

Extra miles pay off for Rocks

The Rock Island girls cross country has certainly learned that going that extra mile — actually, a lot of extra miles — can carry you a long ways.

A fourth-place finish in last year's Western Big Six Conference cross country team was not something which sat well with the Rocks.

They knew they were capable of much better and wanted to do something about it.

"I remember how good it felt when we won conference as a freshman," said Melanie Round, a senior and the Rocks No. 1 runner, "and me and the other seniors wanted to do everything we could to help us get back to that level."

"We were able to get the underclassmen to believe in what we wanted to do. We all pretty much put our heart and soul into running."

Beginning with winter workouts, through the track season and finally a grueling summer schedule later, the Rocks put in mile after mile as they attempted to improve their speed and stamina.

Once the season started, the benefits were immediate as they won their opening quadrangular with Moline, Galesburg and Alleman. The Rocks really have not slowed since, claiming the WB6 title by a 15-point margin over Moline last Friday in Galesburg.

"I don't know if I've ever seen anyone as determined as these girls were during their workouts this summer," first-year Rocks coach

Michelle Menke said. "In their minds, they were going to be conference champs, no doubt about it."

While Round has been Rock Island's No. 1 runner in almost every race, it's the depth behind her which has helped the Rocks move to the next level.

At the WB6 meet, they placed all five of their scoring runners in the top 10 and had a gap of 2 minutes and 2 seconds between their first and seventh runners.

"I don't think I've ever been around a team that is this cohesive," Menke said. "It's real easy in cross country for a runner to get caught up in the individual part of the sport and forget about the team."

"But these girls work together, and if one of them is feeling like they just don't have it on a certain day, they'll encourage their team-

mates to go on without them to help the team."

Another thing those extra miles has done is help the Rocks break through barriers they previously would have shied away from because it has made them stronger — not only physically, but mentally.

Case in point, the Rocks' Emily Marquis not only ran ahead of Mo-

line's Jill Steffens at the WB6 meet, but beat her by 31 seconds, finishing in front of her (third to Steffens' fourth) for the first time in her career.



"Last year, it was tough for me to run the whole 2.5 miles so I almost never went out hard," Marquis said. "But it didn't take me long this year to see I could go out hard and not have to worry about dying at the end."

"And I think that's true for almost all of us. We're all a lot more confident in our abilities this year, because we worked so hard to be ready for the season."

The next step for the Rocks is today's IHSA Rochelle Class AA Regional at Kishwaukee Country Club in Malta.

A year ago, the Rocks failed to advance out of regional as a team — which makes that the top priority.

To win the regional would just be a bonus.

"We'd like to win, but it's going to be close between us, Moline and Geneseo," Round said. "But I think we can do it."

"We've been proving people wrong all year and we'd like to keep on doing it all the way to state."

■ **Leafs domination continues:** This was supposed to be the year that the Geneseo Maple Leafs came back to the rest of the NCIC.

But when last Saturday's races in Princeton were over, once again it was the green-and-white which was reigning over both the boys and girls division.

The Maple Leaf boys collected their third straight title by a 32-point margin over Rochelle, while on the girls side, with junior Jenny Lake running for the first time this fall, Geneseo earned its fourth consecutive crown with a 10-point win over Dixon.

"This was supposed to be the year, where a lot of people thought we might get beat in both races," said Geneseo coach Don Fredericks. "But these kids, both the boys and girls, really pulled together and overcame a lot this year because they wanted to keep the tradition going."

Hampered with a yet-to-be completely diagnosed leg injury all season, Lake didn't win her third straight NCIC individual title but she did place third which probably turned out to be the difference in the Leafs placing first instead of third.

In the boys race, it was the pack which was the key for the Leafs as led by a second-place finish from Tim Nelson, they packed all five of their scoring runners into the top 11.

honors should be tight between NCIC and defending regional champ (Geneseo), WB6 winner (Rock Island) and a Moline team that returns the nucleus of a group which reached state last year. ...With Jenny Lake in the lineup for the first time this season, Geneseo won its fourth straight NCIC title. The junior placed third as the Maple

Leafs took the title by 10 points over Dixon.

