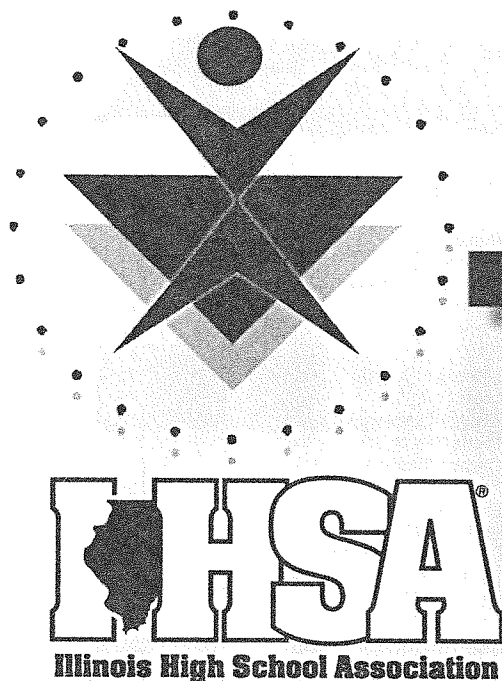

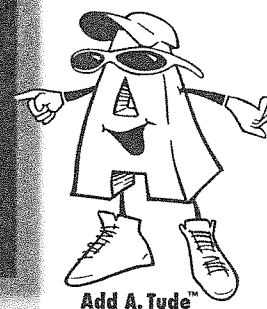

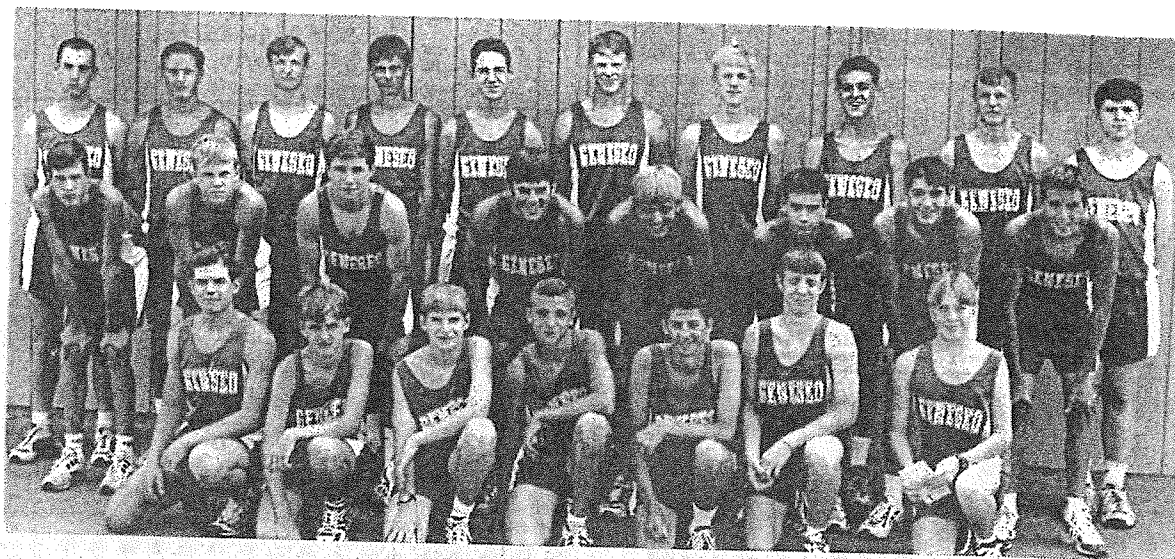

# Q-C area teams gear up for run at state titles

Another week, another meet.

Another big meet, but it's business as usual this week for the boys cross country team at Rock Island and the girls teams at Alleman and Moline.

Those three teams, as well as the sectional champion boys and girls teams at Geneseo and the girls team at Sherrard, will represent the Quad-City region Saturday at the Illinois state championships at Peoria's Detweiller Park.

"The routine remains the same," Alleman coach Mike Ethington said. "It's the week we've been shooting for since the start of the season and everything is starting to fall into place, but you have to keep working just like you would for any other meet."

Rock Island coach Dave Terronez learned that lesson last week when the Rocks turned in a less-than-expected performance in sectional competition at Sterling.

"We changed a few things last week and that wasn't the right thing to do. We're going back to the way we did things the first 10 weeks of the season. We're practicing the way we practiced, we're going to drive down to the meet Saturday morning. Everything will be the same," Terronez said.

The Maple Leafs and Rocks have their eyes on a top-10 finish in the Class AA boys race, while Alleman figures to be in the trophy hunt in the Class A girls race.

With a top five returning intact from a group that finished fifth last year, the third-rated Pioneers are among a group of seven teams that should contend in the 9:30 a.m. race.

Olympia, St. Joseph-Ogden, Sandwich, Robinson, Petersburg-Porta and Woodstock Marian figure to be in the mix with the Pioneers.

"Any one of those seven teams has a chance," Ethington said. "The key for us will be to keep the focus on our strategy, run in a tight-knit pack and hopefully run our best race of the season."

The previous state-best by a Rock Island boys team is 12th place, and Terronez is hopeful that the Rocks can become the first Quad-City area team to crack the AA top 10 since Moline finished fifth in 1993.

"Top 10 is a legitimate goal for this team, but our fourth, fifth, sixth and seventh runners will have to run better than they ran Saturday. I think we saw the importance of that in the sectional and hopefully, we learned from it."

Rock Island's Sean Mendoza, the sectional champion, will be contending for all-state honors.

"We've seen a lot of the front-runners during the course of the season and he can compete with them," Terronez said. "He ran with the guys from Lockport and Naperville Central, who should be two of the top teams, and he competed with some of the other top guys."

