The Leafs were led by Danielle Dewey (29th); Amy Cosgrove (55th); Joann Chenoweth (81st); Nicole Carton (82nd); Abby Winberry (118th); Kate Langdon (128th); and Eliza Cropp (143rd.) 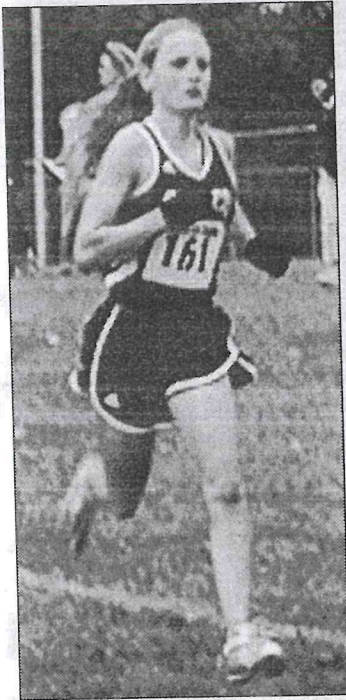

Dan Chenoweth will represent the team next weekend in the State Finals at Detweiller Park in Peoria. He will race at 1:15 pm.

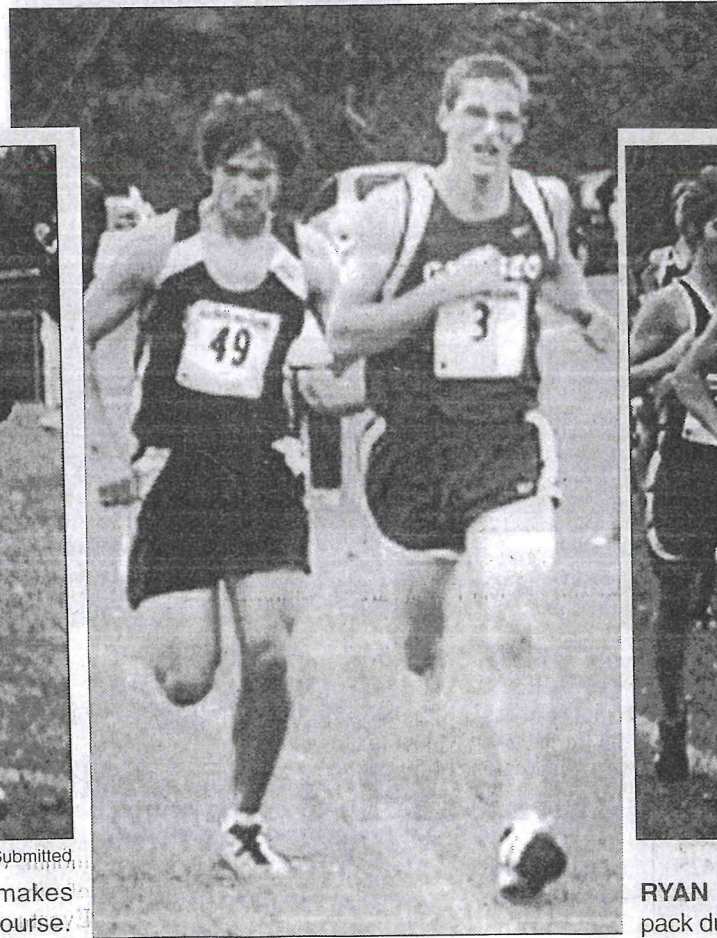

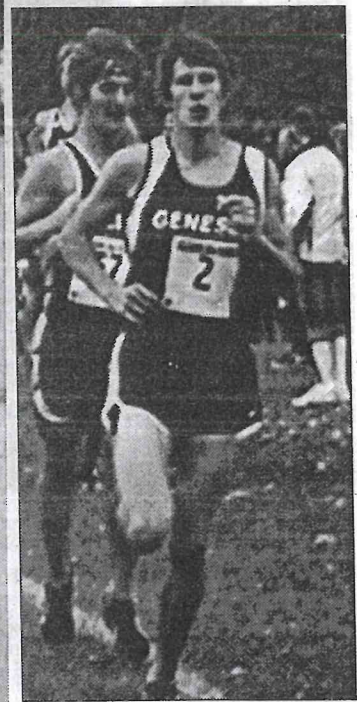

The Geneseo cross country teams accomplished its No. 1 IHSA regional goal Oct. 21, advancing both squads to the sectional meet. The boys placed second overall, while the girls took fifth.