"...Despite not having an overpowering frontrunner, Rock Island continued to prove its solid season is no fluke with its 15-point win over Moline at WB6. The Rocks placed five runners in the top 10 in that race. ...Led by WB6 individual winner Beth Brorby, UT will likely have to fight its way past Dixon and Sterling to earn one of the team berths. ...Individually, Brorby figures to be a pre-race favorite along with Moline's Breanne Steffens and NCIC winner Andi Clinardi of LaSalle-Peru.

■ **What to watch for:** An interesting battle for top team honors should emerge between the champions of the Western Big 6 (Moline) and North Central Illinois Conference (Geneseo). The two teams have not been in the same field since the Peoria Notre Dame Invitational, back on Sept. 18, where the Maple Leafs were 13th and the Maroons 18th. ...After the top two teams, Rock Island and Rochelle look to be the best out of the rest of the field. With Boomer Creger showing signs of

being over a knee injury, the Rocks should be a better team than they were at the WB6 meet. ...UT and Dixon both should contend for the final qualifying spot. ...Individually, WB6 champ Ben Shumaker (Moline) looks to be the runner to beat, but Rochelle's Phil Ginn (the NCIC individual champ) and Paul Bergeson both will be tough on their home course. Creger also can't be counted out of that equation.

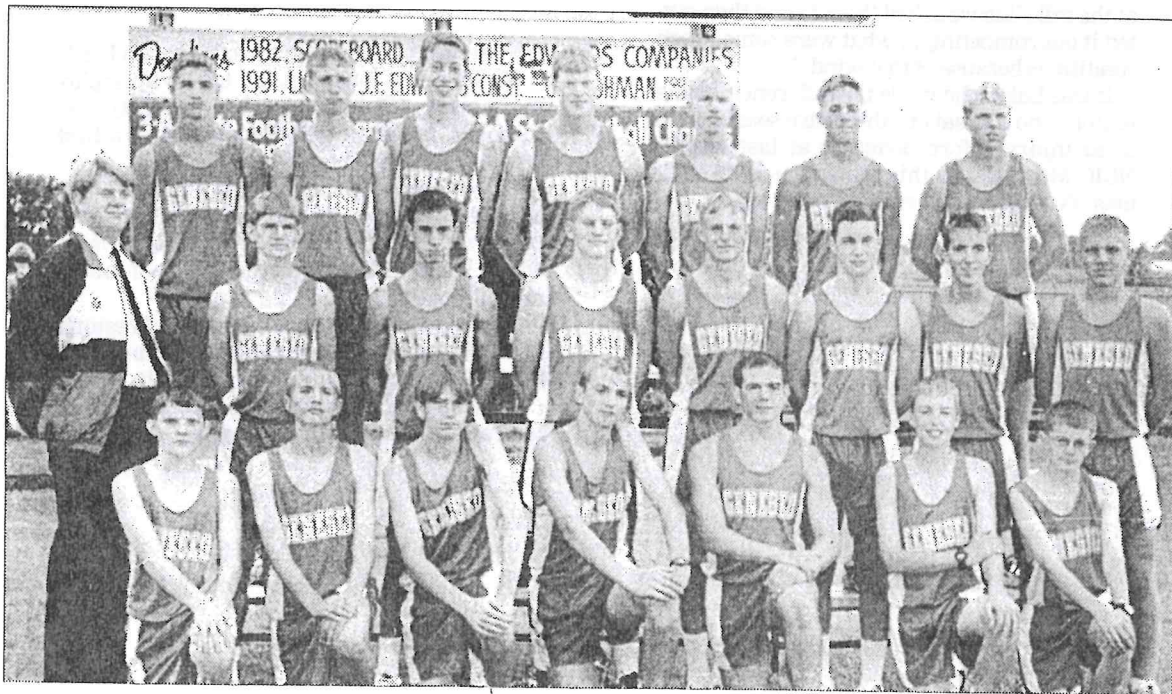

Maple Leafs conquer the field in 'complete upset'

MALTA — If it's the postseason, then it must be time for the Geneseo Maple Leafs girls cross country team to shine.

With junior standout Jenny Lake in the lineup for just the second time this season, the Maple Leafs reeled off a fourth consecutive Class AA regional title by a 53-64 margin over runner-up Sterling at Kishwaukee College.

The victory earns the Maple Leafs a berth at next week's Sterling Sectional, where they'll be joined by Moline (third, 86 points) and Rock Island (fourth, 93).

