► **Storylines:** A tough regional becomes even tougher with United Township dropping down to 2A this season. It should be another good finish for local guys at Lake Storey Park. The question becomes can Tyler Rasso And United Township capture another title with Keith Sands (mononucleosis) still out of the

lineup? The Panthers have proven to be less than toothless, winning the Western Big 6 Conference meet for the first time since 1980. Geneseo's Jordan Starkey had a great run with a sixth-place finish (16:35.30) at the Northern Illinois Big 12 Conference meet at Richmond Hill Park. With the return of Kyle Reiling (wrist injury), Geneseo will be in good shape, too. Rock Island's Eric Ikundiro was sick for the conference meet but still gutted out a 15th-place finish (17:54). Look for Ikundiro's time to drop this week.

On the girls' side, Dixon's Haley Thorpe finished 25 seconds ahead of Geneseo's Emily Ford for the individual title last season, and Dixon convincingly won the team title. Dixon is a Top 10 school in 2A with Brittany Schwarz making a compelling case to be one of the best in Illinois with a time of 17:37, a season best, and faster than Thorpe's (17:47). Still, Geneseo has the talent to match up with Dixon with Paige Gatter, Maggie Schlindwein and Morgan Kelly. Rock Island's Celeste Arteaga was second at the WB6 meet. Rocky's Iradukunda Josephine will be the wildcard in this one after a great 22:00 finish at the Big 6 meet. UT's Autumn Vergeyle was floating on air after making All-Big 6 for the first time (4th, 20:32), and this week could be another good one for the senior.

Motivation comes in finish at Galesburg girls' XC regional

GALESBURG — With seven teams in the Class 2A Galesburg Regional girls' cross country meet advancing to the sectional and only seven full teams in Saturday's field at Lake Storey, you'd think motivation would be tough to come by.

So why did four of the top five runners, including three from the Quad-Cities area, sprint down the final stretch?

"I would have liked second," said Rock Island senior Celeste Arteaga, who placed third in 19:04, just two seconds behind runner-up Leah Brooks of Dunlap. "Plus, I really wanted to beat Emily (Ford of Geneseo), who beat me at Sterling. I wanted to beat her here."

Arteaga did that, with Ford finishing fourth in 19:10. Sixteen seconds behind her was another motivated finisher, Leafs teammate Paige Gatter, whose goal was to finish in the Top 5, and she did so by nine seconds in 19:26.

"I didn't expect Top 5," said Gatter. "This was supposed to be a harder regional than last year. Down the stretch, I was just trying to keep it up, afraid of falling out of the top 5."

"It's always fun to see how well you can do" when you have to have a strong kick at the finish.

such a strong kick, but it was a credit to her running style to put her in the No. 4 spot at the finish.

"I feel like I'm in a zone of my own," said Ford. "I didn't really have it today, but I'm really happy with my finish."

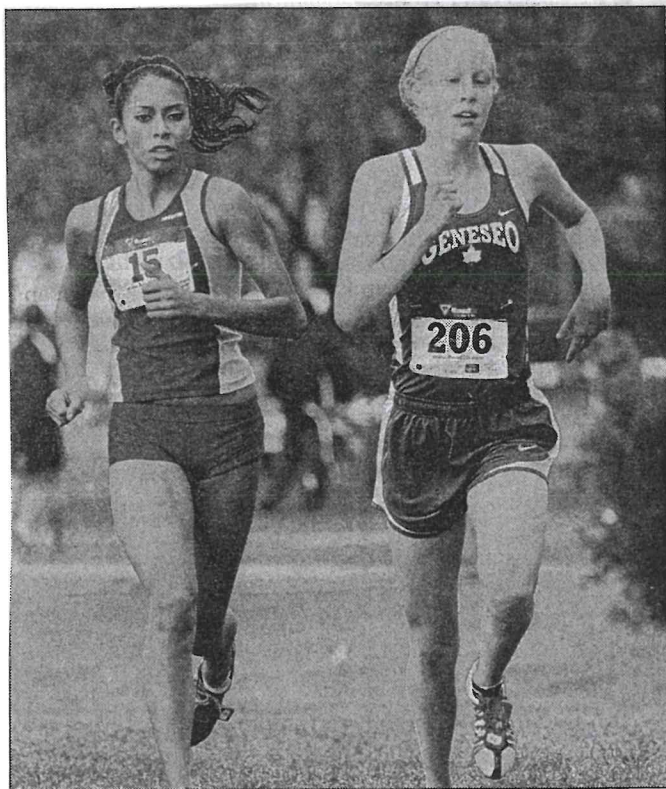
So, too, was Geneseo coach Don Fredericks, after seeing his girls take second with 73 points, behind powerful Peoria Notre Dame with 41. PND's Jessie Lynn was a runaway winner with a time of 18:41.