Dan Chenoweth once again cruised his way to the top of the boys' race with another first-place finish in 15 minutes and 11 seconds.

Josh Lodge added a 12th-place finish in 16:43, followed by Ryan Kotecki in 17th at 17:00; and Blake Wyffels in 23rd with a time of 17:08.

Nate Silver crossed the finish line in 17:18 for 25th, followed by Rob Brenny in

18:04 and Chad Ford at 18:07.

Leading the way for the Lady Leafs was Danielle Dewey in 10th place with a time of 20:11, followed by Joann Chenoweth in 27th at 20:53; Amy Cosgrove in 21:04 for 28th; and Kate Langdon in 30th at 21:09.

Others contributing to the fifth-place finish were Nicole Carton with a time of 21:24, Abby Winberry in 22:07, and Rachel Atwell in 23:23.

The Leafs will take their talents to the next level in IHSA competition when they travel to East Peoria for the Saturday, Oct. 28 IHSA sectional meet at Illinois Central College. The girls' race will start at 10:30 a.m., followed by the boys' race at 11:30 a.m.

Chenoweth, RI's team headed to state meet

EAST PEORIA — Geneseo senior Dan Chenoweth won one of the biggest individual battles he's faced in 2006: the boys' field competing in the Class AA East Peoria Sectional.

While Chenoweth won the individual battle, Rock Island's boys' team won the war that was its quest to return to Peoria's Detweiller Park, site of next weekend's state meet.

The Rocks — behind top-15 finishes from senior Kyle Staley and sophomore Travis Anderson — nabbed the fifth and final team-qualifying spot at Illinois Central College, scoring 163 team points, one less than fourth-place Bloomington, 12 ahead of sixth-place Metamora and 16 ahead of seventh-place Geneseo.

"I wanted to help the seniors get back to state," said Anderson. "Kyle (Staley), Josh (Rice) and Kevin (Moroni), those guys deserved to get back to

state, because it was their last year to get it."

Additionally, Moline senior Aisha Praught advanced as an individual state qualifier, taking seventh individually as the Maroon girls finished sixth in the girls' team competition.

► **Boys:** As has been his usual practice in almost every race this year, Chenoweth burst to the front of the field on the 2.95 mile circular course at Illinois Central. Hononegah's Ryan Jacobs went with him, staying a few feet back, but as Chenoweth made the turn near the mile mark, he put a surge on that Jacobs couldn't match.

When the race was over, Chenoweth had won by a wide margin once again, beating Jacobs by 29 seconds with a time of 14:51.

"I didn't feel my greatest today, but I had to keep pushing. It's great to get a race like this out this week," said Chenoweth. "There's a lot of good guys here, so I just con-

centrated on surging in different places on the course, so that they wouldn't be able to come get me."

While Chenoweth dominated from the front, Staley wasn't all that far behind in fifth place. That fifth eventually

became 10th, but even if the Rocks hadn't qualified as a team, 10th would have been good enough to go as an individual.

"I wanted to go out hard and see what I had left in the end. The guys here are really good," said Staley, who finished in 15:45. "I went out hard the first mile, but I let (Chenoweth) and some of the other guys go and let the wind hit them, instead of me. I felt pretty good and things worked out fine."

Things worked out just fine indeed for the Rocks, with Anderson taking 12th (among runners competing with their full teams; he was 13th overall), Scott Sparkman 30th among team runners, and the 4-5 runners, Rice and Topher Leiby, both finishing near or in the top 60.

"It was all (Galesburg's Zach) Yeager (who was 13th among team runners, two seconds behind Anderson in 15:54)," Anderson said. "That pushed me. He's been beating

me all year. I figured, if this is my last race, at least I gotta get him."

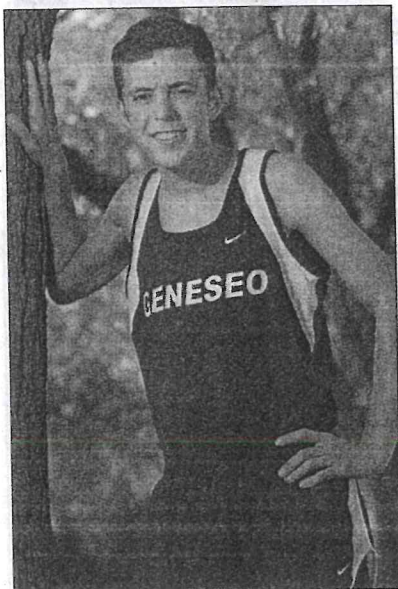
► **Girls:** Praught hung in the race's top 10 for the first two miles, then applied her sprinter skills to surge into seventh place, including finishing just ahead of Galesburg's Shannon Stacey.