Several other Quad-City area entries have similar hopes.

Geneseo is in the midst of one of its strongest seasons and will rank among the top 10 contenders in both the AA girls race at 11:30 a.m. and the AA boys race at 12:45 p.m.

The Moline girls team also is capable of a solid showing in AA as is the Sherrard girls team, led by Jennifer Heitman, in the Class A race.



# Rock Island looking for some redemption

## Both Geneseo contingents look strong

The Rock Island Rocks got a lesson last weekend. This Saturday they'll find out if they learned anything from it.

Geneseo and Rockford Guilford.

Using the sixth man as a tiebreaker, the Rocks were placed third, with the title going to Geneseo and Guilford taking second.

All three teams will be on hand Saturday at Detweiller Park in Peoria for the Class AA State Meet. The boys race will start at 12:45 p.m., following the 11:30 a.m. AA girls race.

"The kids have come back from what happened really focused," said Rock Island coach Dave Terronez, whose team was without No. 5 runner D.J. Waller at sectional after he was suspended for missing practice. "We just did a lot of things wrong last week, both the athletes and me as a coach."

"We changed how we do things in terms of practice — we went out of town to run a couple of times — and I think that put some extra pressure on the kids. Now they seem like they've learned their lesson and are ready to have a good state meet."

Leading the way for the Rocks will be senior Sean Mendoza, who in the last three weeks won the Western Big 6 meet, Galesburg Regional and Sterling Sectional.

A 68th-place finisher at state in 1997, Mendoza has to be considered a contender to place in the all-state top 25 this time around.

"Sean is definitely all-state material," Terronez said. "And we're expecting good races from Boomer Creger, who was seventh at sectional, and Ryan Allen, who was 15th."

"If Sean can be all-state, we can put Boomer and Ryan in the top 50 and if our fourth and fifth guys run like they have all season, we might come away with a top 10 finish."

Despite being plagued with injuries all season, Geneseo earned its

second straight trip to Peoria as it packed all five of its scoring runners at Sterling into the top 61.

Senior Justin Fluck, who was the area's top Class AA individual at state a year ago taking 42nd, but has struggled this season with a foot injury, led the Maple Leafs at sectional, taking 16th. Chris Studer (18th) and Tim Nelson (25th) also cracked the top 25 for Geneseo.

"I am just so proud of these kids for them to not only get back to state, but win the sectional after all they've been through," Geneseo coach Don Fredericks said. "And as for state, our goal down there will be to improve upon our best times of the season."

"We'll also keep an eye on the teams we finished tied with at sectional. If we can go out and beat them again, it would be a way of justifying our winning it and show just how good a team we are."

An eighth-place finisher at state a year ago, Lake should once again secure a spot in the top 10.

She's bolstered by Rhonda Loftus (26th), Andrea Blondell (30th) and Jill Hinrichs (36th), who also finished in the top 40 at Sterling.

"We may not be winning by the margins we did a year ago, but I think overall girls cross country is stronger than it has been the last few years," said Fredericks, whose girls secured their third straight sectional crown at Sterling. "And I really believe this team has yet to run its best race."

"If that comes on Saturday, we might have chance to be in the top 10."

Also competing in the girls race will be Moline, which placed fifth at sectional, and United Township's Beth Brorby.

For Moline, it will be sending out an all-underclassmen lineup, none of whom have ever competed at state before.

"We're looking at this as a great opportunity for the girls to get to see what state is like," Moline coach Jeff Quick said. "We feel that both of the Steffens sisters (junior Breann and freshman Jill) have the potential to be all-state someday as do some of our other girls."

# Too much talent to pick a clear state favorite

## Lake Zurich fails to impress area's best team qualifiers

Either Lake Zurich has been holding back or Steve Pichman made a huge blunder.

After the Schaumburg sectional, Pichman told one newspaper his Lake Zurich team was out to dominate Saturday's Class AA state meet.

At about the same time, after witnessing the power-packed East Aurora sectional, Wheaton North coach Ron Piro shared a very different view of the Bears.

"I don't think Lake Zurich has any idea what has been going on in the western suburbs," Piro said.

Pichman has incited defending champ St. Charles, which shared the No. 2 ranking with the Bears in the last Illinois Prep Top Times poll, No. 1 Naperville North and probably many others.

That likely wasn't wise, because most expect Saturday's 11:30 a.m. race at Peoria's Detweiler Park — the first 2.5-mile final after years of 2.1-mile races — to be extremely close.

"After talking with a few people, I don't see that," Downers Grove North coach Bruce Ritter said of Pichman's prediction.

"St. Charles and Naperville North both have run a much more grueling schedule. I think that's going to help them.

"Lake Zurich has not run any of the five schools in the western suburbs. Obviously, they have a good team. But I really think the race is between Naperville North and St. Charles."

No. 4 York, No. 5 Benet, No. 6 Wheaton North all have a chance to finish in the top three and earn a trophy. Honorable mention Lake Park is the Cinderella team after placing third at Schaumburg.

Naperville North qualified for the eighth consecutive year.

The Huskies' chances of winning its first title since 1993 could depend on how much sophomore Kat Thomas (sore quadriceps) is able to contribute. Thomas, the early-season leader, was Naperville North's No. 7 runner at sectionals.

"Kat has shown improvement daily this week," Naperville North coach Dan Iverson said. "It was brutal to just jump in sectionals. Her efforts to get back I'm sure will rub off and be inspirational whether she's our first runner or our seventh."

At sectionals, Lauren Melnick became the fifth Huskies runner to lead a race. St. Charles' pack was

ahead of Naperville North's but, if healthy, Thomas is capable of keeping pace with the Saints. Senior state veterans Amy Silder and Christy LaFave also should be important factors.

