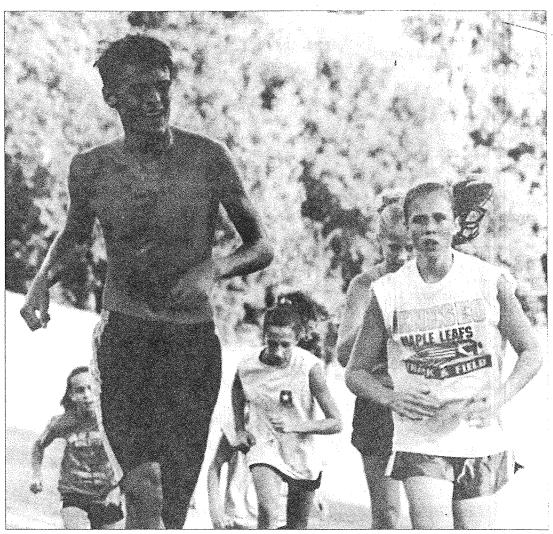

Cross country:

Excitement to burn

C'MON GIRLS. Junior Justin Trujillo, fresh off an impressive spring season on the track, leads a contingent of Maple Leaf runners up the draw at Richmond Hill Park Tuesday night at the annual Alumni/Open Race, which kicks off the 2002 cross country team's season. Trujillo ran in the top three consistently for the Leafs all season last year.

If anybody's out running, whether it be on the hills of Richmond Hill or on the hard Geneseo city pavement, Maple Leafs cross country coach Don Fredericks is going to get excited about it.

But he's especially encouraged about the season that his cross country teams are about to have.

That's because several of the Leafs' top runners from last season's North Central Illinois Conference championship teams return for another season. And, of those, most are juniors, which means they'll be around again in 2003.

That's exciting.

"I'm very excited about what the season has in store for us," Fredericks said. "We're still a very young team that gained a great deal of good experience last fall. We'll only lose one senior off our girls team after this year, and only three seniors on the boys team. That experience coming back is going to be priceless for us."

On the boys side, the lone senior varsity runner is Kyle Fluck, who just missed qualifying for the IHSA Class AA state meet as a junior last year.

"Kyle didn't attain the summer mileage I would have preferred, so it may take him a few weeks to run himself into competitive shape," Fredericks said. "But anything less than a trip to Detweiller Park and the state finals will be a major disappointment."

Fluck is joined at the top by juniors Justin Trujillo and Christian Rowlands and sophomore Nathan Schlindwein. That top four ran at the top four last year as well for the Leafs. Trujillo, in particular, had an outstanding track season, going under 2 minutes for the 800-meter run before season's end.

"The goal is to build on those top four guys from last year's conference championship team," Fredericks said. "We've got good depth, but not as much as I would like. You can never tell with these things, though."

Expect juniors Brad Mattan and Andrew Fehlman, who both ran varsity last year, to move into the No. 5 and No. 6 slots this fall. That makes Mattan part of the Maple Leafs' team score. Fredericks has several candidates in mind for the No. 7 slot, though sophomore Jordan Wildermuth has the most varsity experience.

"It's been three years since Geneseo has been in the state finals (as a team) and this group would like to change that," Fredericks said. "Conference was a true dogfight last year, with Geneseo narrowly defeating Rock Falls, Dixon and Rochelle. Each team has a lot coming back, and it should be another close race."

Fredericks also expects that Ottawa and Kewanee, who dominated the NCIC froshsoph meet, to contend as well.

On the girls side, he isn't sure who will step out and become the No. 1 runner this fall. At

Tuesday night's alumni/open race, it was sophomore Katie Croegaert, who was the Leafs' No. 2 cross country runner last fall and the top distance runner on the Leafs' girls track team, who finished first.

"Following a tremendous spring, Katie had a strong summer of base mileage, and is ready to make the next step in her career, and challenge the sectional's best this fall," Fredericks said. "She ran by herself a lot on Tuesday night. But it's not a perfect picture yet, who the No. 1 is going to be."

That's because junior Ashley Colo, last season's girls team Most Valuable Player as a sophomore, returns for this season. Also, freshman Rachel Wyffels, who has dominated distance races at the middle school and age-group levels areound the area for the past two years, is challenging for the No. 1 spot.

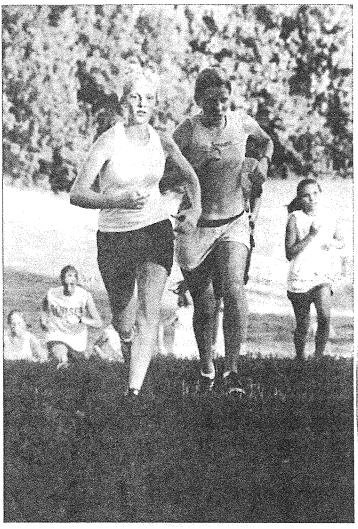
"The girls are all such team kids. I'm just hoping that those three can put together a solid pack for us," Fredericks said. "I think we're really 12 deep on the girls side. There's a top

three there, but even that's not a total guarantee. From 4 through 12, I have no idea who it'll be. There's a tremendous amount of battling for those spots going on already, and some surprises will definitely occur before it's all over with."

Look for juniors Kelle Curran, Becky Johnson, Megan Matyasse and Amanda Pearson to be in the mix for the top seven, as well as sophomores Amanda Hoste, Allie Minnaert, Alison Curran and Stephany Reese to contend. By the post-season series, the Leaf girls' lone senior, Holevoet, could also challenge after recovering from a stress fracture suffered last year.

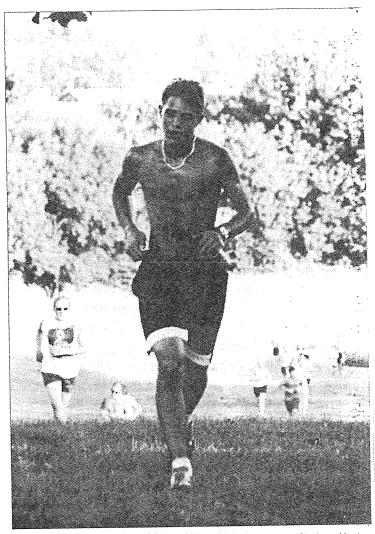
Although last year's conference champion lost three varsity runners to graduation, the depth on the girls' side gives Fredericks a lot of optimism.

"We are blessed with a tremendous amount of strong leadership. Add the fact that these young ladies are extremely hungry, and we have an exciting situation," Fredericks said. "Our youth is certainly a concern; however, many of our Big 12 gained valuable varsity experience. We expect a strong challenge from Sterling and Princeton for the NCIC."