"You have the defending state champion in Peoria Notre Dame, and although they don't have everyone back, they're still a very good team," said Fredericks. "All of our girls are peaking at the right time. Emily and Paige ran smart races; our whole team did."

Four other Leafs finished in the top 20 — Maggie Schlindwein (12th), Jessa Coulter (15th), Danie Manna, (17th) and Jenna Ford (18th).

"And," Fredericks added, "Morgan Kelly (who usually runs No. 3 or 4 for the Leafs) was sick on the course, but she still finished," placing 28th.

UT's Autumn Vergeyle came out strong early. Vergeyle, at 14th, and Galesburg's Stephanie Saey (9th) were the only other Western Big 6 girls to finish in the top

Fantastic finish

UT's Rasso loses by a stride

GALESBURG — United Township cross country coach Russ Boore said he had never in his 25 years of being involved in running seen a finish like the one in the Class 2A Galesburg Regional boys' meet on Saturday afternoon.

A Galesburg race official, though, says you could see another as soon as next week, at the Normal West Sectional, or the following week, at the Class 2A state meet.

"The next time they run, you'd better be ready at the finish line!" the official exclaimed of Peoria Notre Dame senior Michael Kouri and United Township sophomore Tyler Rasso and their scintillating finish, Kouri winning by a half a step at best.

Kouri's time was 15:39; Rasso's was listed at 15:40, though it couldn't have been more than a couple of hundredths behind the winner.

Rasso trailed Kouri by seven seconds at the two-minute mark of the three-mile race. With 800 meters to go, he was behind by three seconds. Then came the final 100, which was as much of a sprint at a track meet only with the combatants already drained by nearly three miles of exertion.

Rasso went from on Kouri's heels to running even with him to being slightly ahead. That's when they exchanged a little paint, in car-racing terms, as they neared the finish. It appears the accidental elbow contact threw Rasso off his stride as Kouri edged past him right at the white line.

"If you look at the video in full speed, it doesn't even look as close as that," the official said of the stopped image at the finish. "It was a

half a stride at best."

Kouri was shocked that he was able to recover from losing the lead down the stretch.

"I was dying at the end. Then I had a surge of adrenaline that let me give it everything I had," he said. "Never before had I ever had a kick where I was passed and then was able to surge ahead."

Both Kouri and Rasso said the contact was not a big deal, though Rasso said it may have affected his finishing stride.

"We were both just giving it everything we had," said Kouri.

Rasso, who won the Western Big 6 Conference meet on the same Lake Storey course eight days earlier, said it was all a part of competitors being winning aggressive.

"That was so much fun!" he said. "I had so much fun with that finish."

Both tried to lean at the end, with Rasso's taking him into a freefall just beyond the line.

"I wanted to win, and I wanted our team to win," said Rasso. "It's a team sport; it's not just about me."

Still, it's Rasso and his gutsy effort that will be the regional talk, despite UT taking third behind the 6th-place of Austin Webster and 16th of Miguel Laferrera.

Geneseo placed fourth of the seven teams advancing to the Normal West Sectional. The Leafs had three in the top 20 — Jordan Starkey at 5th, Mitchell Lawson at 15th and Dan Hanford at 20th.

Rock Island missed advancing, placing eighth out of the nine teams. However, Eric Ikundrio (10th), Treyvon David (36th) and Justin Fredy (42nd) will compete at sectionals by being among the top five not on an advancing team.