"This is a complete upset," said Geneseo coach Don Fredericks. "Two weeks ago, a lot

of people were wondering if we were ever going to get out of the regional, let alone have a chance to win it.

"It's a credit to our kids. They went out there and ran a smart race, made their move at the mile like we asked them to and then gutted it out competing in what were some tough conditions because of that wind."

It was Lake who made the difference, as the junior, who had sat out the entire season with a leg injury before debuting at last week's NCIC Meet, placed third in a time of 15 minutes, 23.06 seconds over the 2.35-mile race.

Joining her in the top 10 were freshman teammate Emily Alden (6th, 15:25.77) and Andrea Blondell (7th, 15:26.10). All five of Geneseo's scoring runners were in the top 19.

"What a gutty effort by Jenny," Fredericks said. "Once the doctor gave her the OK she's been there for us and done an outstanding job."

Individual honors went to UT's Beth Brorby, who picked up the pace a mile into the race and won rather easily in 15:11.16, over 10 seconds better than runner-up Breanne Steffens of Moline (15:21.27).

"I really didn't go out trying to win," said the UT junior. "I knew Jenny was going to be here, and although she's been hurt, she's still

a great runner and I wanted to stay with her."

Steffens was joined in the top 10 by sophomore sister Jill Steffens (10th, 15:38.24). The Maroons, however, were hampered by a first five that stretched back to 28th.

"I thought we ran fairly well," Breann Steffens said. "We were running without our third runner today. She'll be back next week, which should help us a lot in terms of lowering our points."

Saturday was disappointing for Western Big 6 champ Rock Island. Melanie Round (8th, 15:26.38) was the only Rock in the top 10.

UT's Jessica Wright placed 21st (16:12.24) to earn an individual sectional berth.

Lady Leaf harriers set another mark

Raising the stakes, the J. D. Darnall High School varsity girls cross country team has won a third consecutive Regional crown.

Cross country has developed a rich history at Geneseo High School, setting high standards for future teams.

The 1999 Lady Leafs have attained a number of those goals and set new expectations along the way.

Despite running the majority of the season without noted stand-out junior Jenny Lake, the varsity girls still hung in there for the entire season, keeping close with the top teams of the conference and the area.

Just last week, the Lady Leafs earned their fourth-straight NCIC title at the conference meet in Princeton on Saturday, October 16.

A week later, the Lady Leaf harriers claimed a third consecutive Regional crown.

Regional competition was held Saturday, October 23 at Kishwaukee College near Rochelle.

The victory advances the varsity contingent into Sectional competition on Saturday, October 30 in Sterling.

"We encourage everyone to come watch," stated Coach Fredericks, explaining the gun fires for the girls' race at 10:30 a.m. with the boys following at 11:15 a.m.

"They can still zip back and support the football team," he added.

"We'd really appreciate the support so tell every one to come to Woodlawn in Sterling," he added.

Four Regionals form the Sterling Sectional upping Geneseo's competition to 20 teams.

The top five teams and the top seven individuals not members of those teams advance to state competition which will take place at Detweiller Park in Peoria on Saturday, November 6.

Coach Fredericks noted the girls' win at the Regional meet was considered an upset.

"Rock Island and Moline were

avored on the girls side of the meet with Sterling and Dixon who had the potential to put us in fifth.

"Add United Township in there and it became possible that we might end up sixth and out of qualification," explained Coach Fredericks.

"Two weeks ago, many of these teams would not have expected us to even qualify let alone win the Regional," boasted the harrier coach.

Coach Fredericks admits the star runner Lake has played a big part in Geneseo's peaking at this time.

"She's far from 100 percent," he noted. "But she is still a huge factor.

"The rest of the team has really stepped it up as well and increased their performance level.

"It's very exciting," he added. "So many of the girls are having great performances.

Coach Fredericks explained within the last 150 meters of the competition senior Captain Andrea Blondell and freshman stand-out Emily Alden pulled up along side and actually passed Lake.

"That's the first time that's happened to her," explained the Lady Leafs' coach. "Though it was exciting to see her teammates running so well, Jenny admitted it helped her.

"She responded by passing them back and even took a couple of others along the way," recalled the coach.

"It was most definitely a team effort," Coach Fredericks stressed. "These kids not only overcame their opponents but they also fought wind chills in the low 20s to earn this well-deserved victory."

This is the first time in school history that both the Leafs and lady Leafs have won Regionals in the same year.