"I'm looking forward to this week and the girls are looking forward to it," Iverson said. "We just hit a few external things we couldn't control, but we still ran a really good race."

Benet and Wheaton North are coming off season-best races.

Benet advanced for the fifth time in six years. The Redwings had a terrific second-place performance from Lissa Vogley, sixth in last year's state meet, and Suji Swaroop led the next four runners in a 20-second split. Senior Chrissy Mayer also was a key.

"We've really been working on coming together," Swaroop said. "We have a strong team unity. We just wanted to go out and get it done."

Wheaton North built on its regional finish to return to state.

Like Vogley, the Falcons' Rachel Endress figures to be solidly among the top 10. The key Saturday was a nine-second split between Valerie Lambrecht and sisters Shannon and Kyle Bugh.

"It was a typical Wheaton North race," Piro said. "We had three or four good performances and a couple of (problems). At the two-mile mark, we were ahead of Naperville North."

"Still, if everyone runs the way they did (at sectionals), we should have a shot at the top five."

York had a sub-par sectional race. The Dukes hope to rebound and win a trophy as they did in 1997.

Senior Celi Williams is coming off a career-best race. Junior Laura Fitzgerald has developed into a solid No. 2.

"I knew Celi would do that well," York coach Larry Bassett said. "We had a couple of kids that didn't run well, but you can't make excuses."

Lake Park placed fifth at regionals with Ebony Oliver and Kendra Trospier nursing minor injuries. The Lancers improved to third at sectionals and earned their first state team appearance since 1982.

Senior Katie Steffen, fifth at sectionals, is running better than she did as a 1995 all-stater. Christy Ehrhardt is one of the area's top freshmen. Bridget Healy dropped 39 seconds from regionals to sectionals.

"We've had other good teams that didn't qualify," Lake Park

coach Harvey Braus said. "It has been very intriguing and exciting. To have a group like this to work with, it has really been a dream season."

Individually, Rebecca Mitchell of Geneva and Katie Hartmann of Woodstock head a short list of title favorites. Vogley, Endress, Williams and Willowbrook's Jenni Goebel could finish in the top 10. Steffen, Kyna Forkins of Glenbard

West and Audrey Giesler of Downers Grove North have all-state (top 25) ability.

"Right now, Hartmann seems to be the favorite," Ritter said. "This meet probably has more depth than we've had in a long time. There are probably 45 kids who have a shot at the 25 spots."

# York top contender in tight team contest

Over the past month, the boys Class AA state race has become increasingly more interesting as the top contenders have stumbled but not fallen.

Last week at sectionals, it was York's turn.

The Dukes, No. 1 in the Illinois Prep Top Times poll and No. 2 in Harrier Magazine's national rankings, remain the favorite to win Saturday's 12:45 p.m. race at Detweiller Park in Peoria — but no longer the prohibitive favorite.

"Don't overlook Lockport, they're state champs two years in a row," Fenton coach John Kurtz said. "Nothing against Naperville Central, but I think York, Wheeling and Lockport are the top three teams.

"I'm for all four of them, but in my heart, I'd give the nod to York."

To win its 20th state title under coach Joe Newton, York needs to regroup from a 7-point East Aurora sectional win over No. 4 Naperville Central. The Dukes won by a slim margin over the Redhawks at the 3-4-5 positions.

Newton's list of title contenders includes No. 2 Wheeling, No. 3 Schaumburg, Naperville Central and No. 5 Naperville North. No. 7 West Chicago and Andrew are darkhorse candidates.

"I think the thing is wide open," he said. "The way we ran (last) Saturday, we gave a lot of people a chance to take heart. Anybody can win it. We're still in the hunt, we haven't lost yet.

"I've told my kids a true champion finds a way to win when it's not at its best."

York's Halloween scare left it as the only unbeaten team. Naperville Central and Wheeling also are consensus contenders.

Each has two strong front-runners and a very solid pack. Before the season, Wheeling seemed to have a decided advantage with two-time champion Jorge Torres and his brother Ed (eighth in 1997).

Naperville Central's Ryan Teising and Andy Janssen and York's Don Sage and Pete Cioni should make it negligible.

"What those top two guys will do is give a little separation," Naperville Central coach George Cyr said. "I think the winning score will be over 100. On paper, it looks really close."

The third through fifth runners should play a large role. If York returns to form, that's where its edge lies. But it's also where Naperville North and West Chicago can gain ground.

The Dukes have potential all-staters in Sage, Cioni and Adam Palumbo. Until sectionals, York's fourth through sixth runners normally are within 15 seconds of Palumbo but were separated by an additional eight seconds Saturday.

"We just have to run the way we were running in early October," Newton said. "We have to have our pack back. If they're all right together, we'll put that score up and see what happens. If we don't, we're in a dogfight."

Naperville Central probably has the deepest team from the top of the lineup through the seventh runner. With No. 4 runner Gary Parquette slowed by a back injury, Andy Welborn, Matt Roefer and Joe Wilkey ran a 12-second split at sectionals.

Welborn, especially, could be a key at state. At his best, all-state (top 25) status is a possibility.

"Andy ran the way he can," Cyr said after sectionals. "After the race, he came up and told me 'Coach, there's more left.'"

In such a tight race, having three all-staters could be a major advantage.

Teising and Janssen are a given.

"Somebody had to win or lose," Janssen said before the sectional outcome was known. "We really proved ourselves today. Either way, that's going to help us do well at state. That's the goal. This was just a qualifying race."

Naperville North coach Dave Racey projects Teising and Janssen in the top six. The Torres brothers, Sage and Fenton's Chris Siemers also are among the elite group in one of the strongest individual fields of recent years.

