# Amid changes, Geneseo runner keeps his footing

Dan Chenoweth's junior year at Geneseo has been one of transition.

Instead of running cross country as a No. 3 runner — basically showing up and running whatever pace his older brother, Brian, dictated at Cedar Falls (Ia.) High School — it's been Dan's turn to be the leader in 2005.

And instead of running with the Tigers — a perennial Iowa Class 4A powerhouse and a team that included several lifelong friends — he's with a good Geneseo team that clings to a hope to run as a team at the Illinois Class AA state meet the weekend after next.

Still, he's handled the change smoothly, putting his stamp on the local Class AA cross country contingent as its best runner, with a convincing victory at Saturday's Moline Regional, where he beat the field by nearly 10 seconds Saturday.

That, plus a solid season in which he's lost just twice locally, cemented his choice this week as The Dispatch and The Rock

Island Argus Metro Pacesetter.

"I think we have a pretty good shot (at advancing as a team to state)," Chenoweth said. "Meeting most of the guys during track (last spring) really helped out. There's a culture, a big athletic tradition here in Geneseo, and I just want to do my best to help continue that."

For all the transitions and change in Chenoweth's path, the similarities to his prior two years — which included a top-10, all-state effort in Iowa last year — stand out just as much: the ability to bond with teammates, the constant attention to work ethic and the desire to excel. Those have not changed.

"You see a tremendous amount of passion and purpose in everything that Dan does; it's a very exciting combination to build upon," Maple Leafs coach Don Fredericks said.

Chenoweth has the chops for distance running; he's rapidly approaching the 15-minute barrier in cross country, though breaking it Saturday, at the East Peoria Sectional at Illinois Central College, would be very difficult. He's also cooked off a 9:46 in the 3,200 and 4:30

in the 1,600 during track season.

"His brother (Brian, who graduated from Geneseo in the spring) was and is a tremendous influence on Dan; whatever Brian ran his sophomore year, Dan wanted to beat it," Fredericks said, noting that Brian Chenoweth, now running at Division III power Wartburg College, ran 4:22 and 9:25 in the 1,600 and 3,200, respectively, for the Leafs.

"If all goes as planned, Dan wants to run faster than those times."

Chenoweth hopes his state experience a year ago, in which the Tigers took home the 4A state title, will help prepare him not only for Saturday's sectional, but also next weekend's state meet as well.

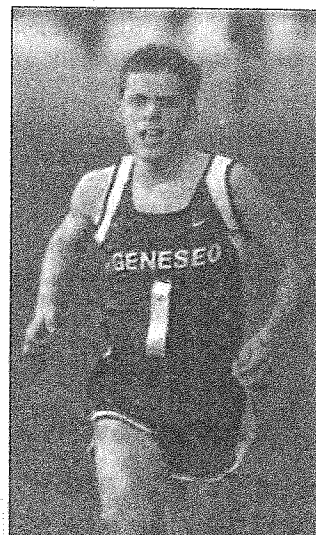
"I think it's a big advantage to have that one experience out there," Chenoweth said. "The competition we've had at some meets, like Woodruff; I'd never seen any meet like that one before, Sterling too. It really helps to see that kind of talent and team talent in one place. It gives you a taste of what state will be like."

But the biggest impact

he's made is not in the fast times, not in the big finishes, but in the small things he does, like mentoring Geneseo Middle School's No. 1 runner, Chad Ford, in a program that Maple Leaf girls assistant Kelley Timmerman began.

"There's not one member of this team who hasn't been mentored by Dan Chenoweth," Fredericks said. "His work ethic, his leadership by example, all are inspiring. Right after he and Brian moved here, they started training right away."

"He understands the correlation between miles and success."

## Class AA Cross Country Preview

► **When & where:** Of the six Class AA sectionals taking place statewide today, one has local interest, at East Peoria's Illinois Central College. Races begin at 10:30 a.m. (girls), followed by the boys at 11:30.

► **Directions:** Take I-74 westbound to Peoria area, exit 89 at War Memorial Drive (US-150). Stay right at the fork in the ramp to get to US-150 eastbound. Stay straight and turn on US-24 east and follow to the campus.

► **At stake:** Top five teams in both boys and girls competitions advance as complete teams to the Class AA state meet next week at Peoria's Detweiller Park. Additionally, the top seven individuals not part of a qualifying team will also advance to state as individuals (Note that the top 10, even if running as individuals, will also qualify).

