▶ When & where: Today at Peoria's Detweiller Park. Races start at 9:30 a.m. with Class A girls, followed by Class A boys at 10:30 a.m. After awards in Class A are handed out, Class AA competition begins with the girls' race (12:15 p.m.) and the boys' race (1:15).

▶ **Directions to Detweiller Park:** I-74 eastbound into Peoria, exit at US-24/IL-29 westbound. Follow that for several miles to the park, which will be on the left-hand side of the road. Arrive early; parking is at a premium.

➤ Class A local participants: Girls: Monmouth-Roseville team; Ellen Kindelsperger, Sherrard; Shelbie Pettie, Sherrard; Alisa Baron, Bureau Valley. Boys: Bureau Valley team; Josh Moshier, Riverdale; Cole Prins, Prophetstown-Erie; Chris Krider, Sherrard.

Class A outlook: On the girls' side, Illinoispreptoptimes.com ranks the M-R Titans 13th in the team race, but Monmouth's strong pack - led by senior all-state threat Hannah Hottle and junior Morgan Melvin — is more than capable of a top-10 effort. Look for Winnebago and Elmwood-Brimfield to battle for team honors, with Rockford Lutheran and Petersburg PORTA also strong top-five threats. Individually, Bureau Valley's Baron is predicted to finish in the top five, and is more than capable of that finish with the times she has run this year. Sherrard's Pettie is the 25th pick by the Web Site, though how she'll respond after collapsing last week at the Oregon Sectional is anyone's guess. Hottle, Melvin and Kindelsperger are all capable of top-25 performances. Watch for Carthage's Katelyn Bastert to run the table and win her fourth individual state title. In the boys' race, Bureau Valley is seeded 14th, which is better than anyone besides the Storm, themselves. could have predicted at the start of the season as BV is peaking at the right time. Individually, both

Riverdale's Moshier (18th) and Sherrard's Krider (24th) are both seeded for all-state honors. Don't be surprised though, if Moshier finishes in the top 15 and P-E's Prins figures into the chase as well. As for a state champion today, look at Tremont's Parker Thompson or Peru St. Bede's Matt Morse.

▶ Class AA local participants: Girls: Aisha Praught, Moline; Shannon Stacey, Galesburg. Boys: Rock Island team; Galesburg team; Dan Chenoweth, Geneseo.

Class AA outlook: Moline's Praught will have to fight to finish in the top 50 in what should be a very elite girls' field, and running the race should give her valuable experience for 2007, when the Maroon team may get a chance to compete in its entirety. Watch for Hinsdale Central to battle with Barrington and Elmhurst York for top team honors, Individually, East Peoria Sectional champion Caitlin Comfort should be the favorite to win state on what is almost a home track for her. In the boys' race, it will be difficult for Rock Island to perform much higher than a top-20 finish. Very few even expected them to be running today. Individually, Chenoweth's win streak - since finishing second at the Peoria Woodruff Invitational, also at Detweiller — is expected to come to an end, but he is being given strong consideration as a top-5 runner by Illinoispreptoptimes.com. Watch him take second or third, behind one of the nation's best, Evan Jager of Algonquin Jacobs, the favorite to win the individual championship. Jager just might have the capability to go under 14 minutes. Chenoweth will be close to that; his effort today would make a strong case for him to become a Division I college distance prospect. Rock Island's Kyle Staley and Travis Anderson both have strong chances to finish in the individual top 50.

(PEORIA, IL) The forecast calls for temperatures in the mid 50s and a chance of showers.

Oh yes, and plenty of great competition.

Although the weather will be frigid, the action will heat up at Detweiller Park on Saturday, site of the annual Illinois High School Association Cross-Country Championships. Storylines abound, but the two most newsworthy angles figure to be for "The Kid" that is finally showing up and "The Man" that will not be.

Jacobs High senior Evan Jager is "The Kid", considered by many as the frontrunner for this year's FootLocker Nationals individual crown. Racing sparingly in meets of consequence thus far this fall, the distance-running star from Algonquin is the heavy favorite to capture the Class 2A title in a race where he placed third to since-graduated Steve Finley (Palatine HS) and Ryan Craven (Prospect). Jager, unbeaten thus far in 2006, made a verbal commitment to attend NCAA national power University of Wisconsin earlier in the week

"The Man" who won't be in attendance will be legendary York coach Joe Newton, who is adhering to a school-imposed suspension for the remainder of the season (along with assistant coach Charlie Kern) for excessive days of coaching contact with student-athletes during the summertime period.

