In each race, Rasso has had a dash to the finish for the title, and one more at sectional could be ahead. The Maple Leafs' Jordan Starky is looking to make his first state appearance after a fifth-place finish at the Galesburg Regional. Rock Island's Eric Ikundrio is another that could be booking his first trip to state after a 10th-place finish. For the girls, Geneseo junior Emily Ford is looking to make her third consecutive trip to state, after being an all-state athlete (22nd at IHSA state meet) in cross country last season. This season the Maple Leafs' Paige Gatter looks to get her second state berth, and maybe Ford and Gatter can take the Geneseo team with them this season. Rocky's Celeste Arteaga had talked since the beginning of the season about her first cross country trip to state. The senior Arteaga comes in with a regional third place finish, and was only two seconds away from second place. Another senior making a case for state is United Township's Autumn Vergeyle after a 14th-place regional finish.



GATTER AND STARKEY QUALIFY FOR STATE FINALS

On Saturday, October 29th, the Leafs traveled to the Normal West IHSA Sectional. The departure time was 6:15 necessitated via a two-hour travel time. The meet site was Maxwell Park and the course was fast with the competition furious. Anyone who knows anything about high school cross country in the state of Illinois knows that it is regarded nationally in the highest regard. Rated as the 2nd hardest AA sectional in the state, the Leafs knew going in that qualifying for the State Finals would be a tough challenge. The top 5 teams out of the 21 team field and the top 7 athletes not on qualifying teams would gain entrance into next weekend's State Finals. The temperature was a bit cool when we first arrived (42 with a 10 mph wind) but it warmed up as the day progressed with a daytime high of 57. All in all, pretty sweet weather for October 29th in the Land of Lincoln.

The girls got things rolling with the firing of the starter's pistol at 10:00 a.m. sharp. The field was loaded and the race went out fast. At the mile, Emily was tucked onto the back of the lead pack of 12 and was hanging on for dear life while Paige was 20th and looking strong. Not too far behind, was "steady Eddy" aka "Mags" with fellow Leaf, Jessa Coulter keeping her company just outside the top 50. Dani, Jenny, and Morgan were all running in the top 75 and looking strong. Over the last half of the race the Lady Leafs gave it their all. When they had all crossed the finish line and the dust had settled, senior Tri-Captain Paige Gatter placed 16th and had grabbed the final individual qualifying spot as our team had placed 8th and out of the money. Our next Leaf was junior sensation Emily Ford

who was simply having a bad day at the office. She fought every step of the way and just missed qualifying with her 22nd place finish. Next up were Maggie Schlindwein and Jessa Coulter who both blasted into the top 50 with strong 44th and 48th place finishes. Senior Jenny Ford continued her amazing season as our 5th scorer in 59th place. Dani Manna wasn't far behind in 70th with Morgan Kelly on her heels with a solid 89th place effort. The bottom line is this sectional was loaded and we are extremely proud of your efforts. Let's dust ourselves off and get back up and help Paige get ready for the STATE FINALS. TOGETHER WE STAND.