► **Local qualifiers:** Teams: Rock Island (boys/girls), United Township (boys/girls), Geneseo (boys), Alleman (boys), Moline (girls) and Galesburg (boys). Individuals: Boys: Mark Gustafson and Colby Schulz (Moline); Girls: Rachel Wyffels (Geneseo), Shannon Stacey and Alex Gordon (Galesburg).

► **Forecast: Boys:** All the work and all the success Rock Island has achieved comes down to an ultimate test today, as the Rocks will be one of the team favorites to advance, along with Bloomington and

Normal Community. Whether Rock Island can win the sectional team title will come down to its ability to pack: last Saturday at Credit Island, their pack between the No. 1 and 5 runners was 1:13, and that will need to drop under 1:10 for best possible results today. Geneseo and UT will battle with several teams for a qualifying spot, and Alleman's experience could bring about a top-10 finish or better, even given an unfamiliar course. Look for Geneseo's Dan Chenoweth, Hononegah's Ryan Jacobs and Normal Community's Chris Zook among the top 5 individually. **Girls:** Metamora will be the team that others are chasing today; the Redbirds had six runners under 20 minutes on the state finals course at last weekend in the Metamora Regional. Normal Community is also very much in the hunt after dominating the Normal West Regional, also with six girls under 20 minutes at Maxwell Park. UT, Moline and Rock Island have all proven themselves capable of strong team performances; they'll have to reach another level to move on as full teams today. Individually, Peoria Notre Dame sophomore Caitlin Comfort is the overwhelming favorite to win the sectional. She'll be chased by Rockford Auburn's Stephanie Baliga, Galesburg's Stacey, Geneseo's Wyffels and Bloomington's Ashley Verplank, among others.

# Chenoweth advances to state competition

Geneseo's Dan Chenoweth battled against some of the top runners in this area of the state as he claimed a second-place finish in the IHSA Sectional Cross Country Meet, last Saturday, Oct. 29, in East Peoria.

"It was good to get someone through," Head Coach Don Fredericks said. "But we were hoping to get more through."

Chenoweth came in second out of 166 runners, the only Maple Leaf to advance. He crossed the finish line in 15 minutes and 23 seconds, just nine seconds behind top finisher, Ryan Jacobs of Rockton Hononegah.

"Dan was not happy that he got beat," Fredericks said. "But he ran a very strong race."

Other Leaf runners competing in the sectional meet were Blake Wyffels with a time of 16:53, followed by Josh Lodge in 17:11 and Nate Silver in 17:12.

"All the guys were disappointed with the race, but Josh Lodge ran a monster race," Fredericks said. "They gave what they had and gained some great experience."

"It is one thing to say they will do the work, but this group is willing to work to get there," Fredericks said.

Ryan Kotecki finished the meet with a final time of 17:23, while teammates Pete Nelson came in at 17:41 and Scott Mattan, 17:58.

The team finished with in 14th place out of 21 teams.

"The guys' team was a long shot and we needed everyone to run the best race of their life," Fredericks said. "But for them to be on the starting line at the sectional meet, the experience you get you can't measure."

In the girls' race, Rachel Wyffels was the lone Lady Leaf representative, placing 14th out of 157 runners with a time of 18:58, just missing a qualifying time by three places and 14 seconds.

"Rachel just missed. We knew she was close, but we thought she was just going to barely miss," Fredericks said. "She came running up to us and said she made

it, but there were nine names highlighted when there only should have been seven and Rachel was ninth. We waited and then talked with the officials because we wanted it done right and it was read incorrectly.

"It was an emotional roller coaster and it wasn't a good thing," Fredericks said. "We told her we thought there was an error.

"Rachel got off to a little slower start on a tricky course,"

Fredericks said. "But she worked up to the top-10.

"She ran a tough race, but said she felt a little flat," Fredericks said. "She ran out of gas a little bit, but she closed like crazy and closed out a tremendous cross-country career and gave it everything she had."

Chenoweth will compete in the IHSA State Meet this Saturday, Nov. 5, in Peoria at Detweiller Park. Chenoweth will run in the last race of the day with warm-ups beginning at 1:05 p.m. followed by final instructions. The race will start at approximately 1:15 p.m. with the awards ceremony following at 2:45 p.m.

"(The state meet) will be a madhouse, it is quite the spectacle with about 10,000 people there," Fredericks said.

"This is Dan's first Illinois state final," Fredericks said. "Last year, he ran 10th in the Iowa state final and the team won the state title so he has a plethora of experience. Having been there is huge and his performance at that level is great.

"Dan's goal is to earn all-state," Fredericks said. "(Class AA) is a tremendously loaded field and Dan is running great and is healthy. We have a lot of confidence in him and are excited about his chances. We wish him the best of luck."