Other area runners with all-state potential include Brent Pfeiffer and Eric Ott of Naperville North, Tim Keller and Dan Young of West Chicago, Nate Phillips of Wheaton Warrenville South and Todd Quednau of Downers Grove North.

"The top five or six seem to be pretty solid," Racey said. "After that it's a big jumble."

Jorge Torres and Sage figure to battle from the start to the chute for the individual title.

"Torres goes out and does whatever it takes to win," Wheaton North coach Jim Martin said. "Because he knows Sage will want to, he might let him take the lead. That's the advantage of having a lot of different skills.

"The conditions might make it a tactical race, which would favor Torres."

Naperville North's solid front three (Pfeiffer, Ott and Mark Jackson) has made it dangerous all season long. Recently, sophomore Brian Rae has added even more consistency. If twin David Rae is on, the Huskies could compete for one of the three team trophies.

"Everything's up in the air for a lot of teams," Racey said. "For us, it looks pretty good. If David runs within 15 seconds of Brian, we'll do very well. I'm sure four from our sectional will be in the top seven and we could have three in the top five."

West Chicago seems certain to record the school's best finish. The Wildcats were 12th in 1990.

Keller is the only junior in West Chicago's top five. Seniors Wes Skidgel, Rich Belcher, Bart Visser and Young have been on a mission all year.

"We've been out trying to get some respect," Skidgel said. "Over the summer, we decided our goal was to get to state. We've had a couple of guys injured, but we knew we could do it."

## Six of seven Leafs record best times in state competition

Six out of seven J. D. Darnall High School varsity harriers recorded personal bests to earn the Leafs a 23rd place finish at the state Class AA Boys Cross Country meet Saturday, November 7. Twenty-eight teams and a number of individual qualifiers from five sectionals competed at Detweiller Park in Peoria under cool temperatures and light wind conditions.

Leading Geneseo through the three-mile course was Chris Studer who took 101st place overall in 15:46. Prior to the state meet, Studer's best time was 16:16 which he recorded in the Sterling Sectional.

Another Leaf to record a personal best time was Geneseo's second harrier Mark Keplinger. Keplinger took 116th place in the field with his time of 15:52. His previous best for the 1998 season had been 16:45 which he ran in the conference meet in Sterling.

Tim Nelson, the third Geneseo harrier through the gate, claimed 127th place overall with his finishing time of 15:56. As one of the "best six," Nelson had recorded his previous best time of 16:21 at the sectional meet.

Andy Beuster was Geneseo's fourth man at state with a 179th-place state finish. His time in Peoria of 16:23 bettered his mark of 16:54

in the sectional meet just a week before.

Rounding out Geneseo's top five was Grant Venema who took 183rd overall. He covered the three-mile course in 16:25, just two seconds behind Beuster though four place finishes. Venema's best time prior to state was earned at the conference meet when he clocked in at 16:42.

Bobby Ristau also recorded a personal best, taking the state meet in 16:30 for 192nd place overall. He covered the sectional track in 16:58 for his previous best mark. Ristau was also the leg of Geneseo's roster which earned the Leafs first place at the Sterling Sectional Saturday, October 31.

After the regular five-man scoring, the Leafs found themselves in a three-way tie with Rock Island and Rockford Guilford. It was Ristau's time which boosted Geneseo into the title position.

Polishing off Geneseo's roster at the state meet November 7 was Justin Fluck who finished at 212nd with a time of 16:41.

Last year, Fluck paced the Leafs to a 21st-place overall finish at state while taking 42nd place in the meet. Studer was 95th at the 1997 meet which Keplinger finished 171st and Venema, 188th. Beuster and Nelson also competed for Geneseo last year, earning 194th and 209th places, respectively.

Jorge Torres of Wheeling defended his individual title with a time of 14:flat. Torres won last year's event with a time of 14:15.

Donald Sage of Elmhurst-York

took second in 14:16 followed by Edwardo Torres of Wheeling, 14:24; Chris Siemers of Bensenville-Fenton, 14:35 and Andy Janssen of Naperville Central, 14:38.

All but Sage of Elmhurst are seniors while Sage is a junior. Of the top 10 finishers, eight were senior athletes, the other two were juniors.

In the team standings, Wheeling took first with 126 points followed by Elmhurst-York, 131; Schaumburg, 151; Lockport, 171 and Naperville Central, 177.

Naperville North, 186; West Chicago High School, 197; Des Plaines Maine West, 230; Salem, 242 and Tinley Park, 295, round out the top ten team finishers.

Other schools competing and their scores include Chicago Marist, 313; St. Charles, 324; Hoffman Estates - Conant, 349; Evanston, 370; Orland Park - Sandburg, 427; Pontiac, 448; Rock Island, 451; New Lenox Lincoln-Way, 465 and Decatur MacArthur, 513.

Also fielding teams were Centralia, 514; Chicago-Farragut, 529; Springfield High, 531; Geneseo, 539; Rockford Guilford, 553; Chatham Glenwood, 579; Chicago Kennedy, 589; Rockford Jefferson, 635 and Mt. Vernon, 686.

# Rocky's Mendoza relives his dream

PEORIA — Dreams do come true.

At least, this one did for Rock Island's Sean Mendoza.

On Saturday, it happened as Mendoza wrapped up his prep harrier career with an all-state 16th-place finish in the boys race at the Class AA State Cross Country meet at Detweiller Park.

"I don't really remember the dream," said Mendoza, who ran the 3 miles in 14:57. "I just remember getting the medal. It's pretty cool that it happened."

Mendoza's effort helped the Rocks to a 17th-place finish in the team standings.

Not quite as high as they would have liked, but coach Dave Terronez was pleased nevertheless.

"I think the kids are pretty happy with how things went," he said. "The last couple of years, we came down here and didn't run quite as well as we had hoped."

