GHS girls win NCIC CC title

The Lady Leaf cross country runners knew they had a tough task ahead of them Oct. 13 in the NCIC meet in having to beat out Dixon in order to win the conference title. And that they did, the Geneseo girls scored the conference title with 33 team points with Dixon following in second.

"They wanted it really bad," head coach Don Fredericks said. "Dixon was everything that was advertised, but our girls ran a phenomenal race.

"The girls really stepped up and it was a knock down drag out brawl. And there were a lot of smiles at the end." Leading the pack for Geneseo were Danielle Dewey, Joann Chenoweth and Stephanie Kennett placing in the top 5. Dewey nabbed second place with a time of 19 minutes and 21 seconds; Chenoweth came in third at 19:25 and Kennett finished in fifth at 19:54.

"Danielle and Joann battled with two Dixon runners for most of the race and Stephanie had a monster race and is a tremendous addition," Fredericks said.

Lauren Schroeder crossed the

finish line in eighth place with a time of 20:21, followed by Eliza Cropp in 15th at 21:22 and Betsy Winberry came in 18th with a time of 21:45.

"Lauren, Eliza and Betsy all ran strong races," Fredericks said. "It was a phenomenal effort The varsity Leaf runners were runners up in the conference title race, placing second overall with 63 team points.

"Our guys have been struggling," Fredericks said. "Last year's seniors left big shoes to fill and the adjustment has been more significant than I thought. The guys are just not clicking on all cylinders, but it's not due to a lack of effort."

Josh Lodge led the team in fourth place, crossing the finish line in 16:07, followed by Chad Ford in 13th at 17:19 and Ryan Kotecki in 15th with a time of 17:34.

Ian Mattan finished the race in 17th place at 17:49, while Eric Windsor ended with a time of 17:52 for 18th. Rob Brenny placed 20th in 17:56 and Carlisle Evans-Peck came in 21st at 18:03.

So, today is payday for the Western Big 6 cross country teams. After a summer's worth of mileage and a fall full of racing, the conference title will be determined this afternoon as runners toe the line in Quincy.

▶Boys' race: This is the more intriguing race of the two, as you've got a very fast couple of Alleman Pioneers in Tim Hird and Brian McGuire, but you've also got a solid team in Moline. Rock Island won't be too far behind, and neither will United Township, as Charles Dundy continues to have a stellar junior year.

Quincy's Marc Amarillas also could figure to be in the mix of the lead pack, as he posted a solid 15:26 just two weeks ago on Quincy's home course.

While Hird is clearly the favorite to win individually, the rest of his teammates will have to hold up against a stingy Maroon pack that lost to Alleman by just three points at the Rock Island Invite on Sept. 22, however, if you scored the meet as a dual, the nod would have gone to Moline by a point.

Today it may come down to guts over the final 100 or so meters to determine who will wear the crown as kings of the cross country in 2007.

Moline's lineup is headed by Jonathan Smith, while Joe Zahn

■ Girls' race: Moline has been a powerhouse all season long thanks to All-State hopeful Aisha Praught. The senior Maroon continues to shine, last weekend finishing second behind the defending state champion Caitlin Comfort of Peoria Notre Dame. Emily Wolbers, Brittany Paller and Sarah Castel round out a Maroon top 4 that could decide the meet.

But, just like in the boys race, it's going to come down to the supporting casts for Moline and Alleman. The Pioneers have a couple frontrunners of their own in Kathleen Hogan and Caitlin Bull.

Moline and Alleman should dominate the top 10, scoring at least three or four girls in single digits.

Outside of Moline and Alleman, the rest of the conference should be a crap shoot. Galesburg doesn't have much, Quincy will bump a few girls around but won't be in contention, Rock Island is rebuilding with a solid group of freshmen and sophomores and United Township is trying to put together solid numbers to improve its top runners.

▶Boys' race: The Maple Leafs will be trying to defend their back-to-back titles on Saturday, but they'll be facing some stiff competition. The Dixon Dukes are ranked 12th in the state, and have been steadily climbing all season long.

Geneseo is heading into the meet ranked second on paper, but with their top pair of Josh Lodge and Ryan Kotecki, they're not ready to concede anything yet.

"Our guys are hoping to make a run at them, we're hoping to see some magic happen," Geneseo coach Don Fredericks said.