"It's neat to think we can't say that any more," admitted Coach Fredericks. "these kids have set yet another first for GHS."

Last year was only the third time in school history both the boys and girls cross country teams qualified for state in the same year.

In the team standings, the Lady Leafs earned 53 points for the win followed by NCIC foe Sterling in second at 64. Rounding out the top five teams which advance to Section-

al are Moline, 86 points; Rock Island, 93 and Dixon, 129.

Other teams in the Regional were United Township of East Moline, 135 points; LaSalle-Peru, 157; Rochelle, 177 and Galesburg, 251.

Beth Brorby of United Township, a junior, won the overall competition, taking the 2.35-mile Kishwaukee College course in 15:11.16.

She is one of five individual qualifiers for the Sectional meet. Also advancing are Andi Clinard of L-P, Sarah Bailey, Rochelle; Stacey Gualandi, L-P and Jessica Wright, United Township.

Lake, though still recovering from a leg injury, topped the Lady Leafs' field by taking third overall in 15:23.08. She finished behind senior runner Breanne Steffens of Moline who clocked through at 15:21.27.

Rounding out the top five individuals for the field were two Sterling juniors, Jill Norman at 15:23.74 and Rachel Van Holten, 15:24.13.

Geneseo's next two finishers packed up sixth and seventh places. Alden took the lead through the gate with a time of 15:25.77 followed by Blondell in 15:26.10.

The next two Lady Leafs crossing the line gave a one-two punch at 18th and 19th positions to end in the top 20 for the field.

Alysa Snyder took the lead, finishing in 16:07.85.

Jann Johnson followed her lead by taking 19th overall with a time of 16:11.36 to complete the Geneseo scoring.

Also competing for the Lady Leafs were Emily Rowlands and Krista Wiedenhoef. Rowlands stopped the clock at 16:41.85 for 37th overall while Wiedenhoef was clocked at 17:08.65 for 43rd place.

Snyder is a senior on this year's roster while Rowlands, Johnson and Wiedenhoef are sophomores.

To date, Geneseo's varsity girls cross country team has claimed nine regional titles (1984, '85, '86, '87, '88, '92, '97, '98 and 1999.) The first four were in Class A action while the final crowns were done under the Class AA banner.

The Lady Leafs have six Sectional crowns, earning the honor in 1984, '85, '87, '96, '97 and '98.

Geneseo boys edge Maroons for championship

MALTA — On a morning where the wind was howling, it seemed only fitting that the Geneseo Maple Leafs blew past the field at Saturday's IHSA Rochelle Class AA Regional Cross Country Meet.

Coach Don Fredericks' Leafs placed all five of their scoring runners between fifth and 15th — encompassing a time gap of just 41 seconds — as they edged runner-up Moline 48-56 to lead the five team qualifiers for next Saturday's Sterling Sectional. Rock Island (third, 78 points) and United Township (fifth, 119) also earned team tickets for Sterling.

"We knew that Moline had been running

and they would not let them out of their sights.

"Fortunately, our guys were able to finish strong, pass a couple of Moline guys, and get us the title."

Moline senior Ben Shumaker earned individual honors, but it did not come easy as he chased Rochelle's Phil Ginn and David Berge-son before surging past them with about a half mile remaining.

"Actually, it was nice to have them in front of me because they cut off some of the wind," said Shumaker, who finished in 15:25. "When I passed them, one of them fell and spiked me, but I didn't let that bother me."

The Maroons' Drew Patterson ran a 15:34 for third place, but their next two finishers were

well the last couple of weeks," said Geneseo's Tim Nelson. "We knew it was important to keep a tight pack because Moline had two really good kids out front."

Nelson was the first Maple Leaf into the chute, placing fifth with a time of 15 minutes, 44 seconds over the 2.95-mile course at Kishwaukee College. Teammates Andy Beuster (seventh, 16:06) and Josh Franks (eighth, 16:09) also cracked the top 10 for the Leafs.