"I'm not sure where we finished as a team, but I can pretty much say all my kids gave everything they had. Plus, having an all-stater on your team can make up for a lot of things."

Mendoza ran a tactically smart race not getting caught up with the war being waged at the front between two-time defending champ Jorge Torres of Wheeling and (Elmhurst) York's Donald Sage — Torres would win in 14:00 — being content to run his own race.

"That could not have been an easy race for Sean," Terronez said. "You'd probably have to go back a long ways to find a race where he was not right up there at the front almost the whole way."

"But he didn't worry about what was going on in front of

him and just ran his own race against the people around him. He knew where he was and what he had to do to get all-state."

Ryan Allen and Boomer Creger were the next two finishers for the Rocks, both clocking a 15:59 for 133rd and 134th, respectively.

The Rocks finished with 451 points for 17th. Wheeling, which got a first from Jorge Torres and third from twin brother Edwar-

do, edged out York for the title, 131-151.

The best finish Geneseo could muster was a 101st from Chris Studer (15:46) on its way to placing 23rd (539 points). Mark Keplinger (116th, 15:52) and Tim Nelson (127th, 15:56) were the next two finishers for the Maple Leafs.

"I thought our boys put forth a tremendous effort," Geneseo coach Don Fredericks said. "Our teams goals were certainly higher, but of our seven runners six of them ran personal-bests and that's all you can ask."

An eighth-place finisher as a freshman, Geneseo sophomore Jenny Lake struggled throughout the race sitting in 16th after the first half mile, before dropping back to 36th and eventually 68th.

"This was probably my worst race," said Lake, who ran the 2.5 miles in 15:29. "It just was not my day. I don't know. The harder I tried, the worse it got."

"It was just very difficult. I'm just glad I have two years left."

Jill Hinrichs (134th, 16:08) and Rhonda Loftus (135th, 16:09) were the next two finishers for the Leafs, who finished with 504 points.

"We had five girls run significant personal-bests for Detweiller today, several of them by 30 seconds or more," Fredericks said. "But while we did have a number of people run well, we are disappointed in how we came out from a team standpoint in both races."

"There was a lot of emotion out there today for our girls, a lot of tears. They accomplished a lot together."

For Moline, BreAnn Steffens (100th, 15:47) and Jill Steffens (109th, 15:55) once again set the pace for the Maroons. Kayti Bouljon (172nd, 16:41) was the next Moline finisher.

"I think our girls did about as well as they could for it being the first time down for all of them," said Moline coach Jeff Quick, whose team totaled 598 points. "The pace that lead group of girls set was incredible and it took a toll on everyone in the race."

"No one expected us to get down here, but we did and this is an experience we can build on for next year."

The Class AA girls team title went to St. Charles with 83 points. (Springfield) Sacred Heart Griffin's Ann Gaffigan ran a 14:03 to take individual honors.

United Township's Beth Brorby ran a 16:01 to place 22nd.



# Wheeling runner takes third title

## ■ Rocks' Mendoza finishes 16th

PEORIA, Ill. — History was repeated and also resoundingly rewritten Saturday afternoon in the Illinois Class AA boys cross country state meet at Detweiller Park.

Wheeling senior Jorge Torres, who captured first-place boys AA honors in 1996 and 1997, became the first person to claim three state titles when he crossed the finish line in 14 minutes.

Torres' phenomenal finish was 3.4 seconds shy of the all-time boys AA record and enabled Wheeling to better top-ranked Elmhurst (York) by five points — 126 to 131 — for the team trophy.

"A fast pace was established at the start, and fortunately for me, I felt good enough to break away toward the end," Torres said. "The fact our team won is the best part of this, though."

Another key contributor for second-seeded Wheeling was

Jorge's brother, Edwardo, who finished in third place in 14:24.

Finishing 17th in the team standings with a score of 451 was Rock Island. Balance helped the Rocks post a better mark than 11 other squads, as five Rock Island runners were positioned between 133rd and 168th.

"I'm very happy with our performance today because we demonstrated a real progression and growth from last year," Rock Island coach Dave Terronez said. "Our runners really put their hearts on the line for this meet."

Setting a swift standard for the Rocks and placing 16th in a field comprised of 234 competitors was senior Sean Mendoza, who completed the inclined, three-mile course in 14:57 and made significant strides from last year, when he failed to finish in the top 60.

"I just couldn't be happier with the way things went," Mendoza said. "My whole goal this year has been a top-25 finish at state. Now that it has happened, it's like a dream come true."

"I ran the first mile slower than normal so I would have a little more energy left at the end," Gaffigan said. "Last year I finished ninth and had very little energy at the end."

Gaffigan's heroics weren't enough, however, to stop St. Charles from seizing the team title with 83 points.

Competing in a 27-team field, Moline ended the grueling race in 24th place. Led by junior Breanne Steffens, who finished 100th, the Maroons had 598 points.

"I'm happy with the way things went," Steffens said. "In the future, I don't want to start out as fast and be as tired toward the end."

Also putting forth a strong showing for Moline was freshman Jill Steffens, who was 109th among 225 runners.

"Our runners were somewhat nervous today," Moline coach Jeff Quick said. "But we have a young team that will only get better."