Newton, whose storied 51-year career at York includes an amazing 25 state titles, complied with the school's decision, thus leaving the interim coaching reins to Stan Reddel, the school's head track coach since 2001. This will be Reddel's second stint at the helm of the Dukes; he coached the squad in 1988 when Newton was in Seoul, South Korea serving as the Team Manager for the U.S. contingent at the Olympic Games. That year, York finished second at the state meet.

York's boys, currently ranked second in the NTN Midwest Region, are the heavy favorites to win the Class 2A race, although Palatine (ranked 8th in the Midwest) and Sandburg (ranked 10th) lead a deep list of challengers.

On the girls side, Hinsdale Central, fourth at last year's state meet, is the Class 2A favorite. Hinsdale is ranked third in this week's NTN Midwest region poll.



Chenoweth makes history placing fourth for "Chenoseo"

With his faith, the tremendous support of his community, and just his natural God-given talent, Dan Chenoweth persevered with his sights set high and ran away with a fourth-place finish at the IHSA Class AA Boys' State Cross Country Meet Nov. 4 at Detweiller Park in Peoria.

"Being No. 1 is something special and before the race, I just asked God to let



me be content with my race," Dan Chenoweth said. "And it happened today. I gave it what I had."

As the gun sounded and the pack of runners took off, Chenoweth made his way into the lead pack just behind nemesis Evan Jager of Algonquin and Hersey's Kevin Havel. And that is where he remained throughout the majority of the race.

"(Friday night) I was real nervous, but I was ready to go," Chenoweth said. "There is some great competition here and it really gives you motivation."

Other motivation for Chenoweth came from his supporters who had traveled to Peoria for the race. Throughout the course, fans could be heard over the loudspeaker as the pace car drove ahead of the runners; some of the more pronounced chants were "Cheno, Cheno" from the Geneseo fans who came out to support their top runner.

Chenoweth held onto his third-place status until approximately the final 100 meters when Neuqua Valley's Kevin Derrick found a surge of energy and gave Chenoweth a battle for third place. Derrick ended up crossing the finish line just two seconds of ahead of Chenoweth for third place. Chenoweth reached the finish line in fourth with a time of 14 minutes and 24 seconds.

"It was a tough last mile for him," Head Coach Don Fredericks said. "It was a knock-down, drag-out brawl for third. Dan and Derrick went at it. Both made moves on each other and Derrick came out in the end."

Chenoweth's finish marks the secondhighest finish in Quad City Class AA history, just behind Rock Island's Mario Vesey in 1988 with a state championship.

Chenoweth's finish is the highest ever for a Geneseo cross country runner. The next top place for the Leafs was by Jenny Lake in eighth place at state in 1997 and, for the boys' team, Andy Snook in 11th in 1992.


After finishing 35th last year at state, Chenoweth wanted to prove he could run with these guys again, since he was facing some of the same he raced a year ago.

"Last year was a low point, but I used it for motivation," Chenoweth said. "I am really thankful for my God-given talent, but it is nothing if you don't use it.

"It was an awesome year and to see all the people from town who came to support me, even though I've only been in this town for a year, was really great."

"I know he is disappointed because he wanted to win and anything other than first would be a disappointment for him," Fredericks said. "But, after he digests everything, I think he will find a smile. He had a tremendous season.

"Dan is so motivated, he loves competition, and he has a tremendous inner

drive to compete. This was only the sec ond race he lost all year and he was bear by only three runners all year. I am proud of his race and his season. It took a lot of guts and fearless running."

And, for the time being on Saturday, Geneseo was known as "Chenoseo" as Chenoweth left everything he had on the course to represent the Leafs.

PEORIA — A town built upon the might of the "Green Machine" football team paid homage to another, if a bit smaller, machine Saturday.

And so the home of the Maple Leafs became, however informally, "Chenoseo," honoring Dan Chenoweth for his

victoryfilled 2006 cross country season.

Chenoweth's final Illinois highschool race didn't result in another victory Saturday at Detweiller Park.

