Boys' forecast: Without a regional title to boast about, Westem Big 6 champ Moline is alone among the best four qualifying scores coming in. The seven-time sectional champion Maroons last won at this level in 1995.

"Rochelle is probably the third, or fourth best team in the sectional, so we know that with us right behind them we have a pretty good shot to make it as a team," Moline coach Jeff Quick said. UT. Rocky and Geneseo don't figure in the top 10 teams, according to last week's numbers. But, if that doesn't change, expect UT's Brian Taghon and Ammon Paquette to be in the individual running for state along with Geneseo's Josh Franks and Rocky's Boomer Creger and Keith Moroni. All five finished in last week's top 10 overall with a Moline threesome led by Drew Patterson.

"We ran good races (at Regionals), so hopefully team wise we'll be competitve," said Taghon.

Creger, also the Big 6 champ,

comes in with the slowest regionalwinning time (15:40),which ranks ninth-best in the field. Bloomington's Kyle Hilgendorf (15:18) was the quickest qualifier. "Boomer

planned out his race, and ran conservatively, due to his bad quadricep, so hopefully he'll be able to run his top race at sectional," said Rocky coach Michelle Menke.

Geneseo won this sectional in 1998; Rocky and UT are still looking for their first sectional crowns. Girls' forecast: Coming off its first regional title since 1991, Moline looks for more. The Maroons own the third-best qualifying team score while regional run-

ner-up Jill Steffens boasts the third-best qualifying time (15:01). "The girls are really starting to peak now, so we have a really solid shot at this week's sectional," said Quick.

Don't doubt that Geneseo is out for revenge, though, after having a string of three straight sectional crowns snapped last year by Pekin. The Sterling Regional

championship time by Leafs' star Jenny Lake tops the field (14:49). Teammate Emily Alden owns the 10th-best qualifying time (15:29). Moline's Jessica Griffin is two spots behind her.

"I wanted to go out fast, and that helped me a lot," Lake said. "It was back and forth the whole race between me and Megan (Braffet, Normal West) and a girl from East Peoria.'

"We lost the girl from East Peoria going up the last hill, and while we were coming down, I lost Megan."

While he was happy to see Lake return to state. Geneseo coach Don Fredericks was hoping for a first-place finish.

"This is the third time Jenny's placed second at sectionals, so its disappointing she didn't win it," he said. "Still, it is nice she is going back to Peoria."

"It was real tight overall, though. We finished ninth, but we were only 23 points back. We knew coming in that this was a strong sectional field.