They'll also need big runs out of Rob Brenny, Chad Ford and senior Eric Windsor if they want to keep the NCIC Reagan trophy.

▶Girls' race: Just like the WB6 boys race, this one will come right down to the wire. It hasn't been since 1983 that a team other than Geneseo or Sterling has won the NCIC, and Dixon is trying to do something they've never done, be crowned champions.

With three girls breaking the 20minute barrier, they're formidable opposition for Geneseo which is looking to get the trophy back from Sterling which has won the last four years. While Dixon has proven tough all season, its not as heavy favorites as its male counterparts.

Last weekend in Sterling, Geneseo finished higher than the Dutchesses, and is now ranked higher than its NCIC foe. It's going to be another showcase of the Maple Leaf super-sophomores, Joann Chenoweth, Danielle Dewey and Amy Cosgrove, as the fate of those top three Geneseo runners will likely determine where the Maple Leafs finish.

"The goal is to go and win the conference championship. (The Geneseo girls) are going there to run their best race of the season," Fredericks said. "We peak for championship season and this is the beginning of it."

Then again, you can't count out Sterling either. 'Afterall with three straight titles, the Golden Warriors not going to go down without a fight.

The NCIC girl's race will be begin at 10:30 a.m. with the boy's race headlining at 11 a.m. at Hall Township High School in Spring Valley.

The Leafs had six runners finish in the top 10 on Saturday with Micah Morrill leading the way in second place at 17:45. Branden Smith came in fourth at 18:28, while Micah Stewart finished in fourth in 18:41.

Andy Adams placed sixth overall in 18:46, followed by Andrew Kellogg in seventh at 18:48 and Tyler Timmerman in eighth with a time of 18:54. Greg Pemble just missed the top 10, coming in 11th place at 19:59.

Running for the Lady Leafs in the varsity open race were Elaine Orendorff taking the top spot, crossing the finish line in 21:49. Kate Langdon followed in second with a time of 21:52, while Rachel Atwell took fourth at 22:43 and Liz Hanford came in fifth in 23:06.

In the boys' open race, the Leafs took second with Chris Bisom leading the team in second place at 18:25.

Jon Fleming placed sixth in 19:10, followed by Austin Carney in eighth at 19:30; Cameron Hodgson came in ninth at 19:31 and John Mullin in 10th with a time of 19:52.

Others racing for the Leafs were Chaz Augustine in 20:37; A. J. Kellogg, 20:43; Ethan Koisti, 21:30; Mark Morrill, 21:43; Steve Whittington, 22:15 and Jacob Carton, 30:15.

"We had a lot of good things happen and a lot of the team members ran personal bests," Fredericks said.

Pacing the Lady Leaf JV runners was Atwell, placing first overall and taking the tape in 21:16. Atwell was followed by Orendorff in fourth with a time of 21:39, Langdon in sixth at 22:06 and Hanford came in eighth at 23:10.

Bisom led the JV boys' team with a second-place finish in 17:43, while Micah Morrill followed in fourth place with a time of 18:11. Andrew Kellogg

crossed the finish line in eighth place at 18:46, while Fleming finished in 18:48 for ninth place. Hodgson took 10th in 18:49, followed by Timmerman in 11th at 19:17.

Others competing for the JV were Carney in 19:33; Augustine, 20:24; A. J. Kellogg, 20:54; Koisti, 20:54; Alex Strohmeyer, 20:55; and carton, 27:20.

Leading the freshman boys' squad were Smith in second place with a time of 18:37 and Adams in third at 18:38. Pemble took sixth in 19:23, followed by Mullin with a time of 19:46 for seventh. Rounding out the effort for the freshman were Mark Morrill in 22:24, Tom Dellett, 22:53; Ben Lodge, 23:09; Mitchell Kittelson, 23:22; and Ryan Frink, 25:06.

Lohman and Mariah Carney took to the course for the freshman girls' team with Lohman in second at 22:51 and Carney in seventh at 27:21.

Geneseo starts postseason action this weekend in the IHSA regional meet at Rock Falls on Oct. 20.

"We are in the toughest regional in the state and the goal is to qualify," Fredericks said. "It will be a challenge, but I am optimistic for the girls because they are really on a roll. I look for us to have good races and I hope they run the best race of their life."