But the "Chenoseo" senior served notice that he belonged in the same conversation as the state's — and, if rankings mean anything, the nation's — best runners by finishing fourth in a school-record time of 14 minutes, 24 seconds in the Class AA boys' state meet.

"It was important for me to show that I could run with these guys. I proved myself against some of the same guys that were killing me a year ago," said Chenoweth, who was 35th last November.

Chenoweth's finish is the best in Quad-Cities Class AA history since Rock Island's Mario Vesey won the 1988 individual boys' state championship. Other than that title effort by Vesey, no Class AA runner, boy or girl, in 36 years has finished so high as Chenoweth.

"(Eventual state champion) Evan Jager (of Algonquin Jacobs, who ran 14:07) set a goal to break 14 minutes. That's a really fast pace," "Chenoseo" coach Don Fredericks said. "You have to decide right from the get-go if you're going to go out with him."

Chenoweth did, eventually settling into the lead of the first pack behind Jager — who is ranked either No. 1 or No. 2 in the nation, depending on which poll is consulted — and Hersey's

Kevin Havel, touring the first mile in 4:35 and first two in 9:30. He held third place until the final 100 meters, when Neuqua Valley's Kevin Derrick sprinted past him and finished in 14:22.

The result solidified Chenoweth's chances to run at the Division I level in college.

"I think the way I ran this year, most likely I will be Division I," said Chenoweth. "I couldn't ask for much more from this season. The whole year has been a great run. I was just hoping to at least contend, and I was able to win some big meets."

Rock Island coach Michelle Lillis also walked away happy, with the Rocks running seven person-

al records (PRs) at Detweiller I Rocky finished 25th as a team I with 616 points, one spot ahead of Bloomington, which beat them at I East Peoria last week.

"(Fourth runner) Josh Rice got here about three minutes before the gun went off," said Lillis, not ing that Rice had a mandatory music competition earlier Saturately music music properties of the saturate o

"We had to take (freshman) Aubrey (Barnes) off the line and put Josh in, in no time at all. Id know there's a lot of officials who are angry with me, but I'm glad Josh was able to make it and arun state in his senior year I decouldn't ask for a better postseason than this. ... Everybody ran the best race they could run."

Senior Kyle Staley closed out his high school career with a 15:09 clocking, good for 61st place individually, to lead the Rocks.

"It's tough to go out hard here, but if you don't, you get boxed in," Staley said. "I went out hard and finished hard, just like all season."

▶ AA girls: Moline junior Aisha Praught set a PR in finishing 76th, touring Detweiller in 18:15. Praught started the race in the same box as eventual individual champion Caitlin Comfort of Peoria Notre Dame.

"It's really tough to figure out how to make turns, because there's about 20 girls in about five feet of space," Praught said.

"The first mile, I blinked, and that was the first mile. The second (mile) felt like it was 15 minutes long, and the third I didn't think at all, except to just run what I could run."



DAN CHENOWETH keeps close with Evan Jager (front), the pack leader during the Class AA boys' state cross country race at Detweiller Park Nov. 4.



Geneseo's Chenoweth finishes 4th at AA cross country

Geneseo senior Dan Chenoweth didn't have time to hesitate Saturday at Peoria's Detweiller Park, the site of the Illinois state cross country meet. He entered the Class AA race hoping to claim a state title, and a hot first mile left him no time for calculations or ambivalence.

He settled for fourth place and a school record of time of 14 minutes, 24 seconds.

Evan Jager, the Algonquin Jacobs superstar who is ranked second in the country and verbally committed to Big Ten cham-

pion Wisconsin, and Arlington Heights Hersey's Kevin Havel joined Chenoweth in the frontpack trio from the start. Jager had stated his goal was to break 14 minutes for the three-mile distance, something that hadn't been done since the course was altered a few years ago.

"We went through that first mile faster than I've ever been through the first mile, and I usually go out pretty fast," Chenoweth said. "I felt alright with it."

Jager and Havel eventually pulled away. Chenoweth was 10 seconds behind at the two-mile mark. He was able to hold off Marmion Academy's Dave Grange at the tape, but Neuqua Valley's Chris Derrick snuck by him in the last 400 meters.

Jager won in 14:07.

"I knew for me to win (Jager) had to have a bad race and I had to have a great race," Chenoweth said. "I was happy with my effort. It's all I could ask for from myself."