"The intensity is so much higher. There's so many more girls here, all of them thinking it could be their last race. So everyone's just that much more aggressive," said Praught, who finished the course in 18:26.

"Toward the end, I was sitting about 10th and somebody yelled at somebody behind me, 'You're a sprinter, start moving up,' and I used that as my own advice."

Praught's teammate, Sarah Castel, and Alleman's Kathleen Hogan made huge late surges to finish in the top 20 individually, but both found themselves just outside the list of individual qualifiers.

Chenoweth gets headlines, but Geneseo needs team effort

As good as Geneseo senior Dan Chenoweth is in distance running, and as big as the spotlight that shines on his cross country exploits can be, it's easy to forget there are six other green-clad runners out there with him.

"It's disappointing that we don't get respect out there, that people even think we almost recruited him to get here," said Maple Leaf senior Blake Wyffels. "So it's neat to go out and show what Geneseo is all about."

And, the Leafs have been all about winning, at least when they aren't going up against the Chicago suburban superpowers. This year, Geneseo is one of three metro schools to send full boys' and girls' teams to Saturday's Class AA East Peoria Sectional.

On the boys' side at least, there's a very good chance the Leafs can put together a state-qualifying team effort on Saturday. That runs counter to

a prediction made on a running Web site — Illinoispreptoptimes.com — which ranks Geneseo ninth at the East Peoria Sectional.

"We're going to give it (state) a try; we'll have to get all of our top five runners in the top 50. Everyone's going to have to run their race, but we'll all be trying to run close to a PR effort," said senior Nate Silver.

Chenoweth, Wyffels and Silver are the leadership nucleus for that top-five group, which also includes junior Ryan Kotecki and sophomore Josh Lodge; sophomore Rob Brenny and freshman Chad Ford round out Geneseo's top seven. It's been the summer mileage that has put the Leafs in the position they're in.

"I had a 500-mile summer; Dan was over 600, Nate ran over 600 and Ryan was over 600, so just between us four, we were way over 2,000," Wyffels said.

Chenoweth races to second IHSA state appearance

Geneseo cross country's Dan Chenoweth keeps blazing past the opposition not letting anyone stand in the way of his quest for an IHSA State Championship.

Chenoweth captured another first-place finish this past week at the Saturday, Oct. 28, IHSA sectional meet, taking the tape in 14 minutes and 51 seconds for first. This marks Chenoweth's second-straight IHSA state appearance.

"Dan was sectional champ, but it wasn't easy as he wasn't 100 percent," Head Coach Don Fredericks said. "He didn't feel great but he still won by quite a bit, approximately 29 seconds. He was out in front from the get go."

Following Chenoweth in the boys' race were Ryan Kotecki with a time of 16:16 for 34th place, Josh Lodge in 16:18 for 36th place, and Blake Wyffels in 48th place with a time of 16:29.

Others competing for the Leafs were Nate Silver with a time of 17:09 for 103rd place, Rob Brenny in 18:05 for 143rd, and Chad Ford at 18:27 for 152nd place.

"The boys' team stated their goal was to qualify for the

state finals and they did everything they possibly could and just came up a little short," Fredericks said. "I am extremely proud of every part of their season. They are a very dedicated group with our top five runners logging 400 miles or more this summer, which paid dividends.

"Everything we've done this season (to prepare); the team has attacked with a great attitude. The boys barely missed qualifying by 16 points. They left it all on the course and ran their hearts out."

The Lady Leafs were once again led by their freshmen trio of Danielle Dewey, Amy Cosgrove and Joann Chenoweth.

Dewey was the top-place finisher for Geneseo with a time of 19:42 for a 29th-place finish, followed by Cosgrove in 55th place at 20:18; and J. Chenoweth in 20:46 for 81st.

Nicole Carton closely followed in 82nd place with a time of 20:47, while Abby Winberry finished with a time of 21:42 for 118th. Kate Langdon took 128th with a time of 22:04, and Eliza Cropp finished the race in 22:31 for 143rd.

"I am pleased with the whole girls' team," Fredericks

said. "If you go back six weeks ago, we didn't know if we would get to sectionals. But the girls lined up and competed well.