## Alleman girls finish 6th

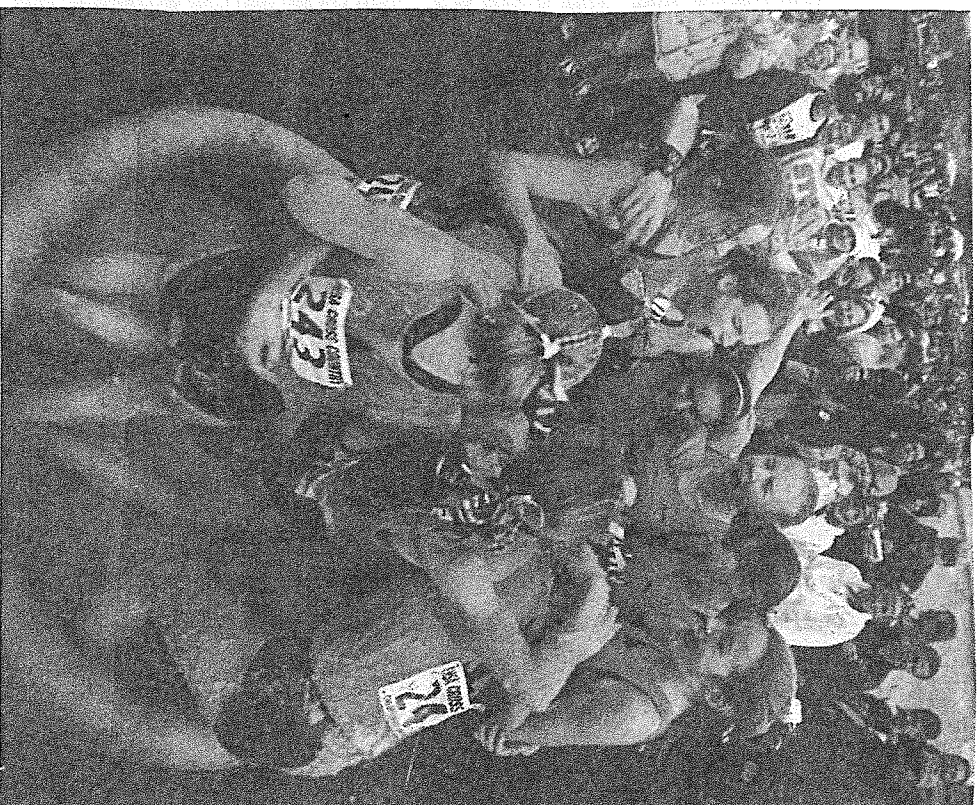

In a time of 14:03 over 2.5 miles, Gaffigan won the girls Class AA cross country state-final race at Detweiler Park.

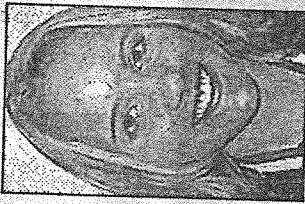

# Wheeling senior shows bit of past in present

**S**o many years had passed since an Illinois high school runner challenged the 14-minute barrier for three miles, you had to wonder what went wrong.

Craig Virgin had an idea. "I knew coming up what it took to be great," Virgin said Saturday, as he awaited the start of the Class AA boys cross country state meet at Detweiler Park. "I don't know if the kids today have the same expecta-

tions and role models who exhibit the commitment."

Virgin had great expectations. He demanded the extraordinary of himself, overcoming bad kidneys and other physical ailments

to become a racing icon. He had a role model, Dave Merrick of New Lenox Lincoln-Way, arguably the top schoolboy runner in the nation when Virgin was a freshman and sophomore at Lebanon.

Virgin committed himself to be unbeatable, and he was. He won the state championship in 1971 and '72. As a senior on the track, he broke the national prep record for two miles. He became an NCAA champion at the University of Illinois and a U.S. Olympian in 1976 and '80. It was the golden age for distance running in Illinois.

As a junior at Lebanon, Virgin ran 13:59 at the cross country state meet. A year later, he cruised to a 13:50, still the course record. In the next five years, Dave Walters of Lincoln-

Park Sandburg also broke 14 minutes, and others came close. Future Olympian Jim Spivey of Bensenville Fenton, in fact, ran 14-flat in 1977 and didn't even win, trailing Graves to the finish chute by four seconds.

But until Saturday, nobody had touched 14:00 since. "I wouldn't know about that," Jorge Torres of Wheeling said after winning the AA boys state championship Saturday. "I wasn't even born yet."

Torres was a big reason Virgin was in town for the race. He had seen Torres race and admitted his guts. Something told Virgin that Torres has the expectations, the commitment, even if he has had to be his own running role model.

As state medals go, Torres is

a freshman, he finished his high school cross country career as the only three-time boys winner in Illinois history.

He commands the respect of his opponents. No, that's not right. He elicits awe.

When Torres won his first state title, in 1996, senior Jesse Barnes of Batavia was so honored to be runner-up to the Wheeling sophomore that he nearly dropped to his knees and kissed the ground at Torres' feet. He is that rare high school athlete whose beaten rivals request his autograph.

Jorge and his twin brother, Edwardo, have the sweetest identical smiles you'll ever see on a pair of 18-year-old boys. They like to talk and joke and laugh. They love to run.

Jorge calls it "a hunger to be at the top."

That's what Virgin could sense. It's what Wheeling coach Mark Saylor had learned in four years coaching Torres. It's what Edwardo has known all their lives.

Edwardo finished third Saturday. Nobody pushed him the final half of the race, and he had the best view in the park of the battle between his brother and Elmhurst York's Donald Sage. He knew it was only a matter of time before Jorge took Sage apart.

Sage knew it, too, although he fought vigorously to fend off the inevitable. Eight times, Jorge Torres tried to shake him with hard, prolonged sprints. Seven times, Sage stuck right on his shoulder.

"Like glue," Jorge said.

But from behind, as they neared the final 1,000 yards, Edwardo could see Sage's head start to bob ever so slightly. Jorge caught the bob from the corner of his eye. This time, when he sprinted, Sage was spent.

The only drama left was Jorge's assault on 14 minutes. With 150 yards to go, he could see the finish-line clock ticking past 13:40. He sprinted. He could have sworn that it was turning to 13:59 as he passed beneath, but his official time was recorded at 14:00.