Riverdale's Josh Moshier finished 24th in the Class A boys race in 15:39. Sherrard's Shelbie Pettie, runner-up to Carthage's Katelyn Bastert in 2005 as a freshman, was 16th in the Class A girls race in 18:23.

PEORIA, IL -- Fast. Faster. Fastest.
Welcome to the 2006 Illinois state meet, where a flat layout, excellent course conditions and perhaps the best depth of individual talent in the entire nation were parlayed into a historic day for prep cross-country running.

First comes the fast.
An amazing 41 boys cracked the sub-15:00 barrier, with 40 of those coming in the Class AA race, very likely to end up as the single-fastest state championship race in the

up as the single-fastest state championship race in the country in 2006! On the girls side, 58 runners dipped under the challenging 18:00 mark on the 3-mile Detweiller Park course, with 52 of those performances cascading down during the Class AA showdown.

Oh, but it gets better... Now for the faster.

Highly popular Jacobs High senior Evan Jager stormed to his first state cross-country title in a superb 14:07 clocking in the Class AA race, a performance seven seconds faster than 2003 meet winner and eventual FootLocker Nationals champion Matt Withrow (Andrew HS, now at U of Wisconsin). champion Matt Withrow (Andrew HS, now at U of Wisconsin). Then there's Hersey 11th-grader Kevin Havel, whose runner-up placing in 14:12 was two full ticks faster than eventual national champ Withrow's junior-year best 14:14.

Yes folks, it gets even better. Now comes the fastest...

times two. Local favorite Caitlin Comfort (Notre Dame HS in Peoria) became the fastest three-miler in state meet history, being timed in 16:47 to win the Class AA race. Comfort kicked home just fast enough to shave one second off the previous standard set by Streamwood's Paulina Garcia in 2003. (The state meet moved from a 2.5-mile layout to the current 3-mile

configuration in 2002.)

Not to be outdone, the fabled York dynasty rolled along quickly on the boys' side, even without legendary coach Joe Newton at the helm for the biggest race of the year. The Dukes delivered a race for the ages in what is believed to be the fastest 3-mile team-time clocking in U.S. prep history with a stunning 73:34 performance (14:42.8 average for its five scoring runners). It was also exactly 100 seconds faster than the team's winning aggregate clocking at the 2004 state meet, which came one month prior to it winning the inaugural Nike Team Nationals event in Portland, Ore.

York won its 26th state title in school history with a commanding 60-point scoring effort that proved 105 points better than a sensational out-of-nowhere performance by St. Charles North HS, which entered the weekend ranked only 11th in the final state Class AA poll. So thoroughly dominating was the Dukes' effort that its 6th (15:01) and 7th runners (15:09) finished ahead of the fourth scorer of all but one opposing team.

"They were a group of boys that all became men," said York coach Stan Reddel, referring to the team's poise when head coach Joe Newton and assistant Charlie Kern were placed on administrative leave of their coaching duties for the remainder of this season. Both were notified of the decision just eight days before the state meet for violating a state association summertime rule that recently came to light regarding coaching contact with athletes.

"Most teams would collapse under the pressure of losing their head coach just prior to the two biggest races of the year, "Reddel added. "These men remembered what they've been taught by their coaches and they went out there today and performed as champions."

So with the super-deep collection of swift harriers, two runners projecting faster than a previous national champion, a girls' state meet course record and perhaps the fastest team performance ever, can anyone keep up

with Illinois? We'll have to wait and see what the Nike Team Nationals and FootLocker Nationals extravaganzas tell us, but for now it's pretty safe to be able to start calling Peoria what it is... Speed City U.S.A.

Course conditions/background: As soon as harriers arrived in town on Friday, the buzz around the course was

echoing: "Times are gonna fly.

echoing: "Times are gonna fly."

Temperatures were steadying in the mid 50's and the enjoyed Detweiller course had just the right bounce to it; the grassy surface was firm, but not too hard. Smiles spread from ear to ear as the runners toured the course for run-throughs.

When the big day arrived, adrenaline also took over as all four races had the leaders out to brisk starts, in a majority of the cases seeing the early leader gap the field by margins not to be relinquished.

"You couldn't ask for a better day," said Jager. "It was perfect."

