# Opening in stride

# Harriers open '98 at 3-0; Lake and Bean earn titles

It was the season opener and the first of three meets in six days. But the J. D. Darnall High School cross country members were going to show what type of season they expect. A winning one.

Both the varsity boys and varsity girls took top honors in the Geneseo Triangular, hosting Kewanee and Rock Falls on Thursday, September 3. LaSalle-Peru, also slated to compete, was forced to forfeit due to the teacher's strike.

Hot, muggy conditions and 91° temperatures prevailed as the harriers took to the Richmond Hill course.

Jenny Lake, true to form, won the girls division and led a pack of four Lady Leafs through the finish gate. Lake completed the 2.5-mile course in 16:42. Lake, a sophomore, was followed by two seniors and then another sophomore. Rhonda Loftus took second with a time of 18:09 while Jill Hinrichs, claiming third, came through at 18:33.

Sophomore Taren Komadina claimed the fourth-place position with a time of 19:16. Komadina was noted last year as a stand-out for the Lady Boilermakers of Kewanee and recently moved to Geneseo and joined the Lady Leafs' squad.

"It was a great season opener," Coach Don Fredericks noted, adding the Lady Leafs earned a 3-0 record with the win.

All total, Geneseo had nine finishers within the top 11 positions.

Alysa Snyder started the next

string of Lady Leafs, coming through at 20:16 for seventh place. Right behind here were Andrea Blondell (20:30), Jann Johnson (20:35), Irene Knapp (20:37) and Nicki Sellon (20:41).

It was a day of group efforts for Geneseo. Four more Lady Leafs were added to the top 20 finishers with Kari Reagin (20:58), Krista Wiedenhoeft (21:00), Mary Terronez (21:08) and Emily Rowlands (21:36)

taking the 14th through 17th positions.

Kim Zigler and Ashley Paulson finished 20th and 21st, respectively with times of 22:39 and 22:44. Jaime Gunnison finished at 24:15 with Megan Irish right next through the gate in 25:25. Kristina Blankenfeld and Rachel Pobanz also took the course for the Lady Leafs.

In the team standings, Geneseo defeated Kewanee 16-44 and Rock Falls 16-50.

Unable to compete for Geneseo were Karen Skelton, Codi Hultman, Erin Schneider and Angie Swagger.

Though Joel Bourque of Kewanee took the overall field in 17:53 for the win, Geneseo packed finishers in the next four positions to take the victory.

Grant Venema led the Leafs, taking the 3.1-mile course in 18:55 for second place overall. He was followed by Chris Studer, 18:55; Andy Beuster, 19:12 and Tim Nelson, 19:13 to round out the top five finishers for the field.

Matt Travis took eighth overall with a time of 19:52 while Chris Cashman claimed the tenth-place slot with a time of 20:06.

Also competing for the Leafs were Josh Fleming, 12th overall, 20:41:

Mike Skelton, 21st, 22:27 and Bobby Ristau, 26th, 24:54.

For the opening meet, the Leafs were without two of its top harriers, Justin Fluck and Mark Keplinger.

"It was a solid season opener," Coach Fredericks stated. "The boys really kicked into gear despite the nasty conditions."

The Leafs, also, sport à 3-0 record, taking Kewanee 16-44 and Rock Falls, 16-50. The forfeit from LP due to the teacher's strike also earns the Leafs a mark in the victory column.

The frosh-soph boys put in their efforts on a 2.5-mile course around Richmond Hill, taking victories from the visiting squads as well. The 15-48 win over Kewanee and 18-42 defeat of Rock Falls, coupled with the LP forfeit, puts the Leafrosh at 3-0 after the opening meet.

Bill Bean put his first win of the season in the books, taking the course in 15:57 for the win. Teammate Brandon Sandoval followed in second at 16:45.

Robert Lund of Rock Falls may have locked up third with a time of 16:48 but it was Geneseo who finished out the top seventh positions.

Kyle Lichthardt took fourth overall in 16:55 followed by Jared Betcher in fifth, 16:58. Josh Franks and Jeremy Heaton rounded out the pack, coming through at 17:17 and 17:32, respectively.

Mark Gleason finished at 13th with a time of 18:34.

Also competing were Phil Mason, 18:55; Mike Stone, 19:00; Brandon Johnson, 19:47 and Adam Kuban, 20:10.

The Leafrosh opened the 1998 campaign without Nathan Ash, Mike Sunstrom or Nathan Thompson.