"Danielle ran a phenomenal race, along with Joann and Amy, and Nicole ran a tremendous race. I am real proud of the way the girls handled the pressure of the final. They gained a lot of experience and we have a lot of talent coming back.

"The girls had tremendous success this season and it is a good example of what hard work and leadership provide. Abby, Nicole and Kelli Lawrence provided great leadership and this season was a definite success."

D. Chenoweth will strive for a state championship this weekend Saturday, Nov. 4, at Detweiller Park in Peoria with the Class AA boys' race starting at 1:15 p.m.

"Dan marches on and state will be a lot more difficult," Fredericks said. "He has seen most of the top runners in the state because of our expanded schedule and he gained priceless experience from those meets. He hopes to make a run for it.

"Dan has only lost to one runner all year, Evan Jager of Algonquin (Jacobs), who won

the St. Charles (North) Sectional. Jager beat Chenoweth at the Sept. 9 Peoria Woodruff Invite. Dan knows what he has to do and he knows what works for him. He is the most savvy race competitor you'll see. He is very intelligent and he has his goals in mind. He is a furious competitor and is a lot of fun to watch."

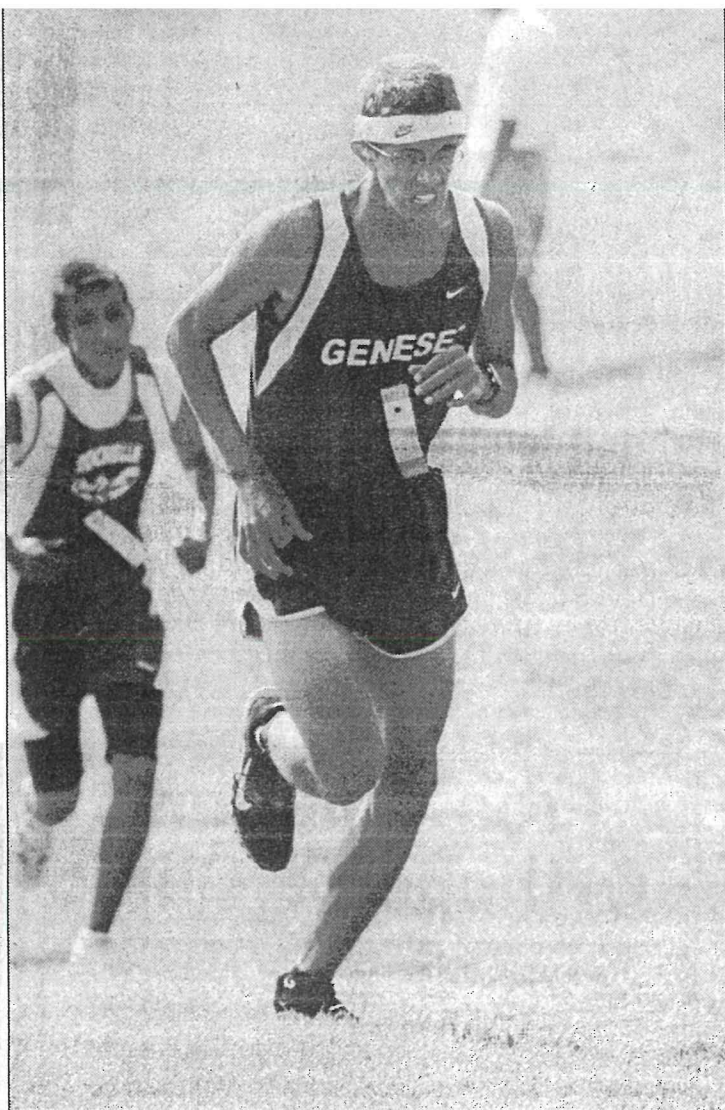

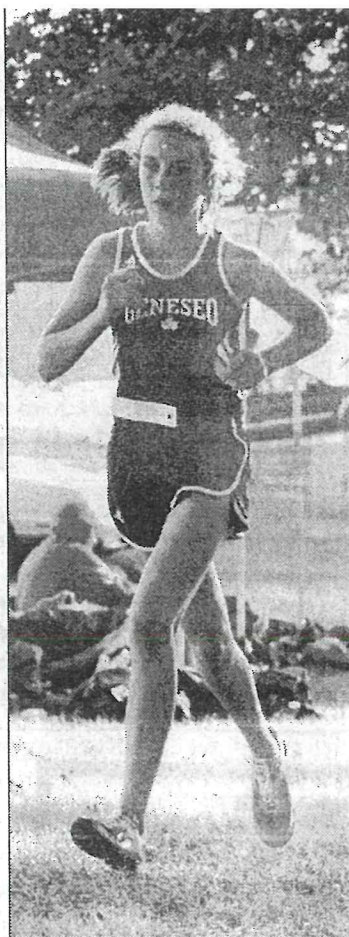

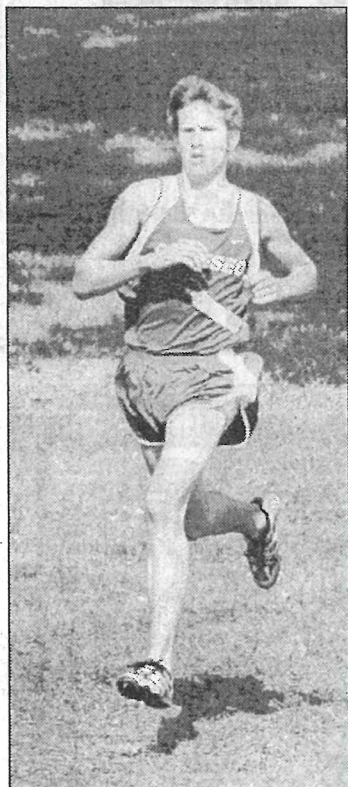

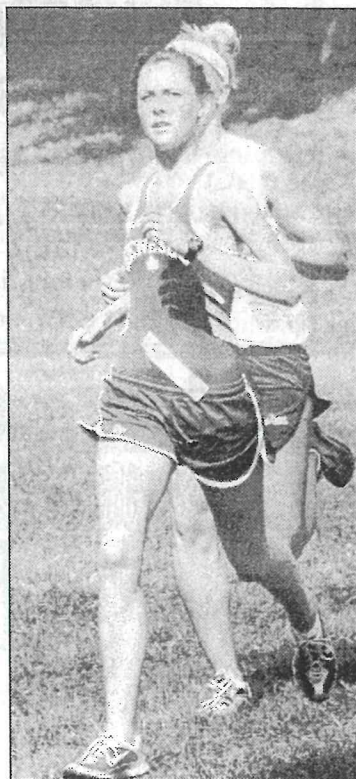

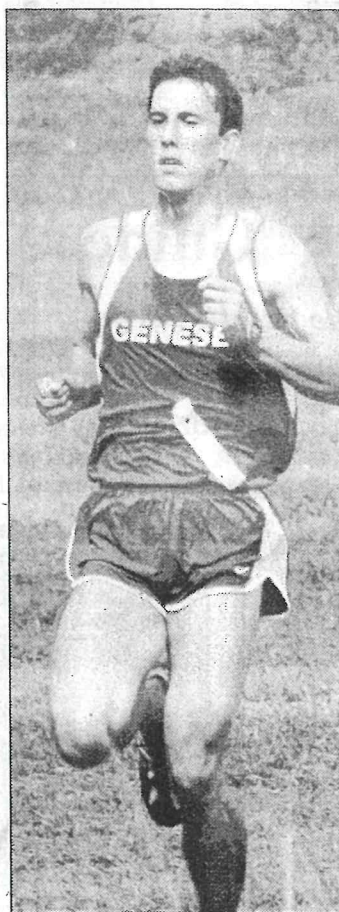

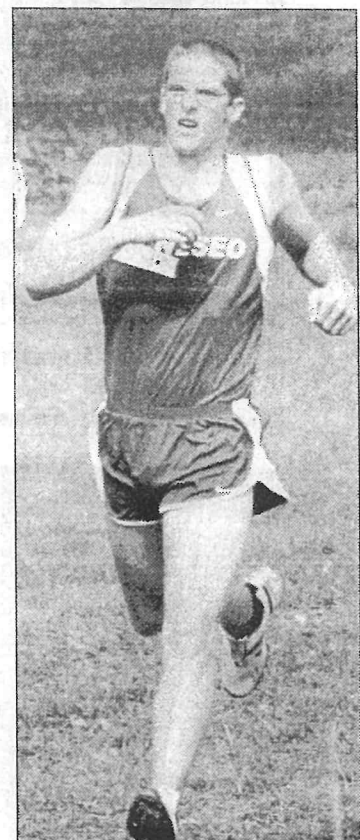