For sake of historical comparison, it should be noted that although Jager's 14:07 winning effort officially ranks him as the eighth-fastest prep performer on the all-time Detweiller Park state meet lists, the course apparently was lengthened in 2003 to a full three miles. Prior to that, it had reported as being 2.96 miles long. Several coaches polled agreed the change tacked on an average of 10 seconds to the total time of elite prep racers.




Although Jager's time was the fastest on the course since the lengthening to a full three miles, an adjusted 13:57 effort (along the pre-2003 layout) would rank him third all time, trailing only meet recordholder Craig Virgin (13:50.6) and Tom Graves (13:56.6). If using the adjusted time, it would make Jager the fastest state

meet performer in 29 years.

Hinsdale's bid for NTN; Class A results: Although York's latest landslide victory on the boys' side garnered major attention nationally, the Class AA girls race also showcased a top-end performance with

Geneseo star finishes 10th at Midwest meet

Most high school cross country runners are enjoying a break from running right now, at least if they're not involved in another sport. Then again, most high school-aged runners aren't Geneseo senior Dan Chenoweth.

In point of fact, almost none is like Chenoweth. Or ever has been.

Chenoweth broke new ground in the sport of distance running Saturday by finishing 10th at the FootLocker Midwest Regional Cross Country Championship race at the University of Wisconsin-Parkside course in Kenosha. His time of 15:19 was just 14 seconds behind race winner Hassan Mead of Minneapolis.

Most importantly, the 10thplace finish means Chenoweth has earned national All-American honors and will compete in FootLocker's national championship run on Dec. 9 at Balboa Park in San Diego. Calif.

How big is the accomplishment? It's never been done by a male Quad-Cities area high school cross country runner on either side of the river. The last time anyone from the Quad-Cities ran at the national meet, Bettendorf's Sara Roberson finished 15th — 20 years ago.

"At FootLocker, there's really no pressure, because it's so far after the season. If you don't run well there; you can always think to yourself, 'Well, the goal was state, anyway,' " said Chenoweth. "But I said that I wanted to be competitive not only on a state level, but on a regional level."

Geneseo coach Don Fredericks doesn't usually need much prompting to wax poetic about Chenoweth, and the singularity of his senior's accomplishment was no exception.

"Just when you think he's done as much as he can do, he tops that," said Fredericks, who was in attendance Saturday. "To me, this is more significant than if he had won the state championship. All the top kids of Illinois were there, and to come out of that was incredible."

The Midwest Regional consists of the states of Illinois, Colorado, North and South Dakota, Wisconsin, Iowa, Minnesota, Indiana, Ohio, Kentucky and Michigan. Chenoweth and Carthage four-time state Class A girls champion Katelyn Bastert were the only Illinois qualifiers Saturday. Bastert finished 7th in the girls race. They'll both receive all-expenses-paid trips to San Diego

"FootLocker flies us out and

they really take care of us, so that's really nice," said Chenoweth. "It's pretty crazy, just thinking there's 39 other guys there that have won a lot of races. It's kind of neat to bring that talent together. I'm really excited about it."

Chenoweth went up Friday after a quick Thanksgiving dinner with his family at his grandparents' home in Des Moines, and ran the course once before Saturday. He said the hills weren't as severely graded as those at Geneseo's Richmond Hill Park and that there were trails late in the first mile and early in the second which were similar to those found at Galesburg's Lake Storey Park.

"At the mile, I was at 4:50, but time didn't matter. I just wanted to make sure I was in position," he said. "At two miles, I was closer to 9:50 and I started to drop back a bit. The top pack, about 11 guys, broke off from the rest, and the last half-mile I was just catching up with guys and trying to get enough to get back to 10th."

One of those guys was Class AA state champ Evan Jager, who was ninth at the 2005 Foot-Locker national meet.

"The last 600 or 700 meters, you start coming down a big hill, and it kind of carries you through," said Chenoweth. "I was going kind of quick and I kind of went by him (Jager) and didn't even realize it. I passed him to get into 10th and ended up being 13 seconds ahead. He must have dropped pretty hard."

What the extension to his season has meant is that the Division I college visits Chenoweth had hoped to make will have to be pushed back once again.

"Everyone in town has been very positive about everything," said Chenoweth. "I told everyone I was going to be focusing on cross country until the season ended and I'd do my visits later. But the season just keeps getting longer and longer."