"At the mile mark we were getting shel-lacked by Moline," Fredericks said. "But we've got five seniors and they run with a lot of pride

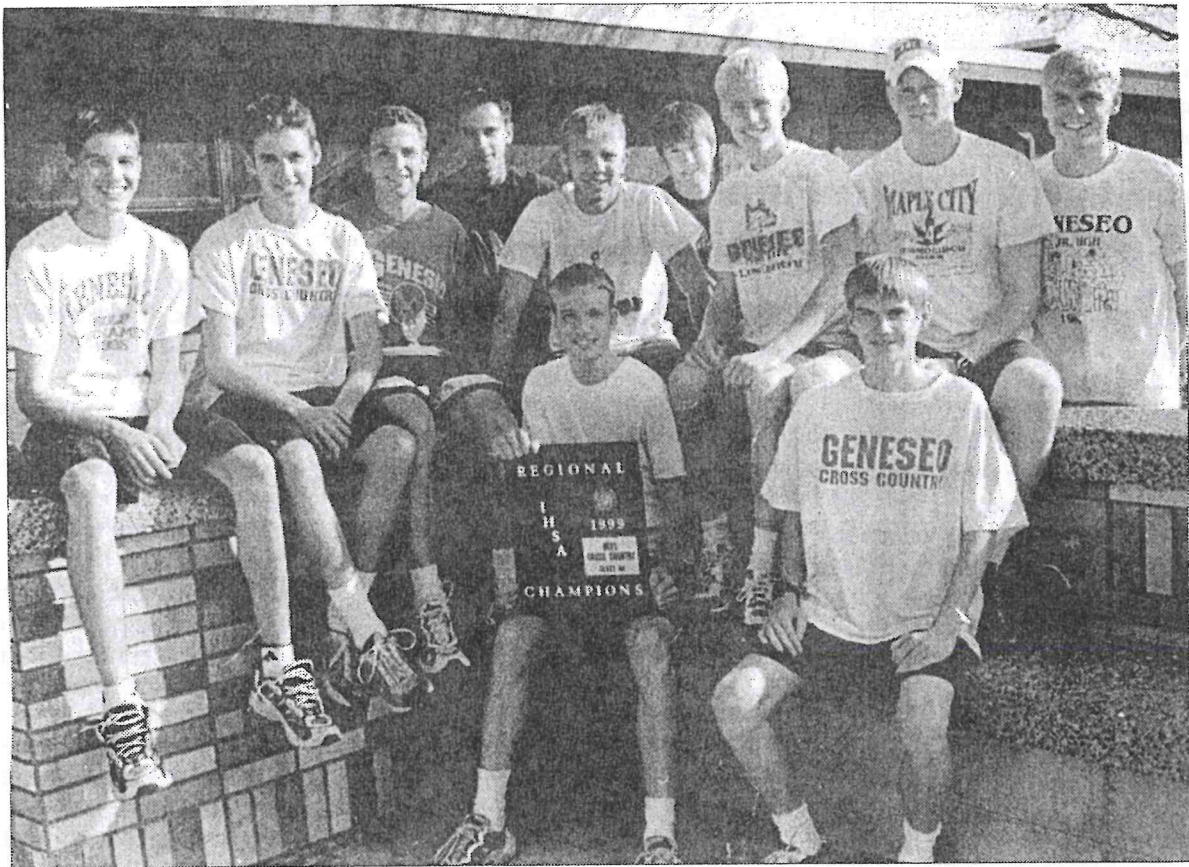
11th and 19th opening the door for Geneseo.

"We just didn't run together today," Moline coach Jeff Quick said. "We had the frontrun-ners, but you need to match Geneseo's pack per-son-for-person, and other than our first three guys we lost contact with the Geneseo kids."

After injuring his right knee two weeks ago and then struggling with the after effects at the Western Big 6 Meet, Rock Island's Boomer Creger seemed closer to form helping the Rocks to a sectional berth with his fourth-place finish (15:40). He was joined in the top 10 by teammate D.J. Waller (ninth, 16:13).

A 14th-place finish from Brian Taghon (16:23) helped UT to its sectional berth. The Panthers beat out Dixon by 6 points for the final spot.

Leaf harriers earn Regional crown in upset victory Oct. 23

Battling poor weather conditions in addition to a highly competitive field of runners, the J. D. Darnall Leaf harriers took the Class AA Rochelle Regional crown.

"The wind chill was in the low 20s," recalled harrier Coach Don Fredericks. "There was no protection (at the Kishwaukee course). Conditions were brutal.

"But I think it helped us - both of our teams," added Coach Fredericks. "Our runners not only overcame the opposition but overcame the conditions making the victory all the more sweet."