# Tough day for Wyffels,

## Q-C area girls at AA sectional

EAST PEORIA — The name of Geneseo cross-country runner Rachel Wyffels was highlighted in yellow on the results board after Saturday morning's Class AA 2.9-mile race at Illinois Central College. As it turned out, the Class AA East Peoria Cross-Country Sectional wouldn't be a highlight for her, or any of the Quad-Cities' runners for that matter.

More than an hour after the official results were posted, they were corrected, with Wyffels' name no longer highlighted, missing the state cut by two spots.

Geneseo coach Don Frederichs detected the error right away, heading to the scorers' tent to make them aware. He knew that only the top seven not on a state-advancing team move on, not the top 10 unless they all finished in the top

10. Wyffels placed ninth among such runners, 14th overall.

Her time of 18:58 was the best of any Quad-Cities runners in the field, which included full teams from Rock Island, United Township and Moline. The last individual qualifier for next weekend's state meet in Peoria finished in 18:44.

"My legs felt really heavy today," said Wyffels, a Leafs senior. "I was trying to go faster; I just couldn't go any faster."

According to Geneseo assistant coach Kelley Timmerman, Wyffels started outside the top 100 in the first quarter-mile. However, she made up plenty of ground before the one-mile mark.

"We panic as coaches as we watch her," Timmerman said, "but we know she always pulls through. That kind of start works for her."

While Wyffels barely missed reaching

state; so, too, did Moline's team and Rock Island's Erika Jakobsen.

Needing to place in the top five teams, Moline was ninth with 274 points. Fifth-place Belvidere had 185 points.

"Our first three looked pretty good," Moline coach Tauwon Taylor said of Danielle Roseman, Sarah Castel and Aisha Praught, who were closely bunched at 29th (19:26), 31st (19:28) and 34th (19:31) among team-hunt participants. "But we might have had too much of a gap to our fourth and fifth runners."

RI's Jakobsen ran a personal-best 19:08 on the challenging, hilly, and sometimes holey, course. She was 22nd overall, and was four spots behind Wyffels in the individual quest for state.

"I really, really wanted to make it to state," said Jakobsen, a junior. "I just got

it in my head to run with the top girls, and shoot for a top-10 finish."

The Rocks as a team finished in 16th, with Jakobsen backed by teammates Mari Alvarado, "her best race ever" with a 19:30, according to coach Michelle Lillis; Julie Dietsch (20:06), Abby Myers (21:38) and Joella Ruefer (21:54).

United Township, last week's regional champ, found the going rough Saturday, finishing 11th as a team. The Panthers were topped by Lauren Savala (48th, 19:36).

"We just didn't have our 'A' game," said UT runner Brooke Ashcraft, who was UT's second best at regional, but fifth in sectional. "Maybe we were so excited that we didn't run our race at all."

Between Savala and Ashcraft for UT were Tari Fisk (20:06), Deloris McDowell (20:11) and Janel Miller (20:17).



# Rocks run to sectional gold

## Three top-15 finishes net title

EAST PEORIA — Rock Island cross-country runner Alex Seiver picked the perfect time for what Rocky coach Michelle Lillis called "the race of his entire season" Saturday at the Class AA East Peoria Sectional.

With Rock Island's Austin Green, Kyle Staley and Brad Begyn all in the top 15 at 5th, 14th and 15th, respectively, Seiver turned a near-personal best 16:12 on the 2.9-mile course for a 23rd-place finish. Along with Scott Sparkman in 40th, it propelled the Rocks to their first cross-country sectional title in school history.

"That was our motivation; we wanted the first sectional title ever," said Seiver, a senior. "Everyone came ready to run. We've been doing that all season, and we wanted to keep it going."

With 81 points, far away the best at East Peoria with runner-up Rockford Jefferson tallying 165, the Rocks advance as a team to next weekend's state meet at Peoria's Detwiler Park.

"They ran extremely well," Lillis said of her runners. "The middle — Kyle, Brad and Alex — was huge for us."

"We thought Austin would run out in front, with Kyle a good distance behind, and then everybody else right together."

It was that close pack of Rocks that keyed their gold-plated team finish.

"Everyone has an important

role on this team," said Seiver, whose best run of the season came in the Rock Island Invitational, a 16:08 on a considerably easier Credit Island course. "It's nice to have a solid pack, for the whole race and the whole season."

Green finished sixth with a time of 15:39. "At the finish, I was more worried about the team," he said. "You can't win a sectional by yourself. This is more for the team than the frontrunner."