Chenoweth reaches All-American status

Geneseo High School senior Dan Chenoweth raced to a 10th-place finish out of 1,200 runners Nov. 25 with a time of 15 minutes and 19 seconds in the Midwest Footlocker Race at the University of Wisconsin-Parkside in Kenosha, Wis. Chenoweth faces national competition

For most fall sports student-athletes, their season ends in the playoffs or at the state meet and then they move on to another sport. But Geneseo's Dan Chenoweth is not most student-athletes. Chenoweth has continued to run throughout these colder months around the Midwest and has now captured a spot on the national stage at the Footlocker National Cross Country Meet.

"It was kind of different because I knew how the guys I raced against in state ran, but I didn't know about the runners from all the other states," Chenoweth said.

Chenoweth raced to a 10th-place finish in the Nov. 25 Midwest Regional of the Footlocker Race, with a time of 15 minutes and 19 seconds. Chenoweth is the only male runner on either side of the river in the Quad-Cities area to achieve this feat. The only other runner to do this from the Quad Cities was Bettendorf's Sara Roberson 20 years ago, who finished 15th.

"I was pretty pumped to make it into the top 10, but I was kind of down that I was the only guy from Illinois to make it," Chenoweth said. "I wanted to race with the other guys from Illinois."

"It is a very special accomplishment and is not an easy challenge," Head Coach Don Fredericks said. "He has done an admirable job and we are very proud of him."

Other racers from Illinois who Chenoweth beat out were the top three runners at the IHSA

state meet last month. Chenoweth finished 10th, crossing the finish line ahead of Evan Jager in 15th (placed first at IHSA state); Kevin Havel in 23rd (placed second at IHSA state); and Chris Derrick in 18th (placed third at IHSA state).

"(In San Diego), with this level of competition, I don't have high expectations. I just don't want to finish last," Chenoweth said.

"The fact that he qualified shows he has been doing the right things," Fredericks said. "It is amazing what this young man has accomplished and he has set his goals so high. He has raised the bar much higher and it is amazing."

Chenoweth plans on continuing his cross country career as he is looking at several different colleges and scheduling some visits, but where exactly he is going is still up in the air.

To prepare for these meets. Chenoweth hasn't been training too hard, but has been running to stay in shape and get ready for his next great feat.

On Dec. 9, Chenoweth will race against the top cross country runners in the United States at the Footlocker Cross Country Championships at Balboa Park in San Diego, Calif.

"It is kind of cool knowing I will be racing against some of the big names you will hear about next year in college." Chenoweth said.

"With his humility, his tremendous work ethic and his Christian upbringing, Dan is the whole package," Fredericks said. "Dan is a rarity and that is so refreshing. He is a powerful role model in Geneseo and he is making a difference in people's lives."

Chenoweth 24th at Foot Locker meet

Dan Chenoweth ran his last prep cross country race Saturday and now he says he has to live with what he has done.

It shouldn't be too hard for him as he added one more impressive feat to his running resume at the Foot Locker Cross Country Championships in San Diego, Calif.

Representing the Midwest Region, Chenoweth notched a 24th-place finish out of 40 top national runners in the 3.1 mile race at Balboa Park.

"I'm happy with that, it was a rough course and a little hot but I got through it,' said Chenoweth. "It's kind of interesting to be done with the sport; I thought a lot about that before the race and now I have to live with what is done."

Chenoweth, the first Q-C male athlete to qualify for this race, was the third best runner in the race on the 10-member Midwest Region squad. Two weeks ago, he was 10th in the regional.

He notched a time of 16:06, with Chad Hall of the West region posting a winning time of 15:20. The Midwest finished last with 89 points. The top three teams were West (32), Northeast (41) and South (73).

"It was like 65 degrees and it seemed a little hotter then what is was out here, but a lot of guys had to deal with it coming from the Northeast and Midwest," said Chenoweth. "I haven't been able to get a lot of work outside with all the snow at home, so this weather makes you feel a little more tired."

The course was mostly flat with a large hill at the one-mile mark that the runners had to hit twice. Chenoweth made a big push at the end of the race, passing four runners in the final 200 meters.

The race was a great chance for Chenoweth to gather some more national collegiate exposure. He will start concentrating on taking college visits to Illinois, Purdue, Iowa State and Harvard and a school yet to be determined.

Bettendorf's Sara Roberson qualified for the race in 1985 and notched a 15th-place finish.



