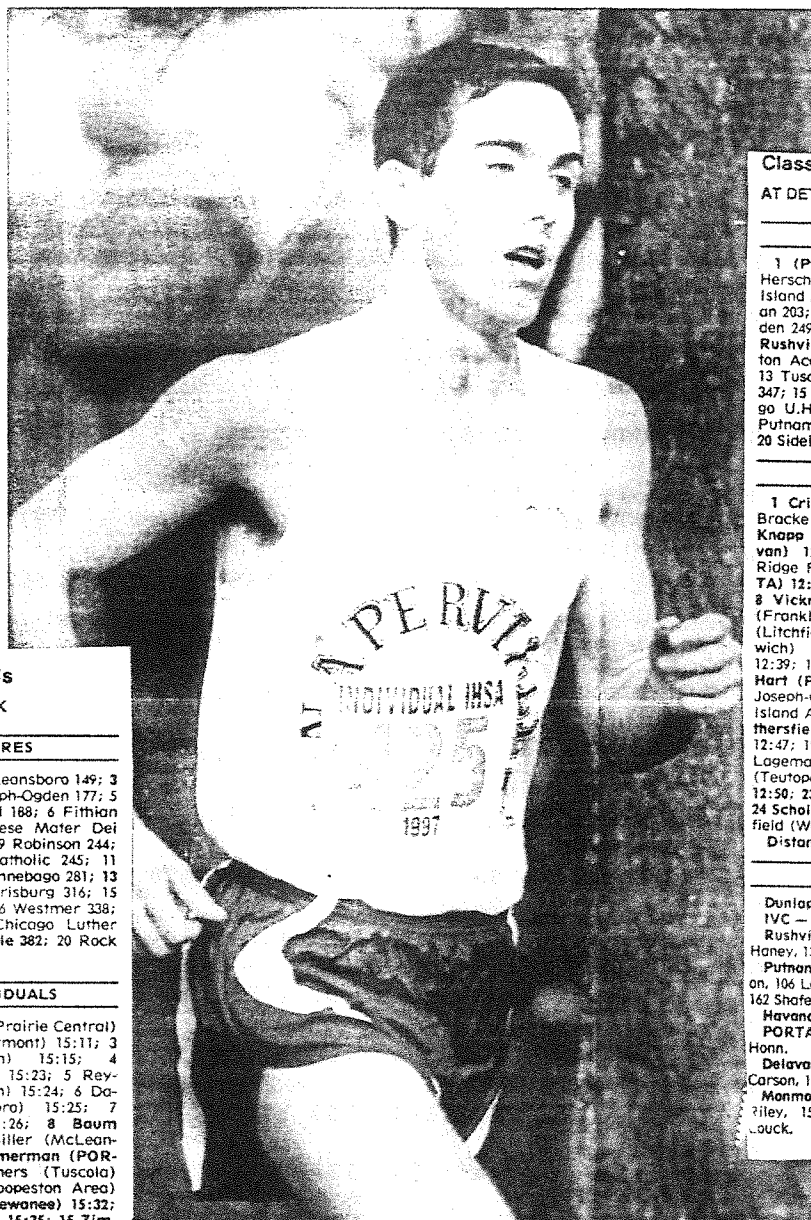
York had won," Thompson said. "I told our guys to be proud of whatever place we received and hold our heads high. I didn't find out we had won until I was walking up the sidewalk."