The second and final race of the day was the boys' race with the gun firing at 10:45 a.m. Jordan Starkey and training-mate Kyle Reiling got out nicely and were both in the top 15 at the mile which they covered in a quick 5 minutes flat. Mitchell Lawson was also out flying and in the top 50 with our pack of Cheno, Dan, Sean, and "Da Chopper" running in the top 80. Over the final mile Jordan made a huge move to go after a qualifying position and achieved his goal with an 11th place overall finish and was the 5th individual qualifier. Kyle faded a bit but fought every step of the way to grab 31st place overall. Oh, for one more week.....I have no doubt you'd be step for step with Stark. Mitchell Lawson just missed the top 50 with a great 59th place finish with Cheno, Danny, and Sean all cracking the top 80. 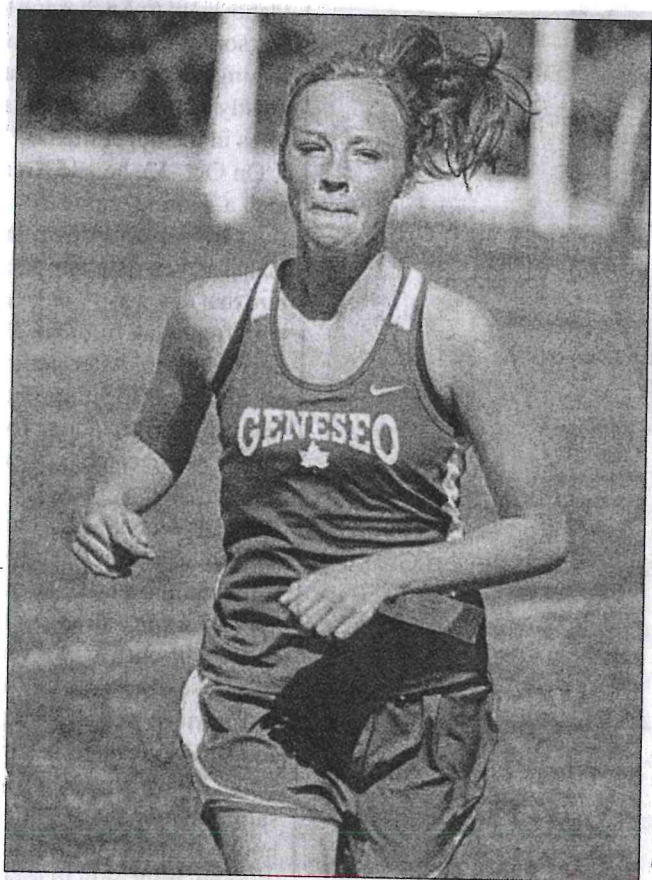

PAIGE GATTER qualified for state after a 16th-place finish at the Oct. 29 Normal West Sectional.

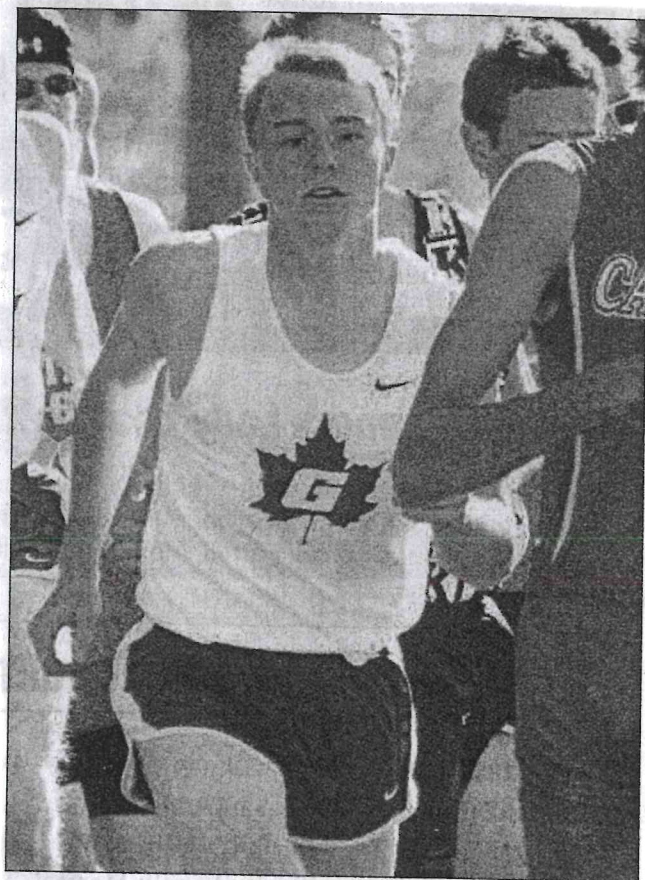

Geneseo senior Paige Gatter and junior Jordan Starkey will represent the Geneseo High School boys' and girls' cross country teams at the 2011 IHSA State Finals Nov. 5.

"I would say our sectional is the second toughest in the state," said head coach Don Fredericks. "It is brutal, and you have to be clicking on all cylinders. Both of our teams ran really well with lifetime bests and their best times of the season."

Gatter, who is making her third trip to the cross country state finals, and Starkey, who is making his first trip, qualified for state at the Oct. 29 Normal West Sectional. Gatter placed 16th with a time of 18 minutes and 21 seconds, while Starkey came in 11th as he crossed the finish line in 15:24.