Best since 1977. Tied for fifth all-time.

"He's right up there with Virgin and all of the best," said York coach Joe Newton. "He's a class act."

"I'll take it," Jorge Torres said.

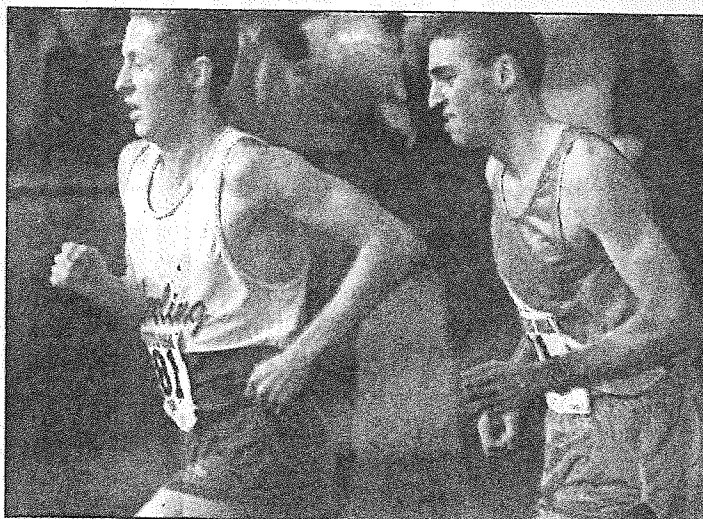
# Torres hits trifecta

PEORIA—The runners hadn't even approached the mile mark, but it was apparent Jorge Torres was in command.

His lead was minuscule over the runner on his left and the one on his right, but his position among the leaders—front and center—foreshadowed the remainder of Saturday's Class AA State Cross-Country Championships at Peoria's Detweiller Park.

The Wheeling senior pulled away from the field without looking back, but if he had turned to check for his nearest competitor, the search would have been long. No one was close as Torres won a boys state-record third championship in 14 minutes,

the fastest state-meet time for 3 miles since Fenton's Jim Spivey ran the identical time in 1977.

"It's something I've been

dreaming about since I won the first one, to be the first guy to win three state titles in Illinois," Torres said. His satisfaction turned into jubila-

tion when he found out his team won its first boys state title in cross country with 126 points to York's 131 and Schaumburg's 151.

"I wanted to go out with the team winning the title," Torres said. "These guys mean a lot to me. They're like my brothers."

In fact, one teammate is his brother. Ed Torres, Jorge's twin, finished third behind York's Donald Sage, the state runner-up for the second straight year. He finished 16 seconds behind Jorge Torres.

"I'm thrilled I got third," Ed Torres said. "I figured if Jorge and me could go 1-2, we could help the team out so much. But I'm satisfied."

Wheeling sophomore Frank Velasquez, who finished 37th, viewed the team champion-

ship as a gift to the Torres brothers.

"I did this for them," Velasquez said. "They deserved it. They wanted it so bad, I could tell. I wanted them to go out with a bang."

York, meanwhile, continued its longest state championship drought since the mid-1970s. The Dukes haven't won since 1994.

"I'm sad," said York coach Joe Newton, who has one chance left to win his 20th state title before he retires in June 2000. "I'm totally exhausted. But life goes on. I will tell the guys that if this is the

worst thing that happens to you in your life, you'll be very lucky."

Sage shared Newton's letdown.

"I'm disappointed, but we ran our best and we have nothing to be ashamed of," Sage said.

The only downer for Jorge Torres was that he didn't break the state record of 13:50.6 set by Lebanon's Craig Virgin in 1972.

"Some records aren't meant to be broken, and I guess Virgin's record is one that is way out there," said Torres.

The Torres brothers were celebrating their championships with teammates and family. Their parents and three brothers together watched Jorge and Ed race for the first time.

"I get tears from my family

being out here," said Jorge Torres, who swallowed hard to fight his emotions.

But if their family is willing to make road trips, there will be more opportunities to watch the twins run. Jorge and Ed announced they will attend Colorado together next year.

"We work great together," Jorge Torres said. "We're great brothers, and he's my best friend."

And on Saturday, both were champions.

# Only seconds separate top area performers

The time it takes to make a surge in cross country — your basic New York second — was all that separated the best teams and runners in the Class AA boys championship.

Wheeling's Jorge Torres surged past York's Donald Sage at a crucial time in the third mile in Peoria's Detweiller Park. The maneuver clinched Torres' third state title. The senior won in 14:00, 16 seconds ahead of Sage.

"He was surging throughout the whole race and I was countering them all," said Sage, who also was second last year, trailing by just 7 seconds. "With about a half-mile, he put a move on and I was beat. I was really pretty tired."

Torres' twin brother, Ed, posted a career-best third-place finish (14:24), helping the Wildcats overtake York 126-131 for the team title. The Dukes' Pete Cioni was one of eight area all-staters, placing 22nd (15:00).

Six of York's seven runners improved their times from the Peoria Invitational in October, which was run on the same course.

"I'm very proud of Don Sage," Dukes coach Joe Newton said. "Our 4-5-6 (runners) came through."

Sage improved his 1997 time by 6 seconds on the 3-mile course, but Torres was 15 seconds faster.

"Individually and teamwise, I think we did our best," Sage said, "but (Wheeling) was just a little bit better."

Fenton senior Chris Siemers had a career-best state finish, placing fourth in 14:35. Siemers stayed back while the leaders set a blistering first-mile pace, then held off Naperville Central's Andy Janssen (14:38) and Ryan Teising (14:41) down the stretch.

"I don't think, right now, I have the speed and strength to match the top

three guys," Siemers said. "I knew guys were going to be coming after me. I pretty much ran the last mile by myself."