Coach Fredericks admits the girls were the only ones to record an upset on the cross country course.

"The Moline boys were picked to win by most people," the coach recalled. "They ran a strong race but our boys knocked 'em off with a tremendous team effort."

The Leafs entered the race with the hopes of bettering their 1998 finish of second place. And top it they did.

Geneseo placed four of its top five runners in the top 20 for the field to earn 48 points and the Regional crown.

Moline took second with 56 points followed by defending champion Rock Island in third at 78.

The other two teams qualifying for the Sterling Sectionals are Rochelle, 100 points and United Township, East Moline, 119.

Other team standings include Dixon, 125; Sterling, 189; Princeton, 213; Galesburg, 253 and LaSalle-Peru, 277.

In addition to the top five teams, the top five individuals not members of qualifying teams advance to Sterling.

Three Dixon and two Sterling runners fit that bill. Dukes Bob Harin, Paul Kuhn and Josh Miler and War-

riors Tony Perez and Johnathon Martin will make the trip to the Sectional meet.

Sterling will host the Sectional meet on Saturday, October 30 with four Regionals converging on the Woodlawn course. Twenty teams will make up the Sectional with the top five teams and seven individuals not members of those teams advancing to the state meet at Detweiller Park, Peoria, on Saturday, November 6.

The girls' race kicks off at 10:30 a.m. on Saturday followed by the boys at 11:15 a.m.

"We're hoping everyone will come and watch us then zip back to the football game," Coach Frederick's added. "We'd really appreciate the support. It gives our kids that extra incentive sometimes."

Ben Schumaker of Moline, a senior, took the individual title, covering the 2.95-mile course in 15:25.

Sophomore Phil Ginn of Rochelle finished second at 15:27 followed by Reed Patterson of Moline in third at 15:34. Patterson is a senior as well.

Senior Tim Nelson was the top Leaf harrier through, taking fifth overall with a time of 15:44. He finished behind junior Mark Creger of Rock Island who took fourth in 15:40.

Two other Leafs also placed within the top 10.

Andy Beuster and Josh Franks packed up the field to take seventh and eighth, respectively, with times of 16:06 and 16:09.

"Franks uncorked the best race of his life," marveled Coach Fredericks. Franks, a junior, ran his first varsity NCIC race last week. Beuster is a senior.

"Beuster . . . all of them had great individual efforts," recalled the harriers' coach.

"We saw a tremendous senior effort."

Seniors Bob Ristau and Grant Venema and junior Bill Bean also finished within the top 20 of the field.

Ristau took 13th overall with a time of 16:22 while Bean was 15th at

16:24. Venema's time of 16:28 edged him into 17th place.

Also competing for the Leafs was Matt Travis who earned 23rd overall with a time of 16:39.

Just 20 seconds separated Travis from the 11th-place finisher though it dropped him 12 places, reflecting the tight competition on the field.

"The pack attack was back," beamed Coach Fredericks, noting he saw the unified effort in both the girls and boys from Geneseo.

"This is only the third regional title for the boys team," added Coach Fredericks, recalling the other two came in 1982 and 1990.

"This team is joining an illustrious group, winning the Regional. There are many, many outstanding teams in this area. We are in a hot bed of distance running being in the Quad City area."

In reference to the two previous Regional crowns, Coach Fredericks noted both of those teams claimed fifth in the state finals.

"If the trend holds . . . well let's wait and see."

This is the first time in school history that Geneseo has claimed both Regional crowns - the boys and the girls.

Both the Leafs and Lady Leafs claimed Sectional titles in 1998 and will seek a repeat performance this year. It was the first Sectional crown for the Leafs.

"It was only the third time in school history Geneseo had qualified both the boys and girls teams for state in the same year," recalled Coach Fredericks. "Though we're still smiling - broad smiles - for this Regional win right now, we'll be focused for Sectionals by the week-end."

In 1988, 1997 and 1998, Geneseo qualified both its girls and boys cross country teams for the state meet. The last two years, Geneseo was the only school in the Sectional to qualify both varsity contingents.

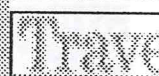
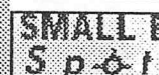

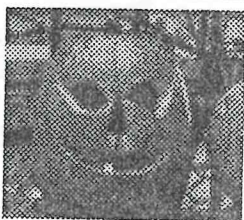