"Paige grabbed the last qualifying spot and ran a tremendous race," said Fredericks. "She probably has the most patience of any athlete on the team. She doesn't go out too fast, but then moves her way up."

"What she accomplished is a big deal, and she worked her way up in the pack and made that final push at the end on Saturday. I am really proud of her. She ran a great race."

"Jordan got out to a nice start and was in the Top 15, but then made a huge surge in the last half mile to secure

a spot," said Fredericks. "It was a ferocious battle for the last spots."

In the girls' race following Gatter were Emily Ford in 22nd place with a time of 18:45, Maggie Schlindwein in 44th at 19:24 and Jessa Coulter, 48th in 19:28.

"Emily was just a bit off Saturday," said Fredericks. "She was not feeling great and was not clicking on all cylinders. It was the only time this season that she wasn't our first girl, but she had a great season. She just barely missed qualifying, but she fought hard."

Jenny Ford placed 59th for the Lady Leafs in 19:40, followed by Dani Manna in 70th at 19:51 and Morgan Kelly in 89th at 20:22.

The girls' team finished eighth overall out of 22 teams. The girls race had a total of 158 runners.

Following Starkey in the boys' race were Kyle Reiling in 31st place with a time of 15:48, Mitchell Lawson in 59th at 16:15 and David Chenoweth, 73rd in 16:29.

"I wish Kyle had one more week left because he is coming on like crazy right now," said Fredericks.

Dan Hanford finished in 75th with a time of 16:30 for the Leafs, while Sean Lillis came in 80th at 16:32 and Mitchell Lamb, 97th at 16:49.

The boys' team took ninth out of 22 teams and the boys' race also had a total of 158 runners competing Oct. 29.

"Our teams ran really well and just showed how good our teams are," said Fredericks. "Everyone on the girls' team, other than Emily, had monster personal bests, and it was the same thing on the boys' side with the excen-

tion of Kyle, so what more can you expect?"

Gatter and Starkey will be competing in Class 2A of the IHSA State Finals Nov. 5 at Detweiller Park in Peoria. Gatter and the rest of the 2A girls' runners will start at 11 a.m., followed by Starkey and 2A boys at noon.

"There will be 210 runners total and a goal for Paige and Jordan is to be in the Top 100, which I think is attainable for both," said Fredericks. "Another goal is to be All-State, which is the Top 25. I am just hoping for lifetime bests."

Verbeke leads Moline girls to state

After last year's heart-break, Moline coach Tauwon Taylor wasn't going to make any guesses.

It looked as if the Maroon girls had qualified for the IHSA Cross Country State Championships, but until Taylor had a hard copy of the results, he wasn't going to speculate.

"The ultimate goal for this year was to qualify for state," Taylor said. "Now we have no pressure and have the opportunity to run PRs and run fast. We know the course and know we can run fast."

Taylor didn't have much reason to worry as his girls were very fast Saturday at the Quincy 3A Sectional. Finishing third out of 21 teams, Moline was well ahead (73 points) of the fifth and final spot to state.

The Maroons were led by their star, Haley Verbeke, who raced to a second-place finish with a time of 18:21. Verbeke's place, paired with sophomore Brisa Almanza's 21st-place finish (19:14), gave Moline a terrific 1-2 punch as the other three Maroon scorers fell in line.

Morgan Timm ran the fastest race of her career, finishing the tough 3-mile course at Westview Golf Course in 19:26. Seniors Allison Wells had a tremendous bounce-back meet after running as the Maroons' No. 7 girl a week ago at regionals. Wells was Moline's fourth across the line Saturday with a time of 19:33, finishing 33rd.

Amber Maland, 38th in 19:39, and Sarahy Castro, 63rd in 20:09, rounded out the Maroons scoring. Castro could have done better if she hadn't encountered some bad luck. Within the first half mile, Castro got caught in traffic and her shoe came off. She ran the last 2.5 miles with one spike and one sock.

O'Fallon, which should be a top-15 team at the state meet next Saturday, won the sectional crown with 32 points. Minooka took second with 65.

2A at Normal West

The history of what Rock Island's Celeste Arteaga is doing isn't lost on the senior runner. She has the potential to become the second all-stater in Rocky girls program history (Tasha Esparza 1992).