Advancing with the Rocks will be pair of Q-C area individuals — Geneseo's Dan Chenoweth and Alleman's Alex Knobloch.

Chenoweth, last weekend's regional champion, came in second Saturday, nine seconds behind winner Ryan Jacobs of Rockton Hononegah with a time of 15:23. His Maple Leaf teammates, though, had a rough go of it. Geneseo was second at the Moline Regional, but couldn't back Chenoweth's performance, finishing in 14th as a team.

"He was hoping to win, as any fierce competitor would," Geneseo coach Don Frederichs said of Chenoweth. "He's not happy; he's not satisfied."

"Afterward, though, I pointed out to him that it's nice to be flat and still finish second in a sectional. And if he has to have a perfect day, he could save it for the state meet."

For Knobloch, his state advancement couldn't have been

any narrower. He ran a 15:50, which tied him for the No. 10 spot with Ben Nathan of Bloomington. The top 10 overall reach state, as do the top seven not on a team that advanced to state. Knobloch was eighth when it came to the latter qualification.

Knobloch, part of an Alleman team that wasn't allowed to defend its Class A state title because of the IHSA-imposed multiplier, headed a Pioneer team that finished 16th.

"We ran really well; I'm pleased with the effort," said Alleman coach Mike Ethington. "This field was pretty deep for us. It could have been tough in Winnebago (where the Pioneers would have run in Class A), let alone here at East Peoria."

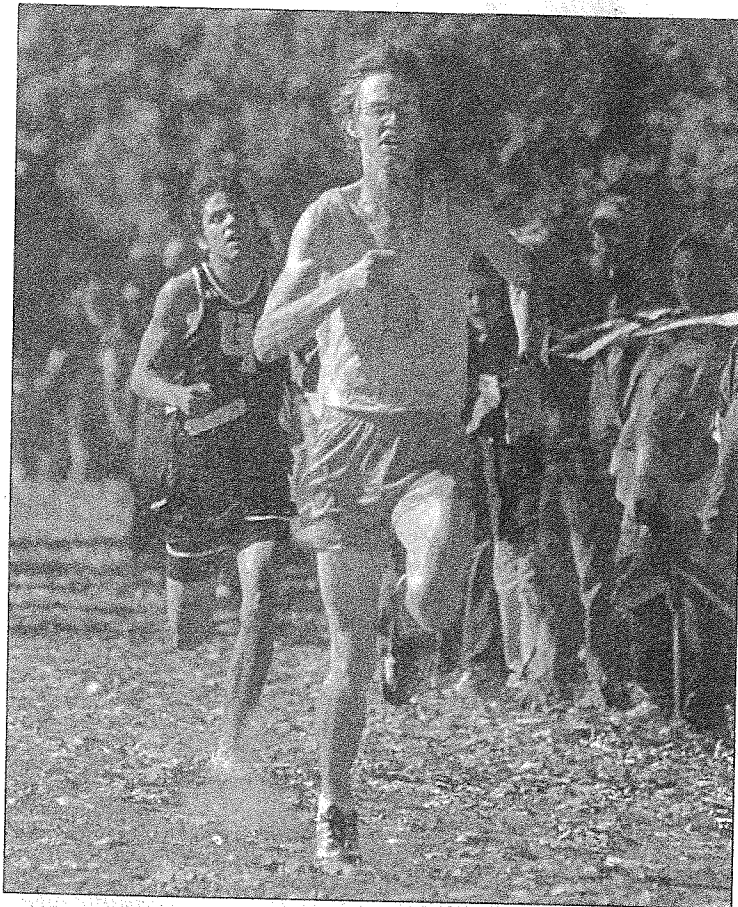
"We're pleased with our performances. It's just a tough field."

Backing Knobloch in scoring for Alleman were Brian McGuire and Troy DeBlieck (tied at 16:45), Joe Carlin (17:43) and Mike Valliere (18:07).

United Township's boys just missed the top 10, at 11th with 291 points. Kankakee McNamara was 10th at 288.

"Michael Hernandez ran the race of his life; he's our No. 4 runner and he finished second for us," said UT coach Russ Boore.

UT was led by Chris Matthews with a 16:09. That was 10th among those not on team qualifiers. Rounding out the Panther quintet were Stefan Escontrias, Jordan Jennings

and Jerome Harms.

Moline had a pair of runners — Mark Gustafson and Colby Schultz — performing as individuals, and both nearly ran their way into the state-qualify-

ing fray. Gustafson's 16:07 placed him 19th overall and 10th among non-team advancers. Schultz, coming in three seconds later, was two spots behind his teammate in both categories.
