
#### **"Schlindwein and Wyffels just miss qualifying for state"**

# Cameron runs to title;

## Panthers second as a team

EAST PEORIA — Forgive Kyle Cameron for taking a split second to enjoy the moment.

He spent the last two weeks chasing other cross country runners — including a disappointing, for him, seventh at the Western Big 6 Conference Meet and second last weekend at the Class AA Galesburg Regional. But on Saturday the United Township senior found himself approaching the final 10 meters of the East Peoria Sectional with a clear view in front of him and no one that close behind.

As he crossed the Illinois Central College 2.98-mile course's finish line in first place, he slowed, raised both hands in the air and with fists clenched, let out a loud, satisfying 'Yeah!'

"It's unbelievable, like the biggest rush ever in my life," Cameron said of winning the sectional, duplicating the feat that Panther alum Brian Taghon, now running at Southern Illinois-Edwardsville, pulled off on the same course three years ago. "Today, I was out there running for the other six guys, to help get them to state and help them reach their dreams while at the same time fulfilling mine."

Cameron's sectional title led the Panthers to a second-place finish (113 points), just nine points behind Rockford Guilford, and qualifying UT for next week's Class AA state meet at Peoria's Detweiller Park. It's the first time a Panther team has gone to state in cross

country since 1980.

"There's not much coaching involved at this point in the season. Right now I just show up for practice, watch them and enjoy it," UT coach Russ Boore said. "It's one of the tightest teams I've ever coached. It's a beautiful thing to see."

Meanwhile, Moline's boys also advanced, though it isn't possible to make the margin of error any closer. The Maroons tied with Metamora for fifth place at 187 points, with all teams tied for fifth qualifying for state.

"We're always happy to get kids down to the state meet; we just wish we'd had better circumstances where we're not standing around worrying about it," Moline coach Jeff Quick said. "We were able to get (senior) Alex Hutchins to

state all four years. We've trained to run at Detweiller. I always expect us to go to state."

The Quad-Cities area also had two individual qualifiers. Rock Island's Austin Green was ninth in the boys race and Moline's Brittany Minor was eighth in the girls competition.

But the day, such as it was with a soggy track at ICC with howling wind conditions, belonged to Cameron, who ran the perfect tactical race.

He was part of a trio of runners (with Galesburg's Tom Tate, who beat Cameron at regionals last week, and Pekin's Matt Koetter) just a step or so behind Bloomington's Andy Kubiak — predicted as the favorite coming into the race.

At the two-mile mark, when the course turns uphill and the wind began beating at the backs of the runners, Cameron made his move and Kubiak went with him, but the UT senior's half-

mile capability was too much and Cameron started pulling away with 600 meters to go.

"I figured that was the time to go, right when the wind was at our back, and it worked. I played my cards right," Cameron said. "(Before the two-mile mark) I wanted to stay with the leader the whole race. We were all trying to draft off of each other and stay out of the wind."

Green's ninth place qualified him for state as an individual, regardless of who else finished ahead of him, as all top-10 runners advanced. "I thought I probably had a chance (to qualify), but I didn't say it too much," said Green, who led the Rocks to a 10th-place team showing. "Qualifying was great, and then the team went all crazy. That's even better."

Minor will be the lone Q-C entrant at the AA girls state meet. She made sure of that with her finish, but the local teams in the field struggled (UT 12th, Geneseo 15th and Rock Island 17th).

"I was hoping to be a little farther up there (toward the leaders), but I'm just happy to be going (to state). Next week's place matters more, anyway," said Minor, who was in the lead pack of runners trailing winner Caitlin Comfort of Peoria Notre Dame and runnerup Stephanie Baliga of Rockford Auburn for most of the race.

"I was surprised that a lot of those girls had a lot left at the end, because I didn't have a lot left. Strength was the biggest thing today. No matter how fast you are, the wind pushed you back."

Senior Nathan Schlindwein and junior Rachel Wyffels both just missed qualifying for the cross country state tournament last Saturday, Oct. 30. The sectional meet was held on the Illinois Central College campus in East Peoria.

Schlindwein, the only representative from the boys' team, finished the sectional race in 29th place with a time of 16 minutes and 51 seconds, just 31 seconds away from qualifying.

"Nathan was right there," Head Coach Don Fredericks said of Nathan's finish. "He ran basically a perfect race."

Schlindwein got cut off at the beginning of the race, but threw in some huge moves to gain a higher position in the pack, Fredericks said. He held his ground and continued to fight hard to move up in the field.

"I was so proud of him," Fredericks said. "He left it all on the course."

Wyffels also came close to qualifying with a 17th place finish in 19:40, only 23 seconds behind the last qualifier.

"Rachel ran a real smart and strong race and put her in a spot to contend for a qualifying position," Fredericks said.

The Lady Leafs came in 15th

place as a team with 309 points for the sectional race.

Freshman Eliza Cropp was the second Lady Leaf to cross the line for Geneseo coming in 62nd with a time of 20:41, only 1:01 behind Wyffels, while teammate senior Katie Croegaert finished in 21:09 for a 87th place finish.

Other Lady Leafs bringing in times for Geneseo were seniors Allison Curran in 90th place with a time of 21:11 and Erica Brenny in 21:32 for 105th. Teammates junior Sally Collis finished with a 22:24 for 132nd and sophomore Abby Winberry in 141st place with a time of 23:03.

"The team overall ran real well and I am very proud of the girls team," Fredericks said. "They ran to the best of their ability and finished with a great season."

"The three seniors, Erica, Allison and Katie, have done a great job and they have had an extremely successful high school cross country career," Fredericks said.

The Lady Leafs and Schlindwein, along with the rest of their teammates, ended this season as Coach Fredericks tells them with 'no excuses, no retreats and no regrets'.