Her fifth-place, personal best of 17:47 at Maxwell Park will build even more confidence going into next weekend's state meet.

"It felt like I was going pretty fast," Arteaga said. "Even though my stomach was churning, I pushed to get a PR because I wanted to have one of my fastest times. I wasn't expecting to be under 18 minutes."

Geneseo's Paige Gatter (16th, 18:21) was the final individual to grab a spot at state. The Maples Leafs' Gatter earned the final spot by four seconds over Normal University's Katie Herrman 18:25. The senior, Gatter has made it her mission this season to earn all-state honors after finishing 49th in state last season.

Last season, Emily Ford finished 22nd at the state meet, earning All-State honors. This season, Ford finished 22nd at the sectional meet and missed out on making a return trip to Peoria. She finished with a great time of 18:45, but the Leafs could only muster an 8th-place finish in the loaded field.

United Township finished 15th in the field of 22 teams, but got tremendous performances throughout their lineup. The Panthers were led by senior Autumn Vergeyle, who ran a lifetime best time of 19:01 and finished 30th.

Normal U-High won the sectional met with 79 points. Washington, Peoria Notre Dame (last year's state champs), Dunlap and Normal West punched their tickets to the big meet. Four of those teams are expected to finish in the top 15 at state.

1A at Elmwood

Sherrard's Robbie Ann Hoyer (9th, 18:47) will join the boys team at Detwiler Park after being the only girl to advance out of the tough sectional.

A week after Macomb's Karyn Paisley won the Macomb Regional over Hoyer, the Tigers sophomore was able to finish 11 seconds faster than Paisley in the Elmwood field, and has bigger expectations at state next weekend.

"I'm looking to get at least top 10 in state," Hoyer said. "I want to try to run about 17 (minutes)."

The rest of the field was disappointed. Mercer County se-

nior Miranda Biddle, hoping to make a return trip to Detweiller Park, missed out by more than 30 seconds as she ran 19:31 to lead the Golden Eagles. Last weekend Mercer County won the regional title but finished 9th on Saturday.

Sherrard finished 11th, Monmouth-Roseville came in 13th, and Rockridge finished 16th in the field of 20 teams.

The Titans were led by senior Megan Byrne, who finished 29th with a time of 19:52, and the Rockets were paced by Laikyn Singleton, who raced to a 53rd in 20:30.

Stanford Olympia won the sectional with 85 points, upsetting Elmwood-Brimfield and Tremont. Those schools, along with PORTA, are expected to finish in the top 10 at state.

1A at Oregon

Nicole Wager knocked it out of the park, while everyone else at the Oregon Sectional struck out in their search for a ticket to the state meet.

Wager, racing in the lead pack the entire race, finished sixth overall, racing to a time of 19:30 over the 3 miles at Oregon West Park. The pack of eight stayed together and ran comfortably the entire race, switching positions every so often.

The Annawan-Wethersfield senior made a move just past the 2-mile mark to the front of the pack and all of them immediately responded. Liz Mosbach from Hall broke the tape in 19:18, but Wager finished in front of Kimi Sanden of Bureau Valley, an all-stater a year ago.

The Titans had the highest team finish of any local crew, finishing 11th, but were more than 60 points away from the final team qualifying spot. Alleman came in 13th, and Erie-Prophetstown came in 15th.

The Pioneer girls have been plagued with injuries, running an injured Mary Adlfinger and Anna Wetherell, Alleman was paced by Sally Doak who finished 34, with 20:42.

"The wear and tear of the season caught up with them," said Alleman coach Dave Burke. "Our girls are very close, so it was tough for them knowing it would be their last race together. They just wish they would've been completely healthy and a different outcome would've been a possibility."

The wait is worth it for Sherrard boys

Holding up five fingers, Michael Holdsworth told the Sherrard boys' cross country team everything they needed to know.

The Tigers team was going to cross-country state.

After waiting for more than an hour to find out the boys' results at the Brimfield 1A Sectional, each team had to car pool from the Maple Lane Country Club course over to the Brimfield High School to find out the results.

Sherrard sat on the Brimfield gym's hardwood floor awaiting its fate.