The duo led Naperville Central to fifth place (177), as four area teams placed in the top seven. Naperville North took sixth (186) and West Chicago seventh (197).

"Not many teams can lose their fourth and fifth runners at the start of the year and overcome it," Red-

hawks coach George Cyr said. "It doesn't matter what place we had, we ran very well."

Andy Welhorn supported the Red-hawks' all-time best 1-2 punch with a 53rd place finish.

"Some of the best runners we've had finished in the 50s," Janssen said. "He didn't get to run at full strength. If I were him, I'd be really happy."

Naperville North was led all-staters Brent Pfeiffer (13th, 14:55) and Eric Ott (21st, 14:59).

"I wanted to pick off all these people," Pfeiffer said. "One-by-one I worked my way up until I was even with Janssen. Then he made and I wish I had gone with him."

"Eric kept pushing me. Brian (Rae) would have ran a lot better if he hadn't lost his shoe."

Rae finished 41st despite losing a shoe in the first mile for the over-achieving Huskies.

"These kids did a great job," Naperville North coach Dave Racey said. "Nobody gave them much respect before the season, and deservedly so, but they worked as a team. I'm proud of them."

West Chicago also was underrated most of the year. The Wildcats equalled its highest ranking and established an all-time state best by taking seventh.

"We got a little respect in the coaches' poll," West Chicago coach Paul McLeland said, "and we proved today we deserved it. We ran really

well. But we had 18 seconds between our third and fourth. In those 18 seconds, 34 runners came in."

The Wildcats' top three formed a tight pack. Dan Young was 31st (15:13), Tim Keller 34th (15:14) and Wes Skidgel 38th (15:16).

"We had a great year," Young said. "We went after it. This was a tough meet and I'd like to think we were one of the teams that made it tough."

Wheaton Warrenville South senior Nate Phillips missed two days of school this week because of illness, but earned all-state status by plac-

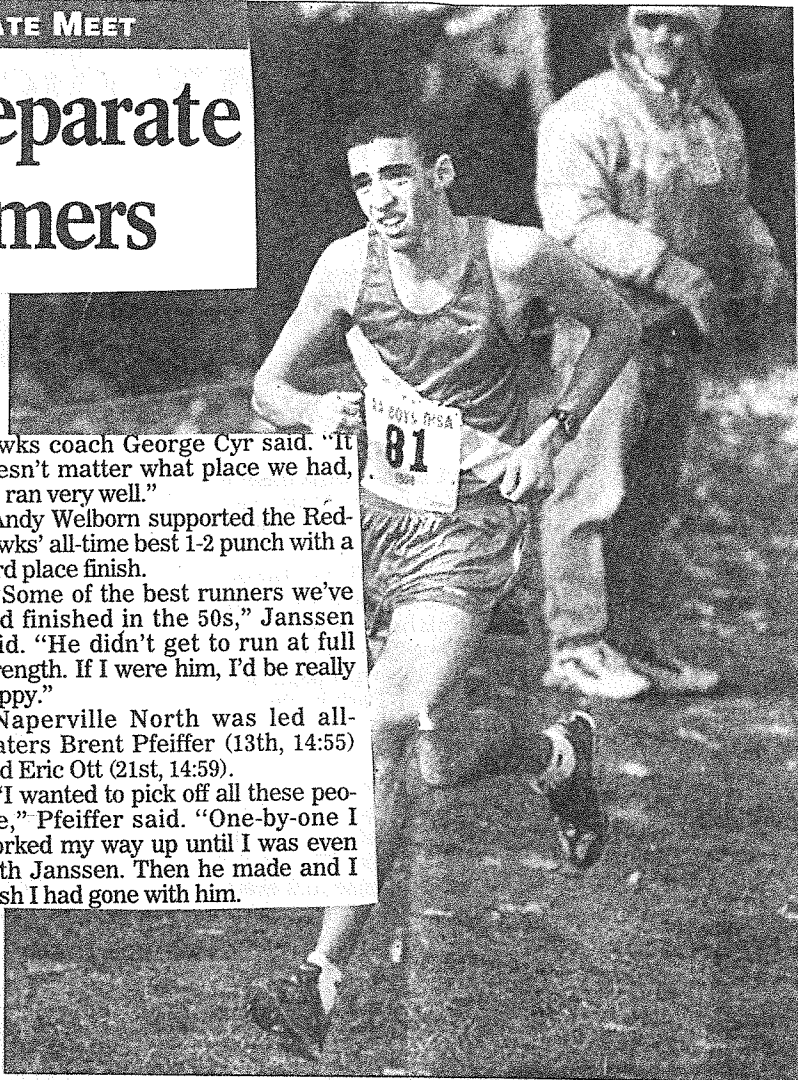
ing 24th (15:02).

"Now I have something to tell the Notre Dame coach when he calls Tuesday," Phillips said.

"I was 36th at the mile. (Schaumburg's) Curtis Judice and I pushed each other. He's a great competitor."

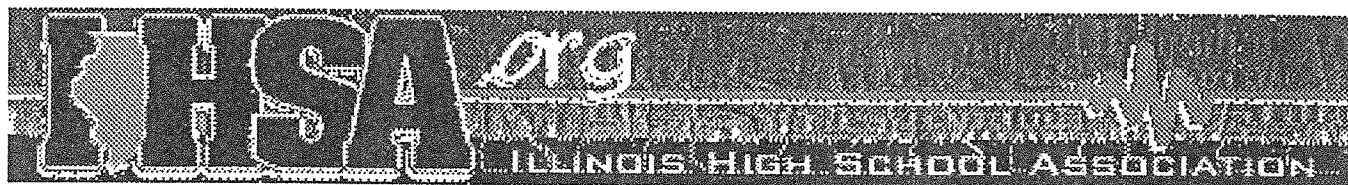