As the results were posted, Holdsworth got to tell the Tigers they advanced for the first time since 2007.

"The waiting is always the hardest part," said Holdsworth. "It was so excruciating because we knew it was close."

Schuyler Wardlow led the Sherrard boys team in, and the Tigers were separated by only 38 seconds.

Mercer County's Sam Whan (7th, 16:01 PR) and Monmouth-Roseville's Devin Clark (10th, 16:09) advanced individually to state next weekend.

"I want to lay it all on the line next week," Whan said. "It's my last cross country race, and I'm hoping to come home with some hardware; get a PR and see what I'm physically able to do."

Clark was running for his first state berth with Bloomington Central Catholic's Mathew Schlenker, pushing him for 10th place.

"I was getting tired by the end," Clark said, "but while I felt tired I saw him there and knowing I was so close. I had to keep pushing."

Tremont continued to impress this season by winning the sectional with just 59 points. The hosts Elmwood-Brimfield took second with Heyworth and Olympia earning the other state-qualifying spots.

1A at Oregon

Last weekend, the Alleman Pioneers looked like a longshot to make the state meet. They finished fourth at the Rock Falls Regional,

and they weren't totally healthy.

Saturday at the Oregon Sectional though, the Pioneers snuck into the state meet behind a remarkable performance up front and a gutsy senior effort in the middle of the pack.

Alleman scored 170 points to finish fourth behind Marquette (136), Harvard (137) and Byron (168), and just barely ahead of Erie-Prophetstown (172) and Winnebago (180) and Bureau Valley (180).

"The kids told me afterward, we beat all the teams that finished ahead of us at regionals and that's pretty cool," Alleman coach Dave Burke said. "As a team we're getting better at the right time."

That is ironic because getting better is something senior Joe McLaughlin has wanted to do all year. Injured since the Sept. 10 meet in Peoria, McLaughlin made his return at regionals and ran well enough to advance the team to this weekend. Saturday, McLaughlin ran as the Pioneers No. 3 runner and made the difference for his team's state berth.

"Talk about a senior stepping up and not wanting his senior year to end," Burke said. "He had a hip problem he's been battling all year but made it back and ran with a lot of guts."

Junior Ethan Adlfinger ran a very strategic race, letting the leaders run themselves out before picking them off one by one.

At the mile he was 20th, but a half mile later he had moved up eight spots and a quarter mile later was in third. With about 1,000 meters to go, Adlfinger made a break for Marquette's James Weisensell but in the final meters, the Crusader senior held on to win.

Erie-Prophetstown also is dancing after their stellar day.

The Panthers got a tremendous race from junior Devin Johnson (14th at 16:49), and then had a pack stay close enough together to finish the job.

Mitchell Mallary, Matthew Mallary, Connor Saad and Josh Green finished from 39th-51st, and had a spread

of just 29 seconds which scored a ticket to Peoria and secured the team's first trip to the state meet since 1982.

2A at Normal West

United Township's Tyler Rasso got his rematch.

Peoria Notre Dame's Michael Kouri edged Rasso for the regional title at Galesburg last weekend.

This time it was Rasso's turn.

With Kouri leading in the final 200 meters, Rasso (14:48) had a kick to win the sectional championship at Maxwell Park.

Rasso won by a second, and the run even surprised himself.

"I was just hoping I could stick on some people," said Rasso after a new personal best by 56 seconds. "I was thinking maybe a top 10 to be all-sectional."

The United Township boys team placed third behind the return of senior Keith Sands (25th, 15:40), and Austin Webster was just few steps back at 26th (15:42).

A season after finishing 46th at sectionals, Geneseo's Jordan Starkey made it individually (11th, 15:24).

Rock Island's Eric Ikundrio will make his first state appearance (14th, 15:28) after running a personal best.

Joining UT at the state meet will be sectional champs Normal U-High, Peoria Notre Dame, Dunlap and Bloomington High. U-High won the meet with 50 points, while PND was second but nowhere close, scoring 146.

3A at Quincy

The Moline boys didn't have any advancers to the state meet, but that's not to say the Maroons had a bad day.

They finished 12th in the 21-team field, and were led by Mike Jarrin. The junior raced to a 35th place finish with a time of 16:25.
